i) SECTOR CDR MET THE GITARAMA PREFECT AND APPRISED HIM OF CHANGES IN HIS SECTOR BOUNDARY WHICH NOW INCLUDES ALL COMMUNES OF GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE PREFECT EXPRESSED HIS HAPPINESS WITH THE POSITIVE RESPONSE THE SECTOR HAS GIVEN TO HIS EACH REQUEST. HE FURTHER REQUESTED ASSISTANCE FOR THE REBURIAL CEREMONY AT MUGINA ON 27 FEB.

ii) THE GITARAMA PREFECT CONFIRMED THAT THE SUB PREFECT AT RUHANGO HAD BEEN ARRESTED ON 14 FEB 95 BASED ON ALLEGATIONS THAT HE HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN KILLINGS DURING THE WAR HE IS LODGED IN GITARAMA PRISON.

iii) A MEETING WAS HELD WITH UNREO, UNHCR AND HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICIALS LEARNT THAT SITUATION IN MUSAMBIRA, MUGINA AND KIGOMA COMMUNES IS TENSE DUE TO LARGE SCALE ARRESTS. IT WAS DECIDED THAT ATTENTION FOR THE NEXT FEW DAYS WOULD BE CONCENTRATED ON THESE COMMUNES. 38 ARRESTS HAVE BEEN MADE IN KIGOMA ALONE.

iv) A RECONCILIATION MEETING BETWEEN BOTH COMMUNITIES TO INCREASE . CONFIDENCE OF RETURNEES IS BEING HELD ON 19 FEB AT MURAMA. SAME WILL ATTENDED BY ONE MILOBS TEAM.

v) ONE TEAM PATROLLED TABA AND KAYENZI TO COLLECT BASIC DATA FOUN KAYENZI COMMUNE AS WELL FREQUENTED BY NGO's.

vi) ONE PATROL TO TABA COMMUNE (84188) TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND COLLECT BASIC DATA FOR UPDATE

OF COMMUNE CALLATION FILES.

THE PRESENT POPULATION IS 55967 AS COMPARED TO 61000 PREWAR.

UNICEF DISTRIBUTE TODAY 17 FEB 95 STATIONARY FOR THE FIRST CLASS ONLY AT TABA COMMUNE WHICH HAVE 17 PRIMARY SCHOOLS WITH 8702 STUDENTS.

vii) A TEAM VISITED KAYENZI COMMUNE (89-83) TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND COLLECT BASIC DATA FOR UPDATE OF COMMUNE COLLATION FILES. THE PRESENT POPULATION IS 33165 AS COMPARED TO 44210 PREWAR 26 RETURNEES DURING THE LAST PERIOD IN THIS COMMUNE WITH 10 SECTORS CARITAS PROVIDING SHELTERS AND "ARMY OF SALUTE" CONTRIBUTE TO REPAIR HOUSES AND PROVIDE FOOD, SEEDS AND SALARIES FOR AGRICULTURE MONITORS. THE BOURGSMaster PIERRE DADIEN SUBMITTED A REQUEST TO UNAMIR TO REPAIR THE COMMUNAL ROUTE. THE PATROL FOUND SEVEN BRIDGES BROKEN ON THE MAIN ROAD BETWEEN KAENZI (89 - 83) AND NYABIKENKE (91 - 72) RENDERIN ROAD IMPASSABLE FOR LARGER VEHICLE. THE PATROL GATHERED VALUABLE INFORMATION TO MAKE IT POSSIBLE FOR THE SECTOR TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.

THE PRESENT POPULATION IS 50250 AS COMPARED TO 54000 PREWAR. 1000 RETURNEES DURING LAST WEEK. R. C. DISTRIBUTING SEEDS AND FOOD FOR 7 SECTORS, ADRA IS CURRING OUT THE SAME SEED PROTECTION PROGRAM FOR ANOTHER 3 SECTORS.

A MISCELLEANOUS VACCINATION CAMPAIGN CURRED OUT BY MASANGO HOSPITAL AUTHORITY WITH NECESSARY MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FROM MALI COY.

