INTELLIGENCE: TEAM OF CIVPOL/MILOBS PATROLLED RUNYINYA AND HUYE COMMUNES, AT RUNYINYA MR SIXBERT SENTOTORI - ASST BOUGAMASTER STATED TWO CLINICS IN THE COMMUNE AT RUNYINYA AND KABILIZI. KABILIZI CLINIC LACKS DRUGS. RUNYINYA CLINIC BEING RUN BY MSF, ORC EMPTY WITH DPS, GOING STRAIGHT TO THEIR SECTORS. SIX PRIMARY SCHOOLS BUT LACK QUALIFIED TEACHERS. POPULATION BEFORE THE WAR 50,000 BUT NOW NUMBER ONLY 15,000. INHABITANTS URGENTLY NEEDED HOES AND SEEDS FOR PLANTING. NGOS OPERATING IN COMUNE ARE WFP AND CARITAS WHO SUPPLY FOOD ITEMS. GEN SECURITY IN AREA CALM EXCEPT FOR SIX SECTORS NAMELY RAMBA, MPANDA, MBESA, KAMALA, GIKOMBE AND EBUHORO WERE BANDITS FROM KIBEHO DPCs ATTACK AND STEAL CATTLE OCCASSIONALLY.

B. AT HUYE COMMUNE BOUGAMASTER MR PHILIP MBALAGA STATED THERE WERE NO CLINICS IN COMMUNES. DPs GO TO THEIR HOMES STRAIGHT THAT 84 FAMILIES NUBERING 342 PERSONS WHO RETURNED FROM DPCs BUT HOMES DESTROYED HAVE BEEN ACCOMMODATED AT MUYOGORO CENTRE AND BEING CARED FOR BY OFFICIALS OF MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION. AN ORPHANAGE AT SUVU SECTOR HAS 250 INMATES AND UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF NGO TERRE DES HOMMES, THREE SCHOOLS OPENED BUT LACK TEACHING MATERIALS. THREE OTHER SCHOOLS NOT REOPENED BECAUSE OF DESTRUCTION AND NEED URGENT REPAIRS. ELECTRICITY SUPPLY LINES DESTROYED BY WAR NO PORTABLE DRINKING WATER. 1. GEN SIT. RELATIVELY STABLE ALTHOUGH THERE IS APPREHENSION AMONGST THE NGO CONCERNING THE SECURITY SITUATION EAST OF BUTARE-GITARAMA HIGHWAY. FURTHERMORE, EFFECT OF REPORTS OF KILLINGS IN MUYIRA (8639) (REF A) ON ATTITUDE OF DISPLACED PEOPLE IN CAMPS IS NOT YET KNOWN BUT WILL NO DOUBT ADVERSELY AFFECT THEIR SENSE OF SECURITY AND THUS THEIR WILL TO RETURN REGARDLESS IF ALLEGATIONS ARE PROVEN TRUE OR FALSE. FIRST INDICATOR OF WILL TO RETURN MAY BECOME APPARENT ON MONDAY 26 SEP WHEN OP HOMEWARD COMMENCES. COMMENT: FROM PREVIOUS HUMINT, A SENSE OF SECURITY IS CREATED BY UNAMIR PRESENCE. RECOMMEND AGGRESSIVE UN FLAG WAVING BY ARMED/MILOB PERSONNEL IN ALL AREAS PARTICULARLY WHEN RUMORS CIRCULATE WHICH ERODE TRUST IN RPA ABILITY TO PROVIDE SECURITY/LAW AND ORDER.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. ~~MUYIRA~~ N7R

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA. (1) RPA TROOPS HAVE CONTINUED TO MOVE INTO SECTOR 4 DURING THE PERIOD. PRECISE FIGURES ARE NOT AVAILABLE, BUT IT IS ASSUMED THAT THERE ARE NOW IN EXCESS OF 500 TROOPS IN SECTOR 4A, APPROX 300 IN 4B AND OVER 1000 IN SECTOR 4C.

(2) RPA CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN QUITE AGGRESSIVE THROUGHOUT SECTOR 3 AND 4, OSTENSIBLY FOR ARMS AND AMMUNITION. NUMEROUS PEOPLE HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND SOME REPORTS SUGGEST THAT IN SOME AREAS, LOCALS ARE CONGREGATING NEAR UNAMIR UNITS AT NIGHT AND RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES DURING THE DAY. ONE REPORT STATED THAT DWELLERS AROUND GAFUNZO (8035) WERE MOVING TO ZAIRE OUT OF FEAR OF THE RPA.

