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

1. OVERVIEW. THE SITUATION REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. NATIONAL HOLIDAY WAS OBSERVED YESTERDAY. RPA ACTIVITIES OF PATROLLING, ROAD BLOCKS AT AN INCREASED SCALE WAS REPORTED ALL OVER THE COUNTRY.

2. RPA.

A. SECTOR 1. REPORTS OF INCREASE IN ROAD BLOCKS. DEPLOYED PLATOON AT RUTARE (1808)

B. SECTOR 3. MILOBS RECEIVED SEVERAL REPORTS OF ARRESTS BY RPA. INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

C. SECTOR 4A. ONE RPA PLATOON WAS REPORTED BY MILOBS IN KARAMBO (4634).

D. SECTOR 4B. THE RPA IS PROVIDING SECURITY TO THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS AGAINST THE WILL OF THE UNIVERSITY AUTHORITIES AND STUDENTS. COMMENT. THIS SECURITY MAY BE TO MONITOR ANY POLITICAL/ANTI-GOVERNMENT ACTIVITY BY THE STUDENTS.

E. SECTOR 6. PATROL ACTIVITY BY MILOBS WAS RESTRICTED BY RPA. ONE PATROL WAS REFUSED ENTRY INTO THE PARLIAMENT PREMISES WHILE THE OTHER WAS DENIED INSPECTION OF A GREEN COLOURED TOYOTA (SUSPECTED TO BE A STOLEN UNAMIR VEHICLE).

3. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NTR.

4. REFUGEES/IDPs. NTR.

5. REGIONAL. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH BBC, A RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL STATED THAT FOOD AID VEHICLES EN-ROUTE TO ZAIRE WERE BEING HALTED AT THE BORDERS BECAUSE OF THE THREAT BY BANDITS TO THE VEHICLE CREWS. COMMENT. DURING THIS ANNIVERSARY PERIOD OF THE GENOCIDE, MEDIA INTEREST IN RWANDA HAS INCREASED, WITH A LARGE INTERNATIONAL MEDIA POPULATION PRESENT IN THE COUNTRY. CESSATION OF FOOD CONVOYS NOT ONLY DEPRIVES THE REFUGEE CAMPS OF SUPPORT (THEREBY INCREASING PRESSURE ON THEIR CLOSURE), BUT BRINGS WORLD ATTENTION TO THE ACTIVITIES OF FORMER GOVERNMENT FORCES AND THE THREAT THEY POSE TO RWANDAN STABILITY AND PEACE.

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) A LARGE NUMBER OF COMMUTERS, MAINLY TRADERS, CROSSED INTO AND OUT OF RWANDA THROUGH THE KAGITUMBA BORDER.
- (3) NIBATT MED STAFF TREATED 88 LOCALS IN AOR.
- (4) MILOBS REPORTED THAT CARITAS DISTRIBUTED WHEAT AND PEAS TO LOCALS AT CYUMBA COMMUNE.

B. SECTOR 2.

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) GHANBATT PTLs TO KANZENZE, GASHORA, NGENDA, BUGESERA, RUKIRA AND RUSUMO OBSERVED LOCALS BUSY ON THEIR FARMS. PTL TO GATI GR 4392 REPORTED THAT RPA DET THERE HAD NOW DEPLOYED TO RUKIRA GR 5601.
- (3) GHANBATT RECEIVED THE VISIT OF STAFF FROM FORCE ENGR COY AT GISHALI GR 4788 TO ASSESS FORM OF ENGR WORKS AT NSINDA PRISON.
- (4) A MILOB TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY HR TEAM, RPA LO AND THE BOURGEMESTRE INVESTIGATED THE INCIDENT INVOLVING THE ARREST OF FOUR LOCALS (HUTUS) IN WHICH ONE WAS REPORTED DEAD IN CUSTODY AT BWERANKA 708618. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE ARRESTED PERSONS WERE ACCUSED OF ALLEGEDLY SENDING MONEY TO FORMER GOVERNMENT FORCES IN ZAIRE. IT WAS HOWEVER ALLEGED THAT THE LOCAL WHO DIED WAS BEATEN TO DEATH WHILE IN RPA CUSTODY. THE BOURGEMESTRE HAS INTIMATED THAT HE WOULD INVESTIGATE THE CAUSE OF DEATH OF THE PRISONER.

