Regensburg

1. On 12 June 1946, the Mess Inspection Team from this Headquarters conducted an inspection of Displaced Persons camp at Regensburg operated by UNRRA Team # 120.

2. Your attention is invited to the following deficiencies that were noted:

- a. Surplus food stocks were on hand.
- b. Kitchen personnel were not examined monthly and health certificates were not posted.
- c. Garbage stands were not erected and lime spread around refuse dumping areas.
- d. There was an insufficient amount of medical and dental supplies.
- e. Spoiled food was present. This may be exchanged for items of equivalent food value upon submittance to Special Rations Distribution Point.

3. As a tribute to the UNRRA Team in charge, the administration of a camp of this size is excellent in spite of the many problems that are presented.

4. Request that this letter be brought to the attention of UNRRA Team No 120, Regensburg.

SUBJECT: Operation of Displaced Persons Camp No 124 at Lohengrin

TO : Director,

1. On 3 July a mess inspection team operating from this headquarters conducted an inspection of Displaced Persons Center No 95 - 295 at Lohengrin.

2. In general, this camp appears to be one of the best administered Displaced Persons Centers so far visited, by the Third Army Mess Inspection Team. A few discrepancies however, do exist in the camp. It appears that the camp is slightly underdrawing rations. This may be due to the "headcount" system recently established. However, the camp has been drawing only the basic ration whereas it may be authorized to draw supplementary rations for workers, hospital patients etc. For some unexplained reason, the results of weighing of individuals at this camp showed a tendency towards underweight, whereas caloric analysis indicates that these people should be overweight. It can be assumed that any ration and messing problem that exists in this camp, will be ironed out by the camp directors.

3. The organization of schools, the development of an attractive camp hospital and the maintenance of high standards of medicine and sanitation are commendable reflections on the UNRRA personnel responsible for this camp.

4. It is requested that this letter be brought to the attention of the Director of UNRRA Team No 124, Lohengrin.

Note to Mr. Whiting.

Subject: Incident at Regensburg.

Joe called late yesterday afternoon to forward an account from Fay Greene of an incident which took place at Regensburg yesterday afternoon.

A Train of 600 infiltrees destined for Hof from Austria arrived in Regensburg yesterday morning, and was held over there. There was no water on the train when it started from Austria, and when it reached Regensburg, a number of people got off the train to get water. The guards were under orders not to allow anyone off, and they fired over the heads of people leaving. The majority of the people returned; however, a few did not, and the guards fired again, wounding one infiltree in the foot.

Team #120, Regensburg, has provided water and medical aid for the people on the train, which was scheduled to leave for Hof yesterday evening, where the ^{They} ~~people~~ will be put into the permanent Jewish camp there. The situation is under control, except for the fact that on this shipment, which was not cleared from this office before being authorized, there were one hundred more people on the train than scheduled.
