SUBJECT : SITREP COVERING PERIOD 231700 TO 241700 B MAY 95

1.A. CALM.

1.B. ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IS OPEN FOR ALL TRAFFIC EXCEPT UNAMIR PERSONNEL. NORMAL BORDER TRAFFIC BETWEEN UGANDAN / RWANDESE BORDER AT CYANIKA BORDERPOST. TRAFFIC STILL CLOSED FOR HUMANITARIAN AID TO GOMA CAMPS.

2.A. MILOBS RUHENGARI REPORT THAT THEY HAVE BEEN INFORMED BY WELL WISHERS REGARDING A FORTHCOMING DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR ON COMING FRIDAY/SATURDAY BY THE LOCALS. THIS IS TO ASK UNAMIR TO GO HOME AFTER THE TERMINATION OF MANDATE IN JUNE.

2.B. NTR.

3.A. REFERENCE LAST SITREP REGARDING ARRESTS IN KAYOVE COMMUNE. THE INVESTIGATING TEAM LEARNT ABOUT THE MURDER OF AN OLD MAN AND HIS WIFE IN GIFUMBA SECT OF KAYOVE COMMUNE, ON NIGHT 16/17 MAY. THE MISCREANTS STOLE 50,000 FRANCS FROM THE MAN. 8 SUSPECTS WERE ARRESTED, AND ARE IN THE COMMUNE PRISON NOW. BESIDES THESE PEOPLE THERE ARE 6 MORE PERSONS IN KAYOVE PRISON WHO HAD BEEN ARRESTED EARLIER ON VARIOUS CHARGES. THE TEAM VISITED SYIKI SECT NEXT, AND CONFIRMED TEN ARRESTS ON CHARGES OF GENOCIDE, MADE IN FEB. THE ACCUSED ARE NOW IN RUHENGARI AND GISENYI PRISON. THE COUNCELLOR WILL HAVE A LIST OF VICTIMS AND WITNESSES READY BY NEXT WEDNESDAY. THE TEAM VISITED THE VUMBI SECT NEXT AND LEARNT ABOUT THE ARRESTS OF THREE PERSONS IN THE MONTH OF MAY. THESE ARE ACCUSED OF CONNIVING WITH THE INTERHAMWE. ON THEIR VISIT TO CYMBILI CELLULE OF SECT KIGEYO THE TEAM LEARNT OF 4 ARRESTS, OF WHICH ONE WAS MADE IN MAY. THESE PRISONERS STATED THAT THEY DO NOT KNOW AS YET THE REASON AS TO WHY THEY HAVE BEEN ARRESTED. NGABO SECT AND NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE REPORTS OF CASES OF ARMED BANDITRY WHICH OCCURED LAST WEEK. THE ABOVE INCIDENTS ARE BEING MONITORED.

3.B. A MILOB-HCDH TEAM VISITED THE NEMBA IDPS. IT IS REPORTED THAT MOST OF THE IDPS HAVE DISPERSED FROM NEMBA INTO THE NEIGHBOURING COMMUNES. ONLY 20 IDPS REMAIN IN THIS PLACE AS OF NOW. SITUATION BEING MONITORED.