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) FIRING WAS HEARD IN KIBUYE AT 1007 HRS. WHEN CONTACTED, THE RPA LO SAID THEY WERE TESTING AN AUTOMATIC MACHINE GUN.
- (3) MALAWICOY TROOPS PROVIDED TRANSPORT TO ADRA P. THE TRANSPORTATION OF TENTAGE MATERIALS TO MUGONEA GR 2161.

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(4) ENFANTE DU MONDE, AN NGO, REGISTERED A NUMBER OF ORPHANS AT KIBUYE GR 2772.

(5) A WOMAN FROM KEYEZI GR 542701 REPORTED TO MALAWICOY TROOPS THAT HER SON WAS SHOT DEAD BY UNKNOWN PERSONS WHEN HE WAS COMING FROM RUBENGERA GR 3374 AT ABOUT 091500 HRS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS. MILOBS AND HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(6) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 5 LOCALS IN AOR.

(7) MALICOY PTLS TO BIRAMBO GR 4663 REPORTED THAT THE AREA WAS CALM. HOWEVER A FEELING OF INSECURITY AMONG LOCALS PREVAILED IN THE AREA. THE RPA HAS NOW DEPLOYED PLATOONS AT MWENDO GR 4559, KIVUMU GR 5673 AND COY HQ WITH ANOTHER PL IN BIRAMBO. IT WAS ALSO OBSERVED THAT NO NGOS WERE OPERATING IN THESE AREAS.

(8) MALICOY PTLS TO GISHALI GR 8860 AND RUBONA GR 8659 OBSERVED THAT MOST OF THE LOCALS HAD NOT RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

(9) MALICOY AND MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 278 AND 5 LOCALS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AORs.

(10) SECTOR MILOBS CONTINUED TO RECEIVE SEVERAL REPORTS OF ARRESTS BY RPA.

(11) THE ENTIRE MILOB TEAM WAS INVOLVED IN MOV OF 120 PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA TO GISENYI PRISON. THE TRANSFER OF THE PRISONERS WENT SMOOTHLY.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MILOBS PATROLLED IDP CAMPS IN THE SECTOR AND THE SITUATION IN ALL THE PLACES REMAINED CALM AND NORMAL. ALL OFFICES WERE CLOSED AS A MARK OF RESPECT FOR THOSE WHO WERE KILLED IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE.

(3) ON 09 APR 95 AT ABOUT 2200 HRS A ZAMBATT SOLDIER OF RAPID DEPLOYMENT PLATOON AT TAC HQ GIKONGORO SLIPPED OUT OF CAMP ARMED WITH AN AK47 INTO THE NEIGHBOURHOOD TO VISIT A FEMALE FRIEND AT THE CRAFT SCHOOL NEAR THE CAMP. A QUARREL ENSUED RESULTING IN A FIGHT, WHEN HE WAS NOT ALLOWED INTO THE SCHOOL COMPOUND BY THE WATCHMAN. TWO OTHER WATCHMEN CAME TO THE AID OF THEIR COLLEAGUE AND THE SOLDIER SEEING THAT HE WAS ABOUT TO BE OVERPOWERED, FIRED HIS WEAPON IN THE AIR, EMPTYING A 30 ROUNDS MAGAZINE. ONE OF THE WATCHMEN WAS INJURED.

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BRUISES ON THE FACE AND SHOULDER. THE UN SOLDIER ALSO SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. UN CIVPOL AND MP INVESTIGATING.

(4) ZAMBATT MED STAFF TREATED 23 LOCALS IN AOR.

(1) THREE UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN ASSAULTED AN NGO AT HER RESIDENCE AT ABOUT 0830 HRS ON 10 APR 95 AT KUGATARE. THE ASSAILANTS STOLE MONEY AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS OF THE VICTIM. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS

(2) A LOCAL RWANDESE AGED 21 YRS WAS ARRESTED FOR STEALING SECURITY LIGHT AT 95 FLSG. HE IS YET TO BE

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HANDED OVER TO THE LOCAL PROSECUTOR.

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UNAMIR INFOSUM FOR 03 APR 95

1. OVERVIEW AN INCREASED RPA PRESENCE IS VISIBLE THROUGHOUT MANY AREAS OF THE COUNTRY. NO INCIDENTS OF FRGF/MILITIA REPORTED.

2. RPA

A. SECTOR 1; IN RUSHAKI, RPA HAS INCREASED ITS PRESENCE BY A COMPANY. THIS COMPANY IS FROM THE KIBUNGO TRAINING CAMP. THE DEPLOYMENT MAY WELL BE POSTING FOR GRADUATES.