(3) INCIDENTS OF THE RPA IMPEDING PROGRESS OF UNAMIR VEHICLES HAVE DECREASED DURING THE PERIOD. THE UNAMIR HELICOPTER WAS DETAINED BY 4 RPA SOLDIERS ON 18 SEPT IN BUTARE. THEY DEMANDED AN APOLOGY FOR LANDING WITHOUT INFORMING THE RPA THAT IT WAS COMING. COMMENT IT IS CONSIDERED THAT THIS AND OTHER ISOLATED INCIDENTS ARE DUE TO THE POOR PASSAGE OF INFORMATION WITHIN THE RPA.

(4) ON 23 SEPT IN GIKONGORO, AN RPA SOLDIER KILLED TWO LOCALS WITH A HAND GRENADE. ONE OF THE VICTIMS HAD APPARENTLY BEEN IDENTIFIED BY ANOTHER LOCAL AS HAVING COMMITTED MURDERS DURING THE WAR. THE SOLDIER WAS DETAINED BY RPA BN HQ. COMMENT WHILE THIS MAY BE AN ISOLATED INCIDENT IT IS INDICATIVE OF THE EASE WITH WHICH AN INDIVIDUAL SOLDIER CAN ACCESS AMMUNITION AND HOW READILY THEY WILL USE THEM.

B. RGF. (1) PREVIOUS REPORTING FROM SECTOR 4C REGARDING RGF ACTIVITY HAS PROVEN TO INCLUDE SOME SPECULATION. SMALL ARMS FIRE IS HEARD REGULARLY IN THE AREA OF THE BORDER BUT SHOULD NOT BE ATTRIBUTED TO RGF ACTIVITY WITHOUT SOME TANGIBLE EVIDENCE. SIMILARLY, A REPORT IN THE UNAMIR SITREP 9-10 SEPT 94 STATING THAT THE RGF WERE SUSPECTED OF INVOLVEMENT IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT IN CYANGUGU WHERE TEN PERS WERE KILLED, PROVED TO BE WITHOUT SUBSTANCE FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION.

(2) THE INITIAL REPORT FROM CYANGUGU OF THE RGF RECRUITING ZAIRIAN YOUTH TO OBTAIN UNAMIR UNIFORMS (16 SEPT 94) AGAIN PROVED TO BE NOT QUITE FACTUAL. APPARENTLY ONE ZAIRIAN MALE REPORTED TO AN ETHIOPIAN SOLDIER THAT HE HAD BEEN APPROACHED BY AN RGF MEMBER IN BUKAVU WHO PROMISED TO PAY HIM IF HE COULD OBTAIN A UNAMIR UNIFORM. COMMENT WHILST THE INITIAL REPORT WAS SOMEWHAT EMBELLISHED, THE FACT REMAINS THAT THE RGF MAY WELL ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN UN UNIFORMS TO USE FOR INSURGENCY/SUBVERSIVE OPERATIONS.

C. MILITIA. OCCASIONAL INCIDENTS HAVE BEEN REPORTED CLAIMING INTERAHAMWE INVOLVEMENT. IT IS DIFFICULT THOUGH TO ATTRIBUTE INCIDENTS TO THE MILITIA AS RETRIBUTION AND LAND OWNERSHIP FEUDS ARE COMMON AT PRESENT.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. TACHQ: PRIMARY EFFORT DIRECTED TOWARDS OP HOMEWARD. NGO INITIALLY SCEPTICAL ABOUT CONCEPT OF OPERATION BUT THEY GRADUALLY ACCEPTED THE INITIATIVE AND DEVELOPED A TEAM SPIRIT. SPEED WITH WHICH OPERATIONS WAS IMPLEMENTED DID NOT ALLOW SUFFICIENT TIME TO IDENTIFY, IN QUANTITY THOSE PERSONS WISHING TO RETURN. CONSEQUENTLY, THE ANTICIPATED RATE OF MOVEMENT HAS BEEN DECREASED FOR THE FIRST WEEK. COMMENT: THIS REDUCED CAPABILITY FOR THE FIRST WEEK WILL ALLOW BETTER INTERFACE BETWEEN THE AGENCIES INVOLVED AND DEVELOP CONFIDENCE.

B. MILOB: CONTINUED ROUTINE PATROLLING HOWEVER THEIR EFFECTIVENESS WAS DIMINISHED BY A LACK OF VEHICLES. COMMENT: LACK OF VEHICLES NECESSITATES CREATIVE MEANS BE SOUGHT IN PROVIDING MOBILITY TO MILOB IE. TRAVEL WITH NGO, ETC.