- 3.C. ONE JOINT MILOB-UNHCR-HCDH-MEDICAL TEAM ALONG WITH RPA LO HELIPATROLLED THE NGORORERO AND KIBILIRA COMMUNES OF GISENYI PREFECTURE, HIETHERBEFORE INACCESSIBLE BY ROAD DUE TO RAINS. THE TEAM FOUND THAT THE RUMOURS OF UNHCR FOODSTOCK STORED AT NGORORERO BEING STOLEN AS UNTRUE. THIS FOODSTOCK IS MEANT FOR 10,000 NEEDY PEOPLE OF RAMBA COMMUNE AND COULD NOT BE TRANSPORTED THERE DUE TO BAD ROAD CONDITIONS. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF NGORORERO INFORMED THE TEAM THAT THE PEOPLE OF RAMBA WOULD NOW MOVE ON FOOT TO RECEIVE THIS FOOD STOCK. UNHCR MONITORING THIS EVENT. THE BOURGEMESTRE INFORMED THE MEDICAL REP THAT THE PEOPLE OF THE COMMUNE HAD TO WALK VERY LONG DISTANCES TO GASEKE COMMUNE TO GET MEDICAL TREATMENT. A DISPENSARY WHICH WAS BEING CONSTRUCTED HERE LIES UNFINISHED SINCE THE GENOCIDE DAYS. THE TEAM VISITED KIBILIRA NEXT. THE BOURGEMESTRE REPORTS THAT THE LAW AND ORDER SITUATION HAD DETERIORATED EVER SINCE THE RPA PULLED OUT OF THIS PLACE. IDPS WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY NOT COME TO THIS PLACE DUE TO PRESENCE OF THE RPA, HAVE NOW GOT INTO THIS AREA, AND AS PER HIM ARE CARRYING OUT ACTS OF BANDITRY. THERE HAVE BEEN TWO CASES WHEREIN ONE MAN WAS BADLY INJURED AND ANOTHER KILLED BY MACHETE ATTACKS ON 09 AND 13 MAY 95. THESE ACTS HAVE ALSO, REPORTEDLY BEEN COMMITTED BY THE IDPS. DETAILS BEING CONFIRMED. MEDICAL ADVICE WAS GIVEN AND DRUGS DISTRIBUTED BY MERLIN REP, WHO ACCOMPANIED THE FLIGHT.
- 3.D. MILOBS RUHENGARI REPORTED OF YET ANOTHER EXPLOSION IN RUHENGARI IN WHICH ANOTHER ELECTRIC PYLON IN MUKINGO COMMUNE HAS BEEN DAMAGED. FURTHER, AN EMPLOYEE OF ELECTROGAZ, WHO WAS TRYING TO REPAIR THE TRANSFORMER DAMAGED EARLIER, STEPPED ONTO A LAND MINE AND WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED. DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.
- 3.E. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED NDUSU AREA. SITUATION REPORTED CALM. A PERSON REPORTED KILLED IN SECTOR NKOTSI 6025, NYAMUTERA COMMUNE, ON 22 MAY. CASE BEING INVESTIGATED.
- 4.A. ENGINEER RECCE TEAM FROM UNAMIR HQ VISITED THE ELECTROGAZ, HYDRO ELECTRIC CENTRE IN CONNECTION WITH DOZER WORK REQUIRED URGENTLY TO REMOVE CHOKES IN THE RIVER BED. THE DOZER IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE SHORTLY.
- 4.B. PUMP EX BROWN AND ROOTS REQUISITIONED TO CLEAN THE GISENYI PRISON SEPTIC TANKS DID NOT ARRIVE DUE TO BREAKDOWN OF EQUIPMENT. EXPECTED NEXT FRIDAY. DIRECTOR PRISONS INFORMED.

- 5.B. NUMBER OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE AT GISENYI\GOMA BORDER-POST WAS 149.

4. (a) 197 returnees came on 23 May to Ngenda commune from NDERA 1884. 161 were taken to Kavuma 1243. The rest are awaiting transportation at the commune transit camp.
(b) 52 returnees arrived from Burundi at Ngenda yesterday. 50 have proceeded to their communes while two have gone to Gitarama prefecture. The asst bourgemestre asked our team to get authorisation from the prefecture to get further info.

EDWARD WHO INFORMED THE TEAM THAT, THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE IS RELATIVELY CALM. BUT COMPLAINTS OF ARMED BANDITS TERRORIZING THE COMMUNE THE BANDITS COMES FROM GITARAMA AREA. ON THEIR EFFORT TO GET RID OF THE BANDITS, THE LOCALS WERE ALERTED TO INFORMED THE AUTHORITY ON ANY SUSPICIOUS MOVEMENT. ACCORDING TO THE MR. EDWARD. AS A RESULT OF SUCH EFFORT BY THE LOCALS 4 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE LOCALS. 6 GUNS WERE ALSO RECOVERED FROM THEM. THE SUSPECTS WERE LATER HANDED OVER TO THE RPA AND TO KIGALI. IN ANOTHER, DEVELOPMENT A TOTAL OF 4 WOMEN WITH THEIR CHILDREN NUMBERING 13 LEFT THEIR COMMUNE KANZENZE IN KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE TO SATINSY COMMUNE FOR SECURITY REASONS. THE IDPS HUSBANDS WERE ARRESTED IN THEIR COMMUNE KANZENZE. SO THAT IS THE MAIN CAUSE OF THE MIGRATION. THE TEAM ALSO FOUND 11 PERSONS ARRESTED ON

