**WEEKLY REPORT No. 10**

Covering period from 07.03., 06.00 hrs to 14.03.1994, 06.00 hrs

**1. General Situation:**

The mixed patrols (CIVPOL/Gend) are continued for increasing the security situation of the population of KIGALI. The situation has improved but there are still serious incidents.

**2. Other Activities:**

**2.1. Investigations:**

- 2.1.1. Concerning the arresting of the driver of the vehicle, which was full with ammunition, a team of CIVPOL was present, when the prosecutor took a statement with the suspect. (See miscellaneous 2.4.7 in the weekly report No. 9)
- 2.1.2. CIVPOL received a complaint of Adele RUGIGANA, including names of a gang of bandits who killed her brother in November 1993. She complains, that Gendarmerie arrested some suspects but also set some of them free. This matter is already under investigation by the prosecutor. CIVPOL is monitoring the investigations. (See Daily Rep.No. 22)
- 2.1.3. CIVPOL received a complaint of Mr. Faustin UWINTIJE, that he got an information that two (2) local gendarmes want to kill his brother. A statement was taken with UWINTIJE and CIVPOL will investigate. (See Daily Rep.No 23)
- 2.1.4. On 12.03.1994 there was a hand grenade attack in GITARAMA on the former Prime Minister Dr. NSENEYAREMYE Dismas. Nobody was not injured. CIVPOL is monitoring the investigation of the local GdN.

- 2.1.5. CIVPOL was investigating in the case of throwing three (3) hand grenades in the area of MYAMIRAMBO in the night from 31.1.1994 to 1.2.1994 (Sec/Det case Ref: 10/PIS/94). Only one grenade exploded. No persons injured. The vehicle No CB 1502 was damaged. The investigations disclosed, that NDIKUBANDI Jos alias NZANYWAYIANA has thrown the grenades. The suspected person was arrested by Gend/Nat and he is now at the prison in KIGALI.

The investigation team asked for a copy of the report No 15/CRI/NG-5B/KGL/94 done by the Gend of NYAMIRAMBO but the chief of the station refused to hand over a copy. The report was sent to the prosecutors office by Gend. (See Daily Rep.No. 24)

- 2.1.6. PMT Gend NYAMIRAMBO investigated together with Gend the following case:  
A patrol of three (3) Gendarmes (Corp. IYAMUREMYE, Corp. GAKWANDI and Gend. NAYBYENDA) arrested Mr MAJYAMBE Jean Bosco by unknown reason and stole from him 7.500.--US-\$. At the Post Office (black market) Gend secured 5.000.--US-\$. The three Gendarmes escaped. PMT is investigating. (See Daily Rep.No 24)

## 2.2. *Incidents:*

- 2.2.1. On 04.03.1994, at 21.30 hrs, a grenade exploded in the sector of REMERA, near the Petrorwanda-station at the hotel "Chez Lando". Three (3) persons injured. Further investigations by GdN REMERA. (See Daily Rep.No 21)
- 2.2.2. On 07.03.1994 at 23.00 hrs some unknown people tried to attack the residence of Mr. IYAMUREMYE, living in NYARUGENGE. The gendarmes who guarded the residence of the Minister of education (the neighbour house) shot a few of rounds in the air. Mr. IYAMUREMYE is the general secretary of the secret service and elected to take the place of Mr. GATABAZI (Minister of Minitrap). Nobody was injured or arrested. (See Daily Rep.No 22)
- 2.2.3. On 02.03.1994 in KACYIRU/REMER A area the men NTEYIRYAYO, RWAKAYIGAMBA, MUBILIGI went to the house trying to kill MULISA and NIYONSABA. The population of this area protected the attacked people and the three (3) men mentioned above were killed by somebody of the crowd. The gendarmerie REMERA arrested one of them and started the investigation. PMT is monitoring the investigations. (See Daily Rep.No 22)
- 2.2.4. In the night of 07.03.1994 the population of NYARRAMA, area KICUKIRO/GIKONDO, hurt a young man with 18 years called TOUMWINE James because they thought, he is a rebel of the FPR. The PMT asked the gendarmerie GIKONDO why they did not bring him to the hospital. The answer was that you have to pay first, than you get help from the hospital KIGALI. PMT brought TOUMWINE to the FAISAL HOSPITAL, where he was treated. (See Daily Rep.No 22)

- 2.2.5. On 09.03.1994, 16.20 hrs, CIVPOL got the information that a grenade was found in the area of KARURUMA. CIVPOL informed the E.O.D. - Team and went together to the location. There was one grenade, M 26 made in South Africa, in the bushes behind some houses. The E.O.D. took the unsafe and dangerous grenade to another place to destroy it. (See Daily Rep.No. 23)
- 2.2.6. On 9.3.1994 Mr ASSOUMANI Kissigui, residence NYAKABANDA, arrived at the Gend-station of NYAMIRAMBO and maintained, that he was beaten by a patrol of Gend. He was serious hurt at his head. Civpol is investigating together with Gend. (See Daily Rep. No. 24)
- 2.2.7. On 11.03.1994 Gend KICUKIRO was informed, that a officer of the National Military (MUTABAZI Etienne, Officer S 1 OPS at Ruhengeri) was attacked at the area of GIKONDO by a crowd of about fifty (50) people. The officer wanted to arrest Mr BIRUSHYA Boniface, Chef of the C.D.R. and Boutique owner at GIKONDO, because he was suspected, to be involved in a theft affair. The officer was escorted to his residence by Gend/Nat. (See Daily Rep.No.24)
- 2.2.8. On 12.3.1994 at 02.15 Hrs, there was a grenade explosion in the area of the Faycal Hospital. No establishments were made by CIVPOL and there were no complaints in this case.
- 2.2.9. On the 11.03.1994 at KICUKIRO the body of a young man was discovered near the Stadium, in front of DON BOSCO School. That person has not been identified. CIVPOL is investigating together with Brigde of KICUKIRO.

