SITREP COVERING PERIOD 071800Z JULY TO 080500Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN KIGALI CITY REMAINS NOT CHANGED. NO CASES OF INCIDENTAL SHOOTING IN THE DOWNTOWN REPORTED. KIGALI DWELLERS ARE ENGAGED IN IMPROVEMENT OF THEIR DWELLING-HOUSES. THE FIRST SIGNS OF SMALL BUSINESS ACTIVITY APPEARED IN THE CENTER OF KIGALI. SRSG IS GOING TO MEET REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TOMORROW. THE TUNISIAN CONTINGENT IS SCHEDULED TO LEAVE FOR NAIROBI TODAY BY AIR. THE REST OF GHANIAN TROOPS COMING FROM NERAMA IS EXPECTED IN KIGALI TODAY. THE AUSTRALIAN RECCE PARTY HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND THEY LEAVE TO NAIROBI TODAY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, THE DESIGNATED PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA WILL COME TO KIGALI NEXT WEEK. HE ASKED THE FRENCH COMMANDER TO PULL OUT FROM RWANDA AT THE END OF JULY. HQs FEEL THAT THE FRENCH SHOULD PULL FROM RWANDA AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE MEDICINES DU MONDE ANNOUNCED THEIR READINESS TO COME TO RWANDA AFTER FRENCH TROOPS WITHELDRAWAL. CONGO WILL SEND 40 PERSONNEL AS A SUPPORT OF OF TURQUOISE AND SENEGAL WILL REINFORCE THE OPERATION WITH 360 PERSONNEL. MR TWAGIRAMUNGU ASKED USA TO INTEGRATE 8,500 PERSONNEL PREPARED BY UN FOR UNAMIR WHICH COULD SPEED UP THE FRENCH RELIEF OPERATION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. THE RPF PRESSURE APPEARED IN THE SOUTH-WEST OF RWANDA DIRECTION BETWEEN GITARAMA AND RWAKIRA. THIS ADVANCE DISPLACED 25000 PEOPLE TO MABWANZA. RPF IS GOING TO ANNOUNCE AN UNILATERAL CEASE-FIRE VERY SOON.

B. RGF. RGF PRESENTLY CONSOLIDATES THEIR POSITIONS AND REORGANIZES THEMSELVES.

C. MILITIA. NO ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. THE NORMAL ROUTINE WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. STAFF BRIEF WAS HELD AT 1900 HRS. PREPARATIONS FOR THE EXPANDED UNAMIR FORCE CONTINUED. SRSG PLANS TO MEET RWANDESE GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES TOMORROW. FC ACCOMPANIED BY SOME STAFF MEMBERS IS GOING TO VISIT SELECTED PLACES IN KIGALI AREA TO ASSESS INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDED FOR UNAMIR.

B. UNOMUR. THE SITUATION IS CALM. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

C. GHANBATT. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTED DISPLACED PERSONS AT AMAHORO STADIUM AND KIA. CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIA GENERAL AREA AND ALONG THE RUNWAY FROM 2230 HRS TO 2330 HRS AND FROM 0400 HRS TO 0500 HRS.

- D. TUN FL. TUN CONTINGENT IS NOT LEAVING TODAY DUE TO SOME ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEM.
- E. MILOR. PLANNING AND PREPARATION FOR DEPLOYMENT UNDER THE NEW MANDATE CONTINUED.
5. UNGIVPOL. ALL ARE IN NAIROBI.
6. FRENCH COALITION MILITARY ACTIVITIES. THE FRENCH COALITION FORCES CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN THE WESTERN PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.
7. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. NO CHANGE FROM PREVIOUS SITREP.
8. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.
9. LOGISTICS. NO CHANGE FROM PREVIOUS SITREP.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. MEETING BETWEEN RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND SRSG WAS HELD AT GESINYI. TENSION DECLINES BETWEEN RPF AND FRENCH COALITION FORCES. ITALIAN GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCED TO SEND THEIR TROOPS AS A PART OF FORCES PARTICIPATING IN OP TURQUOISE. MAURETANIA IS READY TO SEND FORTY MEDICAL PERSONNEL TO SUPPORT UNAMIR.

A. RPF IN KIGALI CITY THERE ARE MANY RPF MOBILE PATROLS. FOR THE MOMENT, PATROLS AND ROAD BLOCKS HAVE BEEN REINFORCED SINCE YESTERDAY IN THE CENTER OF KIGALI. INFORMATION REVEALS ARRIVAL OF IMPORTANT MILITARY CONVOYS OF RPF SOLDIERS SUPPOSEDLY FROM THE SOUTH-WEST OR NORTH-WEST.