B. SECTOR 3.

(1) GITARAMA; 3 APRIL. REPORTS OF 100 ROUNDS WERE FIRED BETWEEN HOURS OF 0525B AND 0545B NEAR GITARAMA PRISON. ONE CIVILIAN WAS KILLED AND THREE OTHERS INJURED. ACCORDING TO MEDIA, A UN HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WAS QUOTED AS SAYING "APPARENTLY THE PRISONERS RIOTED AND SHOTS WERE FIRED". THE HR TEAM APPARENTLY ARRIVED AFTER THE PRISON WAS CLOSED AND WILL HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL TODAY TO CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION. SEVEN PEOPLE PER DAY ARE REPORTEDLY DYING IN THIS PRISON.

(2) MUSHUBATI.

(A) RPA ISSUED INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BURGEMESTRE THAT ALL RESIDENTS WERE TO STAY INDOORS FOR 48 HOURS BEGINNING LAST LIGHT 6 APRIL BECAUSE OF MILITARY EXERCISES. FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS WERE ISSUED THAT NO ONE IS TO HESITATE TO OPEN DOORS, DAY OR NIGHT, WHEN SOMEONE KNOCKS.

(B) COMMENT: THESE INSTRUCTIONS AND THE NOTICES TO THE SAME EFFECT ARE POSTED AROUND THE GITARAMA AREA. THEY HAVE HAD THE EFFECT OF CREATING RUMOURS OF IMPENDING GENOCIDE. HOWEVER, THE ACTION, MAY WELL BE AN ATTEMPT AT MAINTAINING THE INTERNAL SECURITY SITUATION DURING THE ANNIVERSARY PERIOD. THE BRIGADE COMMANDER IS A KNOWN HARD CORPS AND HIS TRAINING ACTIVITIES ARE PROBABLY AN ATTEMPT TO DOMINATE THE AREA BY PATROLLING WHILE EFFECTING WHAT AMOUNTS TO A 48 HOUR CURFEW. IT IS LIKELY THAT MANY FAMILIES MAY WELL LEAVE THE REGION DURING THAT PERIOD.

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C. SECTOR 4C.

(1) NGOMA (9637).

(A) 2 APR 1900B, A MAN CAME FROM IJWE ISLAND TO COLLECT HIS WIFE AND CHILDREN. RPA REPORTEDLY ARRESTED HIM AND USED A MACHETE TO ASSIST IN INTERROGATION. MAN IS IN HOSPITAL NYAMASHEKE.

(B) COMMENT: NYAMASHEKE IS A TROUBLE SPOT. IT IS A HUTU DOMINATED AREA WHERE AN RPA LIEUTENANT WAS MURDERED AND THE SERGEANT WHO TOOK OVER IN THE AREA IS APPARENTLY QUITE HARD-LINE.

(2) GISHOMA. THERE IS SOME CONFUSION WITH YESTERDAY'S REPORTING OF THE DEATH OF THE VICE BURGEMESTRE OF GISHOMA COMMUNE. MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON SUNDAY 02 APR AT 1930, THE EX-CONSEILLER OF NTENYI, WHO WAS ACTING AS BURGEMESTRE OF GISHOMA WAS SHOT AT HIS RESIDENCE BY ARMED PERSONNEL IN UNIFORM AFTER HE HAD COME BACK FROM AN RPA WEDDING CEREMONY. IT APPEARS THAT THE MAN AND WOMAN KILLED ON 31 MAR 95 WERE NOT THE ACTING BURGEMESTRE AND HIS WIFE, BUT HIS DAUGHTER AND SON IN LAW. THE ACTING BURGEMESTRE IS A MODERATE HUTU AND MILOBS BELIEVE THE FAMILY WAS TARGETED, POSSIBLY BY LOCAL RPA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) NYAKABUYE (9116).

(A) 2 APRIL 1920B, A 33 YEAR OLD FORMER HUTU EMPLOYEE OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT BEFORE THE WAR, CURRENTLY EMPLOYED BY MDM, WAS SHOT BY GENDARMERIE. ACCORDING TO REPORTS THE MAN WAS STOPPED IN THE MARKET, QUESTIONED THEN ASKED TO ACCOMPANY THE GENDARMERIE TO THEIR STATION. ALLEGEDLY HE WALKED WITH THEM A FEW METERS, THEN BEGAN TO RUN. HE WAS THEN SHOT.

(B) COMMENT: THERE IS TENSION AND IT IS REASONABLE TO EXPECT SUSPICION AND FEAR IN THE RPA/GENDARMERIE.