### 2.3. *Accidents:*

- 2.3.1. The night patrol in sector Gikondo had an accident on 07.03.1994, about 23.00 hrs. The UN-vehicle 417, Nissan Pick-up, was damaged in the front, by having a collision with a road-block. Nobody injured. (See Daily Rep.No. 21)
- 2.3.2. On the 08.03.1994, about 18.30 hrs, the vehicle (UNAMIR No 1242) of the CIVPOL-patrol-team KICUKIRO was hit by a rwandese private vehicle at the left rear fender. The accident happened in the area of KICUKIRO near the Boulevard of the African Union. Nobody injured. The MP is investigating the case. (See Daily Rep.No. 22)

### 2.4. *Miscellaneous:*

- 2.4.1. On 07.03.1994 there was a weekly meeting between CIVPOL/GdN/MilObs hold at GdN-HQ. The mean points were the security in Kigali in connection with the mixed patrols of CIVPOL and GdN in REMERA and KUCYKIRO areas.

According Col. RWARAKABIJE the security is going better in Kigali after ethnic violent events of the week before. Population which left their places are coming back into their houses. The Colonel also mentioned to do his best for increasing the good co-operation concerning the daily night patrols, but there is an urgent need of vehicles and radios. (See Daily Rep.No.21)

2.4.2. CIVPOL is continuing the night patrols together with GdN which started at 04.03.1994. The situation was mainly calm, there were only some road-blocks established by local milices (this are young men of different political parties, which think that they are responsible for the security in their areas). Sometimes the people at the road-blocks have been aggressive against CIVPOL, but GdN could calm down the situation.

2.4.3. In the night of 9.3.1994 to 10.3.1994 twelve (12) people were arrested in the area of REMERA/KACYIRU, because they ignored the curfew at 22.00 hrs. After paying 1.000 RWF seven (7) of them got released. (See Daily Rep.No. 24)

2.4.4. Case Nr. 44/PIS/94. Reported in the Daily SITREP No 12, item 2.2.1, on 26.2.1994.

Further investigations about 20 killed people near the stadium AMAHORO. The information by Fox-trot O about the killing of 20 people near the AMAHORO stadium on the 25.2.1994, resulted that the information was coming from RUTBAT. Further investigation by RUTBAT (Maj TAIF) resulted, that they didn't know anything about this information. They were only informed that on 25.02.1994, 2 people were killed.

This information was wrong. The GdN of KACYIRU had no information about 2 murdered people on the 25.02.1994.

CIVPOL have got only the information that on the 15.02.1994 two people were killed in the commune of KACYIRU, by unknown perpetrators. This case is closed and transmitted to the procurator under the No34/CRIM/MW03/Kgl/94 on 24.02.1994. The background, political or criminal, is unknown in this case. (See Daily Rep.No. 25)

2.4.5. Meeting: Concerning the shooting of the Minister of Public Work a meeting was held on 11.3.1994 at the office of the Public Prosecutor in Kigali. Further decision's were made to co-ordinate the ongoing investigations. (See Daily Rep.No.25)

2.4.6. On 11.01.1994 the Dutch policeman YP DE VRIES wrote a letter to Adjutant-Chef MUGIRANEZA (Chef de Brigade de Muhima), in which he asked information about the murder case of Michel KARAMBIZI, his wife and his child, who were probably killed by local gendarmes as a revenge act. The incident happened at 2. October 1990. The prosecutor answered CIVPOL the case is still being investigated. CIVPOL will also investigate this case.

2.4.7. CIVPOL arranged an agree with the VIP-Security Department of GdN at Camp KACYIRU that some of the gendarmes will receive basic instructions about bodyguarding and building protection by CIVPOL Officer Insp URACH.

**WEEKLY REPORT No. 11**

Covering period from 14.03., 06.00 hrs to 21.03.1994, 06.00 hrs

**1. General Situation:**

There were several incidents in KIGALI and the situation in the whole country (in the North) seems to be become more tense, since the B.B.T.G. should be installed on the Monday 21 March 94.

CIVPOL carried out mixed patrols together with GdN in the area of KICUKIRO and GIKONDO. Mainly the patrols had to handle problems with roadblocks, installed by local militia.

**2. Other Activities:**

**2.1. Incidents:**

- 2.1.1. On 14.03.1994 there were 18 people arrested by the GdN GIKONDO in KABUNGA because a child (HUTU) has been killed in this area. The 18 people were suspected of being RPF members (TUTSI). After interrogating by CIVPOL and checking their identities by local GdN they have been released on 16.03.94 at 12.00 hrs.
- 2.1.2. On 15.03.94 Maj. KAMANZI M. Frank (LO) of the F.P.R. informed CIVPOL that 11 persons are kept in prison by the GdN RWAMAGANA. The reason is unknown. CIVPOL is still investigating.
- 2.1.3. CIVPOL received a complaint from the R.P.F. about an alleged killing of eight persons in the night of 15.02.1994 at NYAGATARE. R.P.F. accuses the "Interahamwe". Besides R.P.F complaints that in January and February this year several attacks took place against other people in this area. CIVPOL is investigating in this matter and will proceed to the scene.