B. REF. REINFORCEMENT OF THEIR POSITIONS, CHECK POINTS
AND ROAD BLOCKS REPORTED.

4. ~~OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.~~

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE STAFF WORK WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. PREPARATIONS FOR THE EXPANDED UNAMIR FORCE CONTINUED. THE ROUTINE STAFF MEETING WITH THE STAFF OFFICERS TOOK PLACE AT 0700 HRS. FC MET THE COMMANDER OF REF. THEY DISCUSSED ALL MATTERS CONCERNING OF STRUCTURE UTILIZING BY FUTURE UNAMIR UNITS. FC PLANS TO CONDUCT A RECCE OF AVAILABLE INFRASTRUCTURE IN KIGALI INCLUDING UNDO² EDIFICE WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO BE HANDED-OVER TO ALL NGOs ACTING PRESENTLY IN FHQ BUILDING. AUSTRALIAN MILITARY RECCE TEAM WERE BRIEFED ON CURRENT AND FUTURE UNAMIR'S ACTIVITY AND CARRIED OUT QUICK RECCE OF THE FOLLOWING HOSPITALS: KING FAISAL, ICRC AND KIGALI CITY.

B. UNOMIR: AREA OF OPERATIONS REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL FROM ENTEBE TO KIGALI. THREE HELICOPTERS ARE PRESENTLY OPERATIONAL.

C. GHANBAT: PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO DISPLACED PERSONS LOCATED AT KIA AND THE STADIUM. THE BATTALION MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED 42 DISPLACED PERSONS. 49 ALL RANKS ARRIVED TODAY TO KIA BY AIR. 86 REPORTEDLY GHANBAT TROOPS STAY THE NIGHT AT MERAMA AND 71 PERSONNEL IS EXPECTED TOMORROW ARRIVING BY ROAD.

D. TUN PL: TUN PL HAS HANDED-OVER THEIR TASKS TO GHANBAT AND AFTER COMPLETION THEIR MISSION, THEY ARE READY TO LEAVE TO NAIROBI TOMORROW BY AIR.

E. MILCB.

(1) CMO ACCOMPANIED SRSG TO GOMA TO MEET FRENCH AND RGF LEADERSHIP.

(2) THE AUSTRALIAN RECCO TEAM WERE BRIEFED ABOUT THE MISSION, CONCEPT OF OPERATION AND DEPLOYMENT PATTERN OF MILCB AT THE START OF THE MISSION. THEY WERE ALSO BRIEFED ABOUT THE PRESENT ROLE AND TASKS OF MILCB AND FUTURE DEPLOYMENT PLAN AS PER THE NEW UNAMIR MANDATE.

(3) PLANNING, COORDINATION AND THE MONITORING OF VARIOUS ACTIVITIES WAS CARRIED OUT. DUTIES PERFORMED TODAY ARE AS FOLLOWS:

(A) ESCORTED OFFICIALS OF MSF TO THE REFUGEE CAMP AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND ICRC HOSPITAL.

(B) ESCORTED PERSONNEL AND LOGISTICS CONVOY FROM KIGALI TO KAGITUMBA AND BACK.

(C) ESCORTED OFFICIALS OF HAC TO FETCH WATER FOR DISPLACED PERSONS FROM KABUGA.

(D) ESCORTED OFFICIALS OF HAC TO VISIT REFUGEE CAMPS AT NDERA.

(E) ESCORTED THE AUSTRALIAN RECCO PARTY TO ASSESS THE EXISTING MEDICAL FACILITIES AVAILABLE AT KING FAISAL, ICRC, AND KIGALI CITY HOSPITAL.

(F) ESCORTED INCOMING GHANA BATTALION FROM KAGITUMBA TO KIGALI.

(4) MILCB NOTED SEVERAL GROUPS OF REFUGEES RETURNING AND HERDS OF CATTLE BEING LED INTO RWANDA FROM UGANDA.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES ACTIVITIES. SESG VISITED GOMA AND HELD A MEETING WITH THE COMMANDER OF FRENCH COALITION. THEY CONTINUED THEIR HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN THE WESTERN PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

6. UNCIYPOL. ALL ARE IN NAIROBI AT THE MOMENT.

7. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FOLLOWING HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT TODAY:

(1) VACCINATION CAMPAIGN CONTINUED IN NDERA REFUGEE CAMP.

(2) NO FOOD OR WATER WAS DELIVERED TODAY DUE TO LACK OF TRANSPORT AND LACK OF RPF LOGS.

(3) HAC CONDUCTED RECCE OF PSF STORE IN MUHIMA. A TOTAL OF 40 TONS OF MEDICAL SUPPLY IS SUPPOSED TO BE STORED AT THE LOCATION. FURTHER RECCE WILL BE CONDUCTED AS SOON AS RPF LOGS OR GUIDES ARE AVAILABLE.

