DAILY SITREP FOR 03 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS RELATIVELY STABLE ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 3B, MALICOY AND MILOBS REPORTED THAT THERE WAS SMALL ARMS FIRE AT GITARAMA PRISON BETWEEN 0525 HRS AND 0545 HRS ON 03 APR 95. ABOUT 100 ROUNDS WERE FIRED. ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT DEAD AND THREE OTHER INJURED. IT IS STILL NOT KNOWN AS TO WHO OPENED FIRE. SITUATION STILL TENSE. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSC, AMBASSADOR KHAN MET WITH THE WFP REPRESENTATIVE TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, WFP'S SUPPORT FOR THE RE-OPENING OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

B. HE THEN HELD HIS REGULAR MEETING WITH UN HEADS OF AGENCIES DURING WHICH HE ASKED THEM TO CONTRIBUTE TO PROVIDING LOGISTICAL SUPPORT TO THE GOVERNMENT. HE HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING TO DISCUSS THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE TRUST FUND.

C. HE THEN CONCLUDED BY RECEIVING MR. AYALA-LASSO, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR HUMAN RIGHTS WHO GAVE HIM AN OVERVIEW OF HIS MISSION IN RWANDA.

D. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (OAU), MR. SALIM AHMED SALIM, ON SATURDAY ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON A 5-DAY VISIT IN RWANDA.

(2) IN HIS INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA HE SAID THAT PEACE HAD RETURNED TO RWANDA AND HE HAD COME TO SEE WITH RWANDESE AUTHORITIES HOW THE OAU COULD PARTICIPATE IN RWANDA'S EFFORTS IN NATIONAL RECONSTRUCTION.

(3) MR. SALIM ON SUNDAY VISITED THE NYARUBUYE CHURCH COMPOUND WHERE 8,000 PEOPLE ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN MASSACRED. HE ALSO VISITED TWO ORPHANAGES AT NYAMATA, SOUTH OF KIGALI. THE OAU SECRETARY-GENERAL PLEDGED A DONATION OF 200 BEDS AND 200 MATTRESSES, AND A VEHICLE TO THE ORPHANAGES, AND ADOPTED AN ORPHAN CALLED HAVUGIMANA, WHO WOULD REMAIN IN RWANDA, AND FOR WHOM HE WOULD PAY SCHOOL FEES AND OTHER NECESSITIES. HE ALSO VISITED ON SUNDAY NYAGATARE TRANSIT RECEPTION CENTRE FOR RETURNEES.

(4) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA ON SUNDAY OFFICIATED AT THE CEREMONY TO RE-OPEN THE NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF RWANDA (UNR) WHICH CLOSED IN APRIL IN 1994 WITH THE OUTBREAK OF THE GENOCIDE.

(5) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU REMINDED THAT THE OBJECTIVE OF THE RWANDESE UNIVERSITY WAS THE SEARCH FOR TRUTH AND KNOWLEDGE AND REGRETTED THAT RWANDESE ACADEMICS, SUCH AS LEON MUGESERA AND FERDINAND NAHIMANA, HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN GENOCIDE. 1000 UNIVERSITY STUDENTS WERE KILLED, INCLUDING 400 STUDENTS WHO WERE KILLED BY THEIR FELLOWS INSIDE THE CAMPUS. 50 UNIVERSITY LECTURERS AS WELL AS 150 UNIVERSITY WORKERS WERE ALSO KILLED.

(6) THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR HIGHER EDUCATION,

CULTURE AND SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH, MR. JOSEPH NSINGIMANA SAID THAT UNR WOULD HAVE 4000 STUDENTS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 1994-95. HE SAID THAT ONLY 2,000 STUDENTS WOULD BE ACCOMMODATED ON CAMPUS, AND THE OTHER 2,000 WERE TO FIND ACCOMMODATION ON THEIR OWN OUTSIDE THE CAMPUS AND THAT THIS WAS A BIG PROBLEM.

