DR MARTIN-SAMOS SENT MESSAGE OVER SSB THROUGH CHEF ZONE OTRACO THAT AN UNIDENTIFIED TRUCK WAS SPOTTED APPROACHING BUMBA. THIS CREATED PANIC IN TOWN AND LOCAL POPULATION STARTED FLEEING AWAY. AM INSTRUCTING DR MARTIN-SAMOS TO COME TO LISALA IMMEDIATELY BY WHATEVER MEANS AVAILABLE IF THERE IS EVEN SLIGHTEST RISK OF SECURITY.

HAVE RECEIVED FOLLOWING REPORT ABOUT GENERAL SITUATION
UBANGI PROVINCE.

AAA IN OCTOBER ANC SOLDIERS AND REBELS CLASHED SEVERAL
TIMES AT BENWYVILLE AND YAKOMA NORTH OF PROVINCE.
FINALLY REBELW ESCAPED TO BONDO WITH APPROXIMATELY
500 CASUALTIES. PROVINCE IS NOZ UNDER ANC CONTROL
ON 28, 29 QND 30 SEPTEMBER DR MARICALBET WENT TO YAKOMA
UNDER PROVGVERNORS ORDER TO TREAT INJURED . A SPECIAL
UNIT SOLDIER AND CONGOLESE WOMAN WERE BROUGHT TO GEMENA
AND OPERATED THERE. ON 2 OCTOBER MINITARY DC3 AIRCRAFT
TRANSPORTING SPECIALS FROM GEMENA TO LISALA CAUGHT FIRE
WHEN TAKING OFF AND CRASHED NEARBY FOREST. NO CASUALTIES
BUT PLANE DESTROYED. DURING CLASHES AT YAKOMA GENERAL

MUBUTU AND MININTERIOR MUNONGO PAID VISITS TO GEMENA.

ON 2 OCTOBER DR FARES PROCEEDED TO LIBENGE TO COLLECT MEDICAL SUPPLIES WHICH ARRIVED THROUGH RIVERPORT BATANGA. REPORTEDLY AT LIBENGE EUROPEAN AND CONGOLESE POPULATION MALTREATED BY ANC. SOME OF THEM SEVERELY BEATEN WITHOUT REASON. SIX ARMED SOLDIERS ATTACKED BELGIAN AGENT OF AIRCONGO AND SOTRANCONGO AND VERY BADLY BEATEN I WITH BUTTS OF GUNS AND KICKS. HE WAS IMMEDIATELY TAKEN TO GEMENA AND OPERATED THERE. ON OCTOBER 25 PROVINCIAL AUTOIRITIES WITH BELGIAN ADVISERS PAID VISIT TO LIBENGE TO CALM DOWN POPULATION.

BBB RIVERPORT AKULA ISREOPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. MOST VEHICLES BELONGING TO COMPANIES, PLANTATIONS AND INDIVIDUALS WERE REQUISITIONED BY REBELS AND OBVIOUSLY MOST WILL BE BADLY DAMAGED WHEN RECOVERED. DUE HEAVY RAINS AND LACK OF MAINTENACE ROADS ARE ALMOST UNPASSABLE. FARMERS HAVE BEEN UNABLE TO SELL OR EXPORT THEIR LOCAL PRODCE DUE TEMPORARY CLOSURE RIVER TRANSPORT FOR OVER TWO MONTHS.

CCC THERE IS ACCUTE SHORTAGE OF FOOD. THE ONLY MERCHANT DEALING IN FOODSTUFF EVACUATED AND SUPPLIES SUSPENDEC. THE SITUATION IS GETTING WORSE. OUR DOCTRS THERE LIVE ON LOCAL PRODUCE ONLY SUCH AS MANIOC, PONDU WHEAT ETC.

DDD EFFECTS OF REBELS ATTACKS STILL FELT BY LOCAL POPULATION BUT SITUATION NOZ IMPROVING AND FAMILIES

EVACUATED ARE GRADUALLY RETURNING.

EEE IN VIEW EXISTING FOOD SITUATION AT GEMENA EYE SUGGEST NEXT
UN FLIGHT TO COQUILHATVILLE SHOULD NOT BE CANCELLED AND
BE EXTENDED UPTO GEMENA CARRYING SUFFICIENT COMMISSARY
SUPPLIES AND MT SPARES FOR DOCTOS. HAVE ON REQUISITION
SUFFICIENT COMMISARY STUFF, MT SPARES AND TOLS TO JUSTIFY
FLIGHT TO COQUILHATVILLE BUT UNFORTUNATELY NO BACKLOAD.
EYE ALSO SUGGEST DR MARTIN-SAMOS SHOULD ACCOMPANY PLANE TO
GEMENA TO EXAMINE SITUATION, TAKE WITH HIM WHATEVER MEDICINES
AVAILABLE HERE AND ARRANGE DISTRIBUTION OF COMMISARY SUPPLIES
TO DOCTORS AGAINST COUPONS. KINDLY ADVISE SOONEST YOUR
DECISION. AM REQUESTING MORTENSEN AND HECKMAN TO BE

The error regarding 'ONUC Offices and Commissary'
is regretted, which as you will appreciate recurs by force
of habit. Necessary correction will be made in future reports.

