DAILY SITREP FOR 10 MAY 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE. SITUATION IN KIGALI FOR INTERNATIONAL STAFF REMAINS INSECURE DUE TO ARMED ROBBERIES AND VEHICLE HIJACKINGS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. SEE THE SRSG'S WEEKLY POLITICAL UPDATE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH ARMED ROBBERS FROM ZAIRE AT 0200 HRS IN THE AREA OF ISHARA PENINSULA GR 0045. A MOTHER OF 5 CHILDREN WAS KILLED DURING THE EXCHANGE. THE BANDITS HOWEVER MANAGED TO ESCAPE WITH THEIR STOLEN GOODS.

(2) AT 102200HRS FOUR STAFF OF IMC, AN NGO, REPORTED TO TAC HQ THAT 02 ARMED RPA SOLDIERS FORCIBLY ENTERED THEIR RESIDENCE IN BUTARE AND STOLE 600 US DOLLARS, ONE MOTOROLA AND THEN FORCED THEM TO GET OUT OF THE HOUSE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 4A, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA BATT CONTINUES ITS PRESENCE IN KIBEHO CAMP. STILL IN THE SAME SECTOR, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT IN KARAMA GR 3550 AT 100900B MAY 95, RPA SOLDIERS KILLED A LOCAL AND WOUNDED HIS WIFE. THE DECEASED WAS ACCUSED OF STEALING CATTLE AND COFFEE FROM ANOTHER LOCAL. THE WIFE IS ADMITTED TO KIGEME HOSPITAL. IN A SEPARATE INCIDENT RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEATEN A LOCAL IN THE SAME AREA AND CUT OFF ONE OF HIS FINGERS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) IN SECTOR 5, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA BATT DEPLOYED IN GISENYI IS BEING RELIEVED.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE PLATOON COMD AT RUSIZI I WAS ADVISED BY A ZAIRIAN OFFICER TO INFORM UNAMIR AUTHORITIES NOT TO CONDUCT OPERATIONS OVER THEIR TERRITORY WITHOUT PRIOR CLEARANCE. RPA MOUNTED ROADBLOCKS ON THE ROAD BUGARAMA - CYANGUGU, HOWEVER THEY WERE REMOVED AT 1700HRS. RPA AND ZAIRIAN TROOPS HAVE INCREASED THEIR PRESENCE IN THE BUGARAMA AREA. RPA SOLDIERS WERE SEEN DIGGING TRENCHES AND BUNKERS IN BUGARAMA AREA.

(3) NIBATT TPS AND MILOBS UNDERTOOK A FAMILIARISATION TOUR OF THE SOS VILLAGE AT NGARAMA. A NIBATT PL COMD DONATED 24 BOTTLES OF DISINFECTANT TO THE VILLAGE.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ROTATION OF GHANBATT TPS COMMENCED 10 MAY 95. 223 ALL RANKS ARRIVED FROM GHANA WHILE 225 ALL RANKS LEFT KIGALI FOR GHANA.

(3) GHANBATT PROVIDED SY AT GAHINI GR 5758 AND NYARUBUYE GR 5984 HELI PADS DURING THE VISIT OF THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY.

(4) 51 IDPs REMAINING AT SAKE ORC LEFT FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES AT 101200B MAY 95.

(1) INTENSIFIED PATROLS IN THE HOME COMMUNES WITHIN THE SECTOR TO DETER RPA FROM HARASSING RETURNEES.

(2) PROVIDED TRANSPORT TO CHURCH AT KIGEME DURING THEIR PREPARATION FOR THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY'S VISIT.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 41 LOCALS IN AOR.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ESCORTED A UNHCR CONVOY OF 89 IDPs PROCEEDING TO BUTARE FROM NYAGATARE TO KITABI GR 3520.

(3) ETHIOBATT TROOPS IN THE AREA OF GISUMA ASSISTED THE LOCALS TO HARVEST THEIR COFFEE. THE LOCALS WERE VERY PLEASED.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 3 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TUNBATT MED STAFF EVAC TWO SICK LOCALS FROM BUSOGO GR 4927 TO RUHENGARI HOSPITAL.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

K. MILOB GP. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINED CALM. MILOBS CONTINUED ROUTINE PATROLS ESPECIALLY IN AREAS WHERE IDPS HAVE RETURNED OR CAMPED IN TRANSIT. IN SECTOR 4C IN KIRAMBO COMMUNE GR 0444 FOUR ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED INVOLVING ARMED BANDITS. IN THE ISHARA PENINSULA GR 0143 LOCALS REPORTED SEVERAL ACTS OF BANDITRY BY ELEMENTS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM AND ACCOMPANIED BY CIVILIANS WITH SPEARS AND MACHETES. SEVERAL HOUSES WERE ROBBED AND THE INHABITANTS OF THE AREA WERE HARASSED. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THE WIFE OF THE BOURGMESTRE OF KAGANO GR 9941 WAS KILLED BY THE BANDITS DURING THEIR RAIDS. IN NYAMASHEKE AT 0600 HR ON 10 MAY 95 A BOAT WAS SEEN LEAVING FOR IJWI ISLAND. THE BOAT ALLEGEDLY BELONGED TO BANDITS WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY ROBBED TWO STORES IN NGOMA AREA GR 9733.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONTINUED MONITORING THE RESETTLEMENT

OF IDPS. IN MURAMBI COMMUNE 10 RETURNEES HAVE BEEN DETAINED AT THE COMMUNE CELL FOR UNSPECIFIED CHARGES. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PATROL TO MASANGO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT THE COMMUNE PRISON CONTAINED 38 PRISONERS. THEY APPEARED TO BE WELL TREATED. 1628 RETURNEES HAVE SO FAR RESETTLED IN THE COMMUNE. THE BOURGMESTRE SUSPECTS A LOT OF CRIMINALS AMONG THE RETURNEES BECAUSE HE CLAIMED MANY OF THEM HAVE NOT BEEN REGISTERED. THE RETURNEES ARE CURRENTLY FACING FOOD SHORTAGE. HAC INFORMED.

(C) PATROLS TO BULINGA AND NYABIKENKE COMMUNES REPORTED THAT 50 IDPS HAVE RETURNED TO BULINGA COMMUNE. THERE WERE 20 PRISONERS IN BULINGA COMMUNE CACHOT AND 39 IN NYABIKENKE COMMUNE, 37 OF WHOM WERE ALLEGED TO BE GENOCIDE CRIMINALS. IT APPEARED THAT ARRESTS HAD STARTED AND WERE MOSTLY ARBITRARY. THE PTL ALSO SAW A CARITAS VEHICLE ABANDONED ON ROAD NYABIKENKE - RUTOBWE NEAR RUTONGO SECTOR GR 7583, THE PLATE NUMBER WAS 009. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(D) 11 PRISONERS WERE RELEASED FROM NTONGWE COMMUNE CACHOT AFTER INITIAL INVESTIGATION BY IPG TEAM LED BY HR MONITORS. ONE OF THE RELEASED PRISONERS HAD BEEN ACCUSED OF COLLUSION WITH UNAMIR.

(E) A MEETING WAS HELD BETWEEN SECTOR COMMANDER AND ACTING BISHOP OF KABGAYI TO ASCERTAIN REASONS FOR HIS APPREHENSIONS REGARDING HIS POSSIBLE ARREST IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

(F) THE SWISS DISASTER RELIEF'S VEHICLE HAS BEEN HANDED OVER BY THE RPA BUT IN EXTREMELY BAD CONDITION. THE VEHICLE WAS USED TO TRANSPORT RPA SOLDIERS.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE MILOB SECTOR COMD WITH OPS OFFR VISITED KIBEHO. THEY OBSERVED THE BOURGMESTRE OF MUBUGA COMMUNE GR 5202 ADDRESSING ABOUT 200 LOCALS NEAR NDAGO GR 520023. TWO TEAMS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY ARRIVED AT KIBEHO AND GATHERED INFORMATION FROM THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) 310 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI ARRIVED AT BUTARE WAY STATION ON 09 MAY 95. THEY ARE AWAITING TRANSPORT TO THEIR COMMUNES. HAC INFORMED.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) CARRIED OUT PATROL ALONG ZAIRIAN BORDER AND OBSERVED A CONVOY OF 12 TRUCKS IN ZAIRE AT GR 9891 CARRYING PEOPLE WHO WERE PROBABLY REFUGEES. DESTINATION OF THE CONVOY NOT KNOWN.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) A PTL TEAM WENT TO KIRAMBO GR 8735 WITH RPA LOCAL ENGR TO DESTROY SOME UNEXPLODED SHELLS AND GRENADES.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

L. FORCE ENGR COY.

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(2) COMPLETED DIGGING WORK FOR DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AT GISENYI.

