





2. (a) Minister of Social Affairs visited KIBUNGO today.  
(b) RPA Bde Cdr from MURAMBI visited KIBUNGO. RPA maintained strong presence especially in KIBUNGO throughout all ceremonies.
3. (a) Two teams patrolled areas RUSUMO 7448 and RUKIRA 6658. Most of the people went to NYARUBUYE for a church service.  
(b) Two teams patrolled the RWAMAGANA Sub Prefecture 4884 and the KIGERAMA 6170 and KABARONDO 6177 communes. The team reported the following activities:-
  - (i) A peaceful march was conducted from the office of the sous prefect GR 487846 to the junction to GISHALI 4658 and then to the RUTONDE 4884 commune office. Approx 5000 people participated.
  - (ii) A memorial service was held at a school park GR 488859 for both christians and muslims. Local authorities were present.
  - (iii) A burial ceremony was organised in a school at SOVU 478788 where 70 bodies were interned.
  - (iv) The sous prefect gave a speech during which he appealed to the locals not to point accusing fingers at anybody and to forget the past. He also appealed to UNAMIR to bring to justice those who perpetrated the genocide and are under their protection.
  - (v) The events passed off peacefully.
- (c) Sector Cdr and one milob team attended the ceremonies at KIBUNGO and BIRENGA 5959 commune office area. The events were largely attended and passed off peacefully.
- (d) Congregation of people also took place in NGENDA 0644 and GASHORA 2655 communes to commemorate the anniversary of the genocide.
- (e) Sub Sector Cdr RILIMA and three milobs carried out heli recce of the Sub Sector. They reported the situation to be calm.

(f) Five milobs and two Ghanbatt offrs carried out air recce of the KIBUNGO Sector. They reported very little movement of people. They noticed a group of about 20 people collected on the Tanzanian side opposite NYAMUGALI 9545. The situation on the Burundi border is calm.



bourgemestres of RUKARA, MUHAZI and RUTONDE stated that people

in the RWAMAGANA sub prefecture. The locals will participate in  
the burials. The bourgemestres stated their fears of people  
getting agitated after these burials. A number of meetings are

authorities and elders will preach reconciliation. Milobs also  
reported reduced crowds in the localities and markets. The  
bourgemestre of RUTONDE requested the presence of milobs in  
these ceremonies and also to speak on the occasion. The last  
request has been declined.

The bourgemestyr requested that some assistance be given by UNAMIR to orphans and widows on that day. The request has been conveyed to UNHCR. The programme for RUSUMO is to be held at NYARUBUYE from 1000 - 1630h. Three trailer trucks were observed at the RUSUMO border point carrying six vehicles for UNAMIR. They were stopped at that point as the custom officials demanded \$ 100 per truck and the drivers were not in a position to pay. The info was passed to your HQ on radio.  
  
(f) All our teams reported observing numerous meetings in all the communes patrolled today. The meetings are being held by the bourgemestres in different locations on a daily basis.  
  
(g) Force Signal Offr visited this location. Channel 15 has since been made operational.

#### DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, March 29, 1995 - The Ugandan Foreign Minister, Mr. Ruhakana Rukunda, on official visit in Rwanda, on Tuesday held talks with Rwandese Members of Parliament, and discussed ways of establishing cooperation between the Ugandan Parliament and the Rwandese Parliament.

- A security meeting was held on Tuesday in Butare to discuss the situation of security. In a report made by the bourgmestre of Ngoma commune, the parents of Butare express their concerns over their daughters who engage in prostitution because of the money they are offered by UNAMIR troops in Butare. The local population also complained about the illegal occupation of a jam-processing factory compound in Butare, known as CONFIGI, by UNAMIR troops.

The participants in the security meeting also confirmed that the National University of Rwanda would re-open on April 2, and that 1,500 in the 4,000 registered students would be accommodated on the University campus.

The participants realised that security had improved in Butare region despite continued acts of incursions by Interahamwe elements on the border with Burundi.

- The Prefect of Gikongoro, Mr. Felix Zigirinshuti on Tuesday visited Karama commune where 4 people were killed and another wounded by attackers suspected to have come from the camps for displaced people in the area.