C. MALAWI COY: REMAINS DEPLOYED WITH HALF COY IN GITARAMA AND REMAINDER IN BUTARE. CONTINUED TASKS OF (1) MANNING TCP ON GIKONGORO ROAD, (2) ASSISTING WITH SECURITY OF AT TACHQ (3) MOVING PEOPLE TO SECTOR 4A CAMPS TO SEARCH FOR RELATIVES AND (4) PROVISION OF SECURITY AT DISTRIBUTION POINTS. COY COMD EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT BEING AN ARMED PEACEKEEPER EMPLOYED BY UNARMED ELEMENTS OF UNAMIR. COMMENT: DIVISION OF COY CREATES COORDINATION PROBLEMS FOR COMD BUT THIS SHOULD BE RESOLVED WHEN MALI COY ARRIVES. EMPLOYMENT THOUGH OF MALAWI AND MALI COY BY MILOB COMD HOWEVER SHOULD BE EXAMINED AS A CONFLICT OF INTEREST COULD OCCUR/BE PERCEIVED.

D. BRITCON ENGR: RECCE ELEMENTS OF THIS FORCE OPERATED IN SECTOR 3 AND IN SECTOR 4A (SUPPORTING OP HOMEWARD). RESULTS OF THEIR RECCE/EFFORTS HOWEVER WERE

NOT MADE AVAILABLE TO THIS HQ. COMMENT: TO ADEQUATELY CONTROL SECTOR 3 AND 4, WE MUST BE PROVIDED WITH NOTICE OF UNITS OPERATING IN THESE AREAS. REQUEST YOU EMPHASIZE TO ALL UNITS THAT TACHQ BE ADVISED IN ADVANCE OF ANY ACTIVITY OCCURRING IN SECTOR 3 AND THAT TACHQ BE KEPT APPRAISED OF ACTIVITIES OCCURRING IN SECTOR 4.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. NOTHING TO REPORT BEYOND THAT ALREADY SUBMITTED BY MILOB IN SECTOR 3.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS: PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN BUTARE OPENED ON 22 SEP 94. MANY DEFICIENCIES EXIST WITHIN SCHOOLING SYSTEM HOWEVER RWANDAN GOVERNMENT APPEARS INTENT ON PROCEEDING REGARDLESS OF PROBLEMS.

7. LOGISTICS:

A. GENERATORS PROVIDED TO GHAN SUP PL/MALAWI COY AND AUS MED TMT SECT. QUALITY OF LIFE AND ABILITY TO FUNCTION SIGNIFICANTLY ENHANCED.

B. FIELD SERVICES WILL PROVIDE SECURITY LIGHTING TO TCP MANNED BY MALAWI SECURITY ELEMENTS. INSTALLATION DELAYED IN HAVING TO GAIN RPA AUTHORIZATION TO PROCEED WITH PROJECT.

C. GHAN SUP PL NOW SUPPORTING ALL UN AGENCIES/UNAMIR IN BUTARE WITH BASIC NEEDS FOR FUEL AND WATER. FURTHERMORE PL IS SUPPORTING SEVERAL AGENCIES WITH NON-POTABLE WATER INCLUDING THE LOCAL PRISON/DETENTION FACILITY.

D. PROVISION OF VEHICLES FOR MILOB TEAMS GENERALLY AND FOR OP HOMEWARD SPECIFICALLY REMAINS A PROBLEM. DESPITE RECOMMENDATION ABOVE THAT CREATIVE MEANS BE EMPLOYED TO ASSIST MILOB WITH MOBILITY, THE FACT REMAINS THAT MILOB CANNOT EFFECTIVELY PERFORM THEIR DUTIES WITHOUT ADDITIONAL VEHICLES FITTED WITH RADIOS; PARTICULARLY THOSE TEAMS INVOLVED WITH OP HOMEWARD.

E. DEFENSIVE STORES REQUESTED BY THIS UNIT HAVE YET TO BE APPROVED/DELIVERED. ALTHOUGH CURRENT SITUATION IS SUCH THAT SELF DEFENSE CAPABILITY MAY BE PERCEIVED AS MINIMAL, THIS SITUATION COULD CHANGE RAPIDLY AND NOT ALLOW STORES TO BE DELIVERED AND DEPLOYED IN A TIMELY FASHION.

F. ALL BUT ONE UNIT IN BUTARE DO NOT HAVE COLD STORAGE CAPABILITY FOR PERISHABLE FOOD STOCKS AND THUS HAVE BEEN LIVING ON FIELD/COMPO RATIONS SINCE ARRIVAL IN LOCATION. DIET THUS SEVERELY RESTRICTED.