CHARGES OF BEING FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS IN GASEKE
COMMUNE JAIL. CASE REFERRED TO HCDH. REPORTS FROM THE
REMAINING 2 COMMUNES COMES IN TOMOROWS SITREP.



(b) One team patrolled BIRENGA 5959 commune. The situation is calm. The team visited the elderly persons home in KIBUNGO. It is being run by the NGO CARITAS. There are 30 persons in the home. The team reported a shortage of food, clothes and cooking utensils in the home.

(c) One team patrolled RUSUMO 7448 commune. 36 assorted vehicles coming from DAR ES SALAAM meant for UNAMIR FORCE SIG COV are held up at the BUKOBA border post GR 8637. The convoy in charge mentioned problems with regard to payment of customs duty as the reason for the hold up. He also mentioned about shortage of fuel in the convoy. Movcon KIGALI was informed. He intimated that the responsibility of delivering the vehicles at KIGALI lies with the contracting agency. Ghanbatt reported that these vehicles are presently being detained by the RPA for unknown reasons. Same will be verified by our team tomorrow.

(d) One team patrolled the communes in the RWAMAGANA sous prefecture 4884. The team was informed by locals that arrests are still being carried out in the commune. However, the same has not been verified. The general situation is calm.

(e) HQ Sub Sect 2A has shifted to NYAMATA 1060 with immediate effect. Nine milobs are staying there, nine milobs are still located at RILIMA.

B. KIBUYE TEAM

i) PATROLLING WAS SEVERELY CURTAILED DUE TO LACK OF VEHs. ONLY ONE VEH AVAILABLE FOR PATROLLING. ONE TEAM TO KIVUMU COMMUNE 5573. UNEASY CALM PREVAILS IN THE AREA. 2 PRIMARY SCHOOLS AT RUKOKO 4772 HAD TO CLOSE DOWN DUE TO ARRESTS OF 6 TEACHERS FROM ONE SCHOOL AND 4 FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL. IT SEEMS THAT THE EFFORTS TO TARGET THE HUTU INTELLECTUALS IS ON. TEAM VISITED NYANGE HOSPITAL 5573 RUN BY MSF. NO MEDICINE PROBLEM BUT SHORTAGE OF STAFF DUE TO ARRESTS AND ITS THREAT. HE STRONGLY REQUESTED FOR TRANSPORT FROM UNAMER TO CARRY THE FOOD AS A MATTER OF URGENCY TO THE STARVING POPULATION. THE MILOB TEAM VISITED 2 FAMILIES OF RETURNEES WHO CAME FROM ZAIRE RECENTLY. c. KIVUYE COMMUNE. THE NGO IS CARITAS WHICH RUNS THE BUNGWE HEALTH CENTRE. THIS MORNING THE MILOBS TEAM CARRIED BOXES OF MEDICINE AND 5 MATTRESSES FROM CARITAS (BYUMBA) TO THE HEALTH CENTRE. THERE ARE ALSO ABOUT 50 FAMILIES, MOST OF WHOM ARE RETURNEES WHO DO NOT HAVE SHELTER AND ARE APPEALING FOR ASSISTANCE IN THAT REGARD.



2. The PX is expected to provide services for both military and civilian staff of UNAMIR including other UN Agencies within Rwanda.



DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, May 22, 1995 - The representatives of different international and national Christian Church organisations including different denominations of the Protestant Church and Roman Catholic Church on Saturday, at the end of a meeting at Kabusunzu, in Kigali, confessed that the Rwandese Church had not played its role during the tragedy of genocide in Rwanda, and had not taught correctly the Gospel in Rwanda. The church representatives decided to repent and to begin teaching the Gospel with more dedication, in their resolutions.