(4) SCHEDULED RECCE AND EVALUATION OF DAMAGE ON 13 WFP TRUCKS PLUS TRAILERS IN WFP STORE COULD NOT BE CONDUCTED DUE TO ABSENCE OF RPF LOGS/GUIDES.

(5) MEDEVAC FOR THE TWO WOUNDED JOURNALISTS PLUS 2 ACCOMPANYING JOURNALISTS HAS BEEN DELAYED UNTIL 08 JUL 94 DUE TO A SURGERY THE FEMALE JOURNALIST HAD TO UNDERGO TODAY.

(6) HAC RECOVERED TWO FORMER ELECTRO-GAZ EMPLOYEES FROM KABUGA REFUGEE CAMP AND TRIED TO CONDUCT RECCE AND EVALUATION OF DAMAGE AT CYAHAPI WATER PUMPING AND TREATMENT STATION. THIS WAS NOT ALLOWED BY RPF TROOPS IN PLACE BECAUSE OF LACK OF AUTHORIZATION AND ALLEGED MINE CLEARING OPERATION. ACCOMPANYING RPF LO ADVISED TO CANCEL MISSION.

(7) ICRC DELIVERED THROUGH KABALE 52 MT OF FOOD AND 452 JERRY CANS IN BURABI AND GITARE TO 4955 PEOPLE.

(8) ICRC DELIVERED THROUGH CYANGUGU 50 MT OF FOOD TO GIKONGORO.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 061800Z JULY TO 070600Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION THERE IS NO CHANGE OF SITUATION IN KIGALI AND REMAINED ABSOLUTELY QUIET. INFLUX OF REFUGEES FROM OUT SIDE KIGALI CONTINUES. LIFE OF KIGALI BECOMING MORE STABILIZED. HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ACTIVITIES ARE NOW MUCH EASIER THEN THE BEFORE. SRSG LEFT FOR GOMA THIS MORNING TO HOLD MEETINGS WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND COMMANDER FRENCH COALITION FORCE. AUSTRALIAN MILITARY RECCE TEAM WILL BE BRIEFED BY THE CHIEF OF OPERATIONS AND OTHER BRANCH HEADS ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES. KIA IS EXPECTED TO BE REOPENED TODAY. TWO FLIGHTS ARE SCHEDULE TO COME WITH THE FIRST BATCH OF GHANIAN TROOPS FROM ENTERBE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE PRESIDENT OF CHAD STATED THAT HIS COUNTRY IS READY TO SEND HIS TROOPS TO TAKE PART IN OPERATION TURQUOISE. BELGIAN GOVERNMENT HAS EXPRESSED THEIR WILLINGNESS TO REESTABLISH RELATIONSHIP WITH THE RWANDAN TEMPORARY GOVERNMENT. RWANDESE POPULATION HAVE MANIFESTED AGAINST THE BELGIAN INTENTION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. KIGALI CITY REMAINED UNDER FULL CONTROL OF RPF. THEY ARE BUSY WITH THE MOPPING UP OPERATIONS IN THE CITY AREA. NO MAJOR CHANGES HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THE NORTH. RPF ADVANCE WESTWARD IN THE SOUTH HAVE STALLED 10 KMS SHORT OF FRENCH FRONT LINE AROUND GIKONGORO.

B. RGF. RGF ARE PRESENTLY BUSY IN REORGANIZING. ELEMENTS OF RGF, THOSE HAVE FLED AWAY FROM KIGALI, ARE NOW REPORTED TO BE LOCATED AT 20 KMS NORTH WEST OF KIGALI.