It is extremely difficult to give any exact
figures regarding charges for consumption of water and
electricity as REGIDESO is very irregular and inaccurate
in submitting their bills. This month, for instance, we
have received a bill for CF 1,523 for the period 20 June to
25 August 1964. This figure is ridiculously low as compared
to previous bills, specially keeping in view the fact that
TAB Offices were shifted to new premises on 1 May 1964 and
number of electrical equipments like air conditioners etc.
has increased considerably. However, upon personally checking
with REGIDESO they insist that the bill is correct.

As for the bill for consumption of water and
electricity in building No.2, Avenue Coquilhat, is concerned,
it was not stated that the amount will be recovered from
UNESCO. UNESCO is normally accommodated in TAB Offices
along with OMS and Public Works. However, due to shortage
of space in our present office building UNESCO retained an
apartment in building No.2, Avenue Coquilhat, when the
building was surrendered, by courtesy of the Provincial

Government without payment of any rent. It was only fair that we should pay water and electricity charges. If you consider that these should be debited to UNESCO Project, the Chief Finance Officer may kindly be requested to change the coding of the relevant Disbursement Voucher.

This is in reference to your cable LEOCQ 291 of
17 October 1964.

The Bedford truck ONUC 8463 was sent to garage CEGEAC in August 1963 for repairing the transmission which broke down in front of former ONUC premises. In September 1963 whilst the vehicle was still in the garage awaiting spare part from Leopoldville, Mr. Nivarlet, the then Manager of the garage, was expelled from Coquilhatville at 24 hours' notice by the Provincial authorities and for about a month thereafter no-body responsible was appointed in-charge of the garage, which was closed to public. Mr. Tselentis, the then Administrative Officer, approached the local gendarmerie commander to detail guard at the garage so as to ensure that ONUC vehicles or their parts were not stolen. Despite this, when the differential bearing required for the vehicle was eventually received, it was found that the following pieces were missing :

Starter; Generator; Fan belt; Motor
Supports; Condenser; and Regulator.

The matter was discussed with Mr. Pirlot, the new CEGEAC Manager, and the employees of CEGEAC insisted that the parts were taken by Maurice who was driver of the above vehicle and since discharged by the Red Cross, which the latter denied. There is no doubt that legally CEGEAC are responsible for the loss of spare parts as the theft occurred when the vehicle was stored at their workshop premises with no person responsible appointed in-charge for about a month.

Contd. -2-

Meanwhile the Provincial Director of Medical Services sent a note to CEGEAC on behalf of the Red Cross and took few more parts out of this vehicle. The clerk concerned in CEGEAC, thinking as 8463 was a Red Cross vehicle, allowed them to remove the parts against a signed receipt. Fortunately, we have now been able to prevail upon the local authorities to restore the parts removed which has been done. Following is the list of the parts recovered :

Spare wheel complete; Distributor; Water pump;
and Fan belt assembly complete with pulley etc.

If it is intended to repair the vehicle now, the best course would be to provide the parts required and later settle the claim for cost with CEGEAC. Incidentally, the differential bearing sent from Leopoldville is not of correct dimension and will be returned. In addition to the parts for the engine, it will absolutely be necessary to have all the five tyres and tubes replaced, which are completely worn out. Here I would point out that sometime ago four tyres were sent from Leopoldville direct to the Red Cross for use on ONUC 8463 which were never put on the vehicle, and now it is impossible to locate them. It will also require a new battery.

It must be borne in mind that if the required spares are not made available immediately, and the vehicle is stored indefinitely either at CEGEAC or ONUC premises, it is very likely that by the time the parts required are received, the others are found missing from the vehicle.

I therefore personally feel that the parts recovered from the Provincial Director of Medical Services be fixed back on to the engine, and the vehicle then, either, be towed to OTRAC for shipment to Leopoldville, or, be disposed of at Coquilhatville by public tender, where is as is.

If it is decided that the vehicle be repaired here, I will send my requisition for the parts required, on hearing from you.

I shall be grateful to receive disposal instructions of the vehicle at your earliest convenience.