- On Tuesday night, in Musambira commune, in Gitarama prefecture, 3 soldiers were attacked by unidentified bandits who threw stones on them, forcing the soldiers to open fire. No casualty was reported.

- At Karengera, in Rwamatamu commune, in Kibuye prefecture, two guns and 15 grenades were seized on Monday.

- Following widespread clashes between members of the Rwandese Adventist Church and its breakaway sect, a meeting between the opposing parties and security forces was held on Tuesday in Kigali, to find ways of addressing the problem. They found out that the problem was 20-year old and originated in disagreement on faith doctrines. The sect members ask for the provisional closure of Adventist church to chase from it Interahamwe elements. No agreement was found to the problem and the legalised church part asked the breakaway sect to found its own church and security forces warned that those responsible for further acts of insecurity on the pretext of faith would be punished.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR PERIOD 25 MAR 95 to 31 MAR 95

General Situation

1. The humanitarian situation within Rwanda is stable. Sectors report some deficiencies in food and medicine in certain communes visited and these reports are being forwarded to UNREO for investigation and action. Op RETOUR continues however the number of IDPs leaving the camps is greatly reduced. Lack of security and increased arrests remain the main reasons cited by IDPs for opting to remain in the camps. A meeting was held this week with the Prefect of GIKONGORO, the Ministry of Rehabilitation, the RPA Brigade Commander and representatives of UNREO to discuss means to improve the Op RETOUR strategy with renewed operations to start in about two weeks. Rumours concerning revenge killings and FRGF operations on the anniversary of the commencement of the civil war have also resulted in local citizens returning to camps for protection. The Minister of the Information and the Chief of Staff of the Gendarmerie visited Kibeho camp on 24 Mar in an attempt to encourage the IDPs to return home. Milobs reported that he was not well received by the IDP population. He was accused of being a stooge of the Government and disloyal to the Hutu. Op RETOUR will continue to send vehicles to the camps to transport those wishing to leave.

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. A representative of the cell attended the UNREO weekly general meeting with NGOs. The HAC representative passed on security issues of concern to the representatives particularly the information on the mines found by Milobs in communes in Sector 2.

3. HAC sent a two day patrol to monitor the IDP camps in the Sector 4A area. They liaised with UNREO representatives and ZAMBATT troops. Camps visited included NYAMIGINA, BUHORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO, KIBEHO, NDAGO, MUNINI, KAMANA. UNAMIR position at RUNYOMBYI was also visited to determine whether IDPs were moving to BURUNDI. A separate patrol report has been forwarded to concerned parties.

4. HAC received from UNREO a request from UNHCR for the "sustainment rations" available for humanitarian relief. UNHCR plans to use the rations to support the Ministry of Education.

representatives to determine if tasks can be conducted using resources in sector. If unable to assist with local resources HAC will request assistance from UNAMIR HQ through G4.

14. ICRC were observed distributing food in RWAMATUMU.

15. AUSMED visited orphanages in the area to improve conditions.

#### Sector 4A

16. ZAMBATT troops continued to provide security forces for Op RETOUR and humanitarian aid distribution within the IDP camps.

17. The deputy camp commander at KIBEHO camp reported to Milobs that 19,900 persons had entered the camp from GIKONGORO prefecture.

#### Sector 4B

18. Milobs patrolled KANYARU-HAUTE GR 6391, NABISINDU GR 7138. No significant humanitarian problems were reported.

#### Sector 4C

19. Sector is conducting a study of medical concerns in the sector. Report will be forwarded in the near future.

20. The Milobs held meetings with ETHIOBATT and various NGOs to discuss operations in view of the deteriorating security situation in the Sector.

#### Sector 5

21. No significant humanitarian concerns reported.

#### Sector 6

22. No significant humanitarian concerns reported.

#### OP RETOUR

23. Op RETOUR continued. 637 IDPs were transported during this reporting period. The total moved to date is 42,441.

#### HAC PLANNED ACTIVITIES

24. HAC operations will centre on support to UNREO and the IOC and liaison with UNREO to address humanitarian concerns expressed by sector representatives in the field.