D. SECTOR 5.

(1) RPA BDE COMD, 211 INF BDE HAS ASKED THAT TUNBATT VACATE GISENYI NAVAL BASE AND THEIR LOCATION

UN RESTRICTED

IN BUSOGO (4927) AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE IN ORDER THAT THEY MAY MOVE IN THEIR MARINE COMPONENT AND RAPID REACTION FORCES RESPECTIVELY. COMMENT: ALTHOUGH THE RPA HAVE ASKED THAT THIS OCCUR WITHIN THREE DAYS, THIS APPEARS TO BE A BONA FIDE MILITARY REQUIREMENT AND NOT AN EXERCISE IN HARASSMENT. THE SHORT TIME FRAME MAY BE AN ATTEMPT TO HAVE TROOPS IN PLACE BEFORE THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE GENOCIDE.

(2) CO OF 59 RPA BATTALION ADDRESSED A RALLY OF APPROXIMATELY 7,000 PEOPLE AT THE RUHENGIRI STADIUM. THE AIM WAS TO DISPEL RUMOURS OF A RE-EMERGENCE OF GENOCIDE. HE ASSURED THEM OF MAXIMUM PROTECTION. COMMENT: THIS SORT OF THING IS HAPPENING ACROSS THE COUNTRY AS LOCAL COMMANDERS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TRY TO NEUTRALIZE RUMOURS WHICH ARE HAVING A DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE INTERNAL SECURITY SITUATION.

3. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NTR.

4. REFUGEES

A. RWAMIKO CAMP. THERE HAS BEEN A LARGE MOVEMENT OUT OF RWAMIKO CAMP OVER THE LAST FEW DAYS, LEAVING IT ALMOST EMPTY. MOST OF THE INHABITANTS APPEARED TO BE HEADING SOUTH TOWARDS KIBEHO CAMP.

B. COMMENT. TENSIONS CONTINUE AND RUMOURS ARE RAMPANT. SECTORS 3 AND 4C WILL PROBABLY SEE THE GREATEST TENSION AND INTERNAL SECURITY MEASURES. A LOT OF TROOPS AND A LOT OF RUMOURS WILL MAKE THE PERIOD TENSE. MANY RPA ACTIONS, MAY BE MOTIVATED BY FEAR. IT RECOMMENDED THAT CARE EXERCISED WHEN DEALING WITH THEM ON THE GROUND, THE RUMOURS AFFECT THEM, TOO.

5. REGIONAL

A. BURUNDI. REPORTS FROM REUTERS INDICATE THAT 400 HUTUS HAVE BEEN KILLED IN A GENOCIDE IN BURUNDI. THERE IS HOWEVER NO COLLATERAL TO SHOW THAT 400 FIGURE TO BE CORRECT AND THE REPORTS THAT ONE YEAR OLD BABIES BEING BAYONETTED IN THE GENITALS SMACKS OF THE CROATIA EXPERIENCE. WHAT SEEMS PLAUSIBLE IS THAT LAST WEEK THE REGION OF GASORWE WAS ATTACKED. 10 WOUNDED WERE BROUGHT TO NEARBY HOSPITAL. TUTSI RESIDENTS CLAIM THE ARMY HAD GONE INTO GASORWE AREA IN PURSUIT OF HUTU GUNMEN WHO HAD ATTACKED A MILITARY VEHICLE LAST WEEK. IT IS ALSO PLAUSIBLE THAT AS THE MILITARY APPROACHED, MANY RESIDENTS FLED TO THE BORDER. STORIES OF MASSACRES AND ATROCITIES LIKELY GREW. THERE IS NO CONFIRMATION WHETHER SUCH A

UN RESTRICTED

MASSACRE HAPPENED OR THE ATROCITIES AND IF THEY DID WHO DID IT.

