DAILY SITREP FOR 03 JAN 95

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. IN SECTOR 5 TUNBATT REPORTED THAT SHOTS WERE HEARD AT 2255HRS AT NYARUTOVU GR 7619 AND LATER A 40MM ROCKET ALSO EXPLODED VERY CLOSE TO THE SAME LOC. TUNBATT INVESTIGATING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. IN A SUDDEN MOVE TO PREVENT RGF AND GOVT IN EXILE FROM SPENDING CURRENT RWANDAN CURRENCY, THE GOVT OF RWANDA ANNOUNCED EXCHANGE OF 5000, 1000 AND 500 RWANDAN FRANCS ON 02 JAN 95, EXCHANGE TO BE EFFECTIVE AND OPEN TO PUBLIC THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY ON 03 AND 04 JAN 95. A NUMBER OF EXCHANGE POINTS HAVE BEEN OPENED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY AND THE WHOLE

PROCESS IS PROCEEDING SMOOTHLY WITH NO UNTOWARD INCIDENT SO FAR REPORTED. AS A PREVENTIVE MEASURE THE RPA IS CARRYING OUT EXTENSIVE PATROLLING ALONG THE BORDER AREAS AND HAVE ALSO CLOSED THE BORDER CROSSING POINTS TO PREVENT TRANS BORDER MOVEMENT FOR EXCHANGE OF CURRENCY. UNAMIR HAS EXTENDED ALL POSSIBLE HELP TO THE GOVT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EXCHANGE PROCESS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA. RPA INTENSIFIED DAY AND NI FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN MAJOR TOWNS AND VILLAGES DURING THE PERIOD. THEY REINFORCED SOME OF THEIR POSNS AND INTENSIFIED SEARCHES AT THEIR VARIOUS ROAD BLOCKS.

(1) REFERENCE OUR SITREP OF 02 JAN 94, PARA 3A (3). INVESTIGATION INTO THE KILLING OF 8 PEOPLE BY RPA AT WEST OF RWESORO GR 9938 IN SECTOR 4C, REVEALED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 31 DEC 94 THE VICTIMS ROBBED THE LOCAL DWELLERS AND CAME AGAIN ON 01 JAN 95. THE RPA THEN AMBUSHED THEM KILLING 6 AND ARRESTED TWO. THE BANDITS WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE. THE TWO PRISONERS HAVE BEEN SENT TO NYAMASHEKE JAIL. FURTHER INFORMATION ALSO INDICATED THAT ONE OF THE PRISONERS IS A BROTHER TO A FRGF MAJOR.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5, REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 2 WOMEN WHO RODE ON BICYCLES TO THEIR CHECK POINT 4KM WEST OF RUHENGIERI. REASON FOR THE ARREST AND THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE WOMEN NOT KNOWN.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) OP RETOUR THE FOLLOWING DPs WERE EVAC ON 3 JAN 94.

(A) CYANIKA - 974.

(B) NDAGO - 321.

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR IS 2,356.

(3) UNAMIR HQ OPS STAFF CONDUCTED HELI RECCE OF IJWI ISLAND AND NYAMASHEKE IN SECTOR 4C. LOCALS IN NYAMASHEKE NOT HAPPY WITH SECURITY PROVIDED BY RPA AND HAVE ASKED FOR UNAMIR PRESENCE TO DETER BANDITS FROM THE MENTIONED ISLAND.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR. PATROL SENT TO GATUNA OBSERVED THAT MOVEMENT OF PERSONS INTO RWANDA AT GATUNA BORDER POST WERE RESTRICTED IN ORDER TO EFFECT A CLEAN EXCHANGE OF NEW RWANDAN CURRENCY. 120 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MEDICAL CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY)

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT TAC HQ BUTARE.

(2) SENT PATROL TO MPANDA GR 5607, RUSENGE GR 5904, BUNGE GR 5501 AND JALI GR 5900. THE PATROL REPORTED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS CALM HOWEVER THE LOCALS HAVE REPORTED THAT FOOD ASSISTANCE TO THE AREAS WAS NOT FORTH-COMING DUE TO BAD CONDITION OF ROAD.

(3) ANOTHER PATROL SENT TO RUNYINYA GR 8600 REPORTED THAT THOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION HAS IMPROVED CONSIDERABLY IN THE AREA, FEW DPs WERE OBSERVED TO HAVE RETURNED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES. BECAUSE THEY ARE NOT CERTAIN OF THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED SECURITY AND PATROL DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTL BASE AT KIBEHO PROVIDED SY FOR THE EVAC OF 321 DPs FROM NDAGO TO BUTARE TODAY.

(3) AICF OPERATING IN GIKONGORO HAS BEEN ASKED BY RPA TO STOP OPERATING AND LEAVE GIKONGORO PREFECTURE BY 4 JAN 95. KIBEHO PTL BASE REPORTED THAT AICF WERE OBSERVED DEMOLISHING THEIR OFFICE STRUCTURE AT NDAGO.

(5) OPS OFFICER PAID A WORKING VISIT TO CYANIKA IN LINE WITH OP RETOUR AND OBSERVED THAT MORE DPs WERE WILLING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(6) A TOTAL OF 156 AND 150 DPs ARRIVED AT NGENDA GR 068446 AND KANZENZE GR 1163 COMMUNES RESPECTIVELY AND DEPARTED TO THEIR LOCALITIES.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT).

(1) PROVIDED TRUCKS AND SECURITY FOR OP RETOUR AT CYANIKA DPC DURING REPATRIATION FOR 974 IDPs. ALSO CONDUCTED PTLs AND PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE EXCHANGE OF NEW CURRENCIES IN THE AOR.

(2) A TOTAL OF 296 LOCALS WERE ATTENDED TO BY MEDICAL TEAM IN MUSEBEYA, KADUHA AND MUKO.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED SECURITY AND PATROL DUTIES IN AOR AND NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. 18 PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL CARE AT FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) DUE TO THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW CURRENCY INTO THE RWANDESE ECONOMY, RUSIZI-1 GR 7624, BORDER POST WAS CLOSED. IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS CONTACTED AT THE BORDER POST HAVE INDICATED THAT IT WILL BE OPEN ON 04 JAN 95.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) RECEIVED THE VISIT OF RPA NORTHERN SECTOR COMD TO OWN LOCATION.

