ORGANISATION OF EXISTING NATIONAL OFFICES:
POINTS ON WHICH INFORMATION IS DESIRED BY THE U.S. DELEGATION

Information supplied by the Norwegian Government

The Norwegian Office for the collection of information in cases of war crimes belongs to the Investigation Department of the Norwegian State Police. The head of the office is a lawyer. The office is still under organization, and has met with considerable difficulty in recruiting competent staff. The Investigation Department of the State Police is placed directly under the Head of the State Police, who himself is placed under the Ministry of Justice and Police. The sources of information at the disposal of our National Office are at present declarations received in judicial forms by a judge or another lawyer at the Norwegian Office concerned in Stockholm. Furthermore proofs of witnesses given at the Investigation Office of the State Police. Also secret reports from Norway and detailed examination of persons who have escaped or have been released from German prison or concentration camps in Norway and who have been submitted to examination by the German security police or other German Institutions. In all cases the attention of the witnesses has been drawn to the fact that false or misleading statements may expose the witness to punishment. The evidence collected is arranged as preparation for possible prosecution in Norwegian courts.

The Investigation Office of the Norwegian State Police collects evidence both against Norwegian war criminals, who may have committed offences of a more serious character, and against German war criminals in accordance with the list of the War Crimes Commission over war crimes. Up to now evidence has been collected against 45 German war criminals, based upon examination of 62 witnesses in judicial form.

The Norwegian National Office has on its files information concerning 221 witnesses who will be examined, when the Norwegian Government return to Norway. The majority of these witnesses are at present in prison either in Germany or in Norway. Apart from this the office possesses a number of non-judicial declarations of witnesses.



According to the request from the Norwegian Attorney General please find enclosed a list (List A) concerning those Germans who have been listed by Norway but regarding whom investigations have shown that there is no evidence to uphold the charges against them. As a consequence these persons can no longer be regarded as war criminals. The Attorney General, therefore, requests the United Nations War Crimes Commission to delete their names from the lists of war criminals.

For your information please find also enclosed :

List B - concerning those German war criminals against whom no trials will be initiated in Norway either because of insufficient evidence or because of the minor importance of their offences. This does not imply that these persons are no longer regarded by the authorities as war criminals but they are not wanted by Norway for trial and may consequently be released as far as Norway is concerned. The names of these persons should, however, not be deleted from the United Nations War Crimes Commission's lists.

List C shows those war criminals who have since died.

Copies of these three lists have today been sent to CROWCASS.



The Polish War Crimes Office has the pleasure to transmit to the United Nations Commission the first six charges against German war criminals.

The National Office beg to inform you that apart from such simple charges dealing with individual criminals and crimes, which will be transmitted regularly, we will have the pleasure to send to the Commission from time to time also more extensive and important cases. In the near future we will be able to transmit several cases of this kind concerning:

the system of humiliating procedures tending to lower the human dignity of Poles, the destruction of the Polish intellectual classes, the Polish forced labour in Germany, the robbery of public and private property, the usurpation of sovereignty by Germany on the occupied Polish territories, and so on.

As to the first edition of the Form would you kindly please consider the following suggestions:

1. To combine the first two sections on page 1 / name of accused plus the rank, unit or other official position / into one which would be of advantage especially in cases concerning several offenders.
2. To enlarge all sections on the first page except the last one, so as to provide more space for details in more complicated cases. At the same time it would be quite sufficient if the last section provided for short statement of facts would cover only 1/4 or 1/3 of the page.

The Officer in charge would be glad to have, if possible, some more copies of the first edition of the Form for the transmission of cases.



Sir,

I have the honour to refer to our interview of 19 inst. and to your inquiries about the possibility of collecting an adequate amount of charges dealing with the crimes committed by the Germans against the Jews in occupied countries, and beg to inform you that the Polish War Crimes Office has in view to transmit to the Commission in an appropriate time a number of cases which, in particular, will deal with the following matters:

1. The legal position of Jews in occupied Poland as created by the discriminating German regulations,
2. Regulations tending to lower the human dignity of Jews,
3. The treatment of Jewish women and children in particular,
4. Restrictions in the occupation activities of Jews,
5. Confiscation of Jewish property,
6. Persecution of the Jewish religion,
7. Compulsory labour for Jews,
8. Expulsion and deportation of Jewish population,
9. The establishment of reservations, ghettos and concentration camps for Jews,
10. Murders, massacres, brutalities and tortures inflicted upon the Jewish population,
11. The biological mass extermination of Jews.

Though it is difficult to say beforehand how many cases will be required to exhaust all the items mentioned above the Polish War Crimes Office proposes to cover the whole subject of the persecution and extermination of Jews in Poland from the first days of the German occupation up to the present time.



blinka. Other cases will be transmitted to the Commission as soon as possible.