(3) EOD TEAM DEPLOYED TO THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR'S HOME IN KIGALI.

(4) COMPLETED FENCING WORK AT MALAWICOY LOC.

M. AUSMED.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(4) COMDT RPA MIL ACADEMY ACCOMPANIED BY A REP FROM MINISTRY OF WORKS, ARRIVED FOR AN UNANNOUNCED VISIT AT 101155B MAY 95. HE WAS ESCORTED AROUND AREAS VACATED BY INDIAN FORCE ENGR COY BY 2IC AUSMED. COMDT EXPRESSED CONCERN AT STATE OF LECTURE THEATRE AND INDICATED MINISTERIAL STAFF WOULD VISIT ON 11 MAY 95 TO ASSESS DAMAGES.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. TOTAL OF 23 FLIGHTS DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL AND TO THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) INVESTIGATED A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UN VEH, UNHCR NO 20088 AND CIV VEH NO ESSAI 031 AT BLUD L'OUA IN KIGALI. BOTH VEH SUSTAINED DAMAGES AND A PASSENGER IN THE CIV VEH SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) AT 2140HRS 10 MAY 95, MP PTL VISITED A CIVILIAN RESIDENCE IN KIMIHURURA NEAR MERIDIEN HOTEL WHERE 3 RPA SOLDIERS WITH WEAPONS ATTEMPTED TO FORCE OPEN THE ENTRANCE GATE PROBABLY TO STEAL A UNAMIR VEHICLE. THE BANDITS ESCAPED IN THE DIRECTION OF MERIDIEN HOTEL.

A. A SERIES OF ARMED INCIDENTS DETAILS OF WHICH ARE GIVEN BELOW, TOOK PLACE IN AND AROUND KIGALI IN WHICH UNAMIR, STAFF OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS AND THEIR EQUIPMENT WERE TARGETED.

B. 06 MAY 95

(1) SIX ARMED UNIFORMED MEN ATTEMPTED TO HIJACK A UN VEHICLE, BUT WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. IN ANOTHER SEPARATE INCIDENT, FIVE ARMED MED HIJACKED ANOTHER UN VEHICLE. NO INJURIES OCCURRED.

(2) THE RESIDENCE OF A CARITAS NON GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION REPRESENTATIVE WAS ROBBED BY THREE ARMED MEN WHO MADE THE RESIDENTS LIE ON THE FLOOR AT GUNPOINT WHILE THEY RANSACKED THE HOME AND MADE OFF WITH \$10,000 US IN PROPERTY AND MONEY - ONE OF THE MEN ATTEMPTED TO RAPE A EUROPEAN WOMAN AT THE RESIDENCE BEFORE LEAVING.

C. 07 MAY 95

(1) THERE WAS AN ATTEMPTED HIJACK OF A UN VEHICLE BY TEN UNIFORMED RPA SOLDIERS ON AN ACCESS ROAD TO A UN ACCOMMODATIONS COMPLEX. WHEN DESPATCHED TO THE SCENE, THREE UN MILITARY POLICE VEHICLES WERE DETAINED FOR REASONS UNKNOWN ALONG WITH THE ORIGINAL VEHICLE AND ANOTHER UN VEHICLE WHICH HAD HAPPENED UPON THE SCENE. THE ARRIVAL OF THE INDIAN BATTALION RAPID DEPLOYMENT FORCE AND A GENDARME OFFICER HELPED TO RESOLVE THE SITUATION AND ALL VEHICLES WERE RECOVERED.

(2) THE SAME EVENING, TWO UNAMIR MINIBUSES APPARENTLY STOLEN WERE DISCOVERED BY UN MILITARY POLICE ON PATROL NEAR A UN RESTAURANT. THE VEHICLES WERE RECOVERED BY THE UN MILITARY POLICE ALTHOUGH ONE OF THE MEN MANAGED TO ESCAPE, LEAVING BEHIND TWO WEAPONS.

(3) LATE IN THE EVENING OF MAY 7, THREE ARMED AND UNIFORMED MEN RAIDED THE HOUSE OF SOME BRITISH DIRECT AID WORKERS AND STOLE AN ELECTRICAL GENERATOR.

D. 8 MAY 95. AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AT A UN CIVILIAN'S RESIDENCE WAS THWARTED BY THE ARRIVAL OF UN MILITARY POLICE ON THE SCENE WHO HAD BEEN SUMMONED BY RADIO BY THE RESIDENT.

E. "THE DECLINE IN THE SECURITY SITUATION IN KIGALI CONTINUES", SAID BRIG-GEN HENRY ANYIDHOHO, UNAMIR DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER. "IT IS CLEAR THAT THE SITUATION IS GETTING WORSE AND WE ARE TAKING ALL PRECAUTIONS TO ENSURE THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF BOTH UN SOLDIERS AND CIVILIANS IN RWANDA. WE ARE ALSO INVESTIGATING THESE CASES THOROUGHLY TO DETERMINE WHO IS RESPONSIBLE AND BRING THEM TO JUSTICE".

F. UN MILITARY POLICE HAVE CONTACTED THE GENDARMES AND BOTH ARE CURRENTLY INVESTIGATING EACH OF THESE INCIDENTS.

2. ALTHOUGH PRESS RELEASE NOT YET RELEASED, IT APPEARS THAT CONTENTS MAY HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO THE PRESS AS SOME INTERNATIONAL NEWS AGENCIES HAVE BEEN ANNOUNCING ALONG SIMILAR LINES.

HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF REFUGEES:

A. AT 012035HRS IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED AN ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE IN WHICH AN ETHIOBATT SOLDIER SUSTAINED SERIOUS INJURIES.

B. IN KIGALI AUSMED REPORTED THAT AN ANTI-UNAMIR DEMONSTRATION INVOLVING ABOUT 200-400 LOCALS WAS HELD OUTSIDE THE AUSMED HQ. THE DEMONSTRATION WAS PEACEFUL WITH PARTICIPANTS WAVING PLACARDS AND CHANTING ANTI-UNAMIR SLOGANS. A VEHICLE CARRYING A LOUD HAILER WAS USED TO RALLY THE CROWD. THE DEMONSTRATION WAS WELL ORGANISED.

C. IN SECTOR 4B, SENBATT REPORTED UNUSUAL MOVEMENT OF A LOADED RPA TRUCK IN FRONT OF THE BATTALION HQ ON 01 MAY 95. SMELL OF PUTREFACTION WAS NOTICED WHEN THE TRUCK PASSED BY.

D. MILOBS IN SECTOR 3, REPORTED THAT THOUGH THERE HAVE BEEN NO OVERT ACTIVITY IN THE SECTOR FOR THE PAST FEW DAYS, THERE WERE CLEAR SIGNS OF TROUBLE AHEAD. EXHUMATION AND REBURIAL CEREMONIES CONTINUE. RUMOURS OF THE IMMINENT DEPARTURE OF UNAMIR ARE CIRCULATING FREELY.

E. IN SECTOR 4B, ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE WAS REPORTED BY CIVPOL OBSERVERS TO HAVE DIRECTED THAT ALL UNAMIR VEHICLES MUST PRODUCE A PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF BUTARE BEFORE THEY WOULD BE ALLOWED FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT IN THE AREA.