(2) A LOCAL FROM GIHORWE GR 3425 IN MUTURA COMMUNE HAS REPORTED THAT HER DAUGHTER AND SON-IN-LAW HAVE BEEN IMPRISONED BY THE COUNSELLOR OF KABATWA GR 3327 WITHOUT ANY REASON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(3) MEDICAL STAFF ASSISTED 175 RWANDESE PATIENTS.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED SECURITY AND PATROL DUTIES IN AOR. VEHICLE PATROLS CARRIED OUT IN KIGALI AND HINTERLAND BY DAY.

(2) OWS AT NDERA PATROLLED BY DAY AND NIGHT. SITUATION WAS FOUND TO BE NORMAL.

(3) BN OPS OFFR ACCOMPANIED UNAMIR HQ OPS STAFF TO CONDUCT HELI RECCE OF IJWI ISLAND AND NYAMASHEKE IN SECTOR 4C.

(4) RMO TREATED 255 LOCAL CIV PATIENTS AT CLINIC. 380 IDPs DESPATCHED FROM OWS AT NDERA CAMP TO ORC AND HOME COMMUNES. NDERA CAMP NOW HOLDING 466 IDPs.

K. MILOB GP. EXCHANGE OF OLD RWANDESE CURRENCY TO NEW ONES TOOK PLACE WITHIN THE COUNTRY DURING THE PERIOD. RPA PROVIDED SY FOR THE MONEY CHANGING EXERCISE.

(1) POLITICAL. THE GOVT ISSUED A LETTER TO AICF - GIKONGORO TERMINATING THEIR ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA. AICF WAS ADVISED TO RETURN TO KIGALI FOR FURTHER CLARIFICATION ON THE ISSUE. LOCAL RPA COMD PLACED AICF STAFF UNDER HOUSE ARREST. AFTER NEGOTIATIONS, IT WAS DECIDED THAT AICF SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO STAY UNTIL 04 JAN 95. AICF IS TO HAND OVER A LIST OF LOCAL STAFF.

(2) BORDERS. SOME BORDERS WERE CLOSED DUE TO THE

CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE GOING ON WITHIN THE COUNTRY.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR. SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED 17 DPs FROM KIBUNGO TO SAKE.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN AOR.

(B) SECTOR MILOB PTLs COVERED NYAMIGINA DPs CAMP AND REPORTED INFLUX OF DPs INTO RWAMIKO CAMP FROM MGANDA, AND MBASI COMMUNES DUE TO INSECURITY IN THE COMMUNES. A 19 YEAR OLD BOY WHO ALSO ENTERED THE CAMP REPORTED THAT RPA HAD BEEN ARRESTING AND IMPRISONING RETURNEES AT NGENDA WITHOUT CAUSE. SOME ARRESTED RETURNEES WHO WERE SENT TO SAVE PRISON COULD NOT BE TRACED BY THEIR RELATIVES. LOCALS WHO WENT TO VISIT THEIR RELATIVES AT BUTARE PRISON WERE DENIED ACCESS TO THE PRISONERS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIBUYE AND HAVE REPORTED THAT ALL DPs IN KIBUYE HAVE BEEN EVAC. THE LAST DPs WERE EVACUATED ON 02 JAN 95.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR. PTLs REPORTED THAT THERE ARE STILL 93 REFUGEES AT BUGARAMA AWAITING EVACUATION.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN AOR. MONEY CHANGING EXERCISE WAS CONDUCTED WITHIN THE CITY. THE EX IS TO LAST FOR 2 DAYS.

(3) MILOBS ESCORTED B & R FUEL TANKERS TO KIBUYE DURING THE PERIOD.

LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE ADVISED AND THE DRIVER OF THE CIVILIAN VEH WAS FOUND TO BE AT FAULT. NO INJURIES SUSTAINED. MINOR DAMAGE TO BOTH VEHS.

