

SUBJECT : NEWS SUMMARY FROM 100800 - 110800 MAR 96

1. GREAT LAKES REGION

a. The rally for the return of Refugees and Democracy to Rwanda (RDR) has deplored the withdrawal of UNAMIR. The RDR charges that the withdrawal is another mistake which will haunt the UN in the future similar to the April' 94 withdrawal. The RDR further charges that the withdrawal will leave Hutus at the mercy of Tutsis and will definitely be a disincentive to the return of Hutus.

b. LRA rebels have killed over 21 persons when they attacked a convoy in N. Uganda abducting over 200 other people in the process. UPDF reinforcements rescued most of the abducted people later.

2. REST OF AFRICA

a. The NPFL leader, Charles Taylor, has announced that his forces will hand back Kakata, a city 80km north of Monrovia, which the NPFL captured over the weekend. The NPFL took the city after fierce clashes with ULIMO-J rebels, loyal to Roosevelt Johnson.

b. President Omar El-Bashir has survived an attempted coup. A government spokesman announced that a number of military officers have been arrested. Opposition sources are doubtful about the reported coup attempt. They dismiss the attempt as a put-up job by the government to court legitimacy.

c. The Angolan government has agreed to absorb 18 UNITA generals into the National Army. Another 26,300 UNITA soldiers will also join the National Army. Currently, 17,000 UNITA soldiers are in quartering camps waiting to be demobilised.

d. The postponed trial of former South African generals opens in the Durban Supreme Court today. It has been revealed that Gen Magnus Malaan, leading defendant is suffering from Leukaemia.

3. REST OF THE WORLD

a. Palestinian Police have arrested 3 militant Hamas leaders including Abdul-Fatah Sartari, considered No2 in the military wing, in a continuing crackdown on the fundamentalists.

b. In a related development, Yassir Arafat has appealed to Israel to reopen the border with Gaza to allow food into the Strip. Meanwhile, in a move designed to reduce Israeli dependence on Palestinian labour, the government has approved permits for 16,000 foreign workers to enter Israel.

c. President Abdul_Rahman Biswas is continuing discussions with the opposition to find ways of defusing the volatile situation in Bangla Desh. Bangla Desh has been at a stand still since saturday when the opposition begun a non-cooperation campaign.

d. The US has despatched the nuclear-powered carrier 'Independence' and its escorts towards Taiwan. Secretary of State, Warren Christopher has warned of grave consequences if China persists in its belligerent attempts to re-absorb Taiwan.

e. Two former S. Korean Presidents, Chung Doo Hwang and Roh Tae Wu, and 14 other generals have gone on trial for treason and military rebellion. They face the death penalty.

f. The Bosnian Serbs are pursuing their scorched earth policy in the suburb of Ilidza with grim determination. Thousands of Bosnian Serbs have abandoned the suburb scheduled to return to Muslim control soon.

g. Prime Minister John Brutton of Ireland will meet a delegation from the Ulster Unionist Party in Dublin today. It will be the first time Unionist leaders will be meeting an Irish National leader in Dublin.

DAILY SITREP FOR 25 MAR 96

1. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING AT THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE ALONG WITH HEADS OF DIPLOMATIC MISSIONS AND AGENCIES, SO AS TO DISCUSS TAXATION MEASURES WITH REGARD TO THE IMPORT OF STUFF BY NGO'S. THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT DESIRES THAT ITEMS MANUFACTURED AND AVAILABLE IN RWANDA, SHOULD BE PROCURED BY THE NGO'S, OTHERWISE SUCH ITEMS, IF IMPORTED, WOULD INCUR DUTY SO AS TO ENCOURAGE PRODUCTIVITY INSIDE RWANDA.

B. RADIO NEWS REPORTED OF 25 MARCH STATED, THAT THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER ON HIS VISIT TO CAMEROON HAD DISCUSSED THE EXTRADITION OF COLONEL BAGOSORA WHO IS ALLEGEDLY THE RING LEADER OF THE 1994 GENOCIDE. DR. GASANA ALSO STATED THAT THE BELGIAN BLUE HELMETS WHO WERE KILLED IN RWANDA, WERE KILLED IN RWANDA, IN THE CONTEXT OF THE RWANDAN GENOCIDE, AS THEY WERE PROTECTING THE LATE PRIME MINISTER AGATHE UWILINGIYIMANA. HE ADDED THAT ELEVEN BLUE HELMETS COULD NOT BE EXCHANGED AGAINST A MILLION OF RWANDANS WHO WERE KILLED DURING THE 1994 GENOCIDE. HE SAID THAT SINCE THE RWANDAN JUDICIAL SYSTEM IS PURSUING COLONEL BAGOSORA, THE CASE OF THE ELEVEN BELGIANS WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE TRIAL.