- The epidemics of Measles is reported to have erupted in Byumba, where a census of children, and immunisation against the disease starts on Monday with the assistance of the NGO World Vision.

- On the question that the UN Tribunal for Rwanda may be biased in favour of Interahmwe during its trials because UNAMIR is said to have close relations with Interahamwe elements, Judge Richard Goldstone responded that the Tribunal would work with total independence.

- The Rwandese President, Vice-President and Prime Minister, on Saturday received successively the Holland Minister for Cooperation Mr. Jan Planck, and talked about the cooperation between the two countries.

- Two new Rwandese banks, namely, BDCI or Bank for Development, Commerce and Industries, and BACOR or Gold Trust Bank, were legalised on Saturday and were expected to start operating this week.

- A financial agreement was signed on Saturday between the Government of Rwanda and the African Development Bank (ADB) under which the Bank would finance different development projects including the electrification of Kigali city, in conformity to the pledge made by the Bank at Geneva Round-table conference on the rebuilding of Rwanda. The Bank is ready to make available up to USD 100 million in favour of Rwanda. However, the financial assistance will be released on the condition that Rwanda first pays its debt arrears to the Bank, amounting to USD 6 million.

- A countrywide campaign of immunisation of children against Poliomyelitis will be launched in Rwanda starting on May 27, 1995.

- The Rwandese Minister of Tourism and Environment, Mr. Jean Nepomuscene Nayinzira, on Sunday left Kigali for Nairobi in Kenya, where he would participate in the 18th ministerial session of the Management Board of the UN Environment Programme.

- The new Israeli Ambassador to Rwanda with residence in Kinshasa, Mr. Shlomo AVITAR, on Sunday arrived in Kigali, where he was to extend his credentials to President Bizimungu to represent his country. The new Rwandese Ambassador to Israel, Dr. Nsenga has also arrived in Jerusalem, where he will represent Rwanda.

a. GENERAL. CALM.

2. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES. THE SECTOR COMMANDER HAD A LONG MEETING WITH THE RPA BRIGADE CDR, LT-COL KAYONGA, THIS MORNING. FOUR SUBJECTS WERE DISCUSSED: THE MURDER OF THE SOUS-PREFET AND HIS HOUSEHOLD, THE OVERCROWDING OF THE GITARAMA PRISON AND ITS ACCESS, THE INCIDENT THAT WE REPORTED IN OUR 24 JULY 95 SITREP (PARA 3. A. i)) AND THE SECURITY SITUATION OF THE PETIT SEMINAIRE. THE FIRST SUBJECT REQUIRES IMMEDIATE ACTION FROM THE FORCE HQ. THE LAST THREE SUBJECTS WILL BE REPORTED ON IN TONIGHT'S SITREP.

a. POLITICAL.

(1) LT-COL KAYONGA EXPLAINED TO THE SECTOR COMMANDER THAT THE SOUS-PREFET MURDER INVESTIGATION WAS PROGRESSING. HE EXPLAINED THAT THE GENDARMERIE WAS NOW LEADING THE INVESTIGATION AND THAT THEY HAD FOUND OUT THAT A MALI SOLDIER HAD BEEN IN THE HOUSE OF THE PREFET "A FEW MOMENTS" BEFORE THE MURDER. HE SAID THAT A PREGNANT WOMAN (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS WOMAN ALPHA), A FRIEND OF THE FAMILY, HAD TESTIFIED THAT SHE HAD BEEN WATCHING A VIDEO IN THE HOUSE WITH THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE AND A MALI SOLDIER. ANOTHER WOMAN (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS WOMAN BRAVO) CAN ALSO TESTIFY THAT SHE WENT TO THE HOUSE DURING THE NIGHT AND DID SEE THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE, WOMAN ALPHA AND THE MALI SOLDIER ALL WATCHING A VIDEO DURING THE UNDETERMINED SHORT TIME THAT SHE SPENT AT THE HOUSE. LT-COL KAYONGA SAID THAT WHEN WOMAN BRAVO LEFT THE HOUSE, ALL FOUR VIDEO WATCHERS WERE STILL THERE, THAT IS TO SAY THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE, WOMAN ALPHA AND THE MALI SOLDIER. WOMAN ALPHA TESTIFIED THAT WHEN SHE LEFT THE HOUSE, BEFORE THE MURDER AT AN UNSPECIFIED TIME, THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE AND THE MALI SOLDIER REMAINED IN THE HOUSE.

