WELCOME BACK AND BEST REGARDS.

PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT ON THE OCCASION OF THE VISIT TO RWANDA OF MRS. SADAKO OGATA, THE UNITED NATIONS HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES.

On the occasion of the visit to Rwanda by Mrs. Sadako OGATA, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees who had brought a special message from the UN Secretary General, the government of Rwanda is pleased to record its appreciation and high regard of the efforts and support by the International Community towards the reconstruction of the country.

The government reiterates its unflinching ^① determination to do everything possible to enable the safe return of all the Rwandese refugees, in the letter and spirit of the Bujumbura declaration. No efforts will be spared to ensure that every Rwandese enjoys equal right to citizenship and protection by the government. The return of all the Rwandese is without preconditions and this right is inalienable whatever the circumstances. ^②

It is on this basis that when Rwandese nationals in Zaire were expelled under humiliating conditions, the government employed great effort despite our immense limitations to ensure that all those expelled were safely and conveniently settled into their homes. The number of persons that crossed at Cyangungu and Gisenyi were 7,268 and 5,079 respectively. Of the total number of 12,347 ^③ persons expelled from Zaire, only 42 persons were separated from the rest at the borderpost of Cyangungu, while the number for Gisenyi was 205 persons. The separation was a safety precaution as 123 of those separated were soldiers of the former army and they have after screening been taken to Gako military Training Centre for a reintegration program. Among those separated were 55 criminals that were in jail in Goma and the rest were suspected criminals of genocide. The total number of persons (69) being held for suspected involvement in genocide constitute about 0.6% of all those expelled.

Within 4 days all the returnees had been settled in their properties, with the support of UNHCR, UNAMIR and other members of the international community. These organisations have followed the returnees into their areas and are working with the government to help these persons to start a new life.

In anticipation of further repatriation, reception centres at the border have been reinforced with the involvement of UNAMIR, UNHCR and other organisations so as to receive and provide basic services to returnees. These centres will remain open and are to be further strengthened to receive more returnees. The Rwanda government appeals to all its nationals who are outside not to lose this momentum. Furthermore and where necessary due process of law will be followed under international monitoring. This together with the on-going strengthening of the judiciary constitutes supplementary guarantees that there is no arbitrary arrest.

The population that had settled on properties of other persons has been mobilised to vacate them for their legitimate owners and any disputes over property are being handled by special committees at the various levels of government.

All these efforts made towards safe return and reintegration of returnees is paying off dividends as is evidenced by the rising numbers of persons returning voluntarily from Tanzania, Burundi and Zaire. From Burundi alone over 30,000 have repatriated voluntarily, most of them spontaneously over the last two months. It is expected that most of the 100,000 to 150,000 still in Burundi will have repatriated by the end of the year.

The government is developing further mechanisms in collaboration with the UN System and other members of the International community to ensure that more people can be comfortably received in large numbers.

- X Similarly the government is soliciting for the support and involvement of the international community in seeking innovative ways of expediting the healing process of the society and national reconciliation. This process is possible once all the Rwandese nationals are settled in Rwanda and are actively involved.

X The Government of Rwanda wishes to take this opportunity to thank the High Commissioner Madame Sadako Ogata and the UN Secretary General Dr. B.B. Ghalibegović for their manifest interest and untiring efforts in seeking solutions for the problems of Rwanda and Rwandese refugees.

PRESENTATION DE L'ASSOCIATION "RWANDA POUR TOUS" ET SES
PREOCCUPATIONS MAJEURES SUR L'EVOLUTION SOCIO-POLITIQUE
RWANDAISE

1. Présentation de l'association

RWANDA POUR TOUS est une association de réflexion, d'analyse, de proposition, de pression et de prise de position sur l'évolution de la situation rwandaise dans la perspective d'une société pluraliste et non violente, respectueuse des droits de la personne et des valeurs démocratiques au Rwanda.

RWANDA POUR TOUS est né le 18 juin 1995 de l'initiative d'un groupe de rwandaises et de rwandais issus d'horizons socio-professionnels divers voulant réfléchir sur les voies et moyens d'engager leur pays, sortant d'une guerre et de massacres innombrables, dans une évolution positive.

Les membres sont conscients des difficultés et des entraves de tous ordres que le pays devra vivre et endurer avant d'arriver à une situation plus ou moins normale.

Les membres du groupe de fondation partagent des valeurs communes qui les ont amenés à créer l'association.

