SUBJ: INFOSUM 25 NOV 94

1. DURING THE 24 NOV, CANADIANS PARTICIPATING IN OP HOMEWARD WITNESSED ACTS OF BANDITRY BY RPA SOLDIERS. UPON LEAVING KADUHA CAMP (477432), TRUCKS WERE STOPPED AND 12 X BIKES, 1 X MATTRESS, 3 X RADIOS AND 2 X WHEEL BARROWS WERE TAKEN FROM DP'S IN THE UNHCR AND IOM VEHICLES. 1 X BICYCLE WAS TAKEN FROM THE CDN CONVOY. THE REASON GIVEN WAS THAT THE OWNERS HAD NO PROOF OF PURCHASE, ALTHOUGH THE DP IN THE CDN CONVOY DID PRODUCE A RECEIPT. AN RPA SOLDIER CHECKING A CDN TRUCK PRODUCED A GRENADE IN FRONT OF THE DP'S AND TWICE DROPPED IT IN THE BACK OF THE TRUCK. 1123 DPS WERE MOVED THIS DAY. THIS ACTION CAUSED FEAR AND PANIC.

2. ON THE 25 NOV OP HOMEWARD RETURNED TO KADUHA CAMP. WORD OF THE RPA'S BANDITRY HAD SPREAD AND ONLY 16 DP'S WERE WILLING TO GET ON THE TRUCKS. THE BUTARE RPA LO VISITED KADUHA CAMP AND TALKED TO THE LOCAL RPA SOLDIER IN CHARGE SGT SHERIFF NINJA. ASSURANCE WAS GIVEN THIS TYPE OF BEHYVIOR WOULD NOT BE TOLERATED AND WOULD NOT CONTINUE IN THE FUTURE. THE ARTICLES TAEN WERE THEN RETURNED. THE RPA LO THEN TALKED TO THE DP'S WHOM THEN FELT MORE COMFORTABLE WITH GETTING ON THE TRUCE+. APPROX 670 DP'S WERE MOVED THIS DAY.

3. COMMENT: SHOULD THIS TYPE OF BEHAVIOR CONTINUE, OP HOMEWARDS ABILITY TO ~~function~~ EFFECTIVELY WIL BE SE6IRELY HyHDEbed. ALTHOUGH THE PROBLEM HAS BEEN TEMPORARILY RECTIFIED, THIS TYPE OF BEHAVIOR IS LIKELY TO PERSIST IN THE FUTURE.