C. MILITIA. NO ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. THE NORMAL ROUTINE WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. STAFF BRIEF WAS HELD AT 0700 HRS. PREPARATIONS FOR THE EXPANDED UNAMIR FORCE CONTINUED. SRSG ALONG WITH ACTING DFC LEFT FOR GOMA THIS MORNING TO HOLD MEETINGS WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND COMMANDER FRENCH COALITION FORCE. AUSTRALIAN MILITARY RECCE TEAM WILL RECEIVE A DETAIL BRIEFING FROM CHIEF OF OPERATIONS, HAC AND OTHER BRANCH HEADS ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES. THE FIRST BATCH OF GHANIAN TROOPS WILL ARRIVE TODAY.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 060600Z JULY TO 061800Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION IN KIGALI REMAINED QUIET FOR THE THIRD DAY WITHOUT ANY COMBAT. HOWEVER SPORADIC SHOTS WERE HEARD IN THE AFTERNOON IN GENERAL AREA EUGENOE, MACHINE GUN FIRE AT KICUKIRO AND SOUND OF GRENADE EXPLOSIONS IN KACYIRU NEAR THE MERIDIAN HOTEL. RPF STATED THAT THEY WERE CLEARING BOOBY TRAPS. INFUX OF REFUGEES FROM OUTSIDE KIGALI HAS OVER CROWDED ALL THE REFUGEE CAMPS IN KIGALI. UNAMIR PERSONNEL ARE STILL NOT ALLOWED TO MOVE IN KIGALI AREA WITHOUT RPF ESCORTS. FC WENT TO GOMA TODAY TO COORDINATE UNAMIR'S ACTIVITY WITH THE FRANCE COMMANDER AND RETURNED IN THE EVENING. SRSG MET MAJ GEN KAGAME THIS AFTERNOON. THE NORMAL ESCORT DUTIES FOR KAGITUMBA WERE CONDUCTED. AUSTRALIAN MILITARY DELEGATION HAS ARRIVED FORCE HQ THIS AFTERNOON.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SOUTH AFRICAN HEAD OF STATE MR JULIUS NYERERE AND FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU PROTESTED AGAINST THE PROTECTION ZONE. HE ALSO STATED THAT SETTLEMENT IN THE NEAR FUTURE WILL BE MADE BY THE TEMPORARY GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIME MINISTER WILL BE MR TWAGIRAMUNGU WHO WILL INCLUDE ALL THE PARTIES EXCEPT THOSE WHO PARTICIPATED IN CARNAGE OF PEOPLE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. KIGALI CITY IS NOW PATROLLED BY RPF SOLDIERS. BOTH RPF AND UNAMIR HUMANITARIAN CELLS ACCOMPANIED BY RESPECTIVE NGOS WERE ENGAGED IN RECCE OF FOOD WAREHOUSES LOCATED IN KIGALI AND ESCORTED FOOD CONVOYS TO THE DISPLACED PERSONS CAMPS. RPF PRESENTLY CARRYING OUT MOPPING UP OPS IN THE CITY AREA.

B. RGF. RGF ARE PRESENTLY REORGANIZING AT GESINYI. RGF STILL REPORTED TO BE LOCATED AT 20 KMS NORTH WEST OF KIGALI.

C. MILITIA. NO ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE STAFF WORK WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. PREPARATIONS FOR THE EXPANDED UNAMIR FORCE CONTINUED. THE ROUTINE STAFF MEETING WITH THE STAFF OFFICERS TOOK PLACE AT 0700 HRS. FC MET THE COMMANDER OF FRENCH COALITION FORCES THIS MORNING AT GOMA. THEY DISCUSSED ALL MATTERS CONCERNING OPTIONS AND PROCEDURES OF IMPLEMENTATION OF A HUMANITARIAN ZONE, CEASE-FIRE LINE ENFORCEMENT AND LOGISTIC SUPPORT. FC ALSO MET THE COS RGF IN THE AFTERNOON. IMPLEMENTATION WITH GENERAL MAJOR KAGAME TOMORROW.
AUSTRALIAN MILITARY RECCE TEAM ARRIVED FHQ THIS AFTERNOON.

B. IMCOMUGA. AREA OF OPERATIONS REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL FROM KIGALI TO ENTEBBE. 54 VEHs CROSSED THE BORDER INTO UGANDA FROM RWANDA WITH 611 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 320 REFUGEES. 46 VEHs CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH 176 PASSENGERS OUT OF WHICH 102 WERE REFUGEES. 14 DIFFERENT HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES ENTERED RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS. THREE HELICOPTERS ARE PRESENTLY OPERATIONAL.

C. GHANTRATT. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO DISPLACED PERSONS LOCATED AT KIA AND THE STADIUM. THE BATTALION MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED 35 DISPLACED PERSONS.