DAILY SITREP FOR 22 MAR 96

1. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA NEWS REPORT STATED THAT THE DEPUTY CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF ICTR, JUDGE RAKOTOMANA, HAS CALLED UPON THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO INCREASE ITS ASSISTANCE TO THE TRIBUNAL. AT PRESENT, THE TRIBUNAL HAS 28 INVESTIGATORS ONLY AGAINST THE REQUIREMENT OF 100 AT LEAST. JUDGE RAKOTOMANA EXPRESSED HIS ANXIETY, DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE MORE THE INVESTIGATION IS DELAYED, THE MORE VAGUE THE WITNESSES' PROOFS BECOME. HE FURTHER STATED THAT COLONEL BAGOSORA WAS EXPECTED IN BELGIUM VERY SOON, WHERE HE WILL FACE JUSTICE ON THE KILLING OF TEN BELGIAN BLUE HELMETS WHO WERE SERVING WITH UNAMIR IN 1994. MR RAKOTOMONANA ALSO SAID THAT HE IS MEETING THE BELGIAN JUDICIAL AUTHORITIES IN BELGIUM, FOR EXCHANGING INFORMATION.

B. IN ANOTHER RADIO REPORT THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER HAD EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE INCREASED INFILTRATORS ACTIVITIES IN THE PREFECTURES OF RUHENGERI AND GISENYI. THE INFILTRATORS ESPECIALLY FROM ZAIRE HAVE BEEN LAYING MINES, KILLING PEOPLE AND DESTROYING INFRASTRUCTURES SUCH AS ELECTRIC POLES AND WATER PIPES. HE WARNED PEOPLE NOT TO EXTEND SUPPORT TO SUCH CRIMINALS WHO ARE BENT UPON TO DESTABILISE THE COUNTRY.

DAILY SITREP FOR 20 MAR 96

1. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND HAD USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS ON THE AGENDA CONCERNING ; SECRETARY GENERAL'S STATEMENT TO THE INTER GOVERNMENTAL WORKING GROUP ON THE STRENGTHENING OF THE UN SYSTEM, ANNUAL REPORT OF THE RESIDENT COORDINATOR ON OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT OF UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM, UN CONTINGENCY PLANS AND THE ISSUE OF WHITE HELMETS AND MEDICAL FACILITIES. LATER MR IAN MARTIN CALLED UPON THE SRSG AT HIS OFFICE AND DISCUSSED THE ISSUE OF FUTURE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS STAFFING PROBLEMS CONCERNING HRFOR.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT A CABINET MEETING CHAIRED BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, NOTED THAT SECURITY INCIDENTS OCCUR MOSTLY IN RUHENGERI AND GISENYI PREFECTURES AND CARRIED AGAINST HEADS OF SECTORS AND CELLULES. THESE ACTS ARE CARRIED OUT BY INFILTRATORS WHO BENEFIT FROM POPULATION'S COVER. IT WAS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED THAT PEOPLE SHOULD BE MOBILISED TO COUNTER SUCH TENDENCIES.

DAILY SITREP FOR 21 MAR 96

1. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE UN COMMISSION OF INQUIRY, INVESTIGATING THE ARMS FLOW IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION, HAS ESTABLISHED THAT AMMUNITION GRENADES AND GUNS WERE FLOWN FROM SEYCHELLES ISLANDS BY AIR ZAIRE TO GOMA, FOR SUPPLY TO EXFAR. THE REPORT, ACCORDING TO THE RADIO, HAS ALSO CONDEMNED ZAIRE FOR ITS LACK OF COOPERATION WITH THE COMMISSION.

B. THE RADIO FURTHER REPORTED THAT, SECURITY MEASURES HAVE BEEN STRENGTHENED ON AREAS BORDERING KIGALI AND RUHENGERI PREFECTURES, AS CRIMINALITY HAD REACHED A HIGH LEVEL IN RUSHASHI SUB-PREFECTURE, BECAUSE OF INFILTRATORS.

C. ON THE OCCASION OF SECOND ANNIVERSARY OF THE RWANDAN GENOCIDE, RADIO RWANDA QUOTED, POPE JOHN PAUL II, AS HAVING SAID THAT, CATHOLIC CHURCH LEADERS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE 1994 RWANDAN GENOCIDE HAS TO BEAR THE CONSEQUENCES OF THEIR SINS. HE CALLED FOR RECONCILIATION AND PEACE IN RWANDA THROUGH RESPECT OF HUMAN DIGNITY AND JUSTICE.

1. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR G ANDERSON AND MR L JOHNSON OF THE ICTR AND DISCUSSED ADMINISTRATIVE AS WELL AS SECURITY MATTERS CONCERNING THE TRIBUNAL. THEREAFTER, HE HAD A BRIEFING ON HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WHICH INCLUDED AN UPDATE ON INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RENDERED TO THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA FOR HUMANITARIAN PURPOSES. FINALLY, THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION ALONG WITH MR HASEGAWA, THE UN RESIDENT COORDINATOR, IN CONNECTION WITH POST UNAMIR ARRANGEMENTS.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR. YONNES MENGESHA, WFP ROME AND DISCUSSED WFP PROGRAMMES IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS , EFFECTS THESE PROGRAMMES WOULD CARRY ON ACCOUNT OF THE DRAW DOWN OF UNAMIR. HE THEN HELD ANOTHER MEETING ON THE SUBJECT OF COMMUNICATION AND EXAMINED THE POSSIBILITY OF TAKE-OVER OF THE UNAMIR COMMUNICATION SYSTEM BY ICTR.