I also feel it desirable to mention that the respective charges against German war criminals will be prepared in collaboration with the Jewish associations operating in the Allied countries and that the representatives of these associations in the United Kingdom have been invited to cooperate in this respect closely with the Polish War Crimes Office.





Statement by Professor Plaser

As you certainly know, it was decided at the Moscow Conference by the representatives of the United Kingdom, the United States and the Soviet Union, that the German criminals who committed atrocities, massacres and executions in the occupied countries, should be sent back to the countries in which their abominable deeds were perpetrated in order that they may be judged and punished according to the laws of those liberated countries and of the free governments which will be erected therein. Only those criminals whose offences have no particular geographical location should be punished by a joint decision of the Governments of the Allies.

The Polish law has not recognised the restriction resulting from the so-called territorial principle. On the contrary, the Polish Law does apply to and the Polish courts have jurisdiction over all those who have committed crimes either in Poland, i.e. on Polish territory or abroad, against the interests of the Polish State or its subjects.

Therefore, we shall have not only the moral but also the legal obligation to try and to punish the German criminals who have committed crimes against Jews, whether Poles or not Poles, in Poland, and against Polish Jews abroad.

It is true that the definition of what is a war crime is ^{al} contraversion, but there is no doubt that atrocities, massacres and executions committed by the Germans against Jews, are and must be considered as war crimes. In fact, I wonder

whether in the whole history of mankind, more abominable war-crimes have ever been perpetrated. Unfortunately, the Polish soil has been chosen by the German criminals not only as a slaughterhouse for Poles but also for Jews from abroad.

You surely know too that the United Nations Commission for the Investigation of War Crimes, at which I represent the Polish Government, has as one of its main tasks the collection of facts and evidence and the preparation of dossiers which shall enable us in the future to seize the criminals and bring them before justice. You will understand that, in the present circumstances, seeing the difficulties of communicating with our country, this is a very heavy task indeed. These difficulties apply in particular to the dossiers concerning crimes against Jews on account of the vastness of their extent.

What, in my opinion, could facilitate this task would be the so-called legal dispositions or regulations issued by the Germans against Jews, for I have no doubt that all these vile documents constitute a sufficient proof of the guilt of those who have issued and signed them. Nevertheless, we consider it as our duty to invite you today to give us your help and advice on this matter. First of all, we should be grateful to you for your advice concerning the method of this important work and then for your help in supplying us with the necessary material. I feel sure that in today's discussion many problems of importance will be put forward and clarified.

Before the discussion starts I think it might be useful to hear from Dr. Litawski, the representative of the Polish Office for War Crimes, what has already been done in this matter and from dr. Lachs what, in his opinion, should be the plan for our future work. And then, I hope, Mr. Mackinnon Wood, the Secretary General to the United Nations Commission for the Investigation of War Crimes, will be kind enough to start the discussion in expressing his views on behalf of the Commission.

Statement made by Dr. Litwinski

London, 15-6-1944.

At the same time when the United Nations War Crimes Commission took up its functions, a special department i.e. Polish War Crimes Office was constituted in our Ministry with the task to prepare charges against war criminals. It was for practical reasons that this Office has been made an organic part of the Ministry of the Interior: because this Ministry is directing and supervising the activities of the Polish Secret Administration in occupied Poland and receiving the bulk of information about the inside situation in our country.

I will not bore you with details and especially with the numerous difficulties we had to overcome, I merely wish to give you now a brief account of what has been done in this short period of a few months.

Up to-day we have transmitted to the Commission in total 21 indictments against German war criminals dealing with different crimes committed in Poland, such as: murders, massacres, systematic terrorism, tortures, pillage, putting hostages to death, deportations, concentration camps, imposition of collective penalties, devastation and destruction of property, ill-treatment of prisoners of war.

All these charges differ from one another as to importance and extent, some of them dealing only with ~~an~~ individual crimes and criminals, others with crimes committed systematically and en masse.

In these indictments we have accused up to now about 170 Germans /some of them several times for different crimes/ of different importance in their official position and membership of the enemy organizations existing in the occupied Polish territory.

Among these 21 cases transmitted to the Commission there are 2 extensive indictments which deal with the crimes committed against the Jewish population. Both of them concern the most dreadful stage of the persecution of Jews i.e. their biological mass extermination in special extermination camps, so called death camps. Let us not repeat the mistakes made after the last war. It should not happen again that certain men accused before the Court of Leipzig could not be tried as ^{e/} they were untracable, that in spite of the almost general knowledge about German atrocities out of 896 cases only 45 appeared in Court, that there were cases where it was impossible to get witnesses to give evidence or to find a legal basis for their being sentenced.