- 2.1.4. On 15.03.1994, at about 17.40 hrs, five (5) people were killed in an ambush in KINIHIRA. The unknown attackers were using A-47 and hand grenades. An Investigation Team was send out to make the necessary inquiries. (56/PIS/94)
- 2.1.5. On 16.03.1994 CIVPOL received the message that five (05) people were arrested at KABONGA by GdN KACYIRU because of being in illegal possession of 45 grenades of different kind of makes (Russian, Belgium, Chinese and South African) and 28 rifle grenades (South African) together with approximate 30 kg SAA-munition 7.62 for FAL and KV and a some magazines. All stuff has been handed over to EOD. PMT GdN KACYIRU is monitoring the investigation of the local GdN.
- 2.1.6. CIVPOL received information that on 10.03.94 one (01) person got stabbed at NYAKABANDA. At first GdN arrested four (04) persons. One of them, SEMUTWA Jean-Claude has been brought to justice. He is suspected to be a "M.D.R. Power" sympathiser. The victim was belonging to the "M.D.R. TWAGIRAMUNGU". The other three (03) arrested persons have been set free. Further investigations will be done by CIVPOL.
- 2.1.7. On 17.03.1994, 21.00 hrs, a merchant has been assaulted in the neighbourhood of KANOMBE by non-identified people. One of the bandits has been killed in a gunfight with the military. GdN found an ID on his body, which will be verified, and twelve (12) R4 cartridges and two (02) machetes on that place. PMT GdN KACYIRU is monitoring the case.
- 2.1.8. On 17.03.94, about 16.00 hrs, BIZIMANA Jean-Marie has been beaten at the KICUKIRO market by locals thinking he is a TUTSI. He has been saved by a PVK policeman and a bystander.
- 2.1.9. On 17.03.94, during night-time Mr. LIBERAKURO and his children were crossing the road when two (2) persons arrived on a motorcycle. They shot one of the children, who got injured. PMT CIVPOL is investigating.
- 2.1.10. Referring to the weekly report No. 10, Incidents 2.4.1., concerning TOUMWINE James, who was suspected to be a F.P.R. sympathiser. No charges have been withheld against him. GdN closed that case.
- 2.1.11. On 19.03.94, 19.45 hrs, the manager of the hotel "Chez Lando" informed CIVPOL by phone that there was a hand grenade explosion in front of the hotel. seven (7) persons are injured and they are taken to the hospital. The night patrol X-9 went to the place and started the investigation.
- 2.1.12. CIVPOL patrol informed CIVPOL HQ about a second grenade explosion in the sector of GIPOROSO in the yard of SEKIMONYO Louis. Six (6) persons got injured and were taken to the C.H.K.



Notice : There could be a connection between the two grenades explosions of Saturday night. According to a witness two young boys were talking about the matter near the concession of SEKIMANYO. The witness has been taken to REMERA GdN Bde.

2.1.13. On 19.03.94, 22.38 hrs, F-0 informed CIVPOL that there was a group of people surrounded by local Gendarmerie in front of the UNAMIR-HQ-AMAHORO. The people were Moto-taximen who mourn for one member of their group. The person died because of sickness for many days. The local GdN was there reminding the people about the curfew. After the first investigation there was no connection with the hand grenade explosion near the "Chez Lando".

2.2. *Accidents:* N.T.R.

2.3. *Miscellaneous:*

2.3.1 A meeting of sensibility was opened by the mayor of Kicukiro township for population about tolerance between the ethnic groups, confidence to justice and confidence to the order forces. Three quarters will be visited until the end of this week.

2.3.2 On the 14 March there was a meeting from the security council of the Kucukiro's district in order to take efficient measures against violence and criminality. Suggestions were given to the Prosecutor.

2.3.3. Night Patrols: Generally the situation at GIKONDO was calm. There were no roadblocks in this area and most of the inhabitants accepted the curfew. Only in the part of KARAMBO were placed three (3) roadblocks and at one of these, there were a lot of drunken and aggressive people. The GdN told the CIVPOL-Patrol that by passing the roadblock they would attack them. According to the GdN this part of GIKONDO is the most dangerous area and it is always a risk to go there.

2.3.4. On 18.03.94, 22.05 hrs, CIVPOL received information that the former Minister of Foreign Affairs, who is supposed to be a member of the new government, means that somebody wants to kill him this night. The PMT Patrol went to the place of the Minister GOINCIRA and informed the local GdN, who placed three (3) Officers in front of the house.

WEEKLY REPORT No. 09

Covering period from 28.02. to 07.03.1994

**1. General Situation:**

The situation is getting calm since there is a prohibition for the population of KIGALI to leave their houses from 10.00 p.m. to 05.00 a.m.. Also since there are preventive mixed patrols from UN-CIVPOL together with GdN, there are less incidents than before.

**2. Other Activities:**

**2.1. Investigations:**

**2.1.1. Matters which are still under investigation of CIVPOL INVESTIGATION SECTION:**

- a) Message from F0 about the killing of 20 people near the AMAHORO stadium. Nr (44/PIS/94)
- b) Larceny of ruby value 4.000.000 Rf by a Belgian soldier on the 24 Feb 1994 at the entrance of the Belgian Battalion. Nr (41/PIS/94)
- c) Illegal activities by Mr. Innocent RURANGANGABO. Nr (42/PIS/94)
- d) Complaint of Prudence NWISENEZA that he was beaten by an Belgian soldier. Nr (34/PIS/94)
- e) Complaint of Rwandese student in Canada. Nr(32/PIS/94)
- f) Hand grenade attack/AMAHORO. Nr (31/PIS/94)
- g) Burglars broke into a house of refugees. Nr (26/PIS/94) /
- h) Investigation into loss of a camera. Nr (21/PIS/94)
- i) Incident about 2 injured locals. Nr (45/PIS/94)
- j) 18 persons killed since the death of Minister BUCUYANA. Nr (46/PIS/94) /

- 2.1.2. On 06.3.1994, Capt CLAES from Force HQ reported, that there was a suspect person at the entrance of the CND. The unknown person was in the possession of a MOTOROLA hand-set. CIVPOL went on investigation together with local GdN, who arrested the suspected person.