B. FINALLY, THE SRSG MET WITH MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI, POLITICAL ADVISER OF THE RWANDAN VICE-PRESIDENT AND MR. FRANK MUGAMBEGE, DIRECTOR OF CABINET IN THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND DISCUSSED NEW UN MANDATE, THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AS WELL AS MATTERS PERTAINING TO UNAMIR/UNOR, RADIO SYSTEM.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE SMOOTH REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES IS HINDERED BY, POLITICAL WILL BY THE GOVERNMENTS OF ASYLUM COUNTRIES WHICH HAVE FAILED TO CHECK INTIMIDATORS INSIDE REFUGEE CAMPS. THIS WAS STATED ON 17 MARCH 1996, BY THE RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN THE SUMMIT THAT DISCUSSED THE PROBLEM OF REFUGEES IN TUNIS. THE MEETING OF HEADS OF STATES OF THE GREAT LAKES REGION WAS CHAIRED BY FORMER MALIAN PRESIDENT, AMADOU TOUMAN TOURE. IT FURTHER REPORTED THAT, THE TANZANIAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. KIKWETE, WHO WAS IN THE MEETING SAID THAT THE INTIMIDATION AND THE MILITIAS' PROPAGANDA SPREAD INSIDE THE CAMPS ARE A REALITY. HE SAID THAT TANZANIA HAS IDENTIFIED 150 INTIMIDATORS AND SERIOUS MEASURES WOULD BE TAKEN TO HANDLE THIS SITUATION.



A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM ON THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA. BRIEFINGS ON THE JUDICIAL PROCESS ALSO COVERED THE PROGRESS MADE IN IMPROVING PRISON CONDITIONS IN RWANDA. IT WAS AGREED THAT FOLLOW - UP MEETINGS WOULD CONTINUE ON REGULAR BASIS IN THE FUTURE.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND HELD MEANINGFUL DISCUSSIONS ON THE STRUCTURE OF THE OFFICE OF HUMANITARIAN COORDINATOR, THE LAUNCHING OF UN SPECIAL INITIATIVE ON AFRICA, 15 MARCH 1996 AND ON THE SUBJECT ON WORKSHOP MANAGEMENT OF FIELD COORDINATION IN TURIN, ITALY. THEREAFTER, THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER AT HIS OFFICE AND THANKED FOR THE COOPERATION THAT RWANDA HAS EXTENDED WITH REGARD TO THE FULFILMENT OF UNAMIR MANDATE. THE OPPORTUNITY WAS ALSO AVAILED TO DISCUSS MATTERS PERTAINING TO RADIO UNAMIR AND TO THE ISSUE OF EQUIPMENT. THE SRSG EXPRESSED HIS WISH THAT RWANDAN GOVERNMENT SHALL CONTINUE RENDERING COOPERATION TO THE UNITED NATIONS NEW MANDATE IN RWANDA.

B. FINALLY, THE SRSG MET WITH THE INDIAN AMBASSADOR WHO CALLED ON HIM AT HIS OFFICE AND DISCUSSED CURRENT DEVELOPMENT CONCERNING RWANDA AS WELL AS MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE END OF UNAMIR MANDATE. THE EXCELLENT PERFORMANCE OF THE INDIAN MILITARY CONTINGENT WAS LAUDED WITH THE END OF THE MANDATE.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT A CABINET MEETING WAS CONVENED TO DISCUSS THE FUNCTIONING OF THE SPECIAL COURTS FOR THE 1994 RWANDAN GENOCIDE. A. THE SRSG HELD A PRESS BRIEFING AT THE UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS AND SPOKE ABOUT THE MANDATE AND FUTURE COMPOSITION OF UN OFFICE IN RWANDA, THE PHASE OUT OF UNAMIR, THE RATIONALE BEHIND THE GRADUAL AND SUBSEQUENTLY THE COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL OF UN MILITARY CONTINGENT FROM RWANDA AND LAST BUT NOT THE LEAST ON THE DEVELOPMENTS CONCERNING THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES.

B. IN RESPONSE TO A QUESTION, THE SRSG DISPELLED, THE FALSE IMPRESSION, ATTRIBUTED TO UNAMIR THAT ITS PRESENCE WERE TO BE CONSIDERED AS A CRITICAL FACTOR IN THE REPATRIATION PROCESS. INSTEAD, EFFORTS TO PROMOTE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, REHABILITATION OF THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND CREATION OF FAVOURABLE CONDITIONS IN THE CAMPS ARE TO BE VIEWED AS CRUCIAL FACTORS FOR THE RETURN OF REFUGEES. HOWEVER, THE PRESENCE OF UNAMIR DID FACILITATE THE REPATRIATION PROCESS, THROUGH PROVISION OF TRANSPORT, DEVELOPMENT OF HOUSING SITES AND TO SOME EXTENT GENERATED, A SENSE OF CONFIDENCE AMONGST THE RETURNEES.

C. THE SRSG STATED THAT, THE RWANDAN PERCEPTION THAT PRESENCE OF UNAMIR DID SEND WRONG SIGNALS TO THE OUTSIDE WORLD WITH REGARD TO THE GOVERNMENT'S ABILITY TO MAINTAIN PEACE AND SECURITY IN RWANDA IS CORRECT TO SOME EXTENT. SECURITY AND STABILITY HAVE ALWAYS REMAINED THE SOLE CONCERN OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR'S PRESENCE AT BEST FACILITATED THE RECOVERY AND REHABILITATION OF RWANDA.

D. RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER SAID THAT HIS GOVERNMENT HAS NO OBJECTION TO THE DEPLOYMENT OF INTERNATIONAL POLICE DETACHMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA.

E. MR. RUTAJENGWA, PRESIDENT OF IBUKA CALLED UPON THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY OF PROVISION OF UNAMIR EQUIPMENT TO HIS ORGANIZATION. THEREAFTER, MS. GERTRUDE MONGELLA, SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL ON WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT, MET WITH THE SRSG IN HIS OFFICE AND HELD USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS CONCERNING WOMEN FOLK OF RWANDA.

F. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AND BURUNDI SHOULD STRIVE FOR STRENGTHENING SECURITY MEASURES ALONG THE TWO COUNTRIES COMMON BORDERS, SO AS TO PREVENT INFILTRATORS ACTIVITIES. IN THIS CONTEXT EXCHANGE OF SECURITY INFORMATION ALONG THE BORDERS COULD PROVE HELPFUL.





DAILY SITREP FOR 08 MAR 96

1. **HIGHLIGHTS**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS **NIL** . OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS **996** AND OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. UNAMIR'S CLOSURE CEREMONY WAS PERFORMED WITH DIGNITY AND HONOUR AT ITS HEADQUARTERS AT 1700 HOURS ON 08 MAR 96. THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER DR. ANATESE GASANA PARTICIPATED AND WITNESSED THE GUARD OF HONOUR ALONG WITH THE SRSG AND THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER. MEMBER OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS, SEVERAL MINISTERS AND SENIOR OFFICERS OF THE GOVERNMENT WERE PRESENT ON THE AUSPICIOUS OCCASION.

B. THE SRSG IN HIS SPEECH STATED THAT RWANDA HAS TRANSFORMED ITSELF FROM DEVASTATION TO REVIVAL, FROM DEGRADATION TO DIGNITY AND FROM TERROR TO SECURITY. THIS IS A MAJOR ACHIEVEMENT OF THE UN MILITARY CONTINGENT IN RWANDA AND THIS ACHIEVEMENT WILL FORM A ROLL OF HONOUR IN THE ANNALS OF UN'S PEACEKEEPING HISTORY. THE SRSG EXPRESSED HIS PROFOUND SENSE OF GRATITUDE, TO THE GOVERNMENT AND PEOPLE OF RWANDA FOR THE SUPPORT GIVEN TO UNAMIR. IN HIS CONCLUDING REMARKS, THE SRSG STATED THAT UNAMIR IS DEPARTING WITH A SENSE OF PRIDE AND SUCCESS. IN DOING SO, UNAMIR SHARES WITH RWANDA-ITS HISTORY, ITS TRAGEDY AND ITS REVIVAL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP OFFICE AND HAD A USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS WITH REGARD TO UN AGENCIES' ACTIVITIES IN RWANDA. THERE AFTER, HE MET WITH MR. B. IN THE AFTERNOON, MR. MPONDO OF UNESCO MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE FORTH COMING VISIT OF THE DIRECTOR GENERAL FOR UNESCO AS WELL AS UNESCO'S COOPERATION FOR UNAMIR RADIO. THE SRSG ALONG WITH ACTING FC, ALSO ATTENDED A BRIEFING ON THE ROUND TABLE ACTIVITIES IN RWANDA.

C. FINALLY THE SRSG MET WITH THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF BURKINA FASO MR. OUEDRAGO ABLASSE WHO IS ALSO THE CHAIRMAN OF OAU COUNCIL OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS MINISTERS AND DISCUSSED THE BUJUMBURA PLAN OF ACTION AS WELL AS DEVELOPMENTS CONCERNING THE OAU CONFERENCE IN ADDIS ABABA.

D. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT, THE GOVERNMENT HAS ACCEPTED, THAT A SMALL POLITICAL OFFICE OF THE SRSG IN RWANDA, REMAINS IN RWANDA WITH A FEW PERSONNEL. IT FURTHER REPORTED THAT, THE DEPUTY CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE HONORE' ROKOTOMANA, HAS REQUESTED THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT TO COOPERATE WITH THE TRIBUNAL IN PROVIDING CONCRETE EVIDENCE AGAINST THE SUSPECTED PERPETRATORS OF THE RWANDAN GENOCIDE.