(7) THE UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR HUMAN RIGHTS ON A VISIT TO RWANDA, MR. JOSE AYALA-LASSO, ON SUNDAY VISITED THE KIBEHO CAMP FOR DISPLACED PEOPLE. THE PREFECT OF GIKONGORO, MR. FELIX ZIGIRINSHUTI ANNOUNCED THAT THE CAMP WAS A SANCTUARY FOR CRIMINALS WHO REFUSED TO RETURN HOME, SPREAD RUMOURS AND WERE INVOLVED IN ACTS CAUSING INSECURITY IN THE REGION.

(8) MR. AYALA-LASSO SAID THAT CONSIDERABLE EFFORTS HAD BEEN MADE IN RWANDA IN HUMAN RIGHTS RESPECT SINCE THE END OF THE TRAGEDY IN RWANDA IN 1994.

(9) THE SPOKESMAN OF THE RPA AND MP. COLONEL FRANK MUGAMBAGE ON SUNDAY AT 1930 HRS COMMENTED ON AN ARTICLE WRITTEN IN THE NEWSPAPER INTUMWA-LE MESSENGER WHICH ALLEGED THAT THERE WERE INDICATIONS THAT A REPRISAL GENOCIDE WAS POSSIBLY BEING PREPARED.

(10) THE ARTICLE ESTABLISHED A COMPARISON BETWEEN THE PERIOD PRECEDING THE GENOCIDE AND THE CURRENT PERIOD. IT CITED INSTANCES OF ASSASSINATION OF OFFICIALS, ATTACKS ON JOURNALISTS AND A CAMPAIGN TO FORCE UNAMIR TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY. THE ARTICLE ALLEGES THAT SOME RPA ELEMENTS ARE OPENLY SAYING THEY WANT TO COMMIT A GENOCIDE, THAT A MEDIA CAMPAIGN IN THE STYLE OF RTLM BEGAN TO FORCE UNAMIR TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY, AND THAT SOME RWANDESE LEADERS BACK THE PLAN WITH THE EXHUMATION OF SKELETONS WHICH INCITES THE ANGER AND DESIRE OF PEOPLE TO REVENGE THEIR RELATIVES.

(11) COLONEL MUGAMBAGE REJECTED THE ALLEGATIONS AS BEING UNFOUNDED AND RIDICULOUS. HE SAID THAT THE ACCUSATIONS AGAINST UNAMIR AT PRESENT ARE BACKED BY EVIDENCE, UNAMIR TROOPS KILLED A MAN IN BYUMBA, UNAMIR VEHICLES IN KIGALI HIT, KILLED PEOPLE AND GOT AWAY IN KIGALI, AND UNAMIR TROOPS IN KIBUYE OFFERED PROTECTION TO CRIMINALS IN KIBUYE AND DENIED ACCESS TO THE PREFECT, AND THESE WERE TRUTHS, WHILE RTLM HAD ACCUSED UNAMIR OF BEING ACCOMPLICE OF THE RPF WITHOUT PROVIDING EVIDENCE.

(12) COLONEL MUGAMBAGE SAID THAT SUCH WRITINGS WERE AIMED AT CAUSING INSECURITY IN THE COUNTRY AND ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN AGAINST THE AUTHORS OF THE ARTICLE.

(13) THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MR. ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO ANNOUNCED ON FRIDAY THAT THE FIRST TRIALS OF THE AUTHORS OF THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA BY NATIONAL TRIBUNALS WOULD BE HELD IN KIGALI ON 6 APRIL,

1995.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) IN SECTOR 1, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA HAS REINFORCED ITS POSITION AT RUSHAKI WITH A COY WHICH WAS BROUGHT FROM THE KIBUNGO TRAINING CAMP.

(2) SECTOR 2 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THEY WERE TOLD BY THE CIVILIANS AT KABUKUBU 2069 THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE COMING TO THE COMMUNE AT NIGHT AND FORCING THEM TO GIVE MONEY.