**2.2. Incidents:**

- 2.2.1. On 28.02.1994 around 1625 Hr CIVPOL received a message from a unknown person that locals were preparing them selves for attacking privet accommodation in the sector of GIKONDO.  
CIVPOL investigated this matter together with local GdN. During the same patrol CIVPOL met a person, Mr KURURAMGA, who his house was robbed during the night of 27.02.94. CIVPOL investigated this matter together with local GdN, who started an investigation.
- 2.2.2. One civilian person suspected to be FPR was wounded by the crowd in the Gikondo district. He was sent to the Hospital. PMT Kicukiro is investigating.
- 2.2.3. On 3.3.1994, about 05.00 hrs, M.R.N.D. and C.D.R. followers gathered and attacked a house in the area of KIMIHURURA. It was reported, that two peoples have been killed. CIVPOL is investigating if there were political reasons or banditry.
- 2.2.4. On 3.3.1994, 06.30 hrs, five (5) persons were brought to the UNAMIR FIELD HOSPITAL. The civilians were injured by shrapnel's from a grenade explosion. Two persons were reported to be seriously injured.

**2.3. Accidents:** N.T.R.

**2.4. Miscellaneous:**

- 2.4.1. A meeting was hold between the Public Prosecutor, Chief of GdN Brigade REMERA, Chief of C.R.C.D., CIVPOL L. O. and Investigation Team in case of the attack against the Minister of Public Work.
- 2.4.2. CIVPOL received a message, that on 27.2.1994 in RURENGE six (6) civilians have been arrested by R.G.F., because they were suspected to be R.P.F supporters.  
The arrested people were brought to NYAGATARE and in the early morning of 1.3.1994 they were released.
- 2.4.3. In the area of GIKONDO on the 1.3.1994 tree (3) civilians have been arrested by GdN, because of having hand grenades with them.
- 2.4.4. On 2.3.1994 CIVPOL received information about a demonstration, organised by ELECTROGAZ workers. The demonstration in KIGALI centre was non violent.

2.4.5. On 2.3.1994 CIVPOL received information that there was a meeting of the "Conseil de securite de la Prefecture de Ville de KIGALI". The result was that MINUAR should contact F.P.R. for taking action with the convention of the "zones de consignation d'armes" and to remind that also F.P.R. have to give their agreement. Further the Prefecture de Ville de Kigali will finish the guarding of private properties and companies from the beginning of April because they need the policeman for patrols, etc.

2.4.6. On 28.2.1994 one civilian from RUGENGE was arrested because he was illegally in possession of six (6) grenades. Four (4) were handed over to the EOD team and two(2) others stayed in the possession of the local GdN.

2.4.7. On 6.3.1994 CIVPOL was called to an accident. A car driving from AMAHORU to CND missed the road and crashed against a tree. A lot of ammunition and explosive grenades fell out the car. Capt. KEMENCE of MILOBs witnessed the accident. Mj. NAIM of the UNAMIR HQ was informed and came to the place of accident where he took care of the ammunition and the grenades. An E.O.D Team was requested to secure all explosive things. Gendarmerie of REMERA, KARORERO Patrice, was informed. They took the driver under arrest and brought him to the Kigali-Hospital. When we questioned the driver at the hospital, he didn't gave us any information about his ID and the explosive freight. After he was treated for some light injuries he was brought back to prison in the Gd REMERA. After investigation we found that the driver was called NIYONGABE. The statement of NIYONGABE was that he spent the weekend in Kigali and on 04.03.1994 (Friday) he asked a unknown person where he can buy grenades and ammunition. On 05.03. the person brought him to NYAMIRAMBO where he bought everything of explosives we found in the vehicle. The vehicle was transported to the C.R.C.D. PMT Kigali Police is investigating.

## WEEKLY REPORT No. 08

Covering period from 20.02. to 27.02.1994

### 1. General Situation:

The situation is very tense because of the intended installation of BBTG and the murdering of the Minister of Public Work and ENERGY and the President of C.D.R. Party in BUTARE. Since 21.02.1994 there is a prohibition for the population of Kigali to leave their houses from 07.00 p.m. to 05.00 a.m. next day.

### 2. Other Activities:

#### 2.1. Investigations:

- 2.1.1. CIVPOL investigated the killing of the Minister of Public Works of RWANDA near his domicile in KIMIKURURA. The Minister was killed by unknown people together with one of the accompanying Gendarmes. A second Gendarme was heavily injured. A meeting was held at the office of the Prosecutor in Kigali. The purpose was to change information's between Gendarmerie (C.R.C.D.), CIVPOL and the Prosecutor.
- 2.1.2. On 24.02.1994 PMT Nyarugenge visited eleven (11) persons which were arrested in the Brigade of NYARUGENGE because they have demonstrated in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- 2.1.3. On 22.02.1994 about ten (10) Tutsi were killed in the area where BUCYANA (President of C.R.D) lived.
- 2.1.4. Five (5) to six (6) families from GIKONDO were escorted from CIVPOL and GdN to a church where they got shelter. They left their home because of insecurity.