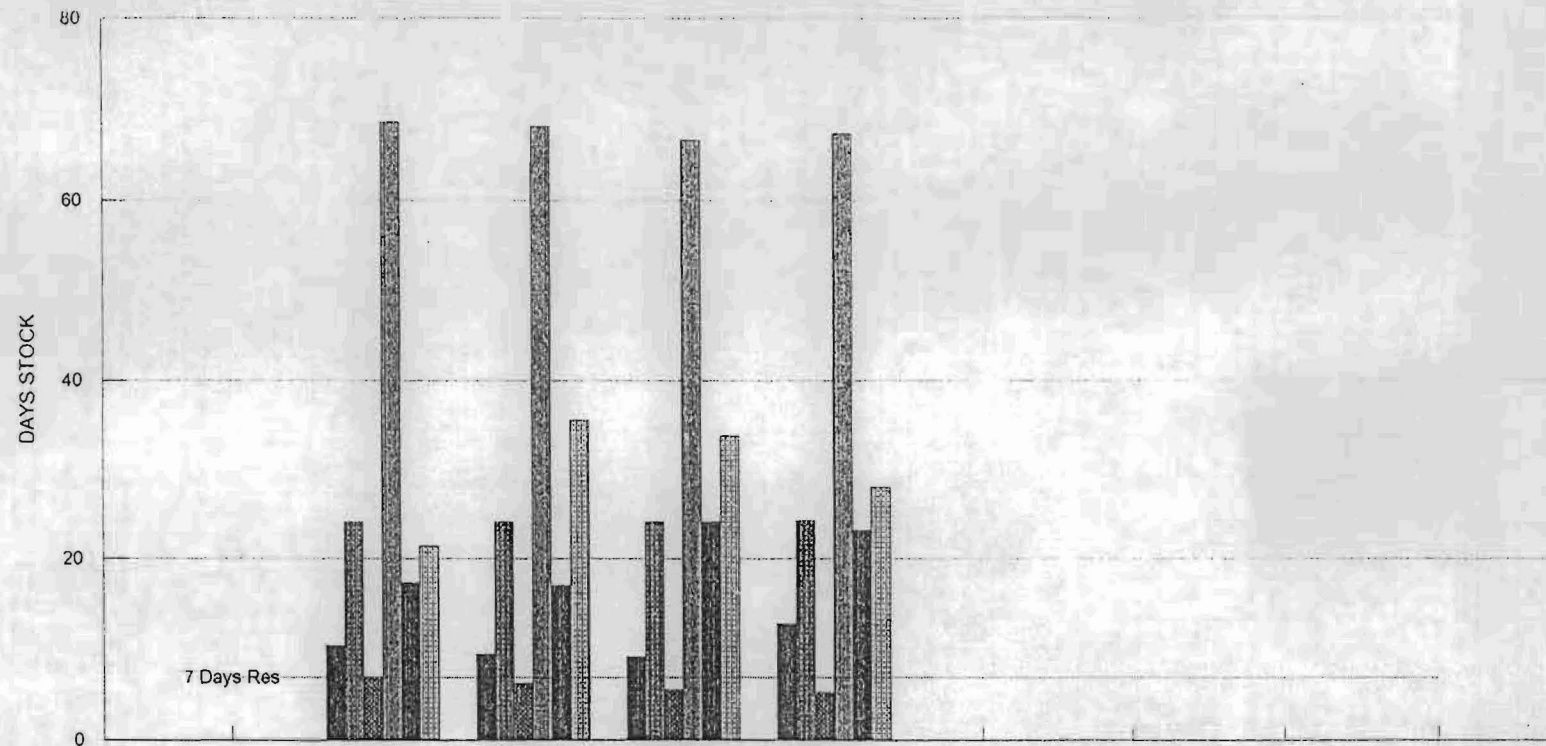

1. **GEN SITUATION**. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. SECTOR 4A (N) REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE SEEN PATROLLING IN CYANIKA DP CAMP. IN MUKO IT WAS OBSERVED THAT NORMAL ROUTINE ACTIVITIES AMONG LOCALS HAD SUDDENLY STOPPED, AN INDICATION OF PERHAPS FEAR OF RPA WHO HAVE SINCE DEPLOYED IN THE AREA. THIS HAS CAUSED AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF IDPs WILLING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES OF ORIGIN.

B. IN SECTOR 4A HQ, PATROL BASE AT MUNINI REPORTED THAT AT 0500 HRS 15 RPA SOLDIERS ARRESTED AN EX-CPL (RGF) AND THREE OTHERS FROM GASARE GR 490977. AT NOON SAME DAY FOUR DEAD BODIES WERE FOUND AT KAMANA VILLAGE GR 509965.

C. REFERENCE OUR DAILY SITREP OF 30 DEC 94, PARA 1B. PLEASE AMEND TOTAL NUMBER OF LOCALS MURDERED AT KABARE GR 7170 AND RUBUMBA IN SECTOR 2 TO READ 8 AND NOT AS EARLIER REPORTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR. 27 REFUGEES WERE PICKED UP FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822 TO KIGALI. 61 LOCALS RECEIVED MED ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE.

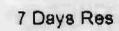

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 25 DEC TO 31 DEC 94.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY STABLE:

A. AT ABOUT 0326 HRS, 25 DEC 94, CPL SMITH SCOTT F, CANADIAN CONTINGENT (CANCON) HOME UNIT 3 COMMANDO, CANADIAN AIRBORNE REGIMENT, CFB PETAWAWA, ONTARIO, WAS THE VICTIM OF A SINGLE GUNSHOT WOUND TO THE HEAD FROM A C7 RIFLE. THE WOUND WAS SELF-INFLICTED. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO CANCON MIR AND WAS PRONOUNCED DEAD BY LCOL SCOTT, MED PL CMDRE. THE INCIDENT UNDER INVESTIGATION.

B. IN SECTOR 3 MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI ARE INCREASING WEEKLY.

C. MILOBS SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT AT KIRARO DP CAMP 400 DPs ATTENDED AN INFORMATION RALLY. DURING QUESTION TIME THEIR MAIN CONCERN WAS ON SECURITY AT THE HOME COMMUNES. THEY COMPLAINED ABOUT RPA MALTREATMENT AND BRUTALITY IN THEIR HOMES OF ORIGIN.

D. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT DPs IN NYARUSIZA CAMP GR 5220 COMPLAINED OF THE INHUMAN TREATMENT BEING METED OUT TO LOCALS WHO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. THEY MENTIONED THE ARREST AND BEATING OF ONE MR MARIGANDE AND THE KILLING OF ONE MUGISHA AND RWAJEKERA IN NOV 94 TO SUPPORT THEIR REFUSAL TO RETURN HOME.

E. OP RETOUR COMMENCED ON 29 DEC 94.

F. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED A NOT-TOO-STABLE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR. MILOBS ATTRIBUTED THIS TO RAIDS CONDUCTED BY INSURGENTS IN NYAMASHEKE AREA GR 9841 EARLY HOURS OF 29 DEC 94.

G. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT DISCOVERED FOUR MASS GRAVES AT MWIYANIKE GR 4518. THE GRAVES CONTAINED A TOTAL OF 19 BODIES.

H. GHANBATT PATROL BASED IN RUNYOMBI REPORTED THAT DPs AT BUSANZE CAMP HAVE BEEN ASKED BY THE LOCAL AUTH AND RPA TO ABANDON CAMP FOR SECURITY REASONS. SAME PATROL ALSO REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 602 BURUNDI NATIONALS IN THE CAMP.

I. ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS DEPLOYED ITS TROOPS IN MUSEBEYA GR 3933, RUKONDO GR 5538, MUSANGE GR 5247 AND AT CYANIKA GR 562203 AND HAS SET UP A ROAD BLOCK ON THE ROAD TO RUKONDO. AS A RESULT OF THE UNWILLINGNESS OF IDPs TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOMES, AN RPA MAJOR ORDERED THE CLOSURE OF THE CYANIKA DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AND STOPPED THE AICF FROM GIVING OUT ANY FOOD TO THE IDPs. THE ISSUE WAS RESOLVED AFTER A

PROTRACTED NEGOTIATION BETWEEN ZAMBATT CONTINGENT COMMANDER AND RPA AND AICF. THE RPA COMMANDER HAS GIVEN THE NGOS TWO DAYS IN WHICH TO FINISH THE DISTRIBUTION EXERCISE AND THERE AFTER THE DPs MUST MOVE.

(C) IN SECTOR 2, RPA DENIED ENTRY TO UNHCR PROTECTION OFFICER INTO GASHORA ON 26 DEC 94. RPA TROOPS INSISTED ON SEARCHING THE VEHICLE.

(D) RPA TROOPS IN NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 SECTOR 4C WERE REPORTED TO HAVE EXCHANGED FIRE WITH ABOUT 25 INSURGENTS FROM THE ISLE OF IJWI ON 29 DEC 94. NO RPA CAS KNOWN. IN WHAT MAY BE A SEPARATE INCIDENT, RPA REPORTED KILLING 16 PEOPLE ON LAKE KIVU ON 28 DEC 94 IN NYAMASHEKE.