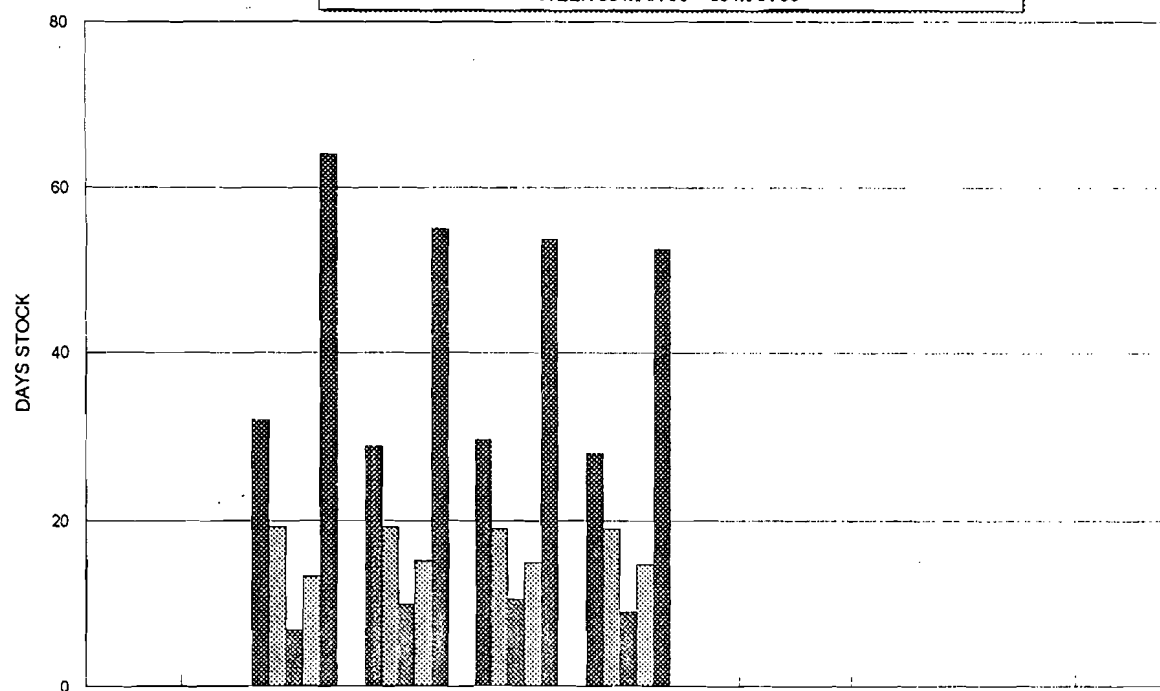



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING OF SENIOR STAFF MEMBERS OF UNAMIR AND TOOK STOCK OF THE SITUATION REGARDING UNAMIR'S PHASE OUT. THEREAFTER, A BRIEFING WAS GIVEN TO THEM ON THE OUTCOME OF THE AFRICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS MEETING IN ADDIS ABBA, WHERE HE WENT, TO ATTEND. LATER, THE SRSG GAVE AN INTERVIEW TO RADIO/TV RWANDA WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE ROLE OF UNITED NATIONS IN THE COUNTRY, AS WELL AS UNAMIR'S WITHDRAWAL AFTER THE 8 OF MARCH. IN THIS CONTEXT, HE STATED THAT THREE OPTIONS CONCERNING THE FUTURE PRESENCE OF UN HAVE BEEN FORWARDED TO THE GOVERNMENT AND TILL DATE THERE HAS BEEN NO RESPONSE FROM THAT SIDE. WHEN ASKED ABOUT THE DISPOSAL OF UNAMIR EQUIPMENT, THE SRSG EXPLAINED, THAT PRIORITY GOES TO THE USE OF THIS EQUIPMENT FOR PEACE KEEPING OPERATIONS ELSEWHERE. SECONDLY THIS EQUIPMENT IS ALSO MEANT TO BE GIVEN TO UN AGENCIES OPERATING IN RWANDA AND OF COURSE A PART OF THE EQUIPMENT WILL BE HANDED OVER TO THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AS INDICATED EARLIER. WITH REGARD TO UNAMIR'S PHASE OUT, THE SRSG STATED THAT THE MANDATE EXPIRES ON 8 MARCH AND THE COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL OF UNAMIR WOULD FOLLOW ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE GIVEN IN THIS REGARD.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, MR. ADEDE ICTR CALLED UPON THE SRSG AT HIS OFFICE AND DISCUSSED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN REGARD TO THE TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS IN RWANDA. FINALLY THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE MEETING OF THE AMBASSADORS AND BRIEFED THEM ABOUT FUTURE UN PRESENCE IN RWANDA AS WELL AS ON THE OUTCOME OF AFRICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS MEETING IN ADDIS ABBA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS, "AFRICA RIGHTS", "MEMORIAL", HAVE CRITICIZED THE FRENCH JUDICIAL SYSTEM FOR ITS POOR PROCEDURES IN FOLLOWING UP SUSPECTS OF THE 1994 GENOCIDE. THE RADIO FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE RWANDA REFUGEES REPRESENTATIVES WHO WERE ON A FACT FINDING MISSION IN GITARAMA AND RUHENGERI, RETURNED TO ZAIRE TO EXPLAIN TO THE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS THAT SECURITY CONDITIONS IN RWANDA WERE QUITE SATISFACTORY AND CONTRARY TO WHAT HAVE BEEN TOLD BY INTIMIDATORS IN THE CAMPS.

B. RWANDA UNITED NATIONS CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI, TANZANIA AND ZAIRE HAS BEEN RELEASED AND OUTLINES ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY UNHCR WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF UN AGENCIES, OTHER INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION AND NGOS IN SUPPORT OF THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA,S EFFORTS TO REPATRIATE THE RETURNEES FROM THE AFOREMENTIONED COUNTRIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ON 24 FEB 96, AN OLD MAN WAS SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA WHEN HE REFUSED TO STOP ON CHALLENGING DURING CURFEW HOURS. ANOTHER PERSON WAS SHOT FOR BREAKING CURFEW IN GATONDE COMMUNE, CYIBUMBA SECTOR (GR 6520). HR INFORMED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA.