(3) RPA BDE CDR, IN SECTOR 3, REPORTED TO THE MILOB SECTOR HQ THAT PRISONERS HAD REMOVED THE MORTAR FROM THE BRICKS ON ONE WALL AND THAT HE FEARED A MASS ESCAPE ATTEMPT IN THE NEAR FUTURE. ALSO IN SECTOR 3, RPA PLATOON AT NTONGWE APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN INCREASED TO COY LEVEL. IT WAS ALSO CONFIRMED THAT THE RPA HAS ISSUED INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MUSHUBATI COMMUNE THAT ALL RESIDENTS WERE TO STAY INDOORS FOR 48 HOURS BEGINNING LAST LIGHT ON 6 APR BECAUSE OF MILITARY EXERCISES. FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS HAVE BEEN ISSUED THAT NO ONE IS TO HESITATE TO OPEN THEIR DOORS, DAY OR NIGHT, WHEN SOME ONE KNOCKS.

(4) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED A LOCAL AGED 38 IN GISHAMVU COMMUNE TOGETHER WITH HIS FIVE CHILDREN AGED BETWEEN 2 AND 16 YRS. THE REASONS FOR THEIR ARREST IS ON ALLEGATIONS OF ILLEGAL BORDER CROSSING. RPA INSIST THEY WILL ONLY RELEASE THE CHILDREN WHEN THEIR MOTHER WHO IS AT LARGE IS LOCATED.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 031930B APR 95 RPA KILLED A LOCAL MDM EMPLOYEE AT KAMEMBE MARKET GR 8031. REASONS FOR THE KILLING UNKNOWN.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC CONDUCTED NORMAL MILITARY BUSINESS. HE MONITORED CLOSELY THE SITUATION EVOLVING IN RWANDA AS THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE CIVIL WAR APPROACHES. ALTHOUGH A SLIGHT INCREASE IN INCIDENTS ARE NOTED THE SITUATION REMAINS CALM. HE ALSO GAVE TWO INTERVIEWS. ONE WITH THE AUSTRALIAN DEFENSE AGENCY AND THE OTHER WITH LE

MONDE NEWSPAPER.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ROTATION EX IN PROGRESS WITH FIRST BATCH HAVING DEPARTED KIA FOR NIGERIA BY 030625B APR 95. NIBATT TWO ADVANCE PARTY COMPRISING 85 OFFERS AND MEN ARRIVED KIA BY 032230B APR 95. 45 OUT OF THE TOTAL ARRIVALS WERE WITHOUT INTERNATIONAL PASSPORTS AND ARE BEING HELD AT KIA BY AIRPORT AUTHORITIES WHO MAY OPT TO RETURN THEM TO NIGERIA TO NEGOTIATIONS FOR THEIR RELEASE AND MOVE TO SECT IN PROGRESS.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 70 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) RPA TROOPS ARRESTED AND DETAINED TWO GHANBATT SOLDIERS AT RUHUNDA GR 4691 FOR NOT HAVING ANY IDENTITY DOCUMENTATION ON THEM. THEY WERE LATER RELEASED WHEN THEIR IDENTITY WAS ASCERTAINED BY OTHER RPA SOLDIERS AS UNAMIR SOLDIERS FROM GHANA.

D. SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A PTL TO MALA GR 2068 REPORTED THAT THE RPA COMD IN THE AREA CONFIRMED THAT RETURNEES WERE NOT ALLOWED TO USE ANY TRANSPORT ACROSS THE LAKE BUT SHOULD GO THROUGH CYANGUGU. ANOTHER PTL TO BIRAMBO GR 4663 REPORTED THAT THE GEN SY SITUATION IS TENSE AND PRISONERS ARE BEING MISTREATED IN PRISONS.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 45 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE AND TRANSPORTED ONE LOCAL TO KIBUYE HOSP.

E. SECTOR 3B (MALICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED TPT TO THE PREFECTURE OF GITARAMA AND LWF TO TRANSPORT SEED POTATOES FROM GISENYI AND RELIEF EQUIPMENT WITHIN TAMBWE COMMUNE.

F. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED TPS AND SY FOR OP RETOUR.

(3) MORE PEOPLE FROM VARIOUS COMMUNES ARE JOINING THE DPCs IN THE SOUTH.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 65 LOCALS IN AOR.

G. SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) AT ABOUT 031130B APR 95, FIRING WAS HEARD BY SENTRIES ON DUTY COMING FROM A DIRECTION EAST OF THE SENBATT LOG BASE IN BUTARE. IT WAS ASSUMED THAT THE FIRING CAME FROM THE BUTARE PRISON AREA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 20 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED 8 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI-1 TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

(3) BN COMD HELD A SECURITY MEETING WITH MDM, UNHCR, ICRC AND MILOB REGARDING THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 6 LOCALS DENTAL PATIENTS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 129 LOCALS IN AOR .

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) RRF UNDERTOOK A SY TASK AT THE AIRPORT.

(3) 314 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND KIGALI TOWN. 62 IDPs WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO RUHENGERI AND BUTARE.

(4) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 56 UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF AT OWN CLINICS.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

- (A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

- (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
- (B) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE GOAL (NGO) HAS COMPLETED A NEW HEALTH CENTRE AT MULINDI WHICH WILL OPERATE FROM MAY 95. UNICEF HAS DONATED 140 PLASTIC SHEETS TO BE USED AS TEMPORARY ROOFS FOR THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS AT KİYOMBE COMMUNE.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

- (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
- (B) MILOBS WENT TO INVESTIGATE THE CIRCUMSTANCES THAT LED TO THE ARREST OF TWO GHANBATT SOLDIERS. THE TEAM FOUND OUT THAT THE SOLDIERS HAD GONE OUT TO WASH THEIR CLOTHES AND THEN BUY SOME ITEMS FROM THE NEIGHBOURING MARKET WHEN TWO RPA SOLDIERS ASKED THEM TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES. THE RPA SOLDIERS TOOK THEM TO THEIR BARRACKS FOR IDENTIFICATION AND THEIR OFFICERS FINALLY RELEASED THEM AFTER IDENTIFYING THEM.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

- (A) THE SIT IN THE SECTOR WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS RECEIVED SEVERAL REPORTS OF MASS ARRESTS BY RPA. THE SPATE OF ARREST IN THIS SECTOR IS BECOMING ALARMING SINCE MOST REPORTS HAVE BEEN CONFIRMED BY MILOBS AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS.
- (B) MILOBS PATROLS TO TAMBWE GR 7653 AND NTONGWE GR 9057 COMMUNES REPORTED OF MANY RUMOURS PERTAINING TO UP COMING ANNIVERSARY EVENTS. IN NTONGWE, THE TEAM NOTED AN INCREASE IN RPA STR TO COY LEVEL.

(C) ANOTHER MILOB TEAM TO MUSHUBATI GR 7070 COMMUNE OBSERVED A NUMBER OF PERSONS AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE WITH COMPLAINTS ABOUT LOOTING OF THEIR HOMES. THE TEAM ALSO NOTICED THAT THE RPA CHECK POINTS ALONG THE MAIN ROAD TO KIBUYE HAVE BEEN REINFORCED AND ARE MUCH MORE RIGOROUS IN THEIR INSPECTIONS THAN BEFORE.

