
1. The situation generally remained calm today.






4. C/S 5 further told us that the personnel had secured food and water and were settling for the night as all efforts to get RPA LO locally were in vain. This update was received on 302115 hrs.

5. With this development, the previous DO and UNAMIR LO to RPA who were then present proceeded to fetch Lt George (RPA LO to UNAMIR. Lt George on arrival, said the occurrence was inevitable because Maj Nicholson of Sup Log Cell has been warned previously that for the berge operations to continue, a written permit by the Minister of Defence (Rwandese) was required by the Local Bn Comd at Gisenyi but this demand was not taken seriously hence resulting in the detention of the persons involved.

6. Lt George however made contact with the Rwandese army commander (Col Samukaka) who promised to liaise with the RPA Bn Comd same night to secure release of the UNAMIR Staff.

7. Lt George further hinted that the Army commander has requested that a UNAMIR official (delegate) be brought to him on 01 Dec 94 for discussion on how to tidy up loose ends to prevent a re-occurrence.

8. As at 010530B Dec 94. The detained persons are yet to be released.





RRF was activated to go and investigate the situation and if necessary provide escort. On arrival on the scene, they found that UNHCR had already contacted RPA to provide them escort, in fear that presence of armed UN troops would cause alarm to the locals and RPA. Furthermore, UNHCR expressed their desire to have a direct means to the Operations cell in order for faster processing of traffic when assistance is required.