G. NON-POTABLE WATER IS CURRENTLY BEING DISTRIBUTED BY SUP PL FROM LEAKING TANKS MOUNTED ON MLVW CHASSIS. REQUEST WATER TANKERS REPORTED DEPLOYED TO THEATRE BE DISPATCHED SOONEST OR THAT REPAIRS BE MADE TO CURRENT WATER TRUCK. IF REPAIRS CONSIDERED THEN TEMPORARY REPLACEMENT REQUIRED FOR WATER TRUCK.

8. MISC.

A. CDN SIGS DELIVERED U-CRTTZ TO THIS HQ AND ABILITY TO COMMUNICATE HAS SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVED.

B. RPA LO APPROACHED TO GAIN AUTHORITY FOR UNAMIR AIRCRAFT TO USE BUTARE AIRPORT. ANTICIPATE NO PROBLEM GIVEN RPA CLAIMS THAT UNAMIR FORCES HAVE UNRESTRICTED

ACCESS TO ANY AREA EXCEPT RPA FACILITIES AND AREAS WHERE
A SECURITY RISK IS PRESENT.

B. RGF. HELO RECON OF MSR FROM GIKONGORO TO CYANGUGU PAID PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO THE COUNTRY NORTH AND SOUTH OF THE MSR THROUGH THE NYUNGWE NATIONAL PARK. PURPOSE WAS TO ESTABLISH PRESENCE OR OTHERWISE OF RGF/MILITIA/BANDIT ELMS IN THAT AREA. THERE WERE NO INDICATIONS (CAMPS, GROUPS OF PERSONS, VEHICLES ETC) TO SUGGEST SUCH ACTIVITY. COMMENT IT IS CONSIDERED PROBABLE THAT PREVIOUS REPORTS OF LARGE NUMBERS OF BANDITS/MILITIA/RGF OCCUPYING THE PARK ARE THE RESULT OF PROPAGANDA IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS. THIS IS CORROBORATED IN PART BY THE MANY REPORTS FROM REFUGEES IN THE CYANGUGU AREA RECEIVED DURING PERIOD 28AUG-1SEPT.

C. MILITIA. THE BURGERMEISTER OF MUDASOMWA GR 4222 INFORMED GHANBAT THAT INTERAHAMWE MEETINGS WERE BEING HELD DURING THE EVENINGS AT THE REFUGEE CAMP AT THAT LOC. A KNOWN INTERAHAMWE SYMPATHIZER WAS REPORTED TO TRAVEL FROM RWAMIKO GR 4913 TO ATTEND THESE MEETINGS. GHANBATT IS PATROLLING THIS AREA.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. GHANBATT - INCREASED VIGILANCE IN PATROLLING. LOCALS ARE CAUTIOUS ABOUT RPA MOVING INTO SECTOR 4A TODAY.

B. FRAFBATT - NTR

C. ETHIOBATT - SOME REFUGEES IN THEIR AREA HAVE ASKED TO MOVE TO ZAIRE IF RPA ARE TO OCCUPY 4C. LOCAL ELDERS ARE ATTEMPTING TO DIFFUSE THE SITUATION BY TELLING THEM UNAMIR WILL PROTECT THEM.

D. TACHQ - THIS HQ HAS BEEN ATTEMPTING TO OPEN A LOCAL PETROL STATION AND IN AN EFFORT TO DO THIS WE BROUGHT THE OWNER(A FORMER PROFESSOR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF BUTARE) TO BUTARE FROM CYANGUGU. UPON ARRIVAL HE HAD TO SEEK REFUGE IN THE TACHQ FROM THE RPA. AFTER REPORTING THIS TO C/S O WE WERE TOLD TO HAND HIM OVER TO THE ICRC. ICRC TOLD US THEY WILL NOT HOLD PRISONERS BUT ONLY MONITOR THEIR TREATMENT. AS A RESULT THE PROFESSOR WAS RETURNED TO KIGALI LAST NIGHT. WE REQUEST DIRECTION REGARDING HANDLING OF INDIVIDUALS THAT SEEK REFUGE WITH UN TROOPS.

- THE DFC ARRIVED TO FACILITATE THE MOVE OF THE

PREFECT FROM BUTARE TO GIKONGORO. THIS COULD NOT BE DONE DUE TO THE UNAVAILABILITY OF THE PREFECT. HE WILL BE MOVED, BY THE MALAWI COY, TO GIKONGORO TODAY. ACCOMPANYING HIM WILL BE A PROTECTION PARTY OF 45 RPA SOLDIERS.