(1) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), ON THE NIGHT OF 15 FEB 96, BANDITS RAIDED RUGALIKA (GR 9574) AND KINYAMI (GR 9177) SECTORS OF RUNDA COMMUNE AND STOLE A BICYCLE AND 6,000 FRW, FOOD ITEMS AND AN UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY FROM THE LOCALS. THERE HAS BEEN NO ARREST SO FAR.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 24 FEB 96 IN RUREMBO SECTOR (GR 6520) ONE PERSON SUSTAINED INJURIES WHEN SOME PERSONS THREW A GRENADE INTO THE HOUSE WHILE ATTEMPTING TO BREAK-IN. THE VICTIM IS ADMITTED AT RUHENGIRI HOSPITAL.

DAILY SITREP FOR 27 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY WAS 449. 114 CAME IN FROM ZAIRE, 293 FROM TANZANIA AND 42 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW FOR THE DAY IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO-DATE IS 26977. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH SENIOR STAFF MEMBERS OF UNAMIR TO DISCUSS THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY LIQUIDATION PROCESS THAT IS IN THE OFFING. LATER, MR KHERA ASIEL, PREFECT OF KIBUNGO, CALLED ON THE SRSG AND SOUGHT ASSISTANCE FOR GENOCIDE VICTIMS OF KIBUNGO AREA. THE SRSG PROMISED TO PROVIDE ALL THE NECESSARY HELP IN THIS REGARD.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG HAD A WORKING LUNCH WITH AMBASSADOR GANNS OF GERMANY AND DISCUSSED A NUMBER OF ISSUES RELATED TO FUTURE UNAMIR PRESENCE IN RWANDA. THE QUESTION OF SHOOTING AND ASSASSINATION OF SETH SENDASHONGA, FORMER MINISTER OF INTERIOR WAS ALSO DISCUSSED.

C. THE SRSG LATER PARTICIPATED IN A MEETING JOINTLY HELD BY UNDP, UNHCR AND HRFOR REPRESENTATIVES TO UNDERTAKE A REVIEW OF THE BUJUMBURA RECOMMENDATIONS THAT OUGHT TO BE DISCUSSED BY THE AFRICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS MEETING IN ADDIS ABABA.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 20 FEB 96 TO 27 FEB 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN /RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

2. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING: TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 8868. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

3. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UNDP ON 20 FEB 96 AND DISCUSSED VARIOUS ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE MEETING SCHEDULED FOR 29 FEBRUARY BETWEEN RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND UN AGENCIES. HE ALSO EXAMINED THE SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF UNAMIR EQUIPMENT TO AGENCIES AND TO THE GOVERNMENT. ON 21 FEBRUARY, HE MET WITH MR GREENE OF THE IRISH FOREIGN MINISTRY AND EXCHANGED VIEWS ON BILATERAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA. THE SRSG ALSO CALLED UPON PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU ON THE SAME DAY AND DISCUSSED FUTURE UN PRESENCE IN RWANDA.

B. THE AMBASSADORS OF FRANCE, BRITAIN AND CANADA MET WITH THE SRSG ON DIFFERENT OCCASIONS BETWEEN 21 AND 22 FEBRUARY AND TOOK STOCK OF THE OVERALL-SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND FUTURE UN PRESENCE IN RWANDA. THE VISITING BRITISH FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH DELEGATION ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH THE SRSG ON 26 FEBRUARY AND WAS BRIEFED WITH REGARD TO UNAMIR AND UN AGENCIES' OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

C. THE WEEK UNDER REVIEW HAD WITNESSED AN ACCELERATED RETURN OF REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI, THOUGH, REPATRIATION FROM ZAIRE STILL REMAINED INSIGNIFICANT, DESPITE ENCIRCLING BY ZAIRE FORCES OF SOME OF THE REFUGEES CAMPS. THE SITUATION CALLED FOR FOLLOWING CONFIDENCE BUILDING MEASURES, SIMILAR TO THOSE TAKEN IN FACILITATING REPATRIATION PROCESS IN BURUNDI AND TANZANIA. CONSEQUENTLY, NEGOTIATION ARE UNDER WAY TO SEEK PARTICIPATION OF RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN PERSUADING THE REFUGEES IN ZAIRE TO RETURN HOME.

D. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 19 FEBRUARY THAT THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA INDICTED TWO PROMINENT RWANDAN PEOPLE ON CHARGES OF GENOCIDE AND CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY. THE TRIBUNAL HAS ALSO REQUESTED BELGIUM TO SEND OTHER PEOPLE ACCUSED OF SIMILAR OFFENSES TO BE DETAINED

IN ARUSHA AWAITING CHARGES. NEVERTHELESS, IN ANOTHER NEWS REPORT OF 22 FEBRUARY, THE GOVERNMENT HAD EXPRESSED ITS DISSATISFACTION OVER THE DELAY IN THE OPERATIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA. THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MRS MARTHE MUKAMURENZI, STATED THAT LACK OF EVIDENCE AGAINST THE SUSPECTS, AS VIEWED BY THE TRIBUNAL, DOES NOT HOLD GOOD, BECAUSE HER GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN PROVIDING ALL POSSIBLE EVIDENCE AGAINST THEM AND SHALL CONTINUE TO DO SO IN THE FUTURE.