25. Discussions continue between the FC, DCMO, COS and CHAO regarding the re-organization and location of the HAC.



(d) One team patrolled areas KIGERAMA 6170 and KABARONDO 6177. They reported that the communes are going to observe holidays on 5,6 and 7 Apr. They are organising a special prayer meeting to open the church at KABARONDO. A prayer meeting is also planned at the mass grave site in the same area.  
  
(e) One team patrolled areas BIRENGA 5959, SAKE 4354 and MUGESERA 4764. They reported the situation to be calm in the area.  
  
(f) One team patrolled areas RUTONDE 4884, KAYONZA 5784 and MUHAZI 4590. They reported the situation to be calm.  
  
(g) At about 1300h Ghanbatt reported that two of their soldiers were taken away by the RPA when they had gone out on foot from their location at GISHALI 4788. One team of milobs went to investigate. The team reported that the soldiers had gone out to wash their clothes and then buy some items from the neighbouring market when two RPA soldiers asked them to identify themselves. The RPA soldiers took them to their barracks for identification and their officers finally released them after recognising them.  
  
(h) Sect Cdr and Ops Offr had a meeting with the Prefect. The Prefect informed that the programme for the coming week is as follows:-
  - (i) 7 Apr. Exhumation and reburial of bodies at the

KIBUNGO mass grave.

(ii) 8 Apr. Cycling by the youth in KIBUNGO.

(iii) 10 - 14 Apr. Debate in all communes on the history of RWANDA, the genocide and reconciliation.

The prefect also stated that most of the rumours had now subsided and he did not think that the planned events would lead to violence and a general degeneration of law and order.

(j) Ghanbatt reported that one man was shot dead at RILIMA at 2130h on 02 Apr. Investigations by our teams revealed the following :-

(i) The victim NTEZILILUABA ALPHONSE was shot dead at close range about 3 km NORTH of RILIMA GR 227630. He had one bullet wound in the neck and two in the head.

(ii) Eye witnesses said that the victim was coming from KABUKUBA 2069 when a person dressed in a long coat requested him for a lift. The victim replied that his motorcycle was not in good order. There was a verbal exchange after which the man took out a weapon and shot him.


(iii) RPA comd and local auths were info. Milobs met Security offr at KANAZI 0963. He initially concluded that the crime was committed by the interhamwe. However, the wife of the victim suspects the RPA because she said that earlier in the day some RPA soldiers had asked the victim for his motorcucle and when he refused they assaulted him. Local auths and RPA said that they will conduct their own investigation.

4. Our team patrolling KABARONDO reported that one orphan NTIZIYARAMEGE, died in the orphanage at GASETSA 5671 after falling into an underground water tank a few days back. There are 19 orphans in the orphanage at the moment. There is a requirement of pump to fill the water tank in the orphanage.

He was shot at close range - 1 in the neck and 2 in the head. The people interviewed at the scene said that the victim was returning from KABBUBUKUBU when he was stopped by a person dressed in long cloth and requested for a lift. The victim explained that his bike was not in good order as such could not meet <sup>the</sup> request. There was verbal exchange after which the man in long cloth pulled out a hidden weapon and shot him. The local auth and PPA Comd were informed and went to see scene where they brought the body to the woman's house. Today, MLOB and Security Off at Sone Prefecture investigated of KANAZI 0963. The Sy Off concluded that investigation attack became the victim was closely linked with local auth of Relinga. The wife and friend of the victim said he was shot by RPA, because early in the day some RPA soldiers asked victim for his motor bike when victim refused he was assaulted. Later in the afternoon another RPA soldier tried to locate the victim. Local Auth and RPA send they will conduct their own investigation.

(3) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN SAKE ( GR 4354 ) AND MUGESERA ( GR 4764 ). MILOBS WERE DENIED PASSAGE BEYOND MUGESERA TO BICUMBI ( GR 3876 ) BY THE RPA. PATROLS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT ALL THE YOUNG MEN IN KABERANGWE VILLAGE ( GR 5270 ) HAD BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA. THEY WERE MOSTLY PICKED AT NIGHT AND THEY ARE ALLEGED TO DISAPPEAR THEREAFTER.