Moreover, if it is the intention to extend my contract for a period of six months, as has been the case since June 1963, it will be imperative that I return from leave before 31 December to be able to serve the stipulated six months' period.

I shall therefore be grateful if you will kindly let me know whether the question of renewal of contract has been decided and it is possible to approve my leave request. I should prefer to take full 12 weeks' leave due to me but if exigencies of service so require, shall be agreeable to proceed on leave for a shorter period.

Report on visit to Coquilhatville (1000 to 1600 hours) 12 September 1964
by P. SCHILLER

I was a few hours in Coquilhatville and went to African cities, markets, visited a few merchants and had a talk with the UNTAG staff there. Military commander and Governor Ngulu were out of town.

Military situation

On the eastern road, rebels are in Boende but have not advanced further.

In the north they are in Bougandanga, but not in Basankusu.

On the Congo River, they may be around Nouvelle Anvers, abandoned by missionaries when they had news that rebels were approaching.

250 ANC in Coquilhatville.

60 ANC and 100 policemen and 30 specials in Ingende.

Two B-26 are coming every day from Leo for air support and reconnaissance in the region. ANC soldiers stabbed and later hanged a baker and two of his aids because he had no bread - this is not going to secure the sympathy of the population.

General Mobutu came on the 12th to inspect the troops.

Political situation

All authorities left town almost a month. Local Governor and two ministers came back on the 12th with Mr. Bembeke, who is one of the local notabilities.

The Mungo tribe is not at all pro-rebel. They heard in Coquilhatville a message from Boende to Stan from the rebel commander asking for help because he could not get anything from the local population. Mungoes are not going to fight the rebels, but they are not going to help them either.

Economic situation

No industry, some small plantations: palm oil, hovea, sequoia (most of them still in operation). People living from farming and fishing (prevented now by fear of ANC patrols).

Main problem will soon be food because on the 12th a survey revealed a stock of 10 bags of rice (main food of Mungo), and rice supply is cut because it was coming from Lissala, Busba, Ikala.

Shops and markets are empty and a number of Portuguese merchants have left.

UNTAB staff

Makes good impression, good team spirit. As administrative people and IIV expert have to leave in case of evacuation, all doctors but one choose to stay, mainly because they have excellent relations with the population and would hate to let them live without health service. (There are also some less disinterested motives behind the decision, but I frankly think they weigh less than expected.) Mr. Nishi seems to enjoy the confidence of his colleagues and of the local people.

Conclusion

Situation normal. In the airport I saw two "specials" heavily armed guarding the airport from the bar.

The unnecessary panic of last Thursday seems to have been created both by local authorities and the Belgian population (usually employees, they do not have the same reason to stay as people with plantations or shops). Reports from Vilain IC to Belgian Embassy were exaggerated and infuriated the local AEF commander.

It is also to be said that the Equatorial province having been without a history of violence from 1960 until now, 1964, people there are less accustomed to trouble than in other places and have an excuse to panic quicker.

The present population of Coquilhatville is estimated in excess of 100,000. According to reports from OTRACO authorities, 2000 people have come from up river to Coq within the last two weeks seeking refuge from the rebels. Arrival of approximately 1500 more is expected in the next two weeks. An estimated 2000 military (including families) coming from the Stanleyville area have taken refuge at the Irebu army camp some 150 kilometers from Coq. These refugees have nothing with them and are without money or means of earning such. To make the situation even more difficult, the majority of civil servants are also without money due to non-payment of provincial government salaries for some time now.

The people are frightened and on edge. They are aware of the rebels' nearness to Coq and feel that they are without leadership because the provincial authorities spend so little time in Coq. There has been little administration for the last two months. Of the 500 white residents only about 100 remain. Food is very scarce and money is tight. The city itself appears calm and peaceful.

SEDEC has 10 sacks of rice, 900 sacks of sugar and several weeks' supply of margarine, tea, and cooking oil in stock. Shipments from Leo have been stopped because: (1) Otraco refuses to accept cargo for Coq and (2) SEDEC has adopted a wait-and-see policy due to a 60,000,000 franc loss in Bolombo (name of city not certain) at the hands of the rebels. Sometime ago SEDEC-Coq ordered 5000 sacks of flour and the maximum amount of rice available from Leo. The manager, M. Lisasi, indicated that if transport were possible he would like to receive one half of the flour and the maximum quantity of rice. In addition, he could use 1 to 2000 sacks of salted fish (50-100 tons)--about 3 months' supply.

