 5. Food supply: Differentiation between Germans and Poles to be clearly established. Poles to receive only the food which they earn by their work.
 6. Jews forbidden to use railways.
 7. Careful handling necessary of deportation of Poles to Germany because of propaganda in U.S. 'Gentle' pressure possible through withdrawal of unemployment benefits.
 8. Two possible methods of procuring Polish labour for Germany: Surround the village and forcibly remove population, or withdraw unemployment benefits.
 9. Jews in the Reich no longer to be moved to General Government but to be transported to French North African Colonies, which the French Government will have to hand over to Germany for that purpose.
 10. General Government to be clear of Jews within a short space of time.
 11. Description of Conditions in Ghetto of Lowicz.
 12. "Greater severity indicated towards Jews in Lublin."
 13. "FRANK speaking at the 'Administrative Academy' in Berlin: 'A Problem which occupies us particularly are the Jews'"
 14. "The Polish State has been destroyed once and for all."
 15. FRANK announces that after the recall of KRUEGER (Senior SS and Police Leader in the General Government) the latter's successor must be subject to the authority of Secretary of State HUEHLER, as Head of the Government.