  - (iv) In MUGESERA, the team was stopped at a militia checkpoint. The team negotiated and passed through. The team questioned the militia man himself and came to know that the checkpoint had been set up by the bourgemestre to prevent people from fleeing the area.
  - (v) The team also confirmed that the bourgemestre had prohibited locals from giving any info to UNAMIR. The locals have been told that they must tell UNAMIR to get the required info from the bourgemestre. The team noticed

some locals running away when their car stopped to talk to them.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR PERIOD 18 MAR 95 to 24 MAR 95

General Situation

1. The humanitarian situation within Rwanda is stable. Sectors report some deficiencies in food and medicine in certain communes visited and these reports are being forwarded to UNREO for investigation and action. Op RETOUR continues however the number of IDPs leaving the camps is greatly reduced. Lack of security and increased arrests remain the main reasons cited by IDPs for opting to remain in the camps. The IOC Op RETOUR reports that about 1000 Rwandans moved into camps in the GIKONGORO area and the camp leader of MUNINI camp informed that about five families a week head for BURUNDI. The Integrated Task Force of the IOC continue to develop a strategy for improving the results of Op RETOUR. The Rwandan Government remains committed to the closure of the camps but a strategy which allows for human rights to be respected continues to be perused. While the Task Force continues planning strategy, Op RETOUR will continue to send vehicles to the camps to transport those wishing to leave.

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. A representative of the cell attended the UNREO weekly general meeting with NGOs. The HAC representative passed on security issues of concern to the representatives.

3. No patrolling was conducted by the cell during this reporting period due to reduced strength of the cell. Humanitarian problems reported by the Sectors have been forwarded to UNREO for co-ordination.

4. HAC has forwarded to UNREO details concerning the availability of "sustainment rations" for distribution by UN agencies. UNREO is presently assessing options and will provide direction shortly. UNREO has been informed of the acute shortage of food in the GISENYI area due to the return of refugees.

5. Sector 4B's request for aid to improve the conditions of infrastructure as discussed with the SRSB have been forwarded to UNREO for action. HAC will inform Sector of results from UNREO. Sector should be advised that UNAMIR operating budget does not provide for humanitarian assistance and if used for such needs it is at the expense of operations. HAC has also forwarded

14. MALI Coy assisted medical authorities in transporting drugs from KIGALI to GITARAMA.

15. The Sector Humanitarian team and the MALICOY doctor visited orphanages in BYIMANA GR 7062, CYEZA GR 7777 and RULI. The team reported lack of drugs. MALICOY medical personnel will visit orphanages weekly and NGOs in area will be approached to assist.

#### Sector 4A

16. ZAMBATT troops continued to provide security forces for Op RETOUR and humanitarian aid distribution within the IDP camps of KIBEHO GR 5107, NDAGO GR 5202, KAMANA GR 5196 and GISUNZU GR 4117.

17. ZAMBATT provided security for CARE International distributing food at MUSEBEYA GR 3933.

18. CARITAS delivered cooking equipment to IDPs at KIGEME camp as well as medicine to NYAMAGINA and BUHORU. MSF delivered water.

19. MILOB patrol to RUTSIRO orphanage report 74 orphans present requiring mattresses and blankets. UNREO, UNICEF to note.

20. ICRC distributed food at KAMANA and RWAMIKO.

#### Sector 4B

21. MILOBs report that four children in KALINDA commune were reported to have died of measles. Despite assurances of there being no epidemic it is suggested that the situation be closely monitored. UNREO, WHO to note.

22. Returnees to BWAKIRO commune were observed lining up at the commune office looking fore distribution of seeds and farming equipment. None present for distribution. UNREO, IOC to note.

23. MILOB patrol visited health centre in KABONA GR 4385 which is run by MEMISA. Needs include water, electricity and repair to building. As well they have transport requirement to move food from CARITAS to centre. MILOB HQ to liaise with local NGOs operating in area as well as formed troops to determine local arrangements capable of addressing problem. If no success then upon receipt of exact needs, HAC will liaise with UNREO for further action. UNREO to note.