(1) RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(A) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT UNIFORMED MEN, BELIEVED TO BE RPA TPS, SEIZED A VEHICLE BELONGING TO CARE AUSTRALIA AT GUN POINT. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED NEAR THE PREFECT'S OFFICE IN BUTARE ON THE NIGHT OF 29/30 APR 95.

(B) IN SECTOR 1, NIBATT REPORTED THAT RPA INSISTED ON SEARCHING UN VEHS INCLUDING THEIR PERSONAL EFFECTS BEFORE PASSING THROUGH THEIR ROAD BLOCKS.

(C) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA HAD ESTABLISHED SEVERAL CHECK POINTS ON ROADS LEADING TO THE BUTARE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS. STUDENTS, STAFF AND VISITORS WERE SEARCHED BEFORE THEY WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER OR LEAVE THE CAMPUS.

(D) IN SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT REPORTED THE ABDUCTION OF A LOCAL MALE AND HIS FAMILY BY RPA AFTER BEING ASSAULTED AND ROBBED OF 400,000 FRANCE. THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE ENTIRE FAMILY STILL NOT KNOWN.

(E) THE COMD 301 RPA BDE, GITARAMA, HAS BEEN APPOINTED COMD BUTARE BDE WHILE THE RUHENGIRI BN COMD IS TO TAKE OVER COMD OF THE GITARAMA BDE. THE POSTINGS ARE PROBABLY DUE TO THE RECENT MASSACRES IN KIBEHO.

(F) IN SECTOR 1, NIBATT REPORTED THAT AT NGARAMA GR 2629, RPA MOUNTED A ROAD BLOCK TO PREVENT LOCAL BROWN AND ROOT EMPLOYEES FROM GAINING ACCESS TO THE PL LOC AFTER THE PL COMD REFUSED TO HAND THEM OVER FOR QUESTIONING BY THE RPA. THE MATTER WAS RESOLVED AFTER THE ACTING FC INTERVENED.

(G) SECTOR 5 MILOBS REPORTED FREQUENT FIRE FIGHTS AND ARRESTS OF ARMED PERSONS IN THE AREA BOUNDED BY EASTING 40-71 AND NORTHING 27-41 WHICH INCLUDES THE VOLCANIC NATIONAL PARK AND STRETCHES UP TO KIDAHO GR 7247. RPA SUSPECTS A BUILD UP OF FRGF TROOPS FROM THE ZAIRIAN SIDE OF THE BORDER AND HAS INTENSIFIED ITS PATROLS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE PREFECTURE.

(2) FRGF/MILITIA. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 01/02 MAY 95, AT NSHILI COMMUNE IN MASUNZU SECTOR, BANDITS KILLED 2 LOCALS INCLUDING A CHILD AND SERIOUSLY WOUNDED 2 OTHERS.

(A) THE ACTING FC PAID A VISIT TO NIBATT ON 02 MAY 95. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH AN EVALUATION TEAM FROM NEW YORK ON ISSUE OF REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. HE ALSO VISITED KIBEHO IDP CAMP TO ASSESS THE SITUATION AND TO PERSUADE THE IDPs LEFT IN THE CAMP TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(B) ON 3 MAY 95 A MEETING WAS HELD AT TAC HQ WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF INTERIOR, REP OF UNREO AND NGOS. THE MINISTER PROMISED REPS OF ICRC AND HUMAN RIGHTS THAT THEY WOULD BE ALLOWED FREE ACCESS TO ALL PLACES WITHIN THE COMMUNES INCLUDING THE PRISONS. HE FURTHER SAID THAT OTHER NGO STAFF ALSO WOULD NOT BE SUBJECTED TO HARASSMENT BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

(C) THE FMO AND THE FORCE HEALTH OFFICER PAID A VISIT TO THE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL AT BUTARE ON 3 MAY 95. THEY MET WITH THE DIRECTOR AND ICRC MEDICAL STAFF WORKING AT THE HOSPITAL. THEY ALSO VISITED THE MSF HOSPITAL, CARE AUSTRALIA AND FEED THE CHILDREN ORPHANAGES.

(A) THE CO AND MILOB SECTOR COMD MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA TO DISCUSS THE WELFARE OF IDPs.

THE SRSG ASSURED THE PRESIDENT THAT ALL ASSISTANCE WOULD BE GIVEN BY UNAMIR TO ESTABLISH THE

TRUTH OF HOW IDPS WERE KILLED. THE PRESIDENT ALSO TRIED TO PERSUADE THE IDPS HOLED UP IN THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX TO GO HOME.

II. IN SECTOR 4B, IN HUYE COMMUNE GR 6711 MILOBS SAW POSTERS IN KINYARWANDA WHICH TRANSLATED THAT THE BURGEMESTRE WAS CALLING A MEETING IN WHICH THE FOLLOWING WERE TO BE DISCUSSED: RENEWAL OF POPULATION REGISTER; GOVT OBJECTIVES; ORGANIZATION OF RECEPTION OF IDP RETURNEES; DISTRIBUTION OF AID BY UNAMIR AND NGOS.

III. THE MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE MADE INDIRECT DEROGATORY REMARKS AGAINST UNAMIR AT A REBURIAL CEREMONY OF EXHUMED CORPSES IN MUYIRA COMMUNE GR 8639 IN SECTOR 4B (BUTARE). HE CASTIGATED THE 'FOREIGNERS' FOR MEDDLING IN THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF RWANDA AND CONDEMNED WHAT HE CLAIMED 'THE DISCRIMINATORY MANNER IN WHICH AID WAS DISTRIBUTED'.

(B) BORDERS. ALL THE BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST WHICH WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(D) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA.

I. CONDUCTED PTL IN AOR.

II. MILOBS ESCORTED IDPS TO THEIR VARIOUS HOME COMMUNES WITHIN THE BYUMBA PREFECTURE. IT WAS REPORTED THAT IN MOST COMMUNES THE IDPS WERE WARMLY RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND INHABITANTS.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

II. MILOBS INVESTIGATED THE ALLEGED MASS ARRESTS AND KILLINGS OF LOCALS SUSPECTED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE, BY RPA TROOPS IN MURWA GR 4449 AND MBUYE GR 4749 COMMUNES. THE REPORTS WERE CONFIRMED BY LOCALS AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

I. MILOBS CONTINUED TO ARRANGE FOR FOOD AID FOR NEWLY ARRIVED IDPS.

II. SECTOR CMD AND MILOBS ATTENDED REBURIAL CEREMONIES OF EXHUMED CORPSES IN TABA AND RUTSIRO COMMUNES.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

II. PATROL TO KIBEHO CAMP REPORTED THAT ON 30 APR 95 AT ABOUT 1715 HRS 6 GROUPS OF RPA, EACH NUMBERING BETWEEN 8 - 18, WERE OBSERVED DIGGING UP SIX LARGE GRAVES AND REBURYING BODIES FROM DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. THE SOLDIERS CARRIED THE BODIES IN BLANKETS. THE TEAM WAS NOT ALLOWED ACCESS TO THE SITE THEY WERE DIGGING.

III. PATROLS TO MURAMBI GR 3538 REPORTED THAT THE STRENGTH OF IDPS AT MURAMBI CAMP HAS INCREASED TO 3000 AS MORE DISPLACED TUTSIS FROM BUTARE ARE COMING TO THE CAMP.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES.

II. LOCALS INTERVIEWED BY MILOB PATROLS SHOWED ANXIETY ABOUT THEIR SECURITY DUE TO RAMPANT ARRESTS BY THE RPA.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU

I. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

II. MILOBS REPORTED THAT 20 BANDITS LED BY BRIG KABERA OPERATING IN ISHARA AND KANOGO AREAS MAY HAVE BEEN KILLED DURING THE SHOOTOUT WITH THE RPA ON 29 APR 95.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES.

II. IN GISENYI, RWERERE AND MUTOVU AREAS, THE BOURGEMESTRES REPORTED THAT THERE WERE FREQUENT CASES OF BANDITRY BY ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM WHO HAVE INFILTRATED FROM ZAIRE. THE INFILTRATORS HAVE NOW MINGLED WITH THE LOCAL

POPULATION AND ARE CONDUCTING ROBBERIES IN A REGULAR MANNER.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. MILOBS PATROLS TO NDERA CAMP REPORTED THAT THERE WERE 358 IDPs AT NDERA TRANSIT CAMP. THE PATROL FURTHER REPORTED THAT LOCALS CONTINUE TO BE HOSTILE TOWARDS UNAMIR.