E. ON 23 FEBRUARY, THE RADIO REPORTED THAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT WILL NOT HAVE POLITICAL NEGOTIATIONS WITH "RDR" AND "RWANDA POUR TOUS" AS DOING SO, WOULD TANTAMOUNT TO ACCEPTING THE LEGITIMACY OF THEIR LEADERSHIP. THE LEADERS OF THESE GROUPS BELONG TO MRND AND RDR, THE POLITICAL PARTIES WHICH PLANNED AND CARRIED OUT THE GENOCIDE. THE OFFER BY THESE GROUPS FOR DIALOGUE, RIGHTLY CONFIRMS THE GOVERNMENT'S APPREHENSIONS, THAT SUPPORT IS EXTENDED TO THEM BY SOME POWERFUL MEMBER OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY.

(1) AN ANTI TANK MINE BLEW OFF AN IRC MOBILE CLINIC VEHICLE ON 20 FEB 96 AT ABOUT 1000 HRS AT RUSUYU SECTOR (GR 7829). THE ENGINE COMPARTMENT AND THE PASSENGER'S SEAT WERE COMPLETELY DESTROYED HOWEVER NOBODY WAS HURT IN THE INCIDENT. THE RPA IS CONDUCTING FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(2) SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) - ON 17 FEB 96, TWO RETURNEES BOTH JUVENILES SUSPECTED TO BE INVOLVED IN GENOCIDE, WERE ARRESTED IN GAKARARA (GR 3921) OF Koba SECTOR AFTER THEY RETURNED FROM ZAIRE ON 16 FEB 96.

(3) SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) - FIVE ARMED MEN IN DIFFERENT INCIDENTS ON 09, 16 AND 17 FEB 96 ROBBED HOUSES IN RUBONA (GR 0854), CYARWA (GR 1257) AND A SHOP IN MUTANDA (GR 1355) SECTORS. THEY ESCAPED WITH 1,000,000 AND 69,000 FRW FROM HOUSES AND ALL THE VALUABLES FROM THE SHOP RESPECTIVELY. THE LOCALS SUSPECT THE INVOLVEMENT OF RPA BECAUSE ONE OLD LADY RECOGNISED THREE OF THE FIVE AS RPA SOLDIERS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) - IN GIKOMA SECTOR (GR 8153), FOUR ARMED BANDITS SHOT DEAD ONE PERSON AT ABOUT 2300HRS ON 18 FEB 96. THE WIFE OF THE DECEASED WAS SEVERELY BEATEN AND ROBBED OF 14000 FRW. RPA CARRYING OUT INVESTIGATIONS.

(2) SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA)-IN MUSAMO SECTOR GS 7952,ARMED BANDITS ATTACKED ONE FAMILY AND DEMANDED MONEY.AS THE MONEY WAS NOT FORTHCOMING,THEY BEAT UP FAMILY MEMBERS SEVERELY.NO ARRESTS HAVE BEEN MADE SO FAR.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ON 10 FEB 96,ONE PERSON THREW A GRENADE ON RPA PATROL. THE SUSPECT WITH ONE RPA SOLDIER WERE KILLED AND THREE OTHER SOLDIERS INJURED AND THEY ARE CURRENTLY BEING TREATED AT RUHENGARI HOSPITAL.

(4) IN SECTOR 5(GISENYI) ON 19 FEB 96 AT ABOUT 2000 HRS ONE TEACHER WITH ANOTHER PERSON WERE SHOT DEAD BY TWO UNKNOWN ARMED PERSONS IN MUKINGO COMMUNE (GR 5129).ON THE SAME DAY IN KANZA SECTOR (GR 6029) OF NYAKIMANA COMMUNE (GR 5927) THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN AN RPA PATROL AND SUSPECTED INTERAHAMWE.NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON EITHER SIDE.

(5) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 14 FEB 96,ONE PERSON WAS SHOT IN THE SHOULDER BY ARMED UNIFORM MEN SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF.

(6) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) AT GISOVU COMMUNE (GR 2951) AND GISHYITA COMMUNE (GR 2062) OF KIBUYE PREFECTURE THE BOURGEMESTRE REPORTED OF SOME INTRUSIONS FROM ZAIRE WHICH RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF TWO PERSONS IN BISESERO SECTOR (GR 2660) IN JANUARY 96 AND TWO PERS INJURED IN MUSENYI SECTOR (GR 2263) LAST WEEK.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KIBOGORA (GR 0443) REPORTED THAT TEN ARMED MEN PASSED THROUGH HIS COMMUNE AT ABOUT 2300 HRS ON 21 FEB 96.THEY WERE SAID TO HAVE HEADED FOR THE FOREST. THE RPA WERE SPOTTED COMBING THE GENERAL AREA.

(8) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) AT RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 3123), THE SABOTAGE AND STEALING ACTIVITIES ARE STILL ACTIVE IN THE COMMUNE BY THE SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE ELEMENTS.

(9) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) ALLEGED INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES ARE ON THE INCREASE. 7 ALLEGED INTERHAMWE WERE ARRESTED BETWEEN 20 AND 23 FEB,96. TWO OUT OF THE SEVEN WERE ARRESTED AROUND THE BDE COMD'S RESIDENCE AND THE REST NEAR THE SECTOR HQ IN KABGAYI.IT IS NOT CONFIRMED WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO THEM.