D. TEM RL. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND HOTEL MERIDIEN. ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. MAKING ALL ARRANGEMENTS TO LEAVE ON 08 JULY 94.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 051800Z JULY TO 060600Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THERE IS NO CHANGE OF SITUATION IN KIGALI. ENTIRE CITY IS UNDER CONTROL OF RPF TROOPS. INFLOX OF FORMER TUTSI INHABITANTS OF KIGALI STARTED RETURNING. CIVILIANS IN THE DOWNTOWN NO MORE CARRYING WEAPONS WITH THEM. LIFE OF KIGALI DWELLERS BECOMING MORE STABILIZED. IMAGE OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL IN KIGALI SEEMS TO BE GOOD, HOWEVER UNAMIR PERSONNEL IS STILL NOT ALLOWED TO MOVE IN KIGALI AREA WITH NO RPF ESCORT. RECCO TEAMS OF UNAMIR HUMANITARIAN CELL REPORTED THAT THERE ARE MANY OBSTACLES EVEN ON THE MAIN STREETS WHICH COMPEL THEM TO TAKE BYPASSES. HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ACTIONS ARE MUCH MORE EASIER SINCE RGF TROOPS HAD LEFT KIGALI AND THERE IS NO FIGHTING ANY MORE. INCREASING NO OF PEOPLE IN KIGALI CREATING LOGISTIC PROBLEMS FOR NGOS. MANY FORMER INHABITANTS, IMMEDIATELY AFTER COMING BACK TO THEIR HOUSES, BEGAN REPAIRING THEIR HOUSES. KIA IS GOING TO BE OPENED ON 8 JULY 94. FC LEFT FOR GOMA TODAY TO COORDINATE UNAMIR'S ACTIVITY WITH THE FRENCH COMMANDER. RGF IS NOW HAVING THEIR FRONT LINE 20 KMS NW OF KIGALI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE PRESIDENT OF REPUBLIC OF RWANDA SAID THAT ONLY ONE WAY TO PEACE IS TO STOP THE WAR FIRST AND THEN UGANDAN FORCES LEAVE RWANDA. ABOUT 5,000 PEOPLE HAVE DEMONSTRATED IN THE TOWN AGAINST THE BELGIAN PARTICIPATION IN OPERATION TURQUOISE AND UNAMIR. ACCORDING TO JOURNALISTS' STATEMENT BELGIAN GOVERNMENT HAVE EVER BEEN CLEARED BY INTERIM GOVERNMENT. RGF TRIES TO JUSTIFY ITS ATTITUDE AGAINST UNAMIR DISSEMINATING FALSE INFORMATION ABOUT ALLEGED HELP FROM UNAMIR TO RPF. RPF IS LIKELY TO ANNOUNCE UNILATERAL CEASE-FIRE AND INTEND TO FORM TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT ACCORDING TO THE ARUSHA PEACE ACCORD. RPF COMMANDER ACCEPTED HUMANITARIAN ZONE IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPE. KIGALI CITY IS UNDER FULL CONTROL OF RPF. RPF HUMANITARIAN CELL ALONG WITH UNAMIR AND NGOS HAS CONDUCTED RECCO OF WAREHOUSES IN KIGALI. SITREP COVERING PERIOD 051800Z JULY TO 060500Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THERE IS NO CHANGE OF SITUATION IN KIGALI. ENTIRE CITY IS UNDER CONTROL OF RPF TROOPS. INFUX OF FORMER TUTSI INHABITANTS OF KIGALI STARTED RETURNING. CIVILIANS IN THE DOWNTOWN NO MORE CARRYING WEAPONS WITH THEM. LIFE OF KIGALI DWELLERS BECOMING MORE STABILIZED. IMAGE OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL IN KIGALI SEEMS TO BE GOOD, HOWEVER UNAMIR PERSONNEL IS STILL NOT ALLOWED TO MOVE IN KIGALI AREA WITH NO RPF ESCORT. RECCE TEAMS OF UNAMIR HUMANITARIAN CELL REPORTED THAT THERE ARE MANY OBSTACLES EVEN ON THE MAIN STREETS WHICH COMPEL THEM TO TAKE BYPASSERS. HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ACTIONS ARE MUCH MORE EASIER SINCE RPF TROOPS HAD LEFT KIGALI AND THERE IS NO FIGHTING ANY MORE. INCREASING NO OF PEOPLE IN KIGALI CREATING LOGISTIC PROBLEMS FOR NGOs. MANY FORMER INHABITANTS, IMMEDIATELY AFTER COMING BACK TO THEIR HOUSES, BEGAN REPAIRING THEIR HOUSES. KIA IS GOING TO BE OPENED ON 8 JULY 94. FC LEFT FOR GOMA TODAY TO COORDINATE UNAMIR'S ACTIVITY WITH THE FRENCH COMMANDER. RPF IS NOW HAVING THEIR FRONT LINE 20 KMS NW OF KIGALI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE PRESIDENT OF REPUBLIC OF RWANDA SAID THAT ONLY ONE WAY TO PEACE IS TO STOP THE WAR FIRST AND THEN UGANDAN FORCES LEAVE RWANDA. ABOUT 5,000 PEOPLE HAVE DEMONSTRATED IN THE TOWN AGAINST THE BELGIAN PARTICIPATION IN OPERATION TURQUOISE AND UNAMIR. ACCORDING TO JOURNALISTS' STATEMENT BELGIAN GOVERNMENT HAVE EVER BEEN CLEARED BY INTERIM GOVERNMENT. RPF TRIES TO JUSTIFY ITS ATTITUDE AGAINST UNAMIR DISSEMINATING FALSE INFORMATION ABOUT ALLEGED HELP FROM UNAMIR TO RPF. RPF IS LIKELY TO ANNOUNCE UNILATERAL CHASE-FIRE AND INTEND TO FORM TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT ACCORDING TO THE ARUSHA PEACE ACCORD. RPF COMMANDER ACCEPTED HUMANITARIAN ZONE IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. KIGALI CITY IS UNDER FULL CONTROL OF RPF. RPF HUMANITARIAN CELL ALONG WITH UNAMIR AND NGOs HAS CONDUCTED RECCE OF WAREHOUSES IN KIGALI. THEY STATED THAT THEY HAVE NO INTENTION TO CAPTURE WHOLE COUNTRY. IT SEEMS THAT TROOPS HAVE STOPPED THEIR ADVANCE TOWARDS THE SOUTH OF RWANDA TAKING POSITIONS ABOUT 10 KMS AWAY FROM THE AREAS WHERE FRENCH TROOPS CARRY OUT THEIR OPERATIONS. 1. GEN SITUATION THE GEN SITUATION WAS QUIET IN KIGALI. THERE WERE NO EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE TWO FACTIONS IN KIGALI CITY HOWEVER SOME SPORADIC FIRE WERE HEARD IN THE OUTSKIRTS OF THE CITY. AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL OF RGF TROOPS FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KIGALI CITY IT IS NOW BELIEVED THAT KIGALI CITY IS UNDER FULL CONTROL OF RPF. SINCE RPF HAVE IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON UNMOs MOVE IN TO KIGALI CITY, SITUATION IN KIGALI IS NOT YET CLEAR TO US. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPF HAVE ALSO CAPTURED BUTARE IN THE SOUTH. THE NEW SRSG HAS STARTED HIS ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR. HE WILL BE BRIEFED BY FC, CHIEF OF OPERATIONS, HAC AND OTHER BRANCH HEADS ON VARIOUS ASPECTS OF UNAMIR ACTIVITIES LATER THIS MORNING. THE NORMAL ESCORT CONVOY LEFT FOR KAGITUMBA THIS MORNING WITH PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI VIA ENTEBBE. DPC LEFT FOR NAIROBI FOR ONWARD MOVE TO GHANA ON A SHORT LEAVE. A PLATOON FROM GHANIAN BATTALION LEFT FOR UGANDA TO ESTABLISH A TRANSIT CAMP AT ENTABEE AIRPORT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SPOKESMAN FROM THE FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTRY HAS STATED THAT OPERATION "TURQUISE" DID NOT NEED THE APPROVAL OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL TO ESTABLISH THE "SAFE HEAVEN" AREAS IN THE WESTERN PART OF RWANDA. THOSE AREAS WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE RESOLUTION 918 OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. IT IS NOW CLEAR THAT KIGALI IS NOW UNDER THE FULL CONTROL OF THE RPF. THE FORCES APPARENTLY TAKEN OVER THE CITY YESTERDAY AFTER DISLODGING THE RGF FROM THEIR REMAINING POSITIONS. INFORMATION ALSO REVEALED THAT RPF HAVE ALSO CAPTURED BUTARE IN THE SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY. REPORTS ARE CIRCULATING WIDELY OF RPF'S INTENTION TO ANNOUNCE A PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT. HOWEVER THIS INFORMATION HAS NOT BEEN CONFIRMED OFFICIALLY BY THE RPF. NO CHANGES IN DISPOSITION AROUND KUHENGURI.