(12) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(B) COMPLETED CONSTRUCTION OF BASE FOR ANTENNA AT TAC HQ BUTARE.

(C) COMPLETED REPAIR OF BRIDGE NEAR NYAMATA.

(D) TRANSPORTED 86 IDPs FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE.

(13) AUSMED

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 371 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 68 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 17 IN - PATIENTS.

(14) AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 129 FLIGHTS ARR AND DEP KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY

(A) ON 06 MAY 95, A TOYOTA LAND CRUISER WAS STOLEN BY 5 ARMED MEN AT GUN POINT ON THE ROAD LEADING TO BELGIUM VILLAGE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(B) ON 06 MAY 95, 6 ARMED RPA SOLDIERS ATTEMPTED TO HIJACK A UNAMIR OFFR NEAR THE FC'S RESIDENCE. THE OFFR MANAGED TO ESCAPE. ON THE SAME DAY, SUSPECTED RPA SOLDIERS CARRIED OUT AN ARMED ROBBERY IN THE HOUSE OF AN EMPLOYEE OF CARITAS INTERNATIONAL AND ASSAULTED THE OCCUPANTS OF THE HOUSE.

(C) ON 07 MAY 95, TWO UNAMIR WERE NEARLY HIJACKED BY RPA SOLDIERS AT GUNPOINT NEAR THE BELGIUM VILLAGE. THE TIMELY INTERVENTION OF THE RRF AND MP

PATROLS SAVED THE SITUATION. THE CULPRITS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND SENT TO REMERA GENDARMERIE STATION. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(D) ON 07 MAY 95, TWO UN VEHS WERE SPOTTED DRIVEN BY RPA SOLDIERS MOVING AT TOP SPEED. THEY WERE BLOCKED BY PATROLS AT HOTEL CHEZ LANDO JUNCTION AND THE OCCUPANTS OF THE VEHICLES WERE ARRESTED. THE SOLDIERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND HANDED OVER TO REMERA GENDARMERIE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(E) OP RALENTIR IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

(16) 95 FLSC CARRIED OUT NORMAL RESUPPLY RUNS AND TECH ASSISTANCE TO ALL SECTORS.

4. UNCIVPOL

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTORS.

B. IN BUTARE PREFECTURE, CIVPOL MONITORS REPORTED THAT 50 IDPs WERE ARRESTED WHEN THEY TRIED TO CROSS INTO BURUNDI. THE TEAM FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT 10 OTHER LOCALS WERE KILLED AT MUHORA IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE ON 24 APR 95. REASON FOR THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN.

C. CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE GOVT HAD ESTABLISHED A MILITARY TRIBUNAL TO TRY LOCALS INCLUDING RPA SOLDIERS INVOLVED IN CRIMINAL OFFENSES.

D. IN GISENYI PREFECTURE, CIVPOL MONITORS REPORTED THAT 7 ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM, ATTACKED THE MSF HEALTH CENTRE AT RUREMBO IN KARAGO COMMUNE ON 28 APR 95 AND STOLE AN UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY AND PERSONAL EFFECTS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

F. THE SRSG PAID A WORKING VISIT TO CIVPOL HQ ON 06 MAY 95. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE CIVPOL COMMISSIONER ABOUT UNAMIR CIVPOL ACTIVITY.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY EJECTED FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A.

B. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF TREATED HUNDREDS OF LOCALS DURING THE WEEK THROUGH RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY HEALTH CARE.

6. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 9 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

7. CONCLUSION .

A. THE SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED TENSE THOUGH UNDER CONTROL. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN KIGALI HAS DETERIORATED CONSIDERABLY TO DUE TO INCREASED ARMED ROBBERY AND HIJACKING OF UN VEHS BY UNIFORMED MEN SUSPECTED TO BE ELEMENTS OF THE RPA. THE ACTS APPEAR TO BE WELL ORGANISED AND PROBABLY AIMED AT HARASSING UN AND NGO PERS INTO LEAVING RWANDA.

B. THE EXHUMATION AND REBURIAL CEREMONIES CURRENTLY BEING CONDUCTED IN ALMOST ALL THE SECTORS AND THE INFLAMMATORY SPEECHES BY GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AT THESE FUNCTIONS ONLY SERVE THE PURPOSE OF ENCOURAGING FAMILIES OF GENOCIDE VICTIMS TO SEEK REVENGE .

(2) MILOB REPORTED THAT THE RPA CHECKPOINT AT THE RUSHAKI GR 0334 ON THE GATUNA-KIGALI ROAD, IN SECTOR 1, HAS BEEN REMOVED.

(3) IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA PRESENCE REMAINED VERY VISIBLE WITH MUCH PATROLLING BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE CITY OF BUTARE AND IN THE COMMUNES.

(4) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT A NEW CHECKPOINT WAS NOTICED BETWEEN BUTARO AND CYERU GR 8035.