(E) RPA COY COMD AT GAFUNZO ESTIMATED THAT ATTACKS BY FORMER RGF/INTERAHAMWE WERE ONLY HARASSING IN NATURE. THEY HAVE INCREASED THEIR PRESENCE AND PTLS IN THE GAFUNZO GR 8935, BUGEZA GR 9244 AND GAHABWA GR 9142 AREAS. RPA ALSO CONFIRMED BEING FIRED ON WITH SMALL ARMS FROM THE DIR OF ZAIRE.

(2) **FRGF**

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT 2 PEOPLE WERE KILLED IN THE AREA OF LAKE KIVU ON 22 DEC 94. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE VICTIMS WERE KILLED AT MURURU GR 8233 AND A SUM OF 53,900 RWANDESE FRANCS STOLEN BY FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS.

(B) IN SECTOR 4C FORMER RGF/INTERAHAMWE CONDUCTED FOUR RAIDS ON LOCAL BUSINESSMEN IN KAGANO COMMUNE. ALL THE ATTACKS OCCURRED SIMULTANEOUSLY AT ABOUT 0130HRS 31 DEC 94. IT WAS SUSPECTED THAT THE ATTACKS WERE CARRIED OUT BY ONE LARGE GROUP WHICH SPLIT ITSELF INTO SMALL GPS FOR SEPARATE TGTS. ATTACKERS TOOK AWAY EVERYTHING THEY COULD LAY HANDS ON.

(C) RPA HAS CONFIRMED THAT THE REGULAR ATTACKS ON CIV TGTS IN SECTOR 4C WERE BY ELMS OF THE FRGF FROM ZAIRE. INSURGENTS WERE SEEN IN RGF UNIFORMS. THEIR WPNS INCLUDED SMALL ARMS AND GRENS. THERE WERE THREE OCCASIONS WHERE THE ATTACKERS MOUNTED HMG ON BOATS EQUIPPED WITH OUT-BOARD MOTORS. ATTACKERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE STOLEN COWS AND FOOD SUPPLIES.

(3) **MILITIA**

(A) IN SECTOR 3, TWO OLD LADIES FROM BUHORO WERE ATTACKED BY BANDITS BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM KIBEHO DP CAMP. THE OLD LADIES SUSTAINED SERIOUS MACHETE WOUNDS.

(B) TWO PERS ATTACKED A WOMAN AT RUKOGULI GR 8514 IN SECT 4C ON 30 DEC 94. THE VICTIM WAS TAKEN TO CYANGUGU HOSP AND CLAIMED SHE RECOGNIZED ATTACKERS AS NEIGHBOURS FROM HER VILLAGE. TWO OTHER LADIES FROM KIZURA GR 9304 REPORTED THAT THEIR HUSBANDS WERE KIDNAPPED ON 30 DEC 94 BY 5 MEN WHO WERE NEIGHBOURS BEFORE THE WAR. THE SAME GROUP OF 5 WERE LATER SEEN AT BUGARAMA. LOC OF HUSBANDS STILL UNKNOWN.

B. **OWN ACTIVITIES**

(1) **UNAMIR**

(A) NORMAL ROUTINE WORK WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) THE FORCE COMMANDER RETURNED FROM LEAVE ON THE 23 DEC 94. HE MET SEVERAL DIGNITARIES AND SENIOR MILITARY STAFF OFFICERS TO DISCUSS MATTERS RELATING TO THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA AND OPERATION RETOUR.

(C) ON 31 DEC 94, FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SECTORS 3, 4A, 4B, 4C AND 5 AND ADDRESSED TROOPS. HE WISHED ALL THE TROOPS A HAPPY NEW YEAR.

(D) A TOTAL OF 563 DPs HAVE SO FAR BEEN MOVED FROM CYANIKA CAMP TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES SINCE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE OPERATION.

(2) **SECTOR 1 (NICOY).**

(A) PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY SITUATION IN BYUMBA ENVIRONS.

(B) A COMBINED WORSHIP WITH OWN TPS/LOCALS WAS HELD IN BYUMBA CATHOLIC/PROTESTANT CHURCH IN COMMEMORATION OF BIRTH OF CHRIST ON 25 DEC 94.

(C) IN KIVUYE, THERE IS REPORTED LACK OF DRUGS AND HOSP EQPT. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE IS AN ALARMING SPREAD SKIN DISEASES AND DYSENTERY AMONG CHILDREN.

(D) IN MUHURA GR 305086 PATROL OBSERVED THAT MOST RETURNEES IN THE COMMUNE HAVE NO HOMES AND FOOD. THE MEDICAL CENTRE RUN BY AN NGO ECHO TOOK CARE OF ABOUT 400,000 PEOPLE. IN BUZARURA GR 3908 THE MEDICAL CENTRE WAS NOT FUNCTIONING. IT WAS ALSO OBSERVED THAT A LOT OF AGED PEOPLE WHOSE CHILDREN WERE KILLED DURING THE WAR DO NOT HAVE RELATIVES TO LOOK AFTER THEM AND ORPHANS WERE SEEN ROAMING ABOUT IN THE AREA FOR LACK OF PARENTAL CARE.

(E) A TOTAL OF 455 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE DURING THE WEEK.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

(4) SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(A) TWO OLD LADIES WERE INJURED BY BANDITS AT BUHORO GR 5710 (SECT 3) ON NI 24 DEC 94. THE TWO WOMEN, ONE AGED 70, SUSTAINED SERIOUS MACHETE INJURIES WHEN BANDITS ATTACKED THEM. THE BANDITS TOOK AWAY 4 COWS, BLANKETS, BAGS OF BEANS AND 6,000 FRANCS. MESSRS KAPERUKA WESEIMANA KALISTE, MUSINBU GIMANA AND GASTON INNOCENT BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM KIBEHO DPs CAMP WERE SUSPECTED. CAS HOSPITALIZED AT BUTARE.

(B) A PATROL SENT TO GISAGARA GR 8113 REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION IS STILL CALM AND THE PEOPLE HAVE RETURNED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES. LOCALS ARE BUSY WITH FARMING ACTIVITIES AND PUPILS AT THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS ARE INCREASING IN NUMBER AS COMPARED TO THE PAST WEEKS. ANOTHER PATROL TO RUNYINYA GR 6011, MUTTORO GR 5710 AND MAMBA GR 5514 REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION WAS CALM AND MANY HOUSES WERE STILL UNOCCUPIED.

(C) MALICOY PL AT MUSANGO, PATROLLED MURAMA AND REPORTED THAT LOCALS AND AUTHORITIES IN MENTIONED AREAS WERE HAPPY TO RECEIVE ABOUT 500 PERS INTO THE NIAKAGO COMMUNE.