The team however strongly suspects the existence of the new mass grave as it was again confirmed to them by the nuns. Investigations will continue and further details will be intimated.





Our observations are as follows:-

(i) Reports of this movement have also been received by us from UNHCR and UNREO KIBUNGO. As per these reports, approx 1000 people appear to have left the NGENDA commune for BURUNDI during the past few days. The apparent reason is an alleged rumour of impending revenge killings being planned by the RPA between 31 Mar and 06 Feb 95.

(ii) Our team patrolling NGENDA met the bourgemestre who expressed surprise at the news of this movement. Locals on questioning also denied any knowledge of this. The immigration officer at the RUTETE border post informed that no movement into RWANDA had taken place since 19 Mar 95.

(iii) Our team patrolling SAKE and MUGESERA reported that no movement had been noticed. However, some locals did mention that a lot of people are hiding in the bush and their movement into BURUNDI may have taken place. The team also reported constant monitoring of their activities by the RPA. They also confirmed that the people in the area are scared of divulging any info to UNAMIR.

(iv) The team patrolling area RWABITAZI reported extensive patrolling by the RPA in the area. It confirmed no movement into BURUNDI from the area. It met a local who had been beaten by an RPA patrol for allegedly having indulged in stealing. It also reported that the cellule of SILO 6543 is deserted.

(b) At 1420 h, one local was chased by one person each of the RPA and gendarmerie into the Ghanbatt platoon location at KABILIZI 5066. The man had been arrested by them on the pretext that his brother had allegedly been involved in the genocide. The man was brought to BARE 5448 by Ghanbatt. Human Rights and milobs went to investigate. The platoon location at KABILIZI was surrounded by two offrs and approx 35 men of the RPA. The milob team is at the moment in the area, negotiating with the

bourgemestre of MUGESERA 4764. Tha RPA has moved away from the platoon area. Further details will follow.

Two workers of Human Rights KIBUNGO were accompanying him in another car. The workers claimed that he had not paid them since Aug 94 and threatened that he would not be released unless he paid them. One team was sent to the site. Ghanbatt was requested to keep one armed escort standby after taking approval of the same from your HQ. The team brought the situation under control. An agreement was arrived at in the presence of milobs, UNREO and the bourgemestre in which the affected man agreed to pay the balance USD 1560 and Fr 103000 which he owed to the workers on the coming Friday.  
  
(d) One team patrolled areas RUKIRA 6658 and RUSUMO 7448. It evacuated one seriously ill girl about 16 years old from RUSUMO to the hospital at KIREHE 7569.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR PERIOD 4 MAR 95 to 10 MAR 95

General Situation

1. The humanitarian situation within Rwanda is stable. The IDPs in the southern camps in Sector 4A continue to leave under Op RETOUR. However the numbers continue to be low with the rise in security incidents, especially in home communes and the numbers of arrest being cited as the main reasons. The overcrowded situation in the jails and prisons in the country continues.

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. The CHAO, Col S. Iliya and Maj B. Mande were repatriated to NIGERIA this week. Current strength of the cell is 2 MILOBS (1 in KIGALI, 1 on CTO/LVE).

3. A representative of the cell attended the UNREO weekly general meeting with NGOs. The HAC representative passed on security issues of concern to the representatives.

Sector 1

4. The president of SOS Children's Village, Mr Helmut Kuti, visited the SOS branch at NGARAMA.

5. MILOBS conducted joint patrols with a representative of the prefect's office to GATUNA, RUKOMO and GITTI

6. MILOBS reported an outbreak of measles in KIZIGURU and NYAGATARE. RPA doctors have started a vaccination campaign in MATIMBA. UNREO, WHO and UNICEF to note.

7. 3476 returnees crossed at the KAGITUMBA border post during the reporting period. NIBATT transported 91 returnees to their home commune. IOC to note.

8. NIBATT medical staff treated 208 locals in AOR.

Sector 2

9. The prefect of KIBUNGO held a conference to discuss the



resettlement of refugees in KARAMA. MILOBS, GHANBATT and UNHCR were in attendance.