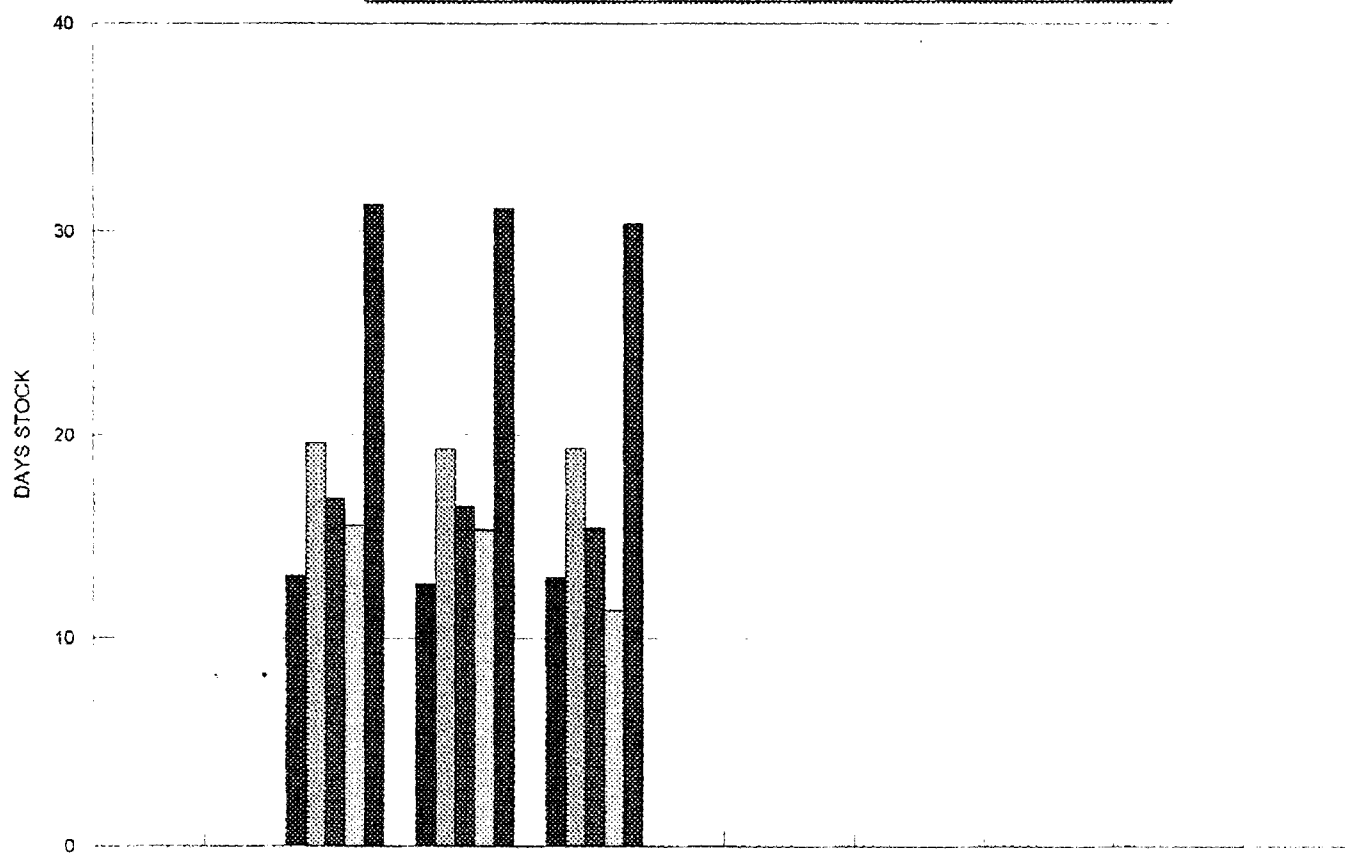

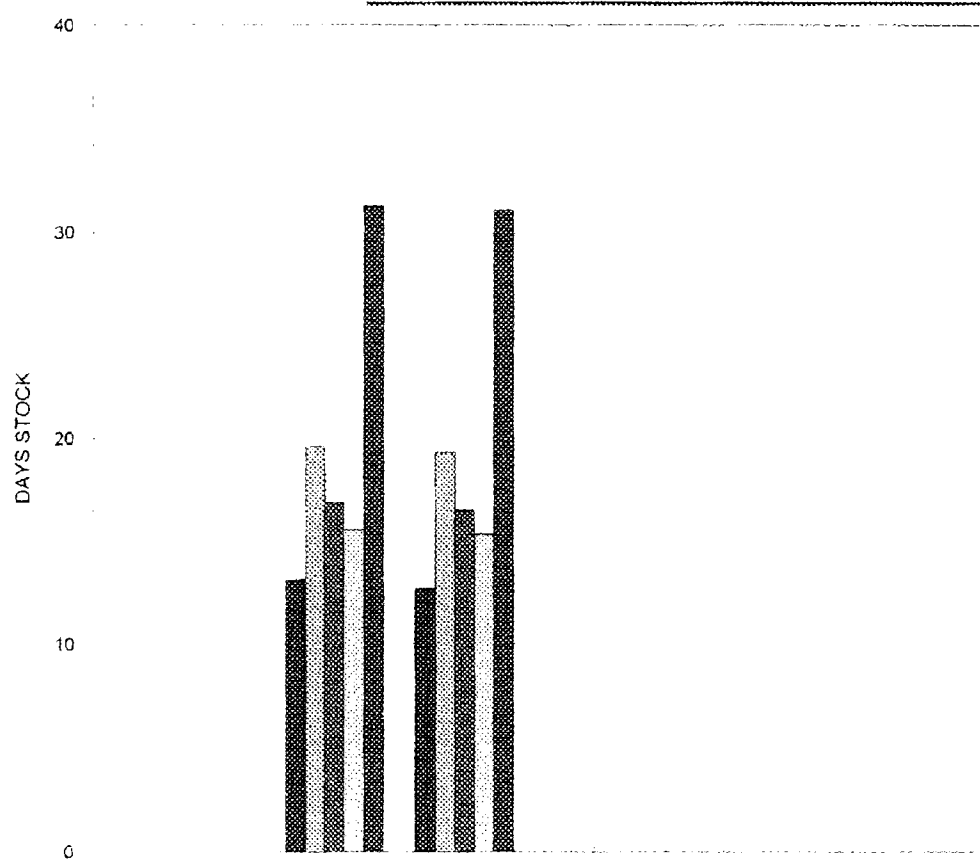

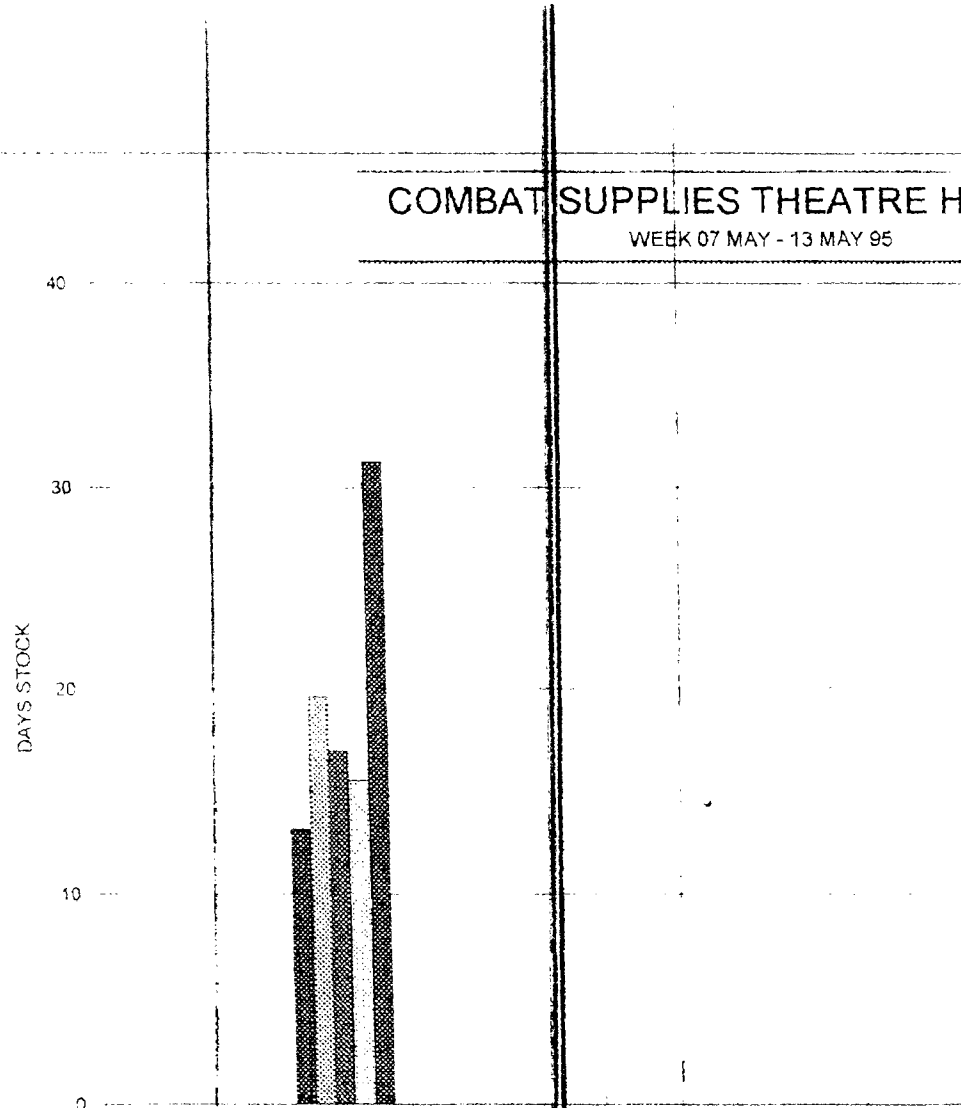

(4) 230 IDPS ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO, BUTARE AND RUHENGERI AND 122 EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, BUTARE AND RUHENGERI.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 10 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

K. MILOB GP. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINED CALM. MILOBS IN ALL SECTORS CONTINUED TO MONITOR OPERATIONS TO RETURN IDPS TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

THE MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE MADE INDIRECT DEROGATORY REMARKS AGAINST UNAMIR AT A CEREMONY TO REBURY EXHUMED CORPSES IN MUYIRA COMMUNE GR 8639 IN SECTOR 4B (BUTARE). HE CASTIGATED THE 'FOREIGNERS' FOR MEDDLING IN THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF RWANDA AND CONDEMNED WHAT HE CLAIMED AS 'THE DISCRIMINATORY FASHION IN WHICH AID WAS DISTRIBUTED'.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

III. CYANIKA BORDER POST.

IV. KANYARU-HAUTE AND KANYARU-BAS.

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) ALL BORDERS TO BURUNDI WERE REPORTED TO BE CLOSED TO ALL RWANDAN CITIZENS WISHING TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY.