(D) TREATED A TOTAL OF 179 PATIENTS AND VACCINATED 689 LOCALS AT KIGEMBE, RUNYINYA AND RUHANGO.

(5) SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) ON 261300B DEC 94 A BANDIT WAS ARRESTED BY PATROL TEAM AT NKUMBURE VILLAGE GR 420205. HANDED OVER TO THE OFFICE OF PROSECUTOR IN GIKONGORO ON 270900B DEC 94.

(B) TROOPS FROM CHARLIE COY DONATED FOOD ITEMS TO THE ORPHANAGE AT RWAMAGANA.

(C) ON 29 DEC 94, UNREO REPRESENTATIVES, AN INTERPRETER AND FIVE DPs FROM CYANIKA DP CAMP VISITED KANZENZE AND GASHORA COMMUNES ON OP RETOUR.

(D) PATROL BASE AT RUHUHA GR 061446 (SECT 2) ASSISTED ICRC TO BUILD TENTS FOR REFUGEES.

(E) ON 30 DEC 94, SUNRAY GH 2, MILOBS AND GOVT REPS ATTENDED OP RETOUR MEETING WITH NGO REPS IN SECTOR 2 TO COORD PREPARATION FOR THE RECEPTION OF IDPs IN SAKE GR 4454.

(F) ASSISTED A NUMBER OF PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD.

(6) **SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAM BATT)**. CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) ON 27 DEC 94 THE PREFECT OF GIKONGORO AND MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND ENERGY ADDRESSED LOCALS THAT THE PROBLEM THE GOVT WAS STILL FACING WAS THAT OF HAVING NO MONEY. HE ALSO ADDRESSED CIVIL WORKERS AT MUSEBEYA COMMUNE. OWN TROOPS PROVIDED SECURITY DURING BOTH MEETINGS.

(B) A TOTAL OF 805 PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF DURING THE WEEK.

(7) **SECTOR 4B (FRAF BATT)**. CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) ICRC DISTRIBUTED FOOD ITEMS TO LOCALS AT MABANZA WHILE ADRA ALSO DISTRIBUTED FOOD AID TO WORKERS OF SEWERS FOR CLEANING THE ROAD BETWEEN MABANZA AND GITARAMA.

(B) RECEIVED THE VISIT OF THE FC AND SENEGALESE'S ARMED FORCES DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF ON 31 DEC 94.

(C) PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 130 CIVILIANS DURING THE WEEK.

(8) **SECTOR 4C (EHTIOBATT)**. CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE PTLs IN AOR.

(A) ESCORTED A UNHCR CONVOYS CARRYING A TOTAL OF 1006 DPs FROM VARIOUS AREAS IN SECTORS TO KITABI. ALSO TRANSPORTED 20 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI GR 7624 TO TRANSIT CAMP AT NYAGATARE.

(B) DONATED 1348 US DOLLARS TO CYANGUGU PREFECTURE FOR THE UPKEEP ORPHANS.

(C) TREATED A TOTAL OF 98 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(9) SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CARRIED OUT PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES THROUGHOUT THE SECTOR.

(A) LOCALS IN KAGANO GR 5841, NKUMBA GR 6639 AND KIDAHU GR 7047 CELEBRATED CHRISTMAS EVE. LOCALS ALSO IGNORED THREATS OF ATTACK BY FRGF TROOPS FROM ZAIRE.

(B) MASS GRAVES WERE LOCATED NEAR REKURA GR 8014. THEY CONTAINED 11 DEAD BODIES. NEAR MBOGO GR 8112, UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF DEAD BODIES WERE LOCATED IN A WELL.

(C) AT SHYORONGI 25 PEOPLE WERE IMPRISONED BY THE BOURGEMESTER FOR KILLING A CHILD. A WOMAN ALSO REPORTED THAT HER HUSBAND HAD BEEN ARRESTED AT GISENYI SINCE 26 DEC 94 BY THE BUHIRA COMMUNE COUNCILLOR.

(D) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 619 RWANDESE PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(10) SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CARRIED OUT VEH PTLS AND PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ALL UN INSTALLATIONS WITHIN THE SECTOR. REGIMENTAL MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED A TOTAL OF 1,433 CIVIL PATIENTS AT CLINIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(11) MILOB GP HQ. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO UNREO AND NGOS.

(A) POLITICAL.

I. POLITICAL INFORMATION CAMPAIGN REPORTED TO BE ONGOING IN SELECTED DPCS IN SECTOR 4A. DPs CONTINUED TO QUESTION THE SPEAKERS ABOUT THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND EXPRESS FEARS ABOUT RPA MALTREATMENT AND BRUTALITY.

II. RPA LOCAL COMD AND BOURGEMESTRE OF NSHILI MET ABOUT 6,000 IDPs AT THE BUSANZE CAMP. THE OFFICIALS DISCUSSED SY SIT WITH THE DPs AND ADVISED THEM TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES.

(B) **BORDER**. THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST.

I. GATUNA, TABAGWE AND KAGITUMBA BORDER POST.

II. RUSUMO BORDER POST.

III. RUSIZI BORDER POST IN SECTOR 4C.

(C) **IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA**. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR.

I. CLINIC AT RUSHAKI REPORTED TO HAVE NO QUALIFIED DOCTOR AND TREATS 150- 200 PATIENTS PER DAY. PATIENTS ARE CURRENTLY TREATED BY A MED ASSISTANT. CLINIC LACKS DRUGS AND NEEDS ASSISTANCE.

II. BOURGEMESTRE OF RUSHAKI AND RUGARAMA COMPLAINED OF LACK OF TRANSPORT TO MOVE FOOD SUPPLIES FROM KIGALI TO THEIR SECT. DUE TO THE STATE OF THE ROADS, ICRC HAS WARNED THAT THEY WILL SOON STOP THEIR SUPPLY OF FOOD TO THE AREA.

III. PTLs TO GAHINI REPORTED THAT A GERMAN MED TEAM WITH ASSISTANCE FROM ITALY, HAVE COMPLETED RENOVATION WORK ON GAHINI HOSP. OUTBREAK OF MEASLES WAS ALSO REPORTED IN KIZIKURO COMMUNE.

(D) **IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO**. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR DURING THE WEEK.

I. SECTOR MILOBS PRESENTED DONATIONS TO THE ORPHANAGES AT KIBUNGO AND GITARAMA.

II. LOCALS IN RILIMA, GASHORA, SASA AND NYAMOTO WERE NOT WILLING TO TALK TO MILOBS, PROBABLY DUE TO THE INCREASED PRESENCE OF RPA SOLDIERS IN THE AREA DUE TO PREPARATION FOR OP RETOUR.