B. RGF. AFTER THE PULL OUT OF TROOPS FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KIGALI OVERNIGHT THEY ARE NOW REPORTED TO BE LOCATED AT 20 KMS NORTH OF KIGALI AND INTEND TO MOVE FURTHER NORTH TOWARDS KUHENGURI. THEIR INTENTION FOR THE FUTURE BATTLE IS NOT CLEAR AT THIS MOMENT AS UNAMIR COULD NOT ESTABLISH ANY CONTACT WITH THE RGF MILITARY COMMANDERS. NO CHANGES HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THEIR DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 040600Z JULY TO 041800Z JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED TENSE ALL DAY. SINCE EARLY THIS MORNING, EVENTS MOVED VERY RAPIDLY WITH THE RPF TAKING CONTROL OF THE CITY BY MID MORNING AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL OF RGF TROOPS FROM THEIR POSITIONS OVERNIGHT. IT APPEARED BY THE AFTERNOON THAT THE RPF HAD ACTUALLY TAKEN UP POSITIONS ALONG A LINE DRAWN FROM ST MICHELLE CATHEDRAL ALONG KAJANGUE STREET TO THE VALLEY OF RUGEN VIA THE O.A.U. BOULEVARD. OWING TO RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED BY THE RPF, UNMOB COULD NOT ENTER THE CITY CENTER. THE RPF IS ALSO REPORTED TO BE CONDUCTING A HOUSE TO HOUSE CLEARING EXERCISE IN THE CITY CENTER. IT IS REPORTED THAT THE RPF HAS ALSO CAPTURED BUTARE IN THE SOUTH. THE NEW SRSB ARRIVED THIS AFTERNOON FROM NAIROBI. HE INSPECTED A GUARD OF HONOUR MOUNTED BY A DETACHMENT OF THE GRANA BATTALION. HE ALSO PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO SOME OFFICERS AND MEN AT A SHORT CEREMONY AFTER INSPECTING THE GUARD OF HONOUR.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE INTERIM GOVT ANNOUNCED THAT THE NEW ASSEMBLY TO BE MADE UP 70 MEMBERS WILL ONLY BE TEMPORARY. THEY FURTHER STATED THAT ALL THE PARTIES WERE REPRESENTED EXCEPT THE RPF.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. THE RPF TOOK CONTROL OF KIGALI CITY AND BUTARE EARLY THIS MORNING AFTER FOUR DAYS OF INTENSIVE EXCHANGES WITH THE RPF. THE RPF IS PROTESTING AGAINST THE FRENCH DECISION TO RESTRICT THEM FORWARD OF THE LINE GIKONGORO, KIBUYE, AND GISENYI. THEY SUSPECT THAT THE FRENCH ACTION IS DELIBERATE AND LIKELY TO INCREASE FRICTION BETWEEN THE TWO FACTIONS WHICH THEY INTERPRET AS AN ACTION TO HELP THE RGF. THE RPF IS THEREFORE SUGGESTING AN IMMEDIATE DEPLOYMENT OF UNAMIR ARMED CONTINGENTS TO REPLACE THE FRENCH TROOPS IN ORDER TO AVERT ANY CONFRONTATIONS WITH THE FRENCH. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT THE RPF MAY ANNOUNCE A GOVT SOON IN VIEW OF THE MILITARY VICTORY IN KIGALI. THEY HAVE ALSO STATED THAT THE RESTRICTIONS ON THE MOVEMENT OF UNMOB IN THE MULINDI AREA WILL BE LIFTED SOON. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THE NORTH. THEIR MORALE IS HIGH IN VIEW OF THEIR MILITARY SUCCESSES.