## **2.2. Incidents:**

- 2.2.1. Political manifestations took place in NYAMIRAMBO, town area of Kigali on 20.Feb.1994. There were some roadblocks at "Rue de la Securite", in the morning.
- 2.2.2. On 20.02.1994 five persons were killed and one person was heavy injured at RWAMPARA, Kigali. The injured person was brought to the hospital by CIVPOL.
- 2.2.3. Some road blocks during the day because of the intended installation of BBTG. CIVPOL was monitoring the scene at the different check-points together with MilObs. During the monitoring on 23.02.1994 there was an incident at check-point KICUKIRO, Kigali. About fifty (50) armed bandits started to attack people in their houses. The GdN didn't act because only two (2) Officers were present. CIVPOL contacted the Commander of GdN who came with supporting gendarmes to handle the situation.
- 2.2.4. A manifestation took place in the City of KIGALI at "Rue de la Revolution" on 21.02.1994. The manifestation was organised by the C.D.R. The Gendarmerie of the Commune NYARUGENGE observed the situation with about 100 officers. When the manifestation was finished by the Mobile Intervention Group of Gend/Nat. CIVPOL escorted about 30 of the hostages, kept in the Ministry of Defence, to their residences.
- 2.2.5. CIVPOL PMT/Gend KACYIRU received the information that on 22.02.1994 six (6) Tutsi were killed by unknown Hutu in the sector on KIMIHURURA-Rugando.
- 2.2.6. Six (6) members of a family were killed on 23.02.1994. According to this murder REMERA Bde of the GdN arrested 12 persons. All of them are HUTU's.
- 2.2.7. On 24.02.1994, at 14.10 hrs, CIVPOL HQ was informed by radio about kidnapping of the Austrian SCHOELLER Kurt. The PC, three (3) PMT and three (3) MilObs went to the house of Mr. SCHOELLER at REMERA, KIGALI. There were about one hundred (100) locals in front of the house, because it was told that their guard was armed with a pistol. The local Gendarmerie was present and the Off. in charge explained to the crowd that he is investigating the case in present of CIVPOL. At this time the guard was unarmed so the GdN made a house-searching, where a pistol, Sturm Ruger and one magazine filled with 15 rounds, were found.

During investigation at the scene of the alleged kidnapping SCHOELLER carried a pistol, GLOCK 17. Both firearms are legal but were confiscated by the local GdN. GdN gave a statement to the crowd, which left the scene of incident. Approx. 20 local gendarmes were present during the action. To protect Mr. SCHOELLER of further attacks KIBATT was informed and based near his house.  
Nat.: SCHOELLER Kurt, 02.08.1929, Austrian, BP 491 Remera I, Kigali;



- 2.2.8 The Cdr of Gend KACYIRU told CIVPOL, that two (2) people have been killed on 25.02.1994, about 10.00 a.m. in that area. He did not know anything about the killing of 20 persons.
- 2.2.9 On 26.02.1994 an armed man has been killed by the population in the sector of NYAMIRAMBO, Kigali. There were found two (2) guns by the man. GdN Nyamirambo investigates the incident because there was found a letter of permission to leave the company QG OPS RULINDO and so there is the possibility that the non-identified man was a member of the Rwandeers Army.
- 2.2.10 Matters which are still under investigation of CIVPOL INVESTIGATION SECTION. See Annex A.

2.3. *Accidents:* N.T.R.

2.4. *Miscellaneous:*

- 2.4.1. CIVPOL was participated at the funeral of the Ministry Felicien ATABAZI at Butare. The whole situation was calm. The GdN did a good job.

### WEEKLY REPORT No. 07

Covering period from 14.02. to 20.02.1994

#### 1. General Situation:

Some handgrenade explosions and a political manifestation at 20.02.1994 disturbed the population of KIGALI.

#### 2. Other Activities:

##### 2.1. Investigations:

- 2.1.1 A complaint was received from Rwandaise students in Canada on 17.02.1994. The students complain that during the night from 17. to 18. Nov. 1993 about 40 people were killed in various places (Gitarama, Bugasera ) by members of the R.P.F.
- 2.1.2. The killing of a person at the COLLIXTE yard, GISHUSHU, by a policeman of the PVK (Prefecture de la Ville de Kigali) was reported to CIVPOL. The non-identified person was shot by the policeman because of throwing "fers de beton" (metal bars used in construction) at him. Investigations will be continued because there are a lot of contradictions in the statements.
- 2.1.3. Mr. MWISENEYA Prudence, a residence of KIGALI, reported to CIVPOL that he was beaten and attacked with a knife on 17.02.1994 at NYAMIRAMBO, Kigali, by an unknown Belgian soldier. MWISENEYA got minor injuries. He was accompanied by CIVPOL to the UNAMIR Field Hospital. This case will be submitted to the Military.

## **2.2. Incidents:**

- 2.2.1. On 15.02.1994 a grenade explosion took place in a soldier's house in GITEGA because of quarrels between two soldiers. No persons injured.
- 2.2.2. The same night followers of the MRND (INTERAHAMWE) installed a roadblock in the area of NYAMIRAMBO to protest against the liberation of a person which was suspected to be a murder. After negotiations between GdN of NYAMIRAMBO and followers of the MNRD, the roadblock was raised. No persons injured.
- 2.2.3. Political manifestations took place in NYAMIRAMBO, town area of Kigali, on 20.Feb.1994. There were some roadblocks at "Rue de la Securite", in the morning. At 07.10 hrs the information of an hand grenade explosion was reported to CIVPOL. No person injured. Different actions against the meeting were started. At "Rue de la Justice" the persons of the manifestation threw stones against the busses of the M.D.R. The local gendarmerie arrested some of the aggressive people. The M.D.R.- Meeting finished at 16.30 hrs.
- 2.2.4. CIVPOL received information, that on 20.02.1994 five persons were killed and one person was heavy injured at RWAMPARA, Kigali. The injured person was brought to the hospital by CIVPOL. The first investigations disclosed that the persons were suspected to be robbers. CIVPOL is investigating. Special report will follow.

**WEEKLY SITREP Nr. 6**

Week from 08.02. to 14.2.1994

**1. General Situation:**

CIVPOL is establishing plans for police work to increase the security of the people of KIGALI an to prevent crimes against them.