(D) REMERA AND AKABUGA BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED FOR NORMAL TRAFFIC. LOCALS WERE ALLOWED TO CROSS THE REMERA BORDER POST WITHOUT TRAVELLING DOCUMENTS. THE POST IS MANNED BY RPA TPS.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI RECCE OVER NYAGATARE GR 3550, MURAMBI GR 4601, KIVUYE GR 9531, GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA. THE OBJECT OF THE PATROL WAS HOWEVER DEFEATED DUE LACK OF A CLEARANCE TO OVERFLY THE TANZANIAN BORDER ALONG THE AKAGERA RIVER.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS OF ALLEGED MASS ARRESTS AND KILLINGS BY RPA TROOPS IN THE MURWA GR 4449 AND MBUYE GR 4749 COMMUNES. LOCALS INTERVIEWED CONFIRMED THE ARRESTS. THOSE ARRESTED WERE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. AT MBUYE, A 14-YEAR OLD BOY INFORMED THE PATROL THAT THE RPA HAD KILLED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN A HOUSE IN THE AREA AND HAD ORDERED THE OTHER LOCALS TO CLEAR THE BODIES TO PREVENT DETECTION. HE WAS HOWEVER TOO SCARED TO TAKE THE TEAM TO THE SITE OF THE ALLEGED MURDERS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR COMD AND MILOB TEAM ATTENDED A REBURIAL CEREMONY OF 1500 EXHUMED CORPSES IN TABA COMMUNE. THE COMMUNE AUTHORITIES EXPRESSED THEIR SINCEREST APPRECIATION TO UNAMIR FOR THE ASSISTANCE GIVEN TO THEM IN THE PROVISION OF REBURIAL MATERIALS. RUTOBWE COMMUNE HAS ALSO BEEN PROVIDED MATERIALS FOR THE REBURIAL OF EXHUMED CORPSES.

(D) KIBUYE MILOBS WITNESSED THE REBURIAL OF 340 EXHUMED CORPSES IN RUTSIRO GR 3183. A BANDIT GROUP, CALLING ITSELF 'INGAMBA' WAS REPORTED TO BE HARASSING THE LOCALS AND STEALING THEIR LIVESTOCK. LOCALS ALLEGED THAT THE BANDITS HAVE SET UP CAMPS IN THE FOREST AREAS NORTH OF RUTSIRO.

(E) MILOB PATROLS TO RUBENGERA GR 3374 WERE INFORMED THAT AROUND THE END OF APR, SOME TUTSIS FROM GIHARA GR 3775 INVADDED A VILLAGE IN KASENZURI AND ARRESTED SOME LOCALS WHO ARE CURRENTLY IN KIBUYE AND RUBENGERA PRISON. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED IDP CAMPS IN KIBEHO, NDAGO, KAMANA AND MUNINI. THE PATROLS ALSO LIAISED WITH ZAMBATT TROOPS AND NGOS AT THE CAMPS. THE PATROL REPORTED THAT THE LARGE AMOUNT OF ROTTING REFUSE AND HUMAN WASTE AT THE KIBEHO CAMP WAS A POTENTIAL HEALTH HAZARD TO IDPs AND UN TPS

OPERATING THERE. 15 IDPS WERE CONVEYED FROM KIBEHO BY UNAMIR TRUCKS TO BUTARE. 3 OTHERS LEFT FOR GIKONGORO ON FOOT.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PTL TO THE NDORA COMMUNE PRISON GR 8112 WERE DENIED ACCESS BY RPA TROOPS. 60 PRISONERS ARE BELIEVED TO BE HELD IN THE FACILITY.

(C) MILOBS ATTENDED A CEREMONY IN THE MUYIRA COMMUNE WHERE SOME VICTIMS OF THE GENOCIDE WERE REBURIED. PRISONERS WERE USED TO EXHUME AND REBURY THE CORPSES. THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY ABOUT 1,500 PERSONS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) LOCALS SEEKING REFUGE AT THE MILOBS' RESIDENCE IN NYAMASHEKE HAVE NOW RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

(C) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN NYAMASHEKE, CYANGUGU AND ALONG THE ZAIRE AND BURUNDI BORDERS. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS NORMAL.

(D) SECTOR CMD AND MILOBS HOSTED A RECEPTION FOR ALL UN AGENCIES, THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU, REPS FROM THE RPA AND ETHIOBATT. THE RECEPTION WAS AIMED AT GETTING ALL CONCERNED TO INTERACT IN AN INFORMAL ATMOSPHERE. THE RPA LO ATTENDED THE FUNCTION ON BEHALF OF THE SECTOR RPA CMD.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SENT PTLs TO GISENYI, MUKARIMA GR 4521, AND KARAGO GR 4517. MILOB PTL COULD NOT GET TO KARAGO DUE TO A MUD SLIDE WHICH HAD BLOCKED THE ROAD. LOCAL EFFORT TO CLEAR THE ROAD UNDERWAY. THE BLOCKAGE IS CURRENTLY HOLDING UP SEVERAL OPERATIONS OF MILOBS AND NGOS IN THE SECTOR. FORCE ENGRS INFORMED.