(D) A MILOB PTL TO THE MURAMBA GR 2056 AND NYAKIBINGO GR 2656 SECTORS OF GISOVU COMMUNE WERE INFORMED ABOUT LARGE SCALE ARRESTS BY RPA. AROUND 50 FAMILIES HAVE LEFT FOR DP CAMPS SOUTH OF GIKONGORO AREA. THE LOCALS WERE HESITANT TALKING TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL BECAUSE THEY FEARED THEY WOULD BE ARRESTED BY THE RPA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS PATROLLED IDP CAMPS AND MONITORED OP RETOUR AT KIBEHO GR 5107 AND NDAGO GR 520023. AT NDAGO IDPS REFUSED TO GO TO THEIR COMMUNES. 102 PEOPLE WERE TRANSPORTED FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE GR 6428 AND GITARAMA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES STILL ON THE INCREASE IN THE SECTOR.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. MILOBS PATROLS TO KACYIRU, KANOMBE, AND NYARUGENGE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KACYIRU COMMUNE INDICATED THAT HE IS UNABLE TO GIVE THE UP TO DATE STATISTICS OF THE POPULATION OF THE COMMUNE DUE TO SHORTAGE OF FUNDS, VEHICLES, STATIONERY AND MAN POWER. AT KANOMBE COMMUNE THERE IS NO ELECTRICITY AND PEOPLE ARE STILL DRINKING WATER FROM SWAMPS IN MASAKA SECTEUR GR 2179.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 52 OUT-PATIENTS AND 5 DENTAL PATIENTS. AUSMED CURRENTLY HOLDING 14 IN-PATIENTS.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. A TOTAL OF 19

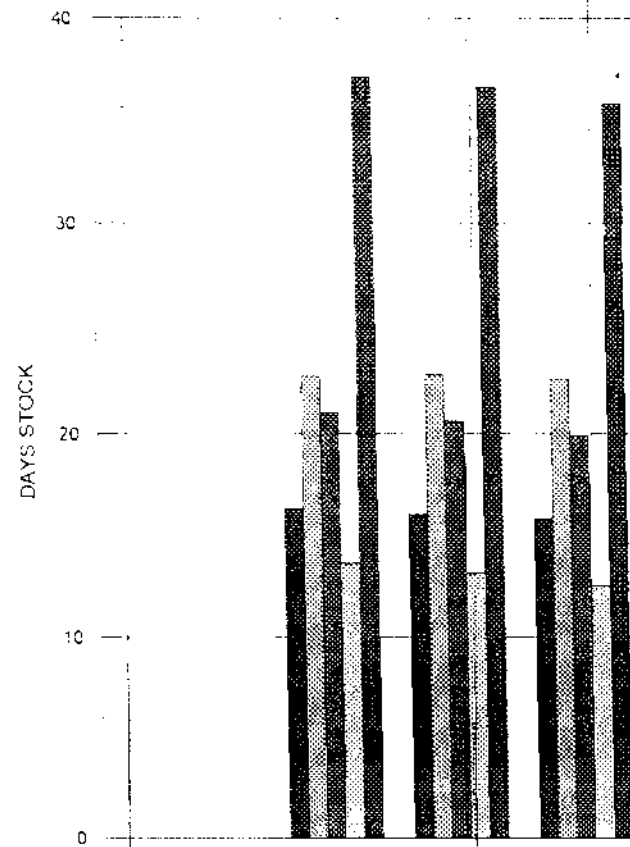

DURING THE INITIAL, INVESTIGATION IT WAS FOUND THAT TWO BROTHERS IN GATAGARA SECTOR (GR 815708) MIGHT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RUMOUR. THE LOCALS MENTIONED THAT MANY PEOPLE WERE MAKING PLANS TO FLEE.