10. MILOBS patrols to RUSUMO and RUKIRA reported that most of the returnees to these areas preferred to settle close to the main road because of the threat of armed robbery from people crossing from TANZANIA. IOC to note.

11. GHANBATT provided transport for 374 IDPs/returnees to their home commune. IOC to note. GHANBATT also provided security to World Vision during food distribution operation and assisted SCF(UK) in putting up tentage for the GATI orphanage.

### Sector 3

12. A MILOB patrol to NTONGWE commune to monitor the progress of returnees discovered that a large number of arrests had taken place in the commune. The holding facility in the town had 80 inmates, a significant number of whom were recent returnees. IOC to note.

13. A joint MILOB/CIVPOL patrol to MURAMA commune to monitor the progress of returnees in the area confirmed that several arrests have been carried out by the RPA. The locals were reported to be living in fear of the RPA. IOC to note.

14. A joint MILOB/CIVPOL patrol to NTONGWE commune was informed that the food distribution is now in the hands of the commune authorities and that, despite the adequacy of the supply, insufficient quantities are distributed. It was alleged that the top authorities skim off too much for their own families and friends. UNREO and WFP to note/investigate.

15. MILOBS assisted local authorities to transport school supplies to MUGUSA commune. UNICEF to note.

16. MALAWICOY transported school books from RUHASHIYA to MUGUSO for distribution by UNICEF.

17. MALICOY/MALAWICOY Med staff treated 16 locals in AOR.

### Sector 4A

18. ZAMBATT reported that a large number of IDPs from KADUHA and GIKONGORO are settling at NYAMBARAGASA DP camp in MUNINI. IOC to note.

19. ZAMBATT reported that a RPA section at NYAMIGINA opened fire at the IDPs and killed 3 people. Reasons for shooting not known, ZAMBATT has reinforced its troops in the area. IOC to note.

20. The president of SOS Children's Village, Mr Helmut Kuti, visited the SOS branch at GIKONGORO.

21. ZAMBATT Med staff treated 194 locals in AOR.

#### Sector 4B

22. MILOBS held a meeting with the sub-prefect of KIBUYE. He reported the presence of 387 returnees in KIBUYE awaiting transport to GISENYI and CYANGUGU. IOC to note

23. The director of KIBUYE hospital informed MILOB patrol that he had informed the local authorities of the outbreak of rabies in the area. He said that people were dying from rabies in the GISOVU commune. One man also died from the disease in GITESI commune. Vaccinations are available, from the KIBUYE hospital, on request. The RPA has given orders to shoot unattended dogs. UNREO and WHO to note.

24. SENBATT transported firewood to KIBUYE prison.

#### Sector 4C

25. ETHIOBATT transported 49 refugees from RUSUZI 1 (GR 7624) to NYAGATARE transit camp ICRC and UNHCR transported 54 refugees from RUSUZI 1 to NYAGATARE. ETHIOPBATT also transported 108 refugees from CYANGUGU to KITABI. The medical staff treated 68 locals.

#### Sector 5

26. MILOBS organized the move of 93 returnees from KATALE camp to GISENYI.

27. TUNBATT provided security for UNHCR and CARE installations. Medical staff treated 148 locals in AOR.

#### Sector 6

28. MILOB patrol to KICUKIRO commune reported that the commune was in need of humanitarian assistance (seeds, tools, etc.). UNREO to note.

29. INBATT helped in the transport and distribution of education materials to RUBUNGO, BICUMBI, GIKORO and GIKOMERO communes. The education materials were from the Rwandan Government and a representative of the Inspector of School was present during the operation. UNICEF to note.

30. INBATT patrol to MUGAMBAZI, RUTONGO and MBOGO communes distributed education material to the MUGAMBAZI and MBOGO communes. They also treated 74 locals at MUGAMBAZI and RUTONGO communes. The patrol also provided some medical care to the orphanage in RUTONGO commune (40 children and 22 adults). UNICEF to note.

#### Op Retour

31. Op RETOUR continued under the direction of the IOC. 840 IDPs were moved by vehicle during this reporting period. A total of 40,711 IDPs have been moved since the commencement of the

operation.