(E) **IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA**. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN KIGOMA, GISHAMVU GR 6505 AND NYAKIZU GR 5796 IN PREPARATION FOR OP RETOUR. THE SITUATION IN THE AREAS PATROLLED WAS REPORTED NORMAL.

(F) **IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.**

I. SECTOR MILOBS ON OP RUBY PATROLLED KAMANA, MUNINI AND BUSANZE DPs CAMPS. THE NUMBER OF DPs IN THE CAMP ARE: KAMANA 21,150, MUNINI 19,500 AND BUSANZE 11,300.

II. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED NEW MILOBS ON FAMILIARISATION TOUR OF MUSANGE (5147), JENDA (5345) KADUHA (4768) , MUKO (3841) AND MUSABEYA (3933). AT RUKONDO, IT WAS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 10,000 PERS ATTENDED A MEETING ORG BY THE GOVT INFORMATION TEAM. MOST DPs EXPRESSED THEIR UNWILLINGNESS TO RETURN BECAUSE OF THE UNCERTAIN SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

III. NDAGO CAMP IS REPORTED TO HAVE AN ESTIMATED POPULATION OF 61,000, WHILE MUNINI CAMP HAS A POPULATION OF 20,000.

IV. SECTOR MILOBS LIAISED WITH NGOS AND PARTICIPATED IN OP RETOUR.

(G) **IN SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE.** MILOBS INVESTIGATED THE PRESENCE OF 139 IDPs IN THE NYAMISHABA CAMP ON 29 DEC 94. IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT THE IDPs WERE EVAC FROM CYANGUGU ON 26 DEC 94 BY UNHCR. ANOTHER 140 IDPs WERE EVAC FROM CYANGUGU TO NYAMISHABA CAMP (KIBUYE) BY UNHCR DURING THE PERIOD.

(H) **IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.** MILOBS CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. OBSERVED LOW BORDER CROSSINGS AT RUZIZI AND BURUNDI BORDER POINT DURING THE PERIOD.

I. SECTOR MILOBS ATTENDED A CONF OF UNREOs. AT THE CONF UNHCR GAVE DETAILS OF REHAB PLAN FOR AN EXPECTED NUMBER OF RETURNEES AND REFUGEES INTO RWANDA OVER THE NEXT SIX MONTHS. THE PLAN WAS BASED ON OPEN RELIEF CENTRES IN EACH COMMUNE.

II. REPORTS FROM LOCALS AND RPA/GOVT SOURCES IN BUGARAMA INDICATED THAT BURUNDI GOVT FORCES HAVE BEEN ENGAGED IN HEAVY CLASHES WITH A GUERILLA MOVEMENT APPARENTLY SUPPORTED BY FORMER RGF AND INTERAHAMWE. FIGHTING OCCURRED 24 AND 27 DEC 94, NO CAS FIGURES AVAILABLE. IT IS UNDERSTOOD THAT THIS GUERILLA FORCE IS EXPERIENCED AND HAVE BEEN RELATIVELY SUCCESSFUL IN ITS MISSIONS OF LATE.

(I) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. LOCALS AT BUSUMBA WERE REPORTED TO BE UNHAPPY ABOUT RPA ARRESTS AT NIGHT. PTLs ALSO LIAISED WITH IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS AND NGOS.

II. SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 120 IDPs FROM NYAMERAMIHIGO TRANSIT CAMP NEAR GISENYI TO MUTURA. 63 OTHER REFUGEES WERE ALSO REPATRIATED FROM GOMA (ZAIRE) TO GISENYI BY UNHCR.

(J) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI.

I. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AND AROUND KIGALI CITY. PTL REPORTED THAT CITY AUTH AND THE GOVT WERE WORKING OUT A PROCEDURE FOR HANDING OVER HOUSES TAKEN BY ILLEGAL OCCUPANTS TO THE RIGHTFUL OWNERS.

II. SECTOR MILOBS MET WITH HUMAN RIGHTS REPRESENTATIVE IN KIGALI WHO INFORMED THEM THAT THERE HAD BEEN NO REPORTED CASES OF HUMAN RIGHT VIOLATIONS IN KIGALI SECTOR DURING THE LAST MONTH.

(12) AUSMED THE SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(A) TREATED A TOTAL OF 305 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 52 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) FOURTH ROTATION OF SPECIALISTS AND FOUR NEW SURGEONS ARRIVED KIGALI.

(C) MEDICAL AND DENTAL CLINIC CONDUCTED AT KIBILIRA GR 5785. 22 MED PATIENTS TREATED AND 38 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE ATTENDED TO WITH 53 EXTRACTIONS.

(13) 1 CDHSR. THE REGT HELD A MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR CPL SMITH. HIS REMAINS WERE THEN FLOWN TO NAIROBI.

(A) SIGNALS SQN. CONTINUED TO WORK ON SIGNALS TRANSITION PLAN IN PREPARATION FOR THE RETURN OF ASSETS TO CANADA.

(B) 3 CSG. HAVE CLOSED LPO SECTION IN KAMPALA ON 26 DEC 94. CONTINUED TO PREPARE EQPT FOR REDEPLOYMENT TO CANADA.

(C) HUMANITARIAN. MOVED A NUMBER OF DPs TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES DURING OP RETOUR.

(14) AIR OPS.

(A) THE GENERAL SITUATION AT KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT REMAINS CALM, WITH NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS IN OPERATION.

(B) THE RWANDESE AUTHORITIES ARE PROGRESSIVELY SEEKING TO NORMALISE SECURITY AT THE AIRPORT. MEASURES INCLUDE TRAINING OF A DEDICATED AIRPORT POLICE FORCE (A BRANCH OF THE RPA), AND THE INSISTENCE ON PROPER VEHICLE AND AIRPORT PASSES.

(C) AUTHORITY TO APPROVE OVERFLIGHTS OF RWANDAN AIRSPACE HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM THE RPA AT THE AIRPORT TO THE RWANDAN MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT IN KIGALI CITY. IN GRANTING LANDING CLEARANCES, THE MINISTRY IS NOW FAVOURING THE REGULAR KIGALI AIRLINES (SABENA, ETHIOPIAN, LUFTHANSA AND AIR EAST AFRICA) BECAUSE THEY GENERATE REVENUE THROUGH THE USE OF AIRPORT SERVICES. THE MINISTRY IS INCREASINGLY NOT APPROVING FLIGHTS FOR OTHER EXTERNAL CHARITABLE CHARTER AIRLINES (MASS AND ECHO FLIGHT) BECAUSE THEY DO NOT USE AIRPORT SERVICES AND COMPETE FOR PASSENGERS WITH THE REGULAR CARRIERS.