(2) THE SECTOR COMMANDER RECOMMENDED TO THE BRIGADE COMMANDER THAT THE GENDARMERIE ASKED UNAMIR TO MAKE THIS MALI WITNESS AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE FOR QUESTIONING.

(3) THE SECTOR COMMANDER THEN CONTACTED COMDT KEITA, THE MALI CONTINGENT COMMANDER TO BRIEF HIM ON THESE NEW DEVELOPMENTS OF THE INVESTIGATION. AFTER HAVING CONTACTED HIS TROOPS IN RUHANGO, HE EXPLAINED THE FOLLOWING:

(a) THE INFORMATION REPORTED BY LT-COL KAYONGA IS TRUE. A SERGEANT FROM THE MALI PLATOON AT RUHANGO WOULD HAVE DEVELOPED A FRIENDSHIP WITH THE FAMILY AND THE NIGHT OF THE MURDER HE DID WATCH A VIDEO WITH THE SOUS-PREFET AS RELATED BY THE ABOVE WITNESSES. THE SERGEANT IS READY TO TESTIFY THAT HE WAS THERE AND THAT HE HAD LEFT AT AN UNDETERMINED TIME BEFORE THE KILLINGS TOOK PLACE.

(b) WHEN ASKED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER AS TO WHY THIS SERGEANT DID NOT COME FORWARD WITH THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION, COMDT KEITA REPLIED THAT EVERYONE HAS A PERSONAL REACTION TO THIS KIND OF SITUATION AND THAT THE SERGEANT HAD PREFERRED TO REMAIN QUIET ABOUT THE WHOLE THING UNTIL HE WOULD BE ASKED TO GIVE HIS DECLARATION.

(c) COMDT KEITA REAFFIRMED HIS DESIRE TO HAVE ALL MALI WITNESSES TO FULLY COOPERATE WITH THE RWANDESE JUSTICE IN THE INVESTIGATION. HE SAID THAT YESTERDAY THE "CHEF DE POSTE" AND THE SENTRY WHO WAS ON DUTY THE NIGHT OF THE MURDER HAD ALREADY BEEN INTERVIEWED BY THE INTELLIGENCE SERVICE OF THE INTERIOR MINISTRY FOR WHAT COULD BE LABELLED AS THE "ADMINISTRATIVE INVESTIGATION".

(4) THE SECTOR COMMANDER TOLD COMDT KEITA TO EXPECT A REQUEST FROM UNAMIR TO MAKE THIS SERGEANT AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE OR OTHER RWANDESE INVESTIGATING AUTHORITIES. THE SECTOR COMMANDER IS OF THE OPINION THAT COMDT KEITA SHOULD MAKE THIS SERGEANT AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE AS SOON AS HIS CHAIN OF COMMAND HAS AUTHORIZED HIM TO DO SO. THIS PROCEDURE WAS DISCUSSED WITH COL DIARRA (CIVPOL) IN PRESENCE OF COMMANDANT KEITA. COL DIARRA HAS ALSO RECOMMENDED TO COMDT KEITA THAT THE SERGEANT BE TAKEN OUT OF RUHANGO TO BE "KEPT" AT THE PETIT SEMINAIRE IN GITARAMA.

(5) THE FORCE HQ SHOULD QUICKLY MAKE A DECISION IN THIS REGARDS BECAUSE "UNAMIR" RECEIVED BAD PRESS (RADIO RWANDA), MIND YOU UNJUSTIFIED, FOR THE INABILITY OF

UNAMIR TO HELP THE SOUS-PREFET WHOSE HOUSE WAS 25 METERS AWAY FROM ARMED UNAMIR TROOPS. THERE IS A HIGH RISK THAT RADIO RWANDA WOULD CERTAINLY TRY TO PORTRAY UNAMIR AS HOLDING BACK SERIOUS INFORMATION, IF IT IS FOUND THAT A SOLDIER WAS PRESENT AT THE HOUSE "A FEW MOMENTS" BEFORE THE MURDERS.