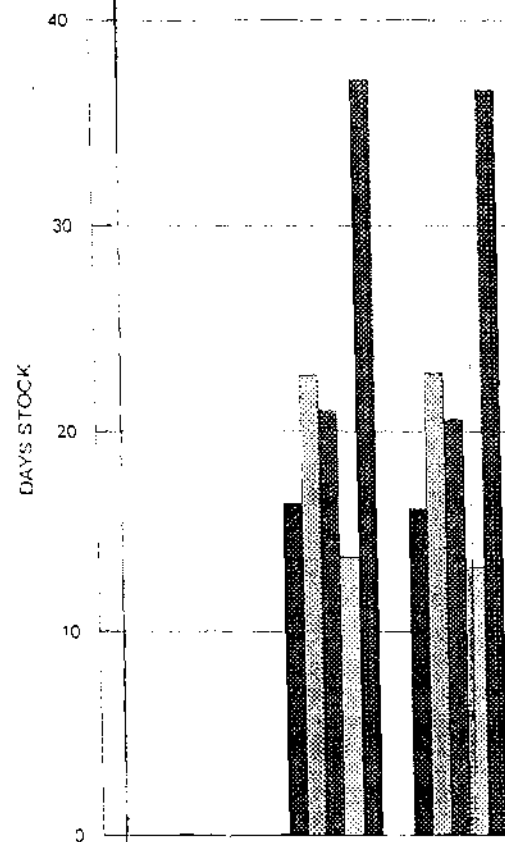

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. GHANBATT PATROL BASED IN RUNYOMBI REPORTED THAT DPs AT BUSANZE CAMP HAVE BEEN ASKED BY THE LOCAL AUTH AND RPA TO ABANDON CAMP FOR SECURITY REASONS. SAME PATROL ALSO REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 602 BURUNDI NATIONALS IN THE CAMP.

B. ZAMBATT HAS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS DEPLOYED ITS TROOPS IN MUSEBEYA GR 3933, RUKONDO GR 5538, MUSANGE GR 5247 AND AT CYANIKA GR 562203 AND HAS SET UP A ROAD BLOCK ON THE ROAD TO RUKONDO. AS A RESULT OF THE UNWILLINGNESS OF IDPs TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOMES, AN RPA MAJOR ORDERED THE CLOSURE OF THE CYANIKA DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AND STOPPED THE AICF FROM GIVING OUT ANY FOOD TO THE IDPs. THE ISSUE WAS RESOLVED AFTER A PROTRACTED NEGOTIATION BETWEEN ZAMBATT CONTINGENT COMMANDER AND RPA AND AICF. THE RPA COMMANDER HAS GIVEN THE NGOS TWO DAYS IN WHICH THEY MUST FINISH THE DISTRIBUTION EXERCISE AND THERE AFTER THE DPs MUST MOVE.

(1) IN SECTOR 4C FORMER RGF/INTERAHAMWE CONDUCTED FOUR RAIDS ON LOCAL BUSINESSMEN IN KAGANO COMMUNE WITHIN THE LAST 24 HRS. ALL THE ATTACKS OCCURRED SIMULTANEOUSLY AT ABOUT 0130HRS 31 DEC 94. IT WAS SUSPECTED THAT THE ATTACKS WERE CARRIED OUT BY ONE LARGE GROUP WHICH SPLIT ITSELF INTO SMALL GPS FOR SEPARATE TGTS. ATTACKERS TOOK AWAY EVERYTHING THEY COULD LAY HANDS ON.

(2) RPA HAS CONFIRMED THAT THE REGULAR ATTACKS ON CIV TGTS IN SECTOR 4C WERE BY ELMS OF THE FRGF. ATTACKS CARRIED OUT BY PERS ARR FORM ZAIRE BY BOATS. ATTACKS WERE SEEN IN RGF UNIFORMS. THEIR WPNS INCLUDE SMALL ARMS AND GRENS. THERE WERE THREE OCCASIONS WHERE THE ATTACKERS MOUNTED HMG ON BOATS EQUIPPED WITH OUT-BOARD MOTORS. ATTACKERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE STOLEN COWS AND FOOD SUPPLIES.

C. MILITIA. TWO PERS ATTACKED A WOMAN AT RUKOGULI GR 8514 IN SECT 4C ON 30 DEC 94. THE VICTIM WAS TAKEN TO CYANGUGU HOSP AND CLAIMS SHE RECOGNIZED ATTACKERS AS NEIGHBOURS FROM HER VILLAGE. TWO OTHER LADIES FROM KIZURA GR 9304 REPORTED THAT THEIR HUSBANDS WERE KIDNAPPED ON 30 DEC 94 BY 5 MEN WHO WERE FORMER NEIGHBOURS BEFORE THE WAR. THE SAME GROUP OF 5 WERE LATER SEEN AT BUGARAMA. LOC OF HUSBANDS STILL UNKNOWN.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY STABLE.

A. IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT SITUATION REMAINS UNSTABLE AND TENSE IN AREA OF NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 DUE TO THE RAIDS BY INSURGENTS GROUPS AND THREAT OF FURTHER RAIDS AGAINST LOCAL BUSINESSMEN.

B. REPORTS REACHING MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 INDICATED THAT ON 28 DEC 94, A TOTAL OF 62 LOCALS WERE MURDERED AT KABARE (7170), CANVETONGA AND RUBUMBA (7473). SECTOR MILOBS IN CONJUNCTION WITH UNHCR AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT. THE VICTIMS WERE ALLEGEDLY KILLED WITH MACHETES. SECTOR MILOBS WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT THERE WAS ONE SURVIVOR BUT EFFORTS TO LOCATE HIM WERE FUTILE. 5 PERS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN CONNECTION WITH THE MURDERS BUT UNHCR OFFICIALS WERE NOT AVAL TO CONFIRM.

C. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT DISCOVERED FOUR MASS GRAVES AT MWIYANIKE GR 4518. THE GRAVES CONTAINED A TOTAL OF 19 BODIES.

D. SUB-PREFECT OF KIGARAMA INFORMED SECTOR 2 MILOBS THAT 8 CIVILIANS HAD BEEN KILLED AND 2 OTHERS INJURED AT KIGARAMA ON THE NIGHT OF 28/29 DEC 94 WITH KNIVES AND ARROWS. THE VICTIMS WERE TAKEN TO RWITRWABU HOSP. HUMAN RIGHTS AND MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

THE MINISTRY IS INCREASINGLY NOT APPROVING FLIGHTS FOR OTHER EXTERNAL CHARITABLE CHARTER AIRLINES (MASS AND ECHO FLIGHT) BECAUSE THEY DO NOT USE AIRPORT SERVICES AND COMPETE FOR PASSENGERS WITH THE REGULAR CARRIERS.

B. FRGF IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT 2 PEOPLE WERE KILLED IN THE AREA OF LAKE KIVU ON 22 DEC 94. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE VICTIMS WERE KILLED AT MURURU GR 8233 AND A SUM OF 53,900 RWANDESE FRANCS STOLEN BY FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS.

IN SECTOR 4A NORTH, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT OC RPA COY IN KADUHA GR 4643 ADDRESSED A MEETING OF LOCALS AT THE MARKET AREA WHERE HE REASSURED THEM OF THE IMPROVEMENT IN THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA. HE FURTHER ENCOURAGED THEM TO START CULTIVATING THEIR FIELDS AND LATER RELEASED 12 DETAINEES WHO WERE IN PRISON.

D. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT TROOPS ON PATROL IN NEMBA AREA WERE APPROACHED BY A TEAM OF 14 DPs REPRESENTING OVER 700 DPs FOR PROTECTION AND FOOD. THE DPs LEFT GITARAMA AREA AND ARE NOW LOCATED IN NEMBA COMMUNE DUE TO ALLEGED HARASSMENT AND HOSTILITY BY RPA SOLDIERS WITHIN THE AREA. HUMAN RIGHTS AND UNHCR WERE INFORMED.

E. IN SECTOR 4C, THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA AND THE MINISTERS OF JUSTICE, FAMILY AFFAIRS AND INTERIOR VISITED CYANGUGU ON 21 DEC 94. THE PRIME MINISTER ADDRESSED PROMINENT PERSONS AND THE PUBLIC. HE SAID HIS PRIORITY WAS TO ENSURE SECURITY TO EXPEDITE THE RETURN OF REFUGEES.

F. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT A MEETING TO DISCUSS OP RETOUR WAS HELD IN KAMANA GR 5197 ON 22 DEC 94. APPROXIMATELY 19000 DPs STATED THEIR DESIRE TO RETURN HOME IF THE STATE AND UNAMIR WILL HELP THEM. THEY STATED THAT THE CONDITIONS FOR THEIR RETURN ARE GUARANTEED SECURITY, THE ENDING OF LOOTING BY THE RPA AND FREE ELECTIONS OF LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

G. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM PTL TEAM AROUND BUGARAMA INDICATED THAT THERE WAS A CONFLICT IN BUJUMBURA IN BURUNDI.