1° Les valeurs démocratiques et le respect de la personne :

Chacun des membres dans son parcours individuel et social s'est engagé auparavant et continue aujourd'hui à s'y employer (engagement dans les ONG, dans les associations des droits de la personne, dans les partis politiques, ...) à la recherche de l'autonomie et à l'épanouissement du citoyen.

Les membres recherchent à contribuer à l'instauration d'un cadre institutionnel démocratique, consensus où tout citoyen se retrouve, quels que soient son ethnie, sa région, son sexe, sa confession religieuse.

2° La recherche du compromis et le respect d'autrui

3° Le règlement pacifique des différends :

Le Rwanda est exsangue et RWANDA POUR TOUS s'indigne de tant de pertes en vies humaines et invite à une mobilisation pour que cela cesse. Les membres condamnent la violence sous toutes ses formes et prônent le dialogue pour régler les différends.

- 4° *Le refus de la bipolarisation ethnique et la recherche d'un avenir qui assurerait la sûreté et la sécurité individuelles.*
- 5° *La lutte contre la culture de l'impunité et contre la gestion totalitaire et démagogique du pouvoir exploitant l'ethnie.*

Le génocide des tutsi, les massacres des hutu par le FPR et les autres crimes contre l'humanité sont la conséquence néfaste de la négation du droit, la négation de la liberté individuelle et la négation de la justice.

RWANDA POUR TOUS n'est pas un parti politique. Il ne veut se substituer à aucun acteur politique. Il lutte plutôt pour que soit instauré un cadre institutionnel permettant aux acteurs sociaux mais aussi politiques d'exercer leurs prérogatives.

L'association ne prétend exercer un quelconque pouvoir politique, elle recherche plutôt à l'influencer dans le sens des objectifs de l'association.

RWANDA POUR TOUS ne défend aucun des camps ethniques, hutu ou tutsi. Il défend l'exercice des droits et des libertés du citoyen et la libre autonomie de l'individu. Il s'oppose avec force aux comportements d'exclusion à caractère ethnique car ils dévaluent l'aspiration à la démocratie.

2. Préoccupations majeures de l'association

RWANDA POUR TOUS est très fortement préoccupé par la situation d'impasse actuelle caractérisée par la fragilité de la base des tentatives de reconstruction nationale et l'absence d'horizons et de perspectives sûrs d'une société rwandaise pour tous les Rwandais.

a) Impasse sur le plan de la justice

Notre association n'a aucun doute sur le fait que la tradition d'impunité, la gestion démagogique du pouvoir et les manipulations ethniques ont été les facteurs déterminants de la tragédie rwandaise.

Ainsi, nous sommes convaincus que l'établissement de la lumière sur les responsabilités respectives dans ce drame, l'identification et le châtiment exemplaire de toutes les personnes y impliquées sont un préalable majeur afin d'envisager un avenir viable pour tous les Rwandais.

Cependant, l'exercice de cette justice est compliqué par plusieurs facteurs dont certains relèvent de la conjoncture même (manque de moyens humains et matériels, absence de sérénité et de confiance après tant de manifestations de haines, la lenteur et l'engagement douteux de la communauté internationale, ...) mais dont plusieurs autres sont dus à l'insuffisance de volonté politique ou à l'ancantissement d'éventuels efforts par l'existence d'un pouvoir occulte qui domine les pouvoirs apparents, surtout le pouvoir judiciaire.

Cet état de choses nous place devant une situation où plus d'un an après la mise en place d'un gouvernement à Kigali, aucun jugement n'a été prononcé par le Tribunal International et la justice rwandaise est inopérante.

Par contre, l'association déplore la persistance d'une justice militaire qui entraîne la multiplication des cas d'emprisonnements arbitraires, la surpopulation des prisons où les détenus survivent dans des conditions infra-humaines. En effet des détenus sont victimes de maladies diverses (gangrènes des membres, infections diverses, malnutrition...), de mauvais traitements, de mutilations par torture et meurent quotidiennement par plusieurs dizaines.