547 CHILDREN (6 MONTH - 12 YEARS) ARE INJECTED TODAY.

DOCTOR SINABIMANGE OF MASANGO HOSPITAL HAS SUBMITTED A REQUEST TO UNAMIR TO PROVIDE FORMS AND PILLOWS, BED SHEETS FOR AT LEAST 50 BED.-

ii) A TEAM VISITED MURAMA COMMUNE (6749) TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES .

THE PRESENT POPULATION IS 32630 AS COMPARED 44000 PREWAR 2733 RETURNEES REACH MURAMA COMMUNE FROM 1 JAN TILL TODATE. PEOPLE IN MURAMA SUFFERING FROM "MALARIA" THEY REQUIRE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. THE BOURGMASER REQUESTS AT LEAST FOUR (04) BICYCLES AND ONE (1) MOTOCYCLE TO MAKE LIAISON WITH ALL SECTORS AND APPROACHED UNAMIR TO PROVIDE THOSE ITEMS.

iii) CIV POL TEAM VISITED RUTOBWE COMMUNE (8077) (RWTONGO) TO INVESTIGATE HARRASSMENT AND ARRESTS. THE COUNCELLER NDAGIJIMANA SAID "ON 4 FEB.95 AT NIGHT HIS DAUGHTER MUKANOHELI WAS ABDUCTED BY UNKNOWN PERSON AND FOUND KILLED THE NEXT

MORNING. THE BOURGMASER WAS INFORMED AND SENT RPA FOR PATROLLING, THEY ARRESTED 12 SUSPECTS, 10 DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE AND 2 TRANSFERED TO GITARAMA.

THE COMMUNE JUGE IS INVESTIGATING THE CASE AND AFTER THAT THOSE SUSPECT WILL BE TRANSFERED TO GITARAMA.

A - GITARAMA TEAM

(i) One patrol to MASANGO Commune (6254) to collect basic data for update of commune collation files and familiarise new MILOBs with the area. Confirmed that UNAMIR initiative for vaccination and immunisation has resulted in local medical authorities conducting the same on 16 Feb. Also confirmed that no arrests of returnees have taken place yet. The Asst Bourgemestre informed the patrol that some criminals have returned from the IDP camps but have yet to emerge from their homes for fear of being identified. It is possible that arrests in this commune will commence soon. The same team also conducted confidence patrolling in MUSHUBATI (6167) and MUKINGI.

(ii) A team visited BULINGA (0079) and NYABIKENKE (7492) as part of initial effort to gather more information on the communes recently included within Sector 3 boundary. In BULINGA it was learnt that the population is still 5000 short of the pre war figures. The patrol found two bridges broken rendering the route impassable for larger vehicles of NGO agencies. Three bridges at BAKAKWE (7477), GASAYO (0793) and GIFURWE (0697) were also found impassable for larger vehicles in NYABIKENKE. The patrol gathered valuable information to make it possible for the Sector to coordinate humanitarian assistance

B. BUTARE TEAM - Report not yet received. Being sent direct to FHQ.

C. MALI COY

(i) Patrol to NYABUSUNZU (9160). Reported no food distribution for last two months.

(ii) Patrol from MASANGO to KARAMBI (6153) and BUHANDA (6853) to secure the market area, being market day of the area.

(iii) Patrol from RUHANGO to KIRULI (7149) where it learnt that 69 IDPs had returned and 85 orphans in the area were being supported by volunteers. General shortage of food, seeds and agricultural tools.

(iv) Patrols with Bedford trucks and UNIMOGs becoming increasingly dangerous.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

i) A PATROL VISITED RUTOBWE (7681) AND KAYENZI (8388) COMMUNES TO TRY TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TO CONFIRM RUMOURS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES IN KAYENZI. THE SECONDARY TASK WAS TO FIND SOME MISSING CHILDREN REPORTED TO BE IN THAT AREA. ONE WAS FOUND ALIVE AND BROUGHT BACK TO A RELATIVE IN GITARAMA. THE PATROL ALSO CONFIRMED THE LOAN OF A TRUCK TO PICK UP AGRICULTURAL SUPPLIES FROM KIGALI TOMORROW.