THE FC HELD A MEETING WITH THE SENIOR STAFF OFFICERS AT 1200 HRS TO DISCUSS THE NEW DEVELOPMENTS. THE NEW SRSG MR SHAHRYAR M. KHAN ARRIVED THIS AFTERNOON. HE INSPECTED A GUARD OF HONOUR MOUNTED BY A DETACHMENT OF THE GHANA BATTALION AFTER WHICH HE PRESENTED MEDALS TO SOME OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE FORCE HQ. THE DFC AND CMO VISITED THE TROOPS LOCATED AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM.

CONTINUED TO COORDINATE MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL FROM KIGALI TO ENTEBBE. 49 VEHs CROSSED THE BORDER INTO UGANDA FROM RWANDA WITH 208 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 37 REFUGEES. 43 VEHs CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH 689 PASSENGERS OUT OF WHICH 573 WERE REFUGEES. FOUR DIFFERENT HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES ENTERED RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS. THREE HELICOPTERS ARE PRESENTLY OPERATIONAL.

C. GHABATE. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO DISPLACED PERSONS LOCATED AT THE KIA AND THE STADIUM. THE BATTALION MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED 62 DISPLACED PERSONS.

D. TUM PL. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND HOTEL MERIDIEN. ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

E. MILOB. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND THE MONITORING OF VARIOUS ACTIVITIES WAS CARRIED OUT. DUTIES PERFORMED TODAY ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) ESCORTED MSF PERSONNEL TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.
- (2) CARRIED OUT ESCORT DUTIES FROM KIGALI TO KAGITUMBA AND BACK. ALSO ESCORTED LOGISTIC CONVOY AND NEW SRSG TO KIGALI.

On 28 June a journalist was shot in the leg at the Meridien Hotel. He was evacuated to Nairobi yesterday.

The UNAMIR Force Commander met with the UN Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda and UN Heads of Agencies yesterday. They stressed the following points:

although the full impact of the French presence/intervention cannot be fully ascertained at the moment, the immediate effect is a an improvement of overall operations.

- UNAMIR troops from Australia and Canada, as well as equipment, will start arriving next week. This will boost UNAMIR's operational capacity.

- there is a need for UNICEF, as lead UN agency for children, to give guidance regarding unaccompanied children. This will involve assisting the children and developing a strategy for assessing the situation.

A meeting between the UN Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda, the Force Commander for UNAMIR, the French Force Commander and the Head of the Humanitarian Cell for the multi-national force taking part in "Operation Turquoise" is taking place in Goma (Zaire) today.