**2. Other Activities:**

2.1. On 9.2.1994 CIVPOL Liaison Section organised a meeting with the Prosecutor of the Republic of RWANDA. The result of the meeting was positive for the further CIVPOL mission.

**2.2. Investigations:**

- 2.2.1. 7.2. to 8.2.1994: Two Police officers reported to the chief of local Police KIGALI, that unknown burglars broke into the house of the 10 refugees, which are into the CND building. CIVPOL is investigating.
- 2.2.2. 9.2.1994: CIVPOL was investigating a grenade explosion 100 m north of the CND building. Enquiries disclosed, that 2 children found a stick grenade. They played with the grenade, when it exploded, causing serious injuries to one and minor injuries to the other. The children's were taken to KIGALI - Hospital.
- 2.2.3. CIVPOL received information from the population of NYAMIRAMBO, that on the evening of 9.2.1994 a young man was stabbed to death at a bar in NYAMIRAMBO, following a fight. It is believed, that the victim was a member of the M.R.N.D. Militia. After the incident 5 grenades were thrown consecutively in that area. Gend/Nat arrested the perpetrator of the murdering and 2 other persons for the throwing of the grenades.

- 2.2.4. 10.2.1994: CIVPOL investigated the detention of 8 persons at SHYORONGI prison by the Military Police of the R.G.F. The persons were in prison from 6.2. until 10.2. 1994. On 10.2.1994, 14.00 hrs the 8 persons were released from the prison of an order from Ministry of Defence.  
After that, the persons were taken over by CIVPOL and escorted from SHYORONGI to the CIVPOL HQ.  
There the 8 persons stated, that they were arrested between 6.2. and 7.2.1994 at a road block, controlled by the R.G.F. (MP) at RULINDO in Prefecture Kigali. They were accused of transporting R.P.F. members from the CND building to RUHENGARI. Whilst in custody, some of the detainees alleged to have been beaten and threatened by the R.G.F. soldiers and Gendarmes. CIVPOL escorted the injured persons (5) to the FAYCAL Hospital, Kigali for medical examination.  
After that the persons were released from CIVPOL (19.30 hrs). Report will follow.
- 2.2.5. 10.2.1994: Between 08.00 to 09.00 hrs approximately 20 people - mainly taxi- and motorbike drivers - established a road block near the "Marche NYABUGOGO" in the district MUHIMA. They protested against increase of taxes.  
The road block was broken up by Gend. No injuries.
- 2.2.5. 3 hand grenades found by workers in Sect. GATSATA/NYAMIGARI.  
CIVPOL was securing the scene until EOD took over the explosives.  
No injuries, no further report.

2.3. *Accidents*: N.T.R.

### **3. Logistics:**

It would be very urgent to supply CIVPOL with more vehicles to start check-points and patrols.

WEEKLY SITREP Nr. 5

Week from 01.02. to 07.02.1994

**1. General Situation:**

- 1.1. PC, Col. BLIEM, started a series of a weekly meeting with the Chief Etat/Major Gendarmerie National General NDINDILIYMANA.
- 1.2. On 31.01.1994 CIVPOL moved from the UNAMIR HQ to the new CIVPOL HQ near the hotel MERIDIEN. At this time, there is still no telephone line installed to the new HQ.
- 1.3. Local people complain about the insecurity in the area of grid E95 1015 (PMT map), REMERA area.

**2. Other Activities:**

- 2.1. On 01.02.1994 at 09.15 h a meeting between the Sous Prefet of KIGALI, the Mayor of the Commune Kacyiru and Col. KAREMERA (FPR) was arranged by CIVPOL.  
Subject: The situation of the 10 refugees in the CND compound.  
The Prefet and the Mayor as well as the Liaison Officer of the GdN joined the meeting, but nobody from FPR side arrived at AMAHORO. So there are still no results in the negotiations about the 10 refugees. The negotiations will be continued if the FPR agrees to join the meetings.

**2.2. Investigations:**

On 01.02.1994 following incidents were reported to CIVPOL:

- 2.2.1. At KABUGURU in NYAKABANDA miscreants were going to create some road blocks. A demonstration at BILYGO was reported by local Gendarmerie.
- 2.2.2. KIBAT patrol reported that there was an grenade explosion at NYAKABANA and near KIKONDO (21.39 hrs).

2.2.3. At 22.10 hrs two grenade explosions at BYLIGO near the avenue DE LA JUSTICE were reported by KIBAT. No casualties, only material damaged. Local Gendarmerie was investigating.

CIVPOL will investigate that cases, after receiving vehicles.

2.2.4. On 03.01.1994, 21.00 h, the Belgian soldier Sgt. BAILLEU threw a stone during a dispute with a gardener to the house of a member of the political party C.D.R. in Kigali, Rue de KIYOKU 10 a. The house owner claimed political reasons and published the incident on the local radio. CIVPOL is investigating.

2.2.5. On 04.02.1994 the CIVPOL, PMT Gd Kigali, inquired an interception during a roadblock mounted by KIBAT with local Gd. A local soldier (in civilian cloths) carrying 2 grenades while off duty. The 2 grenades were handed over to EOD. No further investigations by CIVPOL.

2.2.6. CIVPOL, PMT Kigali Police, tried to install an office together with the local police but there was no room available.

WEEKLY SITREP Nr. 4

Week from 25.01. to 31.01. 1994

**1. General Situation:**

Several handgrenade explosions during nighttime on different locations in KIGALI disturb the population.

**2. Other Activities:**

- 2.1. The CIVPOL monitored National Gendarmerie interventions on the volleyball games (RGF an RPF) and a soccer match (RW-ZAIRE) on 28., 29. and 30.01.1994. There were no incidents.