ii) A PATROL VISITED THE MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (8374) AND WERE ADVISED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THERE ARE 2615 DESTROYED HOUSES AND THAT HELP TO REPAIR THEM IS REQUIRED. THE LOCAL MEDICAL FACILITY NEEDS HELP TO REPAIR THE GENERATOR, THIS WILL BE ARRANGED LOCALLY; EVACUATION WILL BE ORGANIZED FOR ONE PATIENT SUFFERING FROM MENINGITIS. CARE INTERNATIONAL DISTRIBUTED FOOD IN THE AREA TO 2794 PEOPLE; 10KG SEED PER FAMILY AND 15 KG BEANS AND MAIZE FOOD. NEITHER COMMUNE STAFF NOR TEACHERS HAVE BEEN PAID SINCE SEPTEMBER. CATTLE RUSTLING AND THEFT OF MONEY IS A PROBLEM. VERY FEW IDPS OR REFUGEES HAVE COME BACK. SEED AND HOES ARE STILL IN SHORT SUPPLY.

iii) A PATROL VISITED MUGINA COMMUNE (9367) AND WERE ADVISED IN MUGINA SECTOR THAT ONLY 20 REFUGEES HAD COME BACK IN THE PAST TWO MONTHS.

iv) THE SECTOR CDR MET WITH THE LOCAL BDE CDR, COL NGOGA AND DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING POINTS: 1) MARKING AND SAFETY OF NIGHT ROAD BLOCKS, 2) THE NEED FOR SOCIAL CONTACTS AND BETTER LIAISON BETWEEN OFFICERS OF RPA AND UNAMIR, 3) ILLEGAL ARRESTS; AND, 4) THE CONDUCT OF A JOINT PATROL NEXT MONDAY. A FULL REPORT FOLLOWS SEPERATELY BUT THE ATTITUDE OF THE COL WAS VERY POSITIVE ON ALL POINTS.

i) REPORT NOT RECEIVED DUE TO TECHNICAL PROBLEMS

C. MALI COY

i) THE NTONGWE PLATOON SENT A PATROL TO SHYRA SECTOR (9150) AND FOUND THE SIT CALM. A DUTCH LADY HAS DEVELOPED A SYSTEM OF CARING FOR ORPHANS IN THE AREA BY OFFERING TO PAY LOCAL FOSTER PARENTS. SHE IS EXPECTING FUNDS IN JUNE AND IS PROMISING TO REIMBURSE MONIES SPENT ON THE CARE OF ORPHANS WITH 5% INTEREST. WITH THE LARGE NUMBER OF PERSONS RETURNING TO THIS SECTOR, FOOD SUPPLIES ARE GETTING LOW. THE LAST DISTRIBUTION WAS BY ICRC ON 30 DEC 94. THERE IS NO POTABLE WATER AVAILABLE. THE MASANGO PLATOON SENT A PATROL TO BWERAMANA (6555) AND WERE FORCED TO COMPLETE THE LAST SIX KM ON FOOT DUE TO THE STATE OF THE ROADS AND THE NATURE OF THEIR VEHICLES. THE AREA LACKS SEED, FOOD AND MEDICINE. THE RUHANGOI PLATOON SENT A PATROL TO KIGOMA (7750) AND WERE ADVISED THAT 676 REFUGEES HAD COME BACK IN TO THE COMMUNE IN THE PAST WEEKS.

ii) PATROLS ARE BECOMING BOTH VERY DIFFICULT AND DANGEROUS WITH BEDFORD TRUCKS IN THESE RAINS. PATROL VEHICLES ARE URGENTLY NEEDED.

i) SENT DIRECT DUE TO TECHNICAL PROBLEMS.

i) THE PATROL TO RUFOBWE INTERCEPTED THAT UNICEF WATER TRUCK AND WERE ABLE TO OBTAIN A COMMITMENT TO DELIVER WATER TO THE BIYMANA ORPHANAGE TOMORROW.



General

1. The situation in the Sector remained calm.
2. The highlight of this week was the currency exchange which took place from 03 - 05 Jan.
3. OP RETOUR commenced wef 29 Dec 94. Till now around 4000 DPs moved but very few in this Sector. Till now only two ORCs have come up in the Gitarama Prefecture viz Ntongwe (LWF) and Kigoma (OXFAM QUEBEC). The FOOD FOR THE CHILDREN is providing the ORCs in Butare Prefecture. However, the ORCs at Nyakizu and Gishamvu communes are yet to be operational.