(D) EXTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE RWANDAN TPT MINISTRY HAVE PROVED DIFFICULT, AND CONTINUED LIAISON IS NECESSARY TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FLIGHTS INTO THE COUNTRY. HOWEVER, ALTHOUGH 5 DAYS NOTICE OF AIR MOV IS NORMALLY REQUIRED, MINISTRY OFFICIALS HAVE BEEN PARTICULARLY HELPFUL IN GRANTING LATE CLEARANCES WHEN NECESSARY. OVERALL, NGO PASSENGER FLIGHTS HAVE CONTINUED, AND THE GERMAN AIR FORCE AND UNAMIR CARRIED OUT ONE PASSENGER FLIGHT EACH.

(15) UN MP COY

(A) ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE KIGALI AREA AND SECURITY SITUATION WAS NORMAL.

(B) ON 29 DEC 94, FIRE INCIDENT OCCURRED AT THE (KIGALI MP COY STORE) AS A RESULT OF ELECTRICITY SPARK IN THE MENTIONED STORE. MP PERSONNEL MOVED AROUND AND HELP PUT OFF THE FIRE AT ABOUT 1341 HRS.

(C) ON 30 DEC 94 AT 2030 HRS A GREN EXPLODED ADJACENT TO INDBATT TRANSIT CAMP AND 6 GUN SHOTS

WERE FIRED INTO THE TRANSIT CAMP LOCATED BESIDE AMAHORO STADIUM, KIGALI. ALL TROOPS IN THE AREA WERE PLACED ON STAND-TO AND A SEARCH OF THE AREA WAS CONDUCTED, WHICH MET WITH NEGATIVES RESULTS. RPA LO WAS CONTACTED AND IS INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT. NO CAS WAS REPORTED.

(D) **FPM REPORT.**

I. FORCE PROVOST MARSHAL VISITED THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR IN GIKONGORO TO CHECK ON THE PROCESSING OF THE 44 PERSONS DETAINED DURING OP HOPE. REAL PROGRESS HAS YET TO START BUT A SCHEDULE OF VISITS INCLUDING ONE TO THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE ON MON/TUE 2/3 JAN 95 AND THEN TO THE COMMUNES FROM WHICH THE DETAINEES CAME, HAS BEEN PLANNED. UNAMIR WILL PROVIDE TRANSPORT AND ESCORTS FOR THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR TO MAKE HIS VISITS - WHICH WILL START IN EARNEST ON MON 9 JAN 94.

II. DETAINEES WERE VISITED BY UN HRFOR TEAM ON 30 DEC AND FOUND STILL ABLE TO MIX WITH THE OTHER INMATES IN GIKONGORO PRISON. THERE ARE 30 MALARIA SUFFERERS AND 5 WITH DYSENTERY AMONGST THE TOTAL OF 143 INMATES; TREATMENT IS BEING PROVIDED BY ICRC. THE LATTER IS ASSISTING THE NEW GOVERNOR'S PROGRAMME OF CLEANING AND IMPROVING PRISON AND ESTIMATED TOTAL CAPACITY OF THE PRISON AT ABOUT 500 WHEN THE PROGRAMME IS COMPLETED.

4. **UNCIVPOL**

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTORS.

B. SECTOR 6 CIVPOL ASSISTED NYAMIRAMBO GENDARMERIE BRIGADE KIGALI, TO INVESTIGATE THE THEFT OF PERSONAL PROPERTIES OF A HUMAN RIGHT STAFF. ALSO VISITED KIGALI PRISON AND WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE INCREASE IN DEATHS OF INMATES AT AN AVERAGE OF 5 PER DAY. THE PRISON OFFICIALS ATTRIBUTED THIS TO LACK OF SUFFICIENT FOOD AND MEDICAL CARE.

C. MONITORED THE RESETTLEMENT OF 233 IDPs FROM BUTARE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES IN KIGALI.

D. SECTOR 6 CIVPOL ALSO ASSISTED REMERA GENDARMERIE BRIGADE TO INVESTIGATE A CASE OF ARMED ROBBERY IN WHICH A UNAMIR STAFF WAS ROBBED OF HIS PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

E. THE CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER OF CIVPOL LED A TEAM OF

UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS TO GITARAMA AND BUTARE TO ACQUAINT THEMSELVES WITH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE MENTIONED AREAS.

J. ON 31 DEC 94 AT ABOUT 1230 HRS TWO STAFF OF WORLD VISION RWANDA HAD THEIR LIVES THREATENED BY TWO PLAIN CLOTHE MEN ARMED WITH A PISTOL AT CERELE SPORTIF KIGALI. KIGALI GENDARMERIE INVESTIGATING.

K. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHengeri NATIONAL TRAINING SCHOOL IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. ROUTINE IOM/UNHCR TRANSPORT OF IDPs WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE WEEK.

B. PLANNING FOR IDP REPATRIATION TO HOME COMMUNES FROM CAMPS IN SECTOR 4A CONTINUED AT THE TEMPORARY IOC IN THE AMAHORO STADIUM.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

7. LOGISTICS.

A. SUPPLY

(1) THE FUEL BAGS AND WATER STORAGE CONTAINERS HAVE ARRIVED AND DISTRIBUTION PLAN FOR BOTH IS BEING IMPLEMENTED.

(2) UNAMIR HAS GAINED THE USE OF A FUEL SERVICE STATION. THE STATION CONDUCTS RETAIL FUEL OPERATIONS OF BOTH PETROL AND DIESEL FOR UNAMIR VEHICLES UP TO TOYOTA LAND CRUISER SIZE VEHICLES .

(3) REFURBISHMENT OF THE TRAFIPRO WAREHOUSE SITE CONTINUES. ON COMPLETION THE SITE WILL HOUSE THE WAREHOUSE CURRENTLY SITUATED AT THE KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AND 3 CSG. IT IS TO BE AN INTEGRATED MILITARY AND CIVILIAN WAREHOUSE. THE SITE ALSO PROVIDES FOR 3 UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS WHICH WILL BE USED TO CONDUCT TRUCK AND CONVOY REFUELLING .

B. FOOD

(1) DISTRIBUTION OF 7 DAYS RESERVE OF BOTTLED WATER HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND THE DISTRIBUTION OF 7 DAYS COMBAT RATION PACK HAS COMMENCED.