THE TWO PATROLS MISTAKENLY TOOK EACH OTHER FOR FRGF/INTERAHAMWE AFTER FAILING TO PROPERLY CHALLENGE AND IDENTIFY EACH OTHER AS FRIEND OR FOE. DETAILS OF ANY CASUALTIES ARE UNKNOWN AT THIS TIME.
- (B) ON 23 NOV AT 1507 HRS, RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE ON LOCALS WHO WERE FISHING IN LAKE KIVU AND WHO WERE DISOBEYING THE ORDER BANNING FURTHER FISHING. THE FIRING TOOK PLACE AT KABEKERA CELL (GR 019415). NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED BUT LOCALS WERE ANGERED BY THE SHOOTING AND ARE SEEKING RECOURSE THROUGH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. RPA EXPLAIN THIS MEASURE IS NECESSARY AS FRGF RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND BY DAY USING STOLEN BOATS AND INFILTRATE AT NIGHT, OCCASIONALLY MIXING WITH THE LOCAL

FISHERMEN BY DAY TO FACILITATE INFILTRATION. A TOTAL BAN IS THEREFORE NECESSARY AS LOCAL FISHERMEN DO NOT ABIDE BY STRICT FISHING ZONAGE IMPOSED BY RPA.

- (2) FRGF. ON 22 NOV AT 2240 HRS, AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS BLOWN UP AT MUDUMBANO SECTOR, RWENGERO CELL (GR 006413). THE BLAST ONLY MANAGED TO BEND THE PYLON AND NO POWER LINES WERE SEVERED. FRGF/INTERAHAMWE OR SYMPATHIZERS IN THE AREA ARE SUSPECTED OF CARRYING OUT THE OPERATION. THIS OPERATION IS A DELIBERATE ACT OF SABOTAGE. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED AND THE TYPE OF EXPLOSIVE USED REMAIN UNKNOWN.



1. GENERAL SITUATION. UNEASY CALM PREVAILS WITH THE RPA CONTINUING THEIR ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECKS. THE ATMOSPHERE IN THE COMMUNES SUGGEST THE LOCALS WAITING NERVOUSLY FOR THE ARRESTS TO COMMENCE. IT WAS UNOFFICIALLY LEARNT FROM CERTAIN RELIABLE SOURCES THAT THE SPATE OF ARRESTS WOULD PROBABLY COMMENCE IN THREE WEEKS FROM NOW. THE GITARAMA PRISON IS NOW HAVING 6974 MEN, 218 WOMEN, 102 CHILDREN, 20 BABIES AND 18 PREGNANT WOMEN. THE CONDITIONS HAVE IMPROVED SLIGHTLY WITH THE MORTALITY HAVING DROPPED FROM MARGINALLY. IT IS FELT THAT THE NEW WAVE OF ARRESTS WILL COINCIDE WITH THE COMMISSIONING OF THE NEW PRISON COMPLEX WHICH WILL BE READY IN THREE WEEKS TIME. PRESENTLY NO FRESH ADDITIONS TO THE GITARAMA PRISON.

REGISTERED AND ALL SEEM TO HAVE DISAPPEARED INTO THE COUNTRYSIDE. HE REQUESTED UNAMIR ASSISTANCE IN REPAIRING 4 IMPORTANT BRIDGES BROKEN IN THIS AREA. THE FORCE ENGRS WOULD BE CONTACTED LATER TO KINDLY SEND A TEAM TO EVALUATE. FOOD DISTRIBUTION FOR VULNERABLE GROUPS BY CARITAS. THIS AREA APPEARS TO BE ABSOLUTELY CALM WITH A HIGH DEGREE OF CULTIVATION IN PROGRESS. THE HARVEST IS REPORTED TO BE VERY GOOD.