**2.2. Investigations:**

On 29.01.1994 from 08.00 a.m. till 20.00 p.m. a meeting was prepared and hold on 11.00 a.m. at the CND compound with delegations of RPF, RGF, the Sous-Prefet and CIVPOL.

The aim was to make arrangements, that the 10 men, which took shelter in the CND compound, could go back to their homes.

At 19.40 hrs a protocol of the meeting was signed by all the participants.

Specially the RPF side used this oppertunity to put political positions on security matters in this document. Arrangements were made from FPR side and the Sous prefet of KIGALI, that the agreement will be published on the national broadcast. Because of the darkness and on request of the refugees themselves all the parties agreed that it was to late to bring the refugees out. An appointment was made for 30.01.1994 at 10.00 a.m. to execute the agree-ment.

On 30.01.1994 at 10.00 a.m. the Sous prefet did not accept that there was no RPF liasion officer of Minuar to accompany him. Finally the Sous prefet left the CND compound and the negotiations were finished. The 10 refugees are still in CND compound.

On 31.01.1994 the Sous prefet called CIVPOL. He asked to meet CIVPOL with the Mayor of the Commune for making new proposals on this matter. CIVPOL will monitor the next negotiations.

Roadblock on 26.01.1994 at 10.00 a.m. near the CND building. About 50 persons demonstrated, encountered road blocks with trees and vehicles. The persons were armed with machetes, bayonets and large sticks at different points. After the shooting - reported below - the road blocks were removed.

CIVPOL was investigating a shooting at the road block in the area of the CND building on 26.01.1994. The Commander of the RPF accompanied by his own guards, left the compound of the CND. On their way out, they were stopped and prevented from passing at a road block by the demonstrators. The Commander's guards fired overhead in the direction of the demonstrators. The members of the local Gendarmerie also fired in the air to scare the people and to force them to remove the blockade. As a result, the demonstrators opened the way to the RPF Commander. During the shooting one civilian person was injured on the right hand. CIVPOL investigations will be continued.

### **2.3. Accidents:**

Accident involving motorcars CB 2737 (rented by UN) and Landrover 8620 on 25.01.1994, 02.05 p.m. at the entrance of the Unamir Headquarters and stadium avenue. No persons injured.

Accident involving motor vehicle Unamir 1036 on 25.01.1994 at 05.30 p.m. No persons injured. CIVPOL is investigating.

Accident which occurred on 27.01.1994, 07.30 p.m. at Kicukiro involving motor cycle WE 1026 (the driver was injured) and vehicle IT 3149 (rented by UN).

I refer to the above subject and report that around 10:55 hours on 26 January 1994, the Commander of the R.P.F. , accompanied by his own guards, left the compound of the CND. On their way out, they were stopped and prevented from passing at a road block by the demonstrators. The Commander's guards fired overhead in the direction of the demonstrators. The members of the local Gendarmérie also fired in the air to scare the people and to force them to remove the blockade. As a result, the demonstrators opened the way to the R.P.F. Commander and he continued his way to the UNAMIR Headquarters where he visited the military Liaison Officer.

The R.P.F. Commander remained in the UNAMIR Headquarters while his escort returned to the CND Building. When they passed the road block, they were stopped again by the demonstrators. After some rounds of shots fired in the air to intimidate the demonstrators, the blockade was lifted and the party was let to finish its trip.

There were no injured persons or damages reported. CIVPOL is investigating.

**SUBJECT:** Special Situation Report surrounding the demonstration in the area of the CND Building

With reference to the above subject, I wish to inform you that there is a demonstration in progress in the area of the C.N.D. Building and its environs.

Two members from the CIVPOL Division visited the area of demonstration at 1000 Hours and discovered the following situation:

They encountered the roads blocked with trees and vehicles confiscated from persons and placed across the roadway. They met a total of about fifty persons demonstrating who were armed with machetes, bayonets and large sticks at different points. They appeared violent.

The team made enquiries from one of the protestors who told them that on 25 January 1994 a grenade exploded in the area of the CND Building and killed three persons and that the persons involved in the demonstration were from the M.R.N.D. i.e. the Youth Movement of the MRND and the C.D.R. Parties. They demonstrated in retaliation of the killing on 25 January 1994.

The Belgian Battalion and members of the National Gendarmerie are on site.


**2. Other Activities:**

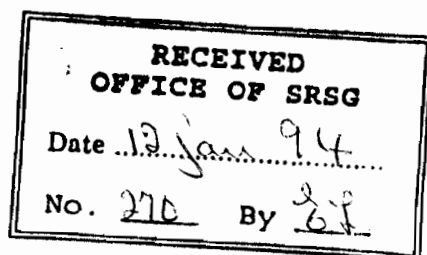

SUBJECT: Hand grenade attack against former Minister

On 11.01.94, at about 12.30 Hours, Mr. André KATABARWA, of Baudouin 1 Avenue, B.P. 1167, Kigali, Vice President of the Human Rights Association of Rwanda, was driving his car and was about to enter the entrance of his residence when he was approached by a male adult of negro descent who enquired about employment. As the man spoke with him, he threw a packet into the car which exploded and caused injuries to Mr. KATABARWA and his servant Constantin HAGENIMANA, who was opening the gate of his entrance.

The attacker then joined a motorcycle driven by another male adult who waited in front of the residence of Mr. KATABARWA and fled from the scene.

The victims were treated at the Central Hospital, Kigali. The car was damaged.

Investigations are conducted by the National Gendarmerie of the Territorial Brigade, Nyarugenge. Reported to CIVPOL at 4.00 P.M. on 11.01.94. Investigations are continuing and monitored by CIVPOL.

We are also preparing the needs of vehicles, radios, accomodations a.s.o.