RPA Activities

4. RPA continues to actively patrol built up areas with foot and vehicle mounted patrols.
5. Meeting was held with the RPA Bde Cdr to clarify details about the proposed deployment of Formed Tps in the communes of Murama, in Gitarama Prefecture and Nyakizu in Butare Prefecture.

RGF/Militia Activities

Locals

6. The local authorities have undertaken a drive to repair some of the major rds in the Sector. They are being assisted with transport by the Formed tps.

MILOB Activities

6. MILOB teams were monitoring progress of OP RETOUR and coordinating the local authorities with the NGOs and other UN agencies. They also monitored the currency exchange op which went on smoothly. The only observation was that there was not enough replacement currency and plenty of people were thus denied the opportunity to exchange their money.

Mali Coy

8. Confidence and information gathering patrols were conducted in AOR. Recce and planning for OP RETOUR was carried out.

9. On an average, it provided one truck daily for humanitarian assistance to the NGOs in various communes in its AOR and escorted one convoy. It also provided trucks to the Prefecture to assist in transportation of materials for rd building.

Malawi Coy

10. Besides, providing protection to TAC HQ, BUTARE, it carried out confidence patrols in its AOR and also monitored and transported returning refugees from the BURUNDI border. Recce and planning for OP RETOUR was carried out.

11. On an average, it provided one truck daily for humanitarian assistance to the NGOs in various communes in its AOR.

12. 96 patients have been treated in their clinics during the past week.

Other Humanitarian Activities

13. One of the pumps which needed repairs in the pumping station at Gitarama was sent to Kigali for repairs with the help of recovery veh from INDBATT and Malicoy.

14. The Sector was successful, with cooperation from Sector 4B and CONCERN, to unite a mother at Gatagara (near Ruhango) and her son who after two weeks of search was located at Kibuye with one of his relatives. The search was undertaken when the mother came to this HQ with the request to help her locate her two year old son who was separated from her during the war and she had received news that she was somewhere in Kibuye area along with one of her relatives.

15. There was a meeting of all NGOs involved in the setting up of ORCs, UNHCR, UNREO, reps from IOC and MILOBS to tie up details regarding coordination, monitoring, info exchange and communication aspects for OP RETOUR.

Border Crossings

16. Total number of persons crossing into RWANDA from BURUNDI between 02 Jan - 08 Jan were 108.

Assessment

17. The situation in the Sector appears to be calm. The presence of Formed Troops in various parts of the sector is greatly assisting in instilling a sense of confidence in the local population. The locals appear to be more encouraged in approaching

UNAMIR elements to report their problems. Constant liaison with local officials of the administration and RPA has succeeded in bringing about a fair level of cooperation from them. Liaison with NGOs and humanitarian agencies is being stepped up in order to bring to notice the problems of the populace and effect better cooperation. However, it seems OP RETOUR has not gained the intended momentum and the lack of coordination between the two ends of the pipeline needs to be addressed at the earliest.

THEY ALSO CONFIRMED THAT THE NYBARONGO RIVER HAD BEEN USED TO DUMP BODIES DURING THE MASSACRE. THERE IS NO PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN THE AREA BUT THEY ARE WELL ATTENDED BY NGOS. NYABIKENKE COMMUNE REQUESTED HELP TO REPAIR THEIR ELECTRIC GENERATOR (LISTER MODEL, 21.7 KW, 33 AMP). IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT 46 GENDARMES ARE BEING TRAINED IN THIS COMMUNE; AT THE SAME LOCATION AS THE COMMUNE HOLDING FACILITY.

ii) A TEAM PATROLLED TO MUSHUBATI (6971), NYAMABUYE (7471) AND MASANGO (6254) COMMUNES. FARMING AND DELIVERY OF HUMANITARIAN AID IS IMPROVING BUT THE FLOW OF IDPS IN BOTH COMMUNES REMAINS LOW. MUSHUBATI COMMUNE POPULATION IS STILL 10,000 LESS THAN BEFORE THE WAR (6,000).

iii) A BUTARE TEAM MILOB HAD A MINOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT AT THE ENTRANCE TO GITARAMA MILOB HQ. AN ACCIDENT REPORT FOLLOWS. NOT INJURIES AND NO DAMAGE TO UN VEH. PRELIMINARY CONCLUSION

IS THAT ACCIDENT WAS ATTRIBUTABLE TO BALD TIRES AND WET PAVEMENT.