(10) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ON 21 FEB 96, A LOCAL PATROL CLASHED WITH SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE IN BURERA CELLULE (GR 2500) OF KIGEYO (GR 2399) SECTOR IN KAYOVE COMMUNE (GR 2792) THE RESPONSIBLE OF THE CELLULE WAS ROUGH HANDLED. THE LOCALS LOCATED A BAG LEFT BEHIND BY THE GROUP WHICH CONTAINED TWO HAND GRENADES.

(11) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ON THE 15 FEB 96, SOME INFILTRATORS ENTERED RUTUMBA SECTOR (GR 6743) OF NKUMBA COMMUNE AND KILLED ONE PERSON. FOUR PERSONS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THIS REGARD.

(12) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), AT TAKWE COMMUNE (GR 7570) MILOB TEAM WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE MURDER OF VINCENT RECLINOLAWA, SECRETARY OF THE KIVUMU CHURCH ON 09 FEB 96, BY UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(13) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) AT ABOUT 1510 HRS ON 26 FEB 96 A MSF (SPAIN) TEAM RETURNING FROM BWEYEYE (GR 1309) WAS AMBUSHED BY UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS, PRESUMABLY FRGF. A LOCAL WAS KILLED, ANOTHER SERIOUSLY WOUNDED AND AN NGO LOST THE FORE FINGER.

(14) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) IN SIMILAR INCIDENT, THREE LOCALS WERE KILLED, ONE KIDNAPPED AND TWO INJURED PRESUMABLY BY FRGF, IN THE EARLY HOURS OF 26 FEB 96 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE (GR 8907).

(15) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED AN INCREASE IN INFILTRATIONS ALONG THE BORDER COMMUNES. THE RPA WERE SAID TO HAVE ENCOUNTERED A GROUP OF INFILTRATORS IN MUKINGO COMMUNE (GR 2618) ON 20 FEB 96. THREE OF THEM WERE ARRESTED AND ARE BEING KEPT AT RPA CAMP AT MUKINGO.

A. INSURGENT ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS 4 AND 5 ARE ON THE INCREASE. THE EX-FAR IS MAKING ALL ATTEMPTS TO RE-ASSERT ITS INFLUENCE IN THESE PREDOMINANTLY HUTU POPULATED AREAS. THIS WILL RESULT IN INCREASED RPA DEPLOYMENT, PATROLLING AND OTHER SECURITY MEASURES. THE SITUATION IS BEING MONITORED CLOSELY.



RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY WAS 132 ALL CAME IN FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW FOR THE DAY IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO-DATE IS 26528. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

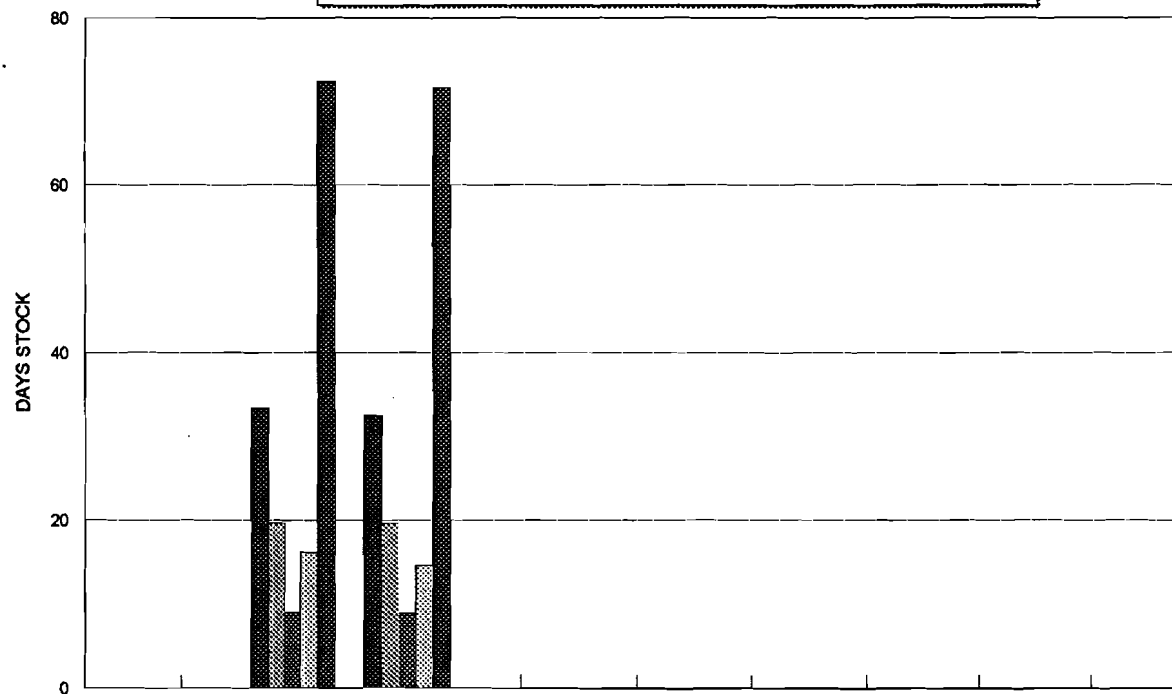