ii) ONE PATROL WENT TO THE COMMUNES OF MURAMA 6749 KIGOMA 7649 AND TAMBWE 7653. AT MURAMA THE TEAM HANDED OVER 520 BOXES OF FOOD FOR THE PRISONERS IN THE CACHOTS WHICH WAS PROMISED TO THEM YESTERDAY BUT COULD NOT BE SENT DUE TO ADMINSTRATIVE COMPULSIONS. AT KIGOMA COMMUNE THE SIT OBSERVED WAS CALM. FOOD AID HAS BEEN RECEIVED AND THE LOCALS WERE BEING GIVEN BUILDING MATERIALS BY A GERMAN NGO FOR REBUILDING OF THEIR HOUSES. AT TAMBWE COMMUNE THERE WAS SERIOUS WATER CRISIS AS DUE TO THE RECENT RAINS THERE HAS BEEN A RUPTURE IN THE MAIN PIPE LINE IN SOME PLACES. THE PIPELINE CARRIES WATER FROM WATER TANKS LOCATED IN MUKINGI COMMUNE SITUATED NORTH OF TAMBWE. IT SEEMS THAT THERE IS AN URGENT REQUIREMENT FOR THE WATER TEAM OF THE FORCE ENGRS TO EVALUATE THE SITUATION.

iii) ONE PATROL TO RUTOBWE COMMUNE 7781 TO DELIVER PLASTIC SHEETING FOR A REBURIAL CEREMONY SLATED TO TAKE PLACE ON 26 MAY. THE COMMUNE CACHOT WAS VISITED. 18 INMATES . CONDITIONS GOOD. ALL ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE.

2. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES. THE SECTOR COMMANDER HAD A LONG MEETING WITH THE RPA BRIGADE CDR, LT-COL KAYONGA, THIS MORNING. FOUR SUBJECTS WERE DISCUSSED: THE MURDER OF THE SOUS-PREFET AND HIS HOUSEHOLD, THE OVERCROWDING OF THE GITARAMA PRISON AND ITS ACCESS, THE INCIDENT THAT WE REPORTED IN OUR 24 JULY 95 SITREP (PARA 3. A. i)) AND THE SECURITY SITUATION OF THE PETIT SEMINAIRE. THE FIRST SUBJECT REQUIRES IMMEDIATE ACTION FROM THE FORCE HQ. THE LAST THREE SUBJECTS WILL BE REPORTED ON IN TONIGHT'S SITREP.

a. POLITICAL.

(1) LT-COL KAYONGA EXPLAINED TO THE SECTOR COMMANDER THAT THE SOUS-PREFET MURDER INVESTIGATION WAS PROGRESSING. HE EXPLAINED THAT THE GENDARMERIE WAS NOW LEADING THE INVESTIGATION AND THAT THEY HAD FOUND OUT THAT A MALI SOLDIER HAD BEEN IN THE HOUSE OF THE PREFET "A FEW MOMENTS" BEFORE THE MURDER. HE SAID THAT A PREGNANT WOMAN (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS WOMAN ALPHA), A FRIEND OF THE FAMILY, HAD TESTIFIED THAT SHE HAD BEEN WATCHING A VIDEO IN THE HOUSE WITH THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE AND A MALI SOLDIER. ANOTHER WOMAN (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS WOMAN BRAVO) CAN ALSO TESTIFY THAT SHE WENT TO THE HOUSE DURING THE NIGHT AND DID SEE THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE, WOMAN ALPHA AND THE MALI SOLDIER ALL WATCHING A VIDEO DURING THE UNDETERMINED SHORT TIME THAT SHE SPENT AT THE HOUSE. LT-COL KAYONGA SAID THAT WHEN WOMAN BRAVO LEFT THE HOUSE, ALL FOUR VIDEO WATCHERS WERE STILL THERE, THAT IS TO SAY THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE, WOMAN ALPHA AND THE MALI SOLDIER. WOMAN ALPHA TESTIFIED THAT WHEN SHE LEFT THE HOUSE, BEFORE THE MURDER AT AN UNSPECIFIED TIME, THE SOUS-PREFET, HIS WIFE AND THE MALI SOLDIER REMAINED IN THE HOUSE.