De plus, RWANDA POUR TOUS condamne la substitution à une justice transparente, de dénonciations injustes, de règlements de comptes, de disparitions, de traitements dégradants, d'assassinats politiques et de massacres d'innocents souvent sur des considérations ethniques. Il est particulièrement préoccupé par le durcissement croissant marqué par l'ancantissement de tentatives pour la mise en place d'un cadre politico-judiciaire, susceptible de condamner les coupables et de sécuriser les innocents. Ce durcissement se traduit par la militarisation des services administratifs et judiciaires, les actes d'intimidations de magistrats et d'acteurs politiques non partisans de l'arbitraire, ainsi que des discours officiels contre les concepts même de dialogue et de réconciliation qui contribuent à la globalisation de la culpabilité. Cette situation entraîne la compromission de l'indépendance de la magistrature, les emprisonnements arbitraires, les disparitions et les assassinats de magistrats, la paralysie des démarches pour la mise en place de la cours suprême, du conseil de la magistrature, ...

b) Impasse sur les conditions de vie de la population intérieure et le problème des réfugiés

RWANDA POUR TOUS est préoccupé par l'état d'insécurité au sens large du terme qui frappe la majorité des Rwandais que ce soit à l'intérieur du pays, que ce soit dans les camps des réfugiés, que ce soit dans les différents pays d'exil où ils se trouvent.

La militarisation à outrance, que le seul après-guerre n'explique, l'omniprésence des militaires dans les moindres recoins du pays à des fins d'intimidation, la neutralisation des échelons communaux, préfectoraux et nationaux de l'administration par de puissants services secrets militaires sont à la base d'un climat d'insécurité, telle que la population intérieure vit dans la peur et l'incertitude du lendemain. Ce climat entrave les activités économiques de la population sur les collines et freine le retour des réfugiés dans leur pays.

Dans les camps des réfugiés la liberté et la sécurité sont entravées par la persistance d'une main-mise de certains responsables politiques et militaires de l'ancien régime, dont certains ont été impliqués dans le génocide et les massacres. L'aide humanitaire, déjà insuffisante, ne saurait subvenir indéfiniment aux besoins des habitants de ces camps; des signes de nervosité de plus en plus perceptibles se manifestent dans la population autochtone des pays d'accueil des réfugiés; et l'impatience des responsables politiques de ces pays est une réalité. Plusieurs exilés ne bénéficient même d'aucune assistance car le HCR refuse de les reconnaître, même ceux qui sont reconnus dans certains pays ne reçoivent aucune aide. Tous ces éléments conjugués font qu'il y a beaucoup de victimes de l'insécurité en général, de la faim et des maladies en particulier. La situation des exilés s'avère intenable chaque jour davantage.

c) Impasse sur le plan des bases et des orientations politico-socio-économiques du pays

La place prédominante d'un pouvoir occulte, les pratiques d'intimidation, le noyautage des différents secteurs de la vie nationale par les militaires, le discours simpliste et globalisant et le refus des responsables politiques actuels d'affronter les vrais problèmes des rwandais, rappellent étrangement les pratiques du régime de Habyarimana. La mauvaise gestion d'une victoire militaire, l'utilisation du génocide pour éluder le débat politique, ainsi que l'exploitation du génocide à des fins de criminalisation globalisante, font douter de la volonté réelle du pouvoir actuel de rechercher la justice et la reconstruction nationale. L'arrêt de fait ou par l'intimidation de l'activité des partis, l'impossibilité d'existence d'une presse libre, à l'exception de la presse partisane du pouvoir, ainsi que l'absence de libertés individuelles et d'association sont par contre des indicateurs d'une volonté de

gestion totalitaire du pays. L'occupation anarchique des biens et des propriétés, l'absence d'un plan transparent d'installation des anciens réfugiés et l'ethnisation progressive du pays constituent des facteurs graves de conflits.

Compte tenu de ces facteurs, compte tenu du délabrement socio-économique du pays et de la menace d'une armée en exil, RWANDA POUR TOUS est préoccupé par l'insuffisance des efforts de clarification des orientations du pays et le risque entretenu d'une confrontation au détriment d'un règlement politique des problèmes.

**CALLS TO MR. EMMANUEL GASANA'S OFFICE IN CONNECTION WITH
COMMENTS ON THE SOMA REQUESTED FROM HIM**

Upon instructions from you, my secretary has made numerous telephone calls to Mr. Gasana's office and so far comments on the Status of Mission Agreement have not been forthcoming.