INTERFINA has in stock 30 sacks of rice and 140 sacks (50 kilos each) of sugar. No powdered milk, flour, or canned meat has been in stock for over three months. On July 7, 1964, a shipment destined for INTERFINA-Coq was supposed to have left Matadi via Otraco. This order, supposedly blocked in Leo, consists of 55 cases of tomatoes (1,100 kilos) and 25 cases of sardines. The gentleman in charge, M. Etue Gerard, indicated the need for flour, rice, powdered milk, and canned goods. He suggested, should transport be possible, that INTERFINA-Leo be contacted to arrange for supplies.

COMPAGNIE DE L'EQUATEUR (wholesale importer) has 10,000 sacks of flour on order under Title I. The terminal delivery date was August 31 and the shipment may have already arrived in the Congo. In addition to this 3 month supply on order, 1000 sacks are in stock. This flour is sold only to bakers. Normally carrying a two month supply of flour, the bakeries now are down to stocks which will cover

their needs for one more month. Also in stock at Cie de l'Equateur are 150 cartons of powdered milk (2,500 lbs.). M. Riasco, the directeur, stated that the native population was not accustomed to beans and would not eat them without tomatoes. There are no vegetables on the local market at this time, all food, other than palm oil, bananas, and manioc, having to be imported either from Leo or the interior (the main source which is now cut off). He went on to say that under normal conditions the annual rice requirement was 200-250 tons but now that other food stuffs are unavailable, 25 tons monthly would be a bare minimum. He indicated his willingness to collaborate with SEDEC and INGEFINA in financing bulk food stuffs should transportation be made available. He does have a 1-2 month supply of sardines and canned meats in stock but stated that the natives could not afford to buy them. In his opinion rice is the most urgently needed commodity.

Dr. Martin-Samoa of WHO stated that it is the custom for patients' families to furnish food, but most of his patients at this time are refugees from the bush. Many who were still sick have actually left the hospital for lack of food. Families either stay in the room with the patient or camp outside. Approximately 100 persons are hospitalized in the 600-bed hospital, which brings the number to be fed to about 500. He would be interested in receiving as much as 10 tons of powdered milk (utilization: two tons per month) which would be specifically reserved for sick children and maternity care. He indicated that distribution would be under his direct supervision and adequate storage facilities are available at the Pharmacie Central.

Miss Mangotte, the advisor to the provincial government on social affairs, stated that results of a recent survey she conducted show that one family in 65 has an adequate diet, the remainder trying to live off of manioc and bananas.

For emergency feeding purposes, 3-4 kilos of rice or flour per person per week would be sufficient if nothing else were made available. 5-7 cases of milk per 100 persons were considered adequate on a weekly basis. The Catholics, the only remaining missionaries, have five centers plus a dispensary from which distribution could be effected. Storage facilities were said to be able to handle "thousands of kilos". Their four trucks plus others available in the city could handle transportation from the airport to the warehouses. Distribution would be organized by Miss Mangotte and the Catholic Sisters who are most familiar with the indigenous population. All interested parties insisted that any food for free distribution must be handled through the hospitals or missions and not be given to the provincial authorities.

The only protestant mission (Disciples of Christ) has been left in the hands of Congolese. It was suggested that Mr. Taylor be contacted in Leo for precise information on distribution capabilities at this mission. It is known that the mission is sheltering a number of invalids and sick people at this time. Food for the Irebu area could be picked up in a boat which is available at the military camp.

All agreed that emergency feeding was required for about 5000 people.

Subject : Lists of surplus merchandise

In reference to your instructions via the SSB I am enclosing a list of surplus commissary merchandise, furniture and office equipment and vehicles and spare parts.

The list of surplus commissary merchandise has been prepared keeping provision for two months' requirements. Furniture and office equipment listed can be disposed of finally. As regards vehicles, the position is as follows :-

(a) Three Willys Station Wagons have been rendered surplus by decrease in the number of WHO personnel assigned to ex-Equator Province. Two station wagons are presently in Coquilhatville and one in Gemena.

(b) Four jeeps

No. 2211 is awaiting disposal. The successful bidder has been transferred from Coquilhatville. Further disposal instructions have been requested from Chief, Purchasing & Supply.

No. 2468 is rendered surplus by transfer of Mr. Depadt, WMO expert to Elisabethville. It is not known whether he will be replaced.

No. 2608 is rendered surplus by repatriation of Mr. Ou, Public Works Engineer.

No. 2594 is rendered surplus by transfer of Mr. Remy Delphin from Gemena. It is not known whether Mr. Delphin will be returning to his duty station.

I should appreciate receiving disposal instructions regarding the above items at the earliest. If it is decided to have the vehicles sent back to Leopoldville, I should like to suggest that I keep the best jeeps here and not necessarily send the vehicles listed above. It will serve no useful purpose to retain vehicles which are off road and cannot be used in an emergency.