It must not happen again as it was the case with the reply of the Dutch Government to Millerand, then French Prime Minister, who asked for the extradition of the Kaiser. It refused extradition as the crimes ^{one} ~~were~~ not legally qualified and not within the penal laws of the Netherlands: the act the Kaiser was accused of: "offense supreme contre la morale internationale" did not fit into the sections or subsections of Penal Codes.

In view of these lamentable experiences of the past, it is our duty to take a safer road now.

How do we propose to do it?

Our work here consists of preparing indictments and submitting them to the United Nations War Crimes Commission. ^{You/} I heard from dr. Litawski that some ~~of~~ indictments were already submitted-however the main task is still ahead of us. I am going to ~~mark~~ ask you ^{kind} co-operation and collaboration, which is in my view indispensable. What I have in mind is a real drive for evidence and for documents.

What do we need?

In order to prepare the formal indictments we need: names of the culprits, the description of their deeds, witnesses, documents-proving them, every possible paper which could be relevant.

Besides the evidence which ^{is} in the hands of the Polish Government we shall very much welcome whatever material you will offer us.

I have in mind newspaper cuttings, German and foreign, books, other literature on the subject, original German orders, decrees and proclamations, texts of broadcasts, ~~pp~~private correspondence and oral evidence of those who escaped from the Nazi hell-as well as anything else you have in your libraries and offices.

We know for instance that a considerable material has been collected by the Institute for Jewish Affairs in New York.

Whatever we get will be used for the indictments to be prepared.

It is proposed to set up the indictments by way of an thorough analysis of the stages of the German anti-Jewish drive in Poland. To start with: the first expropriation measures in 1939, the humiliating legislation up to the creation of the Ghettoes, then the criminal activity with regard to food rationing, which led to the death ~~in~~ of thousands from starvation. Then the Lublin experiment, the concentration in special areas and places-up to the mass murder in death camps.

It is intended to collect as much evidence as possible-to build up the strongest possible case. Many of these events have already died in our memories, time passing by. The five years of war have done theirs, later events have superseded earlier, smaller crimes. It is therefore essential that we get the evidence of the earlier period none lesser than of the later.

All these considerations have ~~will~~ to be well kept in mind.

May I remind you what Lord Maugham said in the House of Lords on October 7th 1942 when speaking about the failure of the Leipzig trials: too much time elapsed since the armistice and we were sick and tired of the whole subject. That is why it failed.

And this is in fact the practical issue of to-day. May I add that I hope that by closely collaborating in the matter we shall be able to achieve the best possible results in this very tragic issue.

~~My~~^I request is therefore directed to you to start a thorough search in your libraries and offices, among your documents and papers, to let us have every detail

that is available, not to leave anything untouched. We ought to begin with the first day of September 1939.

I want to ask you ~~to~~ be in touch with us here and to exchange views on many problems which will arise.

Any suggestions and comments on your part will be very welcome.

May I invite ^{you} to tell us your views and how ~~far~~ you could assist.

PERSECUTION OF JEWS

I spoke to M. Litawski about this, and pointed out that the Decrees against the Jews are already reproduced in part in the "Nazi New Order in Poland" a book brought out by the Polish Govt's ^{own} Information office.

He agreed that he had ample material of this kind. What he most wants ^{has} ~~is~~ are personal statements by Jews who have been ill-treated, which could serve as evidence.

He thinks the Jewish organisations will supply anything they can in that way. It is not a matter in which we can help them.

(N.B. I pointed out to M. Litawski that the decrees against Jews were mostly signed, in the Government-General, not by ^{Dr} Frank, but by Krüger, chief of the Police & SS. (I gave him the numbers of 2 such decrees.) In a list which I obtained from the Foreign Office Research Department of all the "key" Germans in Poland, it is mentioned that attempts to "execute" Krüger have been made, but he recovered. He is therefore, evidently, detested. But the Poles have not yet indicted him. Why not? I have given a copy of the list to M. Litawski.)

I beg to enclose herewith the List of Concentration Camps which I promised some time ago to Col. H. Wade.

The list is based on information of different kind and derived from many sources which have been checked up as far as possible, and comprise -as far as it is known at present- the camps existing in Poland and of those in Germany and Austria into which substantial numbers of Poles are being deported.

Taking advantage of this opportunity I should like to ask you kindly to inform the Chairmen of the Commission and of the Committee I. that the temporary pause in transmission of further Polish cases is caused by the fact that our Office has in preparation several most extensive charges concerning e.g. the persecution of Catholic Clergy /3rd part/, confiscation of property, regulations tending to lower the human dignity of Poles and the conditions in the concentration camp at Oświęcim.

In the cases mentioned we are going to accuse a substantial number of Germans. The cases will be transmitted as soon as possible.