Calls were made on:

1. On 25 July. He was away on sick leave and no one was aware of the SOMA document.
2. On 27 July. He was still on sick leave.
3. On 28 July. Still on sick leave. His secretary promised to ask him to call UNAMIR whenever she spoke to him at his house. Nobody called back.
4. On 31 July. He was not in the office and a message was left again. Nobody returned the call.
5. On 1 August. He was out of the office and a follow-up call was made again in the afternoon at 5.45 p.m. He was not yet back in the office and another call was made again at 6.15 p.m. but no one picked up the phone.
6. On 2 August. He was out in a meeting and a message was left.
7. On 3 August at 8.10 a.m. He was not in. Another call was made at 11:00 a.m. and he was still in a meeting. A message was left, but nobody called back.
8. On 4 August. He was out of Kigali and was expected back on Monday, 7 August. A call was made on 7 August. He was at home. He was expected in the office in the afternoon. Another call was made in the afternoon (4:30 p.m.) and he was not in the office. He was expected back in the office the following day.
9. On 8 August (at 9:30 a.m.). He had not yet come to the office. The secretary did not know if he was going to be in the office that morning. Another call was made in the afternoon (5:20 p.m.). He was not in.

10. On 9 and 10 August. I called Mr. Gasana personally. I was told by his secretary that he was out of the country. I reminded her of the numerous follow-up calls we had made in regard to his promise to provide you with the Government's comments on the SOMA. Up to today, Friday, 11 August, no reaction has been forthcoming.

I would like to suggest that since Mr. Gasana made this offer to you personally, you might now call him directly.

NOTE

At the request of Ms. Pat Banks, UNREO, a meeting was held in the Force Commander's office regarding the forthcoming meeting in Geneva on measures to be taken regarding prison conditions in Rwanda.

Col. Shamir was invited to attend.

It was agreed that the prison situation could only be improved if it was approached on a two pronged way simultaneously. The justice system had to be made functional in order to expedite the release of innocent prisoners and the prisons themselves had to be brought-up to international standards.

UNAMIR could assist in the refurbishment and enlargement of prison facilities if given the equipment and supplies.

The Government could be persuaded to accept military barracks type of detention centers if these could be made acceptable for later military use. The Force Commander was particularly keen that the RPA demobilize soldiers in order to allow the Gendarmerie to assume responsibility for law and order in Rwanda.

It was also agreed that feeding and health facilities had to be substantially upgraded. ICRC was not providing food for prisoners held in cachots. These were not taken care of by their families since mostly were away from their communes of origin. The overcrowding had increased gangrene incidence as well as tuberculosis and other contagious diseases.

I informed Ms. Banks that Mr. de Souza would be attending and representing UNAMIR as well as DPKO.

SUBJECT: New Zealand Trust Fund Contribution:
Butare School for Demobilized Children

Firstly, attached you will find the budget for the repair of the Butare School for Demobilized Children. It comes to a total of US\$77,000.

The UK has made a direct pledge to UNAMIR of \$30,000. UNICEF has indicated that they have done what they can but that they can't complete the work at hand.

Mr. Khan indicated to Mr. Ouziel this morning to access the New Zealand contribution to the Trust Fund. Mr. Khan was advised by Mr. Hansen that he could do this when a project was of special interest to him and UNAMIR. In this connection during the Secretary General's visit, Mr. Khan discussed this project with the Vice President and committed to complete the work.

The funding required as indicated to you is of \$50,000.

I will appreciate it if you would inform Mr. Hansen of the above urgently.


Secondly, I would be very grateful if you would indicate to me which are Major-General Tousignant's projects which are awaiting funding from the Trust Fund. This will help this office in not overcommitting and also enable the SRSG to discuss with the Force Commander the relevant priorities.

Allowed to fly on United Nations aircraft

Government officials and members of the NGO community were authorized by the SRSG to avail themselves of UNAMIR flights. It must be recalled that during the first five months after the conclusion of the war, airport safety regulations made it impossible for commercial airlines to land at Kigali International Airport. Therefore, only UNAMIR flights connected Kigali with the outside world.

The SRSG considered essential for the political stabilization of Rwanda to allow Rwandese Government officials to use UNAMIR aircraft since this was the only available air transport out of the country. In the same manner and since NGOs were UNAMIR's partners in the emergency and rehabilitation assistance effort, it was considered essential that they also avail themselves of UNAMIR flight facilities.

Since the audit report was made, UNAMIR has changed procedures regarding the use of its aircraft by personnel other than United Nations officials. At the present time, NGOs are utilizing commercial flights, as are Government officials.