### 1. General Situation:

The general situation in collaboration with the Local gendarmes, we can divided in two parts:  
First we have the collaboration with the Police monitoring teams (PMT).

In all brigades of the GdN where CIVPOL is active there is a growing in confidence due to the use of the CIVPOL UN vehicles. Those vehicles are always used for mixed patrols and other interventions. Without this collaboration it's not possible for the GdN to be mobile.

X For those PMT the collaboration is not existent in cases of political and ethnic crimes. In those cases the GdN seems to wait for CIVPOL investigators to bring on all possible information.

An other problem is the fact that the reports of the GdN are written in KINYARWANDA what include that the PMT monitors can't check the contents of those reports.

Until now the GdN did not yet decided if they are going on with the organisation of the CHECKPOINTS for weapon clearance.

There is still a main problem to clear by MINUAR about the authorisation for CIVPOL to transport local civilians and GdN in the UN vehicles. Due to the specified mission of CIVPOL we can't follow the regulations of the UN in this case.

Second we have the collaboration with the Police Investigation Teams (PIS).

Because the importance of this mater please find in annex B a full detail report about this mater. It will be given together with the daily sitrep Nr 42.

## **2. Other Activities:**

### **2.1. Incidents:**

- 2.1.1. On 21 March between 11.10 hr and 12.05 Hr there was an illegal manifestation going on workers of ELEKTROGAS , in Kigali town , because they had not been paid like oreseen. The Gendarmerie intervanted and struck the demonstration apart by the means of teargas and batons. After this a group of 50 people continued in the direction of the CND building. On their way ,the responsible of the group agreed to go with the local Gendarmerie to the Pirmatuur, to discus their matter. The whole manifestation had no political background.
- 2.1.2. There is a general mobilisation of security forces in Kigali to monitor , manifestations planned by some political parties , which do not agree with the planned B.B.T.G
- 2.1.3 On 21 March 94 at 0900 Hr a journalist , IYUBAHUMPATSE Jean Baptiste , who is working for the French BBC Service, was assaulted by locals in his Gikondo residence . The reason there fore was an article that he had written about the political situation in RWANDA. The CIVPOL- PMT asked the Bde Comd of Kicukiro to patrol the neighbourhood.
- 2.1.4. The Gendarmerie of NYARUGENGE , arrested two(2) soldiers who tried to sell a weapon in Kigali centre on 20 March 94. Weapon : Rifle R4 5,56 mm Nr 784706  
The rifle has been confiscated by the GdN.
- 2.1.5. In the night from 22 March to 23 March , the Gendarmerie from Nyamirambo arrested 4 people, because they were in possession of one(1) hand grenade.
- 2.1.6. On 23.03.1994, 20.00 hrs a handgrenade exploded in the sector RUGENGE in the district NYARUGENGE. A group of 6 unknown people came in front of a shop in this sector. One of them threw the grenade into the area of the house. Nobody was injured.  
The GdN of NYARUGENGEN makes an investigation.
- 2.1.7. In the night of 24.03.1994 at about 23-24 Hrs one sound of an grenade explosion was heard in the area of the CND. There was no direct complaint in this case, but there were several security checks.
- 2.1.8. During a patrol by PMT together with GdN the patrol found a young girl injured. The girl was hurt with a knife by a group of bandits.  
The Gd of NYAMIRAMBO makes an investigation.
- 2.1.9. On the 25.03.94 at 1800 hrs CIVPOL received message form that one (1) Local civilian was injured while cutting grass near a house in KICUKIRO.  
While cutting the grass his tool must have streak a hand grenade and exploded.  
The man received injury on his person.

- 2.1.10. On the 25.03.94 at 2045 hrs CIVPOL received message form from UNAMIR HQ that one (1) person needs help because some criminals may attack his house. CIVPOL went to the scene of the incident. There are still investigating this mater together with GdN.
- 2.1.11. In the night of 24.03.94 at 2250 hrs. A Gd patrol arrested a local police guard at Petrowanda station in NYAMIRAMBO. The guard was on duty, but was drunken. He threaded 10 un guilty persons whit his kalnachnikov. The Gd secured the gun and the police guard was given to the prefecture de ville de KIGALI. NYAMIRAMBO Gd makes the investigation.
- 2.1.12. On 27 March a local boy was beaten up by unknown attackers near the C.N.D. for unknow reason . He was seriously injured and brought to the FAYSAL hospital for treatment. This matter will be handled by a CIVPOL -PMT .

2.3. **Miscellaneous:**

- 2.3.1. CIVPOL has been informed of the increasing drug problem in and around Kigali. Most of the drugs are being distributed and consumed in " Kigali Night " and the " club Sportive Kigali ".
- 2.3.2. UNAMIR Finance office requested from CIVPOL to escort the MSA on 24 March. Two CIVPOL -Officers will do the job.
- 2.3.3. On 25.03.94 at 1500 hrs a meeting was held in the office of the Public Prosecutor concerning the killing of the Minister of Public Work. From CIVPOL: Inspec KRANZL, Comm.ASSIH and Maj DELPORT were present at the meeting. The Prosecutor informed CIVPOL about the new information and statements. Then CIVPOL went together with the Prosecutor to the bar "LAS VEGAS" to make an investigation. As this bar is an illegal brothel the Prosecutor arrested the owner on the scene. The person was brought to KIGALI prison.

51 Police Officers

On 22 March 94 the military Division of UNAMIR has transferred 4 Senegal Gdn from UNMOS to CIVPOL. But until now they did not report to CIVPOL for duty !!!

**4. Logistic:**

15 vehicles, still not enough to perform Civpol duties.

14 radios, 1 base station, urgent need of battery chargers

**Urgent need of military maps.**