B. TANZANIA: THE KAGERA REGIONAL COMMISSIONER PHILIP MANGULA ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY THAT REFUGEE CENTRES ON THE BURUNDIAN BORDER WOULD BE CLOSED. THIS INCLUDES THE KABANGA CENTRE WHICH HAD EARLIER THIS WEEK RECEIVED THOUSANDS OF RWANDAN AND BURUNDIAN HUTU REFUGEES. THE BORDER STILL REMAINS CLOSED TO REFUGEE INFLOW. THERE ARE A REPORTED 700,000 REFUGEES ALREADY IN TANZANIA. TANZANIAN GOVERNMENT CITED DETERIORATION IN THE SECURITY SITUATION, ECONOMY AND ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION AS SOME OF THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE REFUGEE PROBLEM.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) NIBATT ROTATION EX IN PROGRESS WITH FIRST BATCH HAVING DEPARTED KIA FOR NIGERIA BY 030625B APR 95. NIBATT TWO ADVANCE PARTY COMPRISING 85 OFFRS AND MEN ARRIVED KIA BY 032230B APR 95. 45 OUT OF THE TOTAL ARRIVALS WERE WITHOUT INTERNATIONAL PASSPORTS AND HAVE BEEN REPATRIATED BACK TO NIGERIA.

(3) NIBATT MED STAFF TREATED 70 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

(4) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT GOAL (NGO) HAS COMPLETED A NEW HEALTH CENTRE AT MULINDI WHICH WILL OPERATE FROM MAY 95. UNICEF HAS DONATED 140 PLASTIC SHEETS TO BE USED AS TEMPORARY ROOFS FOR THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS AT KIYOMBE COMMUNE.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) RPA TROOPS ARRESTED AND DETAINED TWO GHANBATT SOLDIERS AT RUHUNDA GR 4691 FOR NOT HAVING ANY IDENTITY DOCUMENTATION ON THEM. THEY WERE LATER RELEASED WHEN THEIR IDENTITY WAS ASCERTAINED BY OTHER RPA SOLDIERS AS UNAMIR SOLDIERS FROM GHANA.

(3) MILOBS WENT TO INVESTIGATE THE CIRCUMSTANCES THAT LED TO THE ARREST OF TWO GHANBATT SOLDIERS. THE TEAM FOUND OUT THAT THE SOLDIERS HAD GONE OUT TO WASH THEIR CLOTHES AND THEN BUY SOME ITEMS FROM THE NEIGHBOURING MARKET WHEN TWO RPA SOLDIERS ASKED THEM TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES. THE RPA SOLDIERS TOOK THEM

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TO THEIR BARRACKS FOR IDENTIFICATION AND THEIR OFFICERS FINALLY RELEASED THEM AFTER IDENTIFYING THEM.

D. SECTOR 3 (KIBUYE AND GITARAMA)

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) MALAWICOY PTL TO MALA GR 2068 REPORTED THAT THE RPA COMD IN THE AREA CONFIRMED THAT RETURNEES WERE NOT ALLOWED TO USE ANY TRANSPORT ACROSS THE LAKE BUT SHOULD GO THROUGH CYANGUGU. ANOTHER PTL TO BIRAMBO GR 4663 REPORTED THAT THE GEN SY SITUATION IS TENSE AND PRISONERS ARE BEING MISTREATED IN PRISONS.
- (3) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 45 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE AND TRANSPORTED ONE LOCAL TO KIBUYE HOSP.
- (4) MALICCOY PROVIDED TPT TO THE PREFECTURE OF GITARAMA AND LWF TO TRANSPORT SEED POTATOES FROM GISENYI AND RELIEF EQUIPMENT WITHIN TAMBWE COMMUNE.
- (5) MILOBS RECEIVED SEVERAL REPORTS OF MASS ARRESTS BY RPA. THE SPATE OF ARREST IN THIS SECTOR IS BECOMING ALARMING SINCE MOST REPORTS HAVE BEEN CONFIRMED BY MILOBS AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS.
- (6) MILOBS PATROLS TO TAMBWE GR 7653 AND NTONGWE GR 9057 COMMUNES REPORTED OF MANY RUMOURS PERTAINING TO UP COMING ANNIVERSARY EVENTS. IN NTONGWE, THE TEAM NOTED AN INCREASE IN RPA STR TO COY LEVEL.
- (7) ANOTHER MILOB TEAM TO MUSHUBATI GR 7070 COMMUNE OBSERVED A NUMBER OF PERSONS AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE WITH COMPLAINTS ABOUT LOOTING OF THEIR HOMES. THE TEAM ALSO NOTICED THAT THE RPA CHECK POINTS ALONG THE MAIN ROAD TO KIBUYE HAVE BEEN REINFORCED AND ARE MUCH MORE RIGOROUS IN THEIR INSPECTIONS THAN BEFORE.
- (8) A MILOB PTL TO THE MURAMBA GR 2056 AND NYAKIBINGO GR 2656 SECTORS OF GISOVU COMMUNE WERE INFORMED ABOUT LARGE SCALE ARRESTS BY RPA. AROUND 50 FAMILIES HAVE LEFT FOR DP CAMPS SOUTH OF GIKONGORO AREA. THE LOCALS WERE HESITANT TALKING TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL BECAUSE THEY FEARED THEY WOULD BE ARRESTED BY THE RPA.