(2) THE SECTOR COMMANDER RECOMMENDED TO THE BRIGADE COMMANDER THAT THE GENDARMERIE ASKED UNAMIR TO MAKE THIS MALI WITNESS AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE FOR QUESTIONING.

(3) THE SECTOR COMMANDER THEN CONTACTED COMDT KEITA, THE MALI CONTINGENT COMMANDER TO BRIEF HIM ON THESE NEW DEVELOPMENTS OF THE INVESTIGATION. AFTER HAVING CONTACTED HIS TROOPS IN RUHANGO, HE EXPLAINED THE FOLLOWING:

(a) THE INFORMATION REPORTED BY LT-COL KAYONGA IS TRUE. A SERGEANT FROM THE MALI PLATOON AT RUHANGO WOULD HAVE DEVELOPED A FRIENDSHIP WITH THE FAMILY AND THE NIGHT OF THE MURDER HE DID WATCH A VIDEO WITH THE SOUS-PREFET AS RELATED BY THE ABOVE WITNESSES. THE SERGEANT IS READY TO TESTIFY THAT HE WAS THERE AND THAT HE HAD LEFT AT AN UNDETERMINED TIME BEFORE THE KILLINGS TOOK PLACE.

(b) WHEN ASKED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER AS TO WHY THIS SERGEANT DID NOT COME FORWARD WITH THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION, COMDT KEITA REPLIED THAT EVERYONE HAS A PERSONAL REACTION TO THIS KIND OF SITUATION AND THAT THE SERGEANT HAD PREFERRED TO REMAIN QUIET ABOUT THE WHOLE THING UNTIL HE WOULD BE ASKED TO GIVE HIS DECLARATION.

(c) COMDT KEITA REAFFIRMED HIS DESIRE TO HAVE ALL MALI WITNESSES TO FULLY COOPERATE WITH THE RWANDESE JUSTICE IN THE INVESTIGATION. HE SAID THAT YESTERDAY THE "CHEF DE POSTE" AND THE SENTRY WHO WAS ON DUTY THE NIGHT OF THE MURDER HAD ALREADY BEEN INTERVIEWED BY THE INTELLIGENCE SERVICE OF THE INTERIOR MINISTRY FOR WHAT COULD BE LABELLED AS THE "ADMINISTRATIVE INVESTIGATION".

(4) THE SECTOR COMMANDER TOLD COMDT KEITA TO EXPECT A REQUEST FROM UNAMIR TO MAKE THIS SERGEANT AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE OR OTHER RWANDESE INVESTIGATING AUTHORITIES. THE SECTOR COMMANDER IS OF THE OPINION THAT COMDT KEITA SHOULD MAKE THIS SERGEANT AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE AS SOON AS HIS CHAIN OF COMMAND HAS AUTHORIZED HIM TO DO SO. THIS PROCEDURE WAS DISCUSSED WITH COL DIARRA (CIVPOL) IN PRESENCE OF COMMANDANT KEITA. COL DIARRA HAS ALSO RECOMMENDED TO COMDT KEITA THAT THE SERGEANT BE TAKEN OUT OF RUHANGO TO BE "KEPT" AT THE PETIT SEMINAIRE IN GITARAMA.

(5) THE FORCE HQ SHOULD QUICKLY MAKE A DECISION IN THIS REGARDS BECAUSE "UNAMIR" RECEIVED BAD PRESS (RADIO RWANDA), MIND YOU UNJUSTIFIED, FOR THE INABILITY OF

UNAMIR TO HELP THE SOUS-PREFET WHOSE HOUSE WAS 25 METERS AWAY FROM ARMED UNAMIR TROOPS. THERE IS A HIGH RISK THAT RADIO RWANDA WOULD CERTAINLY TRY TO PORTRAY UNAMIR AS HOLDING BACK SERIOUS INFORMATION, IF IT IS FOUND THAT A SOLDIER WAS PRESENT AT THE HOUSE "A FEW MOMENTS" BEFORE THE MURDERS.