H. TAC HQ REPORTED THAT A MASS RALLY WAS ORGANISED AT NYIKIZU COMMUNE GR 5796 BY THE PREFECT OF BUTARE PREFECTURE TO ENCOURAGE THE POPULATION TO UNITE AND COOPERATE WITH THE RPA AND THE LOCAL ADMINISTRATION.

(C) RPA COMD IN KIBUNGO VISITED SECTOR 2 HQ TO DISCUSS THE RECENT DETENTION OF MILOBS IN KIBUNGO FOLLOWING A PROTEST LAUNCHED BY THE SECTOR COMD. RPA COMD ASSURED MILOBS THAT THERE WOULD BE NO RESTRICTIONS ON THE MOVEMENTS OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL IN THE SECTOR.

THE UNAMIR VEHICLES ESTABLISHMENT CONTAINS PROVISION FOR ONE HEAVY, FIVE MEDIUM AND 28 LIGHT BUSES. AS ADVISED BY THE CMCO, THE CTO HAS BEEN REQUESTED TO INITIATE URGENT STEPS TO PROCURE THESE BUSES TO SUPPORT THE MISSION.

(2) BEDFORD TRUCKS. THE BEDFORD FLEET OF VEHICLES CONTINUES TO BE A PROBLEM. AS PREVIOUSLY STATED, THE FLEET IS AT THE END OF ITS LIFE. UNAMIR IS AVERAGING IN EXCESS OF FIFTY TASKS PER WEEK (EACH INVOLVING MULTIPLE VEHICLES AND/OR TRIPS). THIS WILL PLACE EXTRA STRAIN UPON THE VEHICLE FLEET AND HASTEN ITS DETERIORATION. IT IS HOPED THAT SUITABLE TRANSPORT

RESOURCES FROM UNOSOM, WHICH HAVE ALREADY BEEN REQUESTED THROUGH THE CAO, WILL BE FORTHCOMING IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

(3) MATERIAL HANDLING EQUIPMENT (MHE). THERE IS A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF MHE WITHIN UNAMIR. EVEN WITH AN IMPROVED FLEET OF VEHICLES TRANSPORT TASKING WILL BE INEFFECTIVE IF THERE IS NO MEANS TO LOAD OR UNLOAD VEHICLES, PARTICULARLY WITH HEAVY/OVERSIZE LOADS. THE OBVIOUS SOLUTION IS TO OBTAIN MORE MHE. GIVEN THAT THE UN TRANSPORTS JUST ABOUT ALL OF ITS GOODS INTO AND OUT OF MISSION IN SEA CONTAINERS IT IS AMAZING THAT THIS MISSION HAS NO CONTAINER LIFT CAPABILITY.

(1) REQUEST FOR LOA TO UNNY HAVE NOT YET BEEN ANSWERED AND MANY OF THE CONTINGENTS HAVE EXHAUSTED THEIR 30 DAYS STOCK HOLDINGS OF REPAIR PART THAT THEY BROUGHT WITH THEM FROM THEIR HOME NATIONS.

(2) THE MISSION REQUIRES HEAVY LIFT RECOVERY VEHICLE TO PERFORM THESE TASKS.

NOTWITHSTANDING HIS COMPLAINT THAT FOOD SUPPLY IS A PROBLEM, ICRC AND CARITAS HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT DELIVERIES. PUBLIC PROSECUTOR HAS INTERVIEWED ALL 44 AND - REGARDLESS OF THE CRIMES OF WHICH THEY ARE ACCUSED - INTENDS TO START VISITING THEIR HOME COMMUNES NEXT WEEK WITH A VIEW TO DETERMINING WHETHER OR NOT THEY HAVE CASES TO ANSWER.