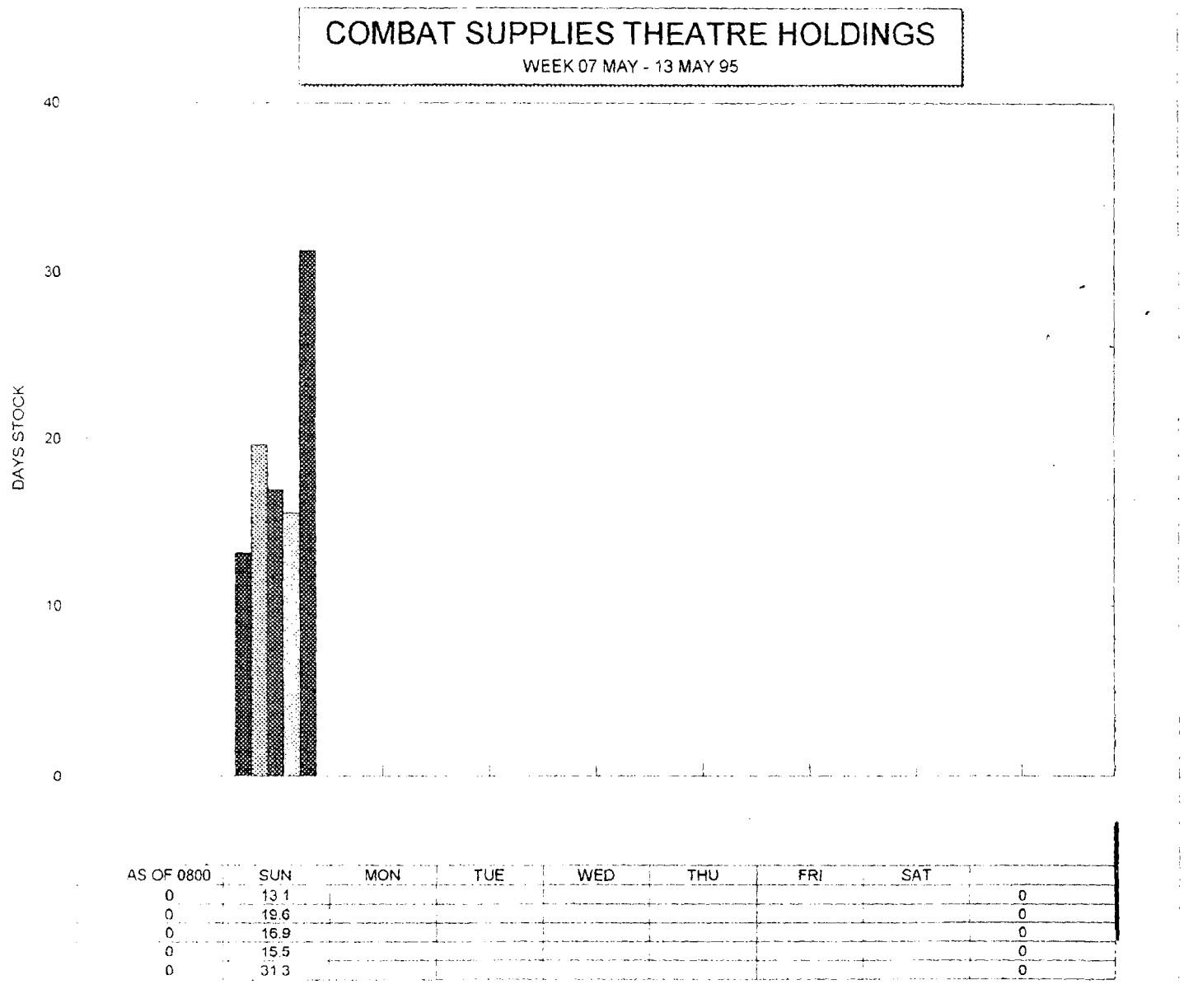

DAILY SITREP FOR 05 MAY 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. MILOBS IN SECTOR 3 REPORTED THAT THOUGH THERE HAS BEEN NO OVERT ACTIVITY IN THIS SECTOR DURING THE PAST FEW DAYS, THERE ARE CLEAR SIGNS OF TROUBLE AHEAD. THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE HAVE STOPPED ARRESTS FOR THE TIME BEING BUT MAKE NO SECRET OF THEIR INTENTION TO CARRY ON WITH ARRESTS AS SOON AS THEY THINK THEY CAN DO SO WITHOUT STARTING TROUBLE. EXHUMATION AND REBURIAL CEREMONIES CONTINUE TO FAN THE SPIRIT OF VENGEANCE AMONG THE POPULATION. RUMOURS OF THE DEPARTURE OF UNAMIR ARE BEING CIRCULATED FREELY. WITH THIS, THE SLIGHT IMPROVEMENT IN WORKING RELATIONS WITH BOTH THE RPA AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE IS DIFFICULT TO INTERPRET. PAST EXPERIENCE HAS RENDERED MILOBS WEARY OF GESTURES OF FRIENDSHIP FROM EITHER SIDE.

C. IN SECTOR 4B, ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE WAS REPORTED BY CIVPOL OBSERVERS TO HAVE DIRECTED THAT ALL UNAMIR VEHICLES MUST PRODUCE A PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF BUTARE BEFORE THEY WOULD BE ALLOWED FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT IN THE AREA. NEGOTIATION IN PROGRESS.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, MET WITH DR. LILLIAN WONG AND A DELEGATION FROM ODA TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, ISSUES RELATED TO THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO. HE THEN HELD SEVERAL INTERNAL MEETINGS IN PREPARATION FOR MONDAY'S OPENING SESSION OF THE COMMISSION.

B. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) ON THURSDAY, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, SAID THAT 400 IDPS LEFT KIBEHO CAMP ON THURSDAY FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES, SOME OF THEM ON FOOT. MR. SENDASHONGA POINTED OUT THAT EPIDEMICS OF TYPHOID AND DYSENTERY HAD ERUPTED IN THE CAMP. HE TOLD RADIO RWANDA THAT 49 TRUCKS, PROVIDED IN PART BY UNAMIR, WERE AVAILABLE AT KIBEHO FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF RETURNEES. HE ADDED THAT THE RED CROSS AND WFP WOULD PROVIDE FOOD SUPPLIES AND JERRY CANS TO THE RETURNING IDPS.

(2) THE MEMBERS OF THE RWANDESE PARLIAMENT ON THURSDAY INITIATED DISCUSSIONS ON THE DRAFTING OF A NEW RWANDESE CONSTITUTION BASED ON ELEMENTS OF THE 1992 RWANDESE CONSTITUTION, THE 1994 ARUSHA PEACE AGREEMENTS, THE AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE RPF AND RWANDESE POLITICAL PARTIES NOT INVOLVED IN THE GENOCIDE SIGNED ON 17 JULY 1994, AND THE AGREEMENTS REACHED BETWEEN THE POLITICAL PARTIES IN THE GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY SIGNED ON 24 NOVEMBER 1994.

(3) ON THURSDAY, THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU VISITED CYANGUGU PENITENTIARY TOGETHER WITH A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE RED CROSS AND MEMBERS OF CYANGUGU SECURITY COUNCIL. THEY LEARNED THAT 1,813 DETAINEES ARE CURRENTLY BEING HELD IN THE PRISON, WHICH HAS A MAXIMUM CAPACITY OF 500 PEOPLE. THE REPRESENTATIVES FOUND THIRTY-SIX CHILDREN, INCLUDING ONE BABY AND TWENTY-SIX DETAINEES SUFFERING FROM DYSENTERY. NINETY

PER CENT OF THE DETAINEES ARE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE, AND THE PRISON IS RECEIVING AN AVERAGE OF EIGHT NEW DETAINEES PER DAY.

(2) IN SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE ABDUCTED A LOCAL MALE AND HIS FAMILY, AFTER ASSAULTING HIM AND HIS FAMILY AND ROBBING 400,000 FRANCE. THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE ENTIRE FAMILY IS NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 2 MILOBS REPORTED OF A NEW RPA BN POST AT KIGARAMA GR 7844.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE CO AND MILOB SECTOR COMD MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA TO DISCUSS THE WELFARE OF IDPs.

(3) THERE WERE REPORTS OF MOVEMENTS OF PEOPLE IN AND OUT OF RWANDA THROUGH THE KAGITUMBA AND BUZIBA BORDERS. INFLOW 2,160 AND OUTFLOW 1,800. REPORTS ALSO INDICATED THAT 107 PEOPLE ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH BUZIBA BORDER.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 86 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 50 IDPs AT SAKE ORC WERE REGISTERED AND ESCORTED TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES BY GHANBATT TPS.

(3) FOUR REPS OF REFUGEES' POLICY GROUP (NGO) AND GHANBATT TPS TALKED TO IDPs AT SAKE ON RESETTLEMENT.

(4) A TOTAL OF 11 DPs FROM BURUNDI AND ZAIRE WHO WERE

RECEIVED BY OWN TPS AT SAKE ORC WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(5) GHANBATT DCO ON BEHALF OF OFFRS AND MEN PRESENTED TEN SCHOOL DESKS TO THE KIBUNGO PRIMARY SCHOOL. THE ITEMS WERE RECEIVED ON BEHALF OF THE SCHOOL BY THE SOUS PREFECT OF KIBUNGO AND THE INSP OF SCHOOLS FOR THE PREFECTURE.

(6) TWO GHANBATT LOCAL WORKERS EMPLOYED BY BROWN AND ROOT WERE HANDED OVER TO THE PROSECUTOR OF KIBUNGO IN THE PRESENCE OF HR, ICRC AND MILOBS. THEY WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR.

(2) PTL TO MURANGARA GR 2266 REPORTED THAT LOCAL MALES, ESPECIALLY HUTUS, IN THE COMMUNE WERE BEING ARRESTED AND JAILED BY THE RPA FOR NO APPARENT REASONS. THE PTL ALSO OBSERVED THAT THE PRIMARY SCHOOL IN THE AREA LACKED LEARNING MATERIALS.

(3) ASSISTED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD FOR CIVIL SERVANTS WITHIN THE GITESI COMMUNE.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED ONE LOCAL IN AOR.

E. SECTOR 3B (MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

F. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED TPS TO GUARD UNAMIR VEH NO 1120 DETAINED BY RPA IN GIKONGORO. THE MENTIONED WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT.

(3) UNICEF DELIVERED 50 BOXES OF BISCUITS FOR DISTRIBUTION TO IDPs LEAVING IN MSF BUILDING AT KIBEHO.

(4) A TOTAL OF 126 IDPs LEFT KIBEHO TODAY.

(5) LOCALS IN RURAMBA GR 4712 WERE REPORTED NOT TO BE SLEEPING IN THEIR HOUSES FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED BY RPA SOLDIERS. ZAMBATT PTLs INTENSIFIED IN THE MENTIONED AREA.

G. SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE A/FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SENBATT LOC.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 107 LOCALS IN AOR.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) DEPLOYED RRF AT 050320 HRS UPON INFORMATION OF BANDITRY ACTIVITY AT GOAL (NGO), OFFICE/RESIDENCE, NEAR KIGALI NIGHT CLUB. ON ARRIVAL, THE RRF WAS INFORMED THAT THE BANDITS HAD ROBBED TWO WATCHMEN OF MONEY, WATCH AND CLOTHING AT APPROX 050130 HRS. THE BANDITS COULD NOT ENTER THE HOUSE BECAUSE AN RPA PATROL WAS NEARBY. ONE BANDIT WAS REPORTED WOUNDED IN AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND THE BANDITS. THE BANDITS HOWEVER ESCAPED. THE RRF CONTINUED TO PROVIDE PROTECTION TO THE GOAL COMPOUND TILL 050445 HRS.

(3) PROVIDED THREE TCVs TO THE RWANDAN MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FOR TRANSPORTATION OF EDUCATION MATERIALS TO BUTARE. TCVs RETURNED ON COMPLETION OF TASK.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE MILOB SECTOR COMMANDER MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA TO DISCUSS MODALITIES OF MONITORING OF IDPS' WELFARE AND RESETTLEMENT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE SECTOR COMMANDER MET THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO AND DISCUSSED THE PROBLEM OF THE MUGESERA CHECKPOINT AND THE REFUSAL OF THE AUTHORITIES TO ALLOW PASSAGE OF MILOB TEAMS INTO THE NYAKIRAMBI RWINKWAVU TRANSIT CAMPS AND THE BUKOBA BORDER CHECKPOINT. THE PREFECT INSISTED THAT DETAILS ON FIGURES AT THE TRANSIT CAMPS AND THE BORDER CHECKPOINT SHOULD BE COLLECTED DAILY FROM THE PREFECTURE OFFICES. ON PATROLS BEYOND THE MUGESERA CHECK POINT, HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS MUST ALWAYS CONTACT THE BOURGEMESTRE FOR ACCESS BEYOND THE CHECK POINT. THIS HAS NOW PUT IMPEDIMENTS ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR. BORDER OFFICIALS AT THE RUSUMO BORDER, HAVE ALSO REFUSED TO GIVE DETAILS OF CROSSINGS AT THE BORDER. THEY ARE INSISTING THAT MILOBS BROUGHT A NOTE FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS FROM KIBUNGO AND RILIMA WERE AGAIN DENIED ACCESS BEYOND THE MUGESERA CHECKPOINT.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. HOWEVER, RPA HAVE MADE KNOWN THEIR INTENTION OF CARRYING OUT FURTHER ARRESTS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THERE HAD BEEN AN ORDER FOR CESSATION OF ARRESTS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE, PROBABLY DUE TO LACK OF SPACE IN THE PRISONS OF GITARAMA AND KIBUYE. GITARAMA PRISON NOW HOLDS OVER 7,000 INMATES AND THAT OF KIBUYE, WHICH WAS ORIGINALLY MEANT FOR 250 PEOPLE, IS NOW HOLDING 1,068. LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE INDIFFERENT TO THE SITUATION IN THE PRISONS.

(C) MILOBS IN KIBUYE REPORTED THAT THE RPA CONTINUED THEIR ARRESTS OF LOCALS IN THE AREA. LOCALS HOWEVER REFUSED TO GIVE DETAILS FOR FEAR OF REPRISAL FROM RPA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MURAMBI GR 3538 AND KIBEHO CAMPS. SITUATION IN MURAMBI WAS CALM. AT KIBEHO, MILOBS OBSERVED RPA TROOPS LEADING SOME TUTSI LOCALS TO RETRIEVE ITEMS FROM THE GARBAGE IN THE CAMP.

(C) MILOBS CARRIED OUT AN AERIAL RECCE ALONG RIVERS IN THE VICINITY OF KIBEHO IN AN EFFORT TO SEARCH FOR DEAD BODIES ALONG THE BANKS. NONE WERE OBSERVED, DUE TO BAD WEATHER.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS ESCORTED THE AFC/CMO ON HIS TOUR OF SENBATT.

(C) PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO RUNYIYNA GR 6012, KIBAYI GR 8490, RUSATIRA GR 6097, KANYARU BAS GR 6890, KANYARU HAUTE GR 6390 AND KIBEHO CAMP GR 5007. SIT WAS REPORTED CALM IN AREAS PATROLLED.

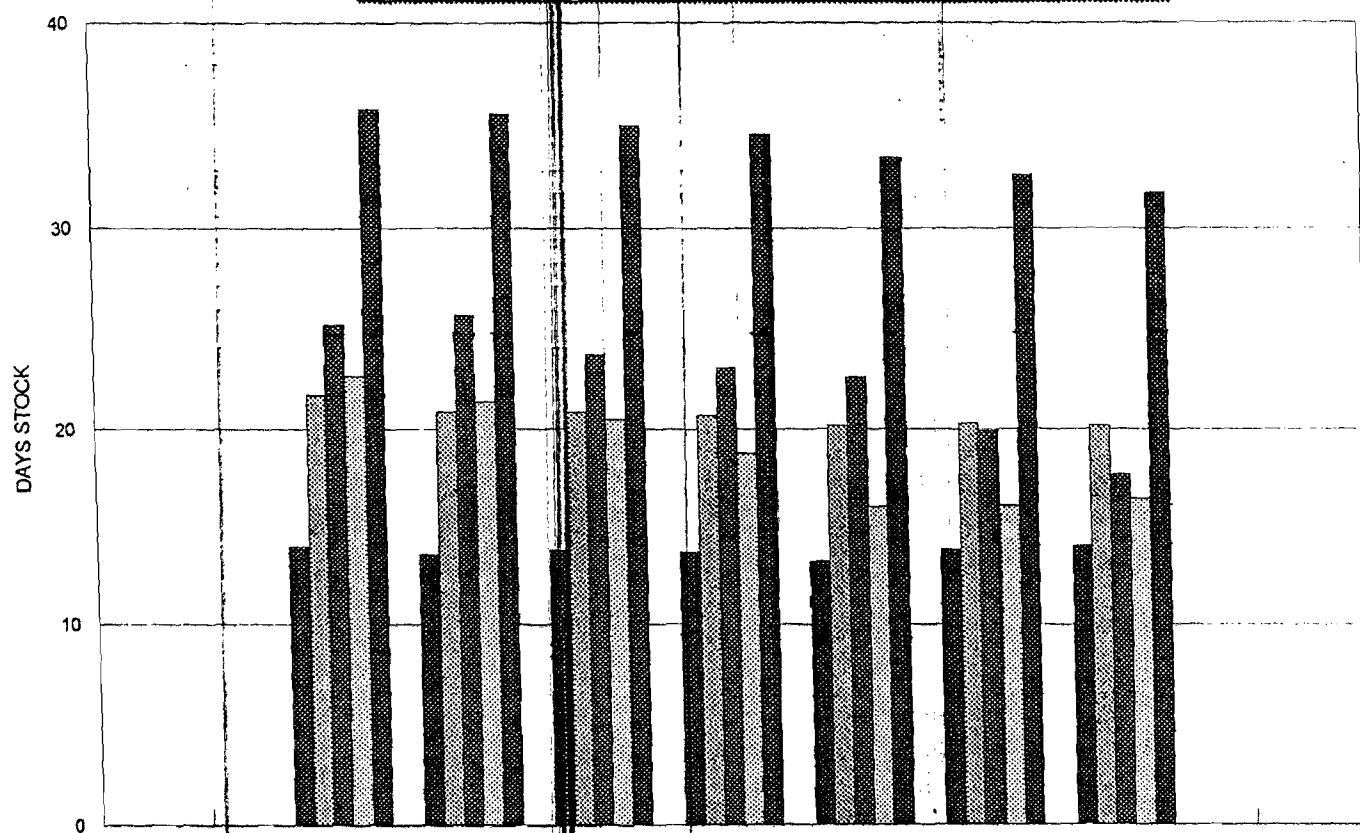