UN/NGO Advanced Humanitarian Team in Kigali reported that :

- there are plans to prepare a displaced camp at the Kigali Golf Course (at the rear of King Faisal Hospital). People will be transferred to this camp from King Faisal Hospital, Amohoro Stadium and Kigali Airport. This camp will accommodate approximately 15,000 people.

- the Extended Programme of Immunization (EPI) will begin at Ndera tomorrow.

- the communities at Ndera, Kabuga and Amohoro Stadium have teachers who would like to re-establish schools. Education kits are needed.

there is an estimated 5,000 displaced persons in and around Ste Famille church.

The RPF wrote a letter to the ICRC requesting that they move from the ICRC hospital in Kigali. The reason they gave was that the hospital is on the front line of fighting. ICRC transferred 45 patients from ICRC to King Faisal Hospital under UNAMIR protection on 28 June.

The UNICEF/WHO/RPF needs assessment in RPF controlled areas has completed its data collection. Eight of the RPF controlled camps were

visited: Ruhango, Nyamata, Rwanagana, Kayanza, Rutare, Ngarama, Tabagwe and Kidaho. Preliminary findings revealed the following:

- the situation is very fluid - Ruhango camp is currently being evacuated by the RPF with people being moved to Nyamata.
- the percentage of women, elderly men and children in the camps is very high. In Ruhango 95% of the population is female. There is a low percentage of under fives, suggesting high mortality rates among young children.
- the Mother and Child Health (MCH) system has collapsed. Drugs and equipment are in short supply. The major causes of mortality and morbidity in southern Rwanda are malaria, malnutrition, and diarrhoeal diseases. In the northern highlands, acute respiratory diseases are common. War wounds are rarely seen outside the limited health facilities; this is probably due to high mortalities among the wounded.
- protein-energy malnutrition is widespread, especially in Ruhango and Rwanagana. At least 3,800 children are in need of therapeutic feeding and another 9,200 people need supplementary feeding in the camps visited. A large number of breastfeeding mothers require supplementary feeding.
- although most of the sources provide good quality water, shortages of clean water still exist. Some areas have water supply systems, but they require maintenance due to damage and neglect.
- although the whole population is affected by the violence seen in the last few months, children are especially vulnerable to psycho-social trauma. There are nearly 12,000 unaccompanied children in orphanages or foster homes in seven of the eight camps visited.
- the vast majority of people have lost a family member, and/or had their homes and possessions destroyed.

UNICEF reported that a meeting was held yesterday in Byumba (at the RPF's request) to discuss policy and strategy for unaccompanied and traumatized children.

MSF Goma (Zaire) reported that about 1000 Tutsis have crossed the border in the last few days. MSF Burundi reported that Bujumbura is quiet. Most of the people who fled to Bujumbura during the last weekend have since returned to their homes.

The UN/NGO Advance Humanitarian Team in Kigali reported that:

- mortars hit the market in Kigali, killing three and injuring seven civilians. A shell hit the Eglise Pentecostal killing two persons, half an hour before the AHT arrived to deliver food.
- there is a need for anti-malarial drugs.
- the Extended Programme of Immunization (EPI) for Ndera commenced yesterday.
- the RPF stressed the urgency for a food delivery for the displaced at Ndera.

ICRC reported that a mission travelled from Cyangugu to Kibuye to Musange to Gikongoro and back to Cyangugu again. They were accompanied by guides from each of the districts they travelled in. The Kibuye Prefect was not cooperative and as a result the team was unable to assess the situation in and around Kibuye. There were a lot of checkpoints, but none were manned by militia. Between Gikongoro and Cyangugu there was only one check point. A number of people are travelling to Butare (for shopping) which is quiet with an operating market. There are approximately 120 French soldiers guarding Cyangugu camp (8,000 displaced persons). ICRC made the following estimates regarding the displaced population in the areas they travelled in:

Gikongoro Prefecture (estimated 250,000 people)

Musange (sub-prefecture Kaduha)	50,000
Karambo/Kaduha	23,500
Rugazi/Nyamiyaga	13,500

Sanza, 60 km from Kibuye, was the only place ICRC identified that has critical and immediate needs. The 5,000 displaced persons have not received food for two months and there is very severe malnutrition. Otherwise the whole region needs food, domestic items, medical supplies, and water and sanitation facilities. The following NGOs are working in the region : ICRC (medical and food), CRS/ Caritas (food), TROCAIRE (medical) and Rwandan Red Cross (medical and domestic items).

MSF reported that they are sending two more people to Kigali. MSF will now have 15 staff members in Kigali who will work at King Faisal Hospital, Amahoro Stadium and ICRC hospital. The ICRC hospital is very overcrowded with 100-150 people arriving per day. The King Faisal Hospital water and electricity supply works twenty four hours a day. There are 300 patients in King Faisal Hospital.