AS AN INTERIM MEASURE, MALAWICOY WILL ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE A WEEKLY MEDICAL VISIT. MUYAGA STILL HAS 9,000 REFUGEES IN BURUNDI. SOME FORM OF INFORMAL AGREEMENT EXISTS BETWEEN THE COMMUNE AUTHORITIES AND THE NEIGHBOURING COMMUNE IN BURUNDI REGARDING TRANS-BORDER CROSSINGS. OTHER COMMUNES IN THE AREA WILL BE CHECKED TO SEE IF THE SAME ARRANGEMENTS ARE IN PLACE. THE PATROL RETURNED VIA NTYAZO WHERE AN ORC WITH APPORX 60 PLASTIC TENTS WAS NOTICED. NO OFFICIALS WERE ON HAND TO EXPLAIN WHY THIS ORC WAS IN A COMMUNE THAT HAD NOT BEEN SELECTED AS A TARGET COMMUNE FOR OP RETOUR.

THE UNHCR REP HAD FOLLOWED UP TWO FAMILIES IN THE MURAMA COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT THEY ARE IN GOOD HEALTH AND ARE BEING ASSISTED IN SETTLING IN BY THEIR NEIGHBOURS. THE ATTITUDE OF THE BOURGEMESTRE OF NTONGWE WAS ALSO DISCUSSED AND IT WAS AGREED THAT HE IS TOO EMOTIONALLY AFFECTED BY HIS OWN LOSSES TO OVERCOME HIS DESIRE FOR REVENGE.

B. BUTARE TEAM

i) ONE PATROL WAS SENT TO KINYARU-HAUTE AND KINYARU-BAS BORDER CROSSINGS. 2 RWANDESE RETURNED ON 31 JAN.

ii) ONE PATROL WENT TO MARABA COMMUNE. THEY WERE ADVISED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT MANY PEOPLE NOT BELONGING TO HIS COMMUNE HAD BEEN BROUGHT IN BY OP RETOUR. HE DOES NOT WANT TO ACCEPT THEM AND WILL SPEAK TO HIS PREFET TO DISCUSS MOVING THEM TO THEIR OWN COMMUNES. MORE DETAILS TOMORROW.

iii) A MILOB TEAM WAS ADVISED THAT 3 PERSONS WERE KILLED AND ONE WOUNDED DURING AN ATTACK IN THE NYKI SECTOR (7232) OF RUSITARA COMMUNE DURING THE NIGHT OF 30/31 JAN. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT THE ATTACK WAS BY BANDITS FROM CAMPS IN THE GIKONGORO AREA.

C. MALI COY

i) NO PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TODAY DUE TO ROTATION OF PLATOONS. EXERCISE COMPLETE; PATROLS RESUME TOMORROW.

ii) A PRISONER ESCAPED FROM THE NTONGWE HOLDING FACILITY EARLY THIS MORNING AND TOOK REFUGE WITH THE MALI PLATOON STATIONED THERE. A COMPANY OFFICER PROCEEDED TO THE LOCATION AND THE INDIVIDUAL WAS HANDED BACK OVER TO AN RPA OFFICER.

D. MALAWI COY

i) SECURITY DUTIES CONTINUE AT TAC HQ.

ii) PATROL SENT TO GISHAMVU AND NYAKIZU ORCS. IDPS CONTINUE TO GO DIRECTLY TO THEIR HOMES WITHOUT DELAYING AT ORCS. RPA SOLDIERS REFUSED THE PATROL ENTRANCE TO THE CLINIC AND SCHOOL AT GISHAMVU COMMUNE. TO BE FOLLOWED UP LOCALLY. A SECOND PATROL COVERED RAZIBINGE (5705) AND RUSENGE (5904) AND REPORTED SIT CALM.

i) MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO PREFECTURE OF GITARAMA FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE OF THE MAIN KIGALI/GITARAMA ROAD AND AN ESCORT TO THE BROWN AND ROOT BREAD TRUCK GOING TO CYANGUGU; MIGHTY EXPENSIVE BREAD.