(2) CHRISTMAS RATION SUPPLEMENTS HAVE BEEN CONSUMED, AND THOSE ITEMS REQUESTED BY ETHIOBATT WHO CELEBRATE

CHRISTMAS ON 7 JAN HAVE BEEN ORDERED .

(3) THE RESUPPLY OF FRESH RATIONS TO FRAFBATT WAS LAST WEEK COMPLETED BY ROAD. THE ROAD IS STILL DIFFICULT TO NEGOTIATE AND IS NOT RELIABLE. ACCESS BY BARGE FROM GISENYI STILL BEING PURSUED AS AN ALTERNATIVE .

C. **TRANSPORT**

(1) **BUSES**. THERE ARE A TOTAL OF 3 BUSES OPERATED BY BROWN & ROOT. OUT OF THESE, TWO ARE UNSERVICEABLE OR EFFECTIVELY INOPERABLE AS THEY REQUIRE DETAILED REPAIRS WHICH CANNOT BE COMPLETED DUE TO LACK OF PARTS. THIS IN EFFECT LEAVES ONLY ONE BUS, WHICH IS INADEQUATE. THE UNAMIR VEHICLE ESTABLISHMENT CONTAINS PROVISION FOR ONE HEAVY, FIVE MEDIUM AND 28 LIGHT BUSES. AS ADVISED BY THE CMCO, THE CTO HAS BEEN REQUESTED TO INITIATE URGENT STEPS TO PROCURE THESE BUSES TO SUPPORT THE MISSION.

(2) **BEDFORD TRUCKS**. THE BEDFORD FLEET OF VEHICLES CONTINUES TO BE A PROBLEM. AS PREVIOUSLY STATED, THE FLEET IS AT THE END OF ITS LIFE. UNAMIR IS AVERAGING IN EXCESS OF FIFTY TASKS PER WEEK (EACH INVOLVING MULTIPLE VEHICLES AND/OR TRIPS). THIS HAS STRAINED THE VEHICLE FLEET AND HASTENED ITS DETERIORATION. IT IS HOPED THAT SUITABLE TRANSPORT RESOURCES FROM UNOSOM, WHICH HAVE ALREADY BEEN REQUESTED THROUGH THE CAO, WILL BE FORTHCOMING IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

(3) **MATERIAL HANDLING EQUIPMENT (MHE)**. THERE IS A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF MHE WITHIN UNAMIR. EVEN WITH AN IMPROVED FLEET OF VEHICLES, TRANSPORT TASKING WILL BE INEFFECTIVE IF THERE IS NO MEANS TO LOAD OR UNLOAD VEHICLES, PARTICULARLY WITH HEAVY/OVERSIZE LOADS. GIVEN THAT THE UN TRANSPORTS JUST ABOUT ALL OF ITS GOODS INTO AND OUT OF MISSION IN SEA CONTAINERS IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT A HEAVY MHE CAPACITY BE OBTAINED .

D. **MAINTENANCE**

(1) REQUEST FOR LOA TO UNNY HAVE NOT YET BEEN ANSWERED AND MANY OF THE CONTINGENTS HAVE EXHAUSTED THEIR 30 DAYS STOCK HOLDINGS OF REPAIR PARTS THAT THEY BROUGHT WITH THEM FROM THEIR HOME NATIONS. APPROVAL TO PURCHASE SOME REPAIR PARTS HAS BEEN GIVEN BY CMCO TWO DAYS AGO . WHEN PROCURED, SOME VEHICLES WILL RETURN TO A SERVICEABLE CONDITIONS .

(2) THE MISSION REQUIRES A HEAVY LIFT RECOVERY VEHICLE. THIS HAS BEEN REPORTED A NUMBER OF TIMES AND THE MISSION STILL HAS NO HEAVY RECOVERY CAPACITY .

8. CASUALTIES. 1. (SEE PARA 1A).

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. NTR.

10. CONCLUSION. DESPITE THE SLOW START OF OP RETOUR, IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT IDPs WILL SOON TURN THEIR ATTENTION HOMEWARD WHEN THEIR SECURITY AT THE HOME COMMUNES IS GUARANTEED AND WHEN NGOs AND OTHER RELIEF AGENCIES OPERATING IN RWANDA SHIFT THEIR EMPHASIS FROM THE DP CAMPS TO THE HOME COMMUNES. THERE ARE INDICATIONS THAT THIS WILL BE THE CASE IN THE VERY NEAR FUTURE.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. GHANBATT PATROL BASED IN RUNYOMBI REPORTED THAT DPs AT BUSANZE CAMP HAVE BEEN ASKED BY THE LOCAL AUTH AND RPA TO ABANDON CAMP FOR SECURITY REASONS. SAME PATROL ALSO REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 602 BURUNDI NATIONALS IN THE CAMP.

B. ZAMBATT HAS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS DEPLOYED ITS TROOPS IN MUSEBEYA GR 3933, RUKONDO GR 5538, MUSANGE GR 5247 AND AT CYANIKA GR 562203 AND HAS SET UP A ROAD BLOCK ON THE ROAD TO RUKONDO. AS A RESULT OF THE UNWILLINGNESS OF IDPs TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOMES, AN RPA MAJOR ORDERED THE CLOSURE OF THE CYANIKA DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AND STOPPED THE AICF FROM GIVING OUT ANY FOOD TO THE IDPs. THE ISSUE WAS RESOLVED AFTER A PROTRACTED NEGOTIATION BETWEEN ZAMBATT CONTINGENT COMMANDER AND RPA AND AICF. THE RPA COMMANDER HAS GIVEN THE NGOS TWO DAYS IN WHICH THEY MUST FINISH THE DISTRIBUTION EXERCISE AND THERE AFTER THE DPs MUST MOVE.

ATTACKERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE STOLEN COWS AND FOOD SUPPLIES.

C. MILITIA. TWO PERS ATTACKED A WOMAN AT RUKOGULI GR 8514 IN SECT 4C ON 30 DEC 94. THE VICTIM WAS TAKEN TO CYANGUGU HOSP AND CLAIMS SHE RECOGNIZED ATTACKERS AS NEIGHBOURS FROM HER VILLAGE. TWO OTHER LADIES FROM KIZURA GR 9304 REPORTED THAT THEIR HUSBANDS WERE KIDNAPPED ON 30 DEC 94 BY 5 MEN WHO WERE FORMER NEIGHBOURS BEFORE THE WAR. THE SAME GROUP OF 5 WERE LATER SEEN AT BUGARAMA. LOC OF HUSBANDS STILL UNKNOWN.