DISCUSSION WITH FOD (DPKO) DEPUTY DIRECTOR

1. The DCMO after welcoming the Deputy Director, FOD, Mr Medilli and his team, highlighted a few issues which needed for the smooth operation of MILOBS. These were as follows:

- a. Inadequate vehicles for the performance of duties.

- d. The hiring of local guards to provide security at MILOB Sector HQ/Sub-sector HQ (where forms troops are not available)
- e. The issue of MILOBS being repatriated without replacements.

2. SMPO MILOB HQ presented to the team, the administrative and welfare issues that were lowering the morale of MILOBS. The SMPO highlighted on the following:

- a. Loss of Personal Effects. The claims by MILOBS, who lost their personal effects during the war, had been

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forwarded. He requested that these claims should be processed on time since most of these MILOBs would be ending their tour of duty soon.

b. Reduced Baggage Allowance. SMPO said that the revised baggage allowance policy allow MILOBs to report in the mission area with 100kg accompanied baggage. However on repatriation one is allowed 100kg unaccompanied baggage (excluding airline baggage allowance). The problems encountered by the policy include cumbersome customs procedure, delays in receiving military kit for use on arrival at home and possible losses of accountable military equipment. The SMPO requested for a review of the policy and suggested two options.

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(2) To go with 50 kgs accompanied (excluding 20kgs provided by airline) or opt for 100 kgs unaccompanied.

It may be mentioned here that 98 MILOBs will be repatriated by Dec 94. A quick decision would be highly appreciated.

c. Leave. The SMPO requested that the policy on leave being earned should be reviewed so that MILOBs could take leave in advance. He recommended that the CMO

should be given authority to grant a minimum of 6 days leave advance to MILOBs.

d. Compensatory Time Off. SMPO said the new policy on CTO which states that, CTO could not be accumulated by MILOBs is reducing the operational efficiency of MILOBs. He therefore suggested that a maximum of 12 days be accumulated and this could be carried forward from one month to the other to allow for flexibility in the planning of CTO for MILOBs to ensure efficiency.

e. MSA. The SMPO then talked about the thorny issue of deductions in MILOBs MSA. He said the Finance Section was deducting \$27 per diem across the board from MILOBs MSA for having stayed in UN hired accommodation. He stressed that not all MILOBs lived in UN hired accommodation during the period 21 Sept - 31 Oct 94 and so it would be unfair to treat all like that. He also requested that MILOB HQ be notified in advance of any deductions and justifications before deductions are effected.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOD/CAO RESPONSE

3. Provision of Operational Equipment. Mr Medilli praised MILOBs for the good job they did and are still doing to bring stability in Rwanda. He said everything was being done to equip UNAMIR with the required number of vehicles and this would materialize soon. On the inadequate communication equipment, he said he was not aware of the inadequacy and asked that this be submitted to UN HQ soonest.

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4. Forward Repair Teams He agreed with the suggestion on having Forward Repair Teams in all Sectors and asked that the CTO be instructed to open these as soon as feasible.

5. Security. On the hiring of local guards, he said the possibility of locating MILOB SECTOR HQs with the formed troops should be exploited. He asked that the issue be studied and a paper submitted on it.

6. Replacements for Repatriated MILOBs. He promised to take up the issue of MILOBs being repatriated and not being replaced with Maj Gen Baril at UN HQ.

7. Review of Baggage Policy. Mr Medilli agreed with the problems that returning MILOBs are likely to encounter with their unaccompanied baggage and promised to take up the issue. He said that he could give decision on 50kg additional accompanied baggage on the spot but he would study and see whether 100kg additional accompanied baggage could be given.

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12. Mr Medilli summarized by directing the CAO that before cuts in MSA or major administrative changes are made, these should be coordinated with the CMO.

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c. Leave. Decision would be given soon regarding the possibility of CMO granting leave advance up to 6 days.

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e. Mission of Area. Kenya accepted as part of the mission area.

f. Forward Repair Teams. The CTO to set up Forward Repair Teams in sectors as soon as possible.

4. CONCLUSION The DCMO thanked the DD (FOD) for attending the conference despite his busy schedule and urged all to keep up the good work done inspite of the logistics inadequacies.
