1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STILL CALM. REFUGESS CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA. ONE UN FOOD CONVOY LEFT FOR GISENYI THIS MORNING AND IS EXPECTED TO RETURN WITH DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM RUHENGERI TOMORROW.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS FROM THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS IN TUNISIA DELIVERED A MESSAGE TO THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA FROM THE PRESIDENT OF TUNISIA, WHO IS ALSO THE CURRENT CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANIZATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (OAU). THE SRSG HELD A DISCUSSIONS WITH THE VISITING DELEGATION FROM THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT. THE SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR FOR HUMAN RIGHTS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG. HE IS SCHEDULED TO MEET THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE TONIGHT.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL THE KIGALI CITY. THEY CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN AID EFFORTS WITH NGOS AND HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES. REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE THAT TEN PEOPLE WERE KILLED ON 28 JUL 94 BY RPF AT KAZIZ AND ABOUT 1000 PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE RETURNED INTO HPZ BECAUSE OF THIS INCIDENT. THEY CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN PRESENCE ALONG THE HPZ LIMITS.

B. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. A/DFC HELD MEETING WITH THE STAFFS AT 0800 HRS.


B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES CONTINUED TO ENTER RWANDA WITH HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS.

C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY IN KIGALI. ARRANGEMENT ARE BEING MADE TO WITHDRAW THE PLATOON FROM ENTEBBE AIRPORT BY 30 JUL 94. PREPARATION FOR DEPLOYMENT INTO SECTOR 4 CONTINUED.

D. MILOB. PROVIDED ESCORT TEAMS FOR THE BRITISH DELEGATION TO RUHENGARI AND FOR US EMBASSY FROM THE BORDER OF BURUNDI. MILOBS FROM MULINDI SECTOR HAVE MOVED TO BYUMBA FROM MULINDI.

5. UNCIVPOL. CONTINUED TO WORK IN COORDINATION WITH MILOBS.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. WFP DELIVERED FOOD TO THE REFUGEES AND MEMBERS OF HAC ATTENDED A MEETING WITH RWANDESE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND DIFFERENT NGOS REGARDING THE CHOLERA PROBLEM. HAC ALSO ACCOMPANIED THE CANADIAN MEDICAL TEAM TO GISENYI. HAC HELD A MEETING WITH THE OIC HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS OF THE US FORCES IN RWANDA.



Dear General Dallaire,

In the light of the most recent developments of the situation in Rwanda, the Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights there, ~~Mr. René Degni-Ségui~~, has decided to carry out a second visit to Rwanda to establish contacts with the new authorities and discuss with them current human rights concerns, particularly with regard to refugees and displaced persons. It is envisaged that he ~~travel to Kigali on Thursday 28~~ July 1994 from Nairobi. On 29 July, he would like to meet with those representatives of the new Government dealing with human rights-related issues. Conditions permitting, he then intends to travel to Goma. He is scheduled to leave Nairobi for Abidjan on the afternoon of Sunday 31 July 1994.

As we do not dispose of a way to contact the Government directly, I should be very grateful if you could transmit the attached letter to the Minister for Foreign Affairs. It would also be highly appreciated if the Special Rapporteur could benefit, as during his first mission to Rwanda, from your support as concerns transport and accommodation. All details regarding flight and other arrangements may be coordinated with Ms. Karen Kenny, the Centre's field officer currently in Kigali. In particular, I would be grateful if all necessary steps could be taken for Mr. Degni-Ségui to obtain security clearance for Rwanda. I have also approached Mr. Hein in this regard.

Thank you very much for your assistance.

J'ai l'honneur de vous communiquer la lettre ci-après, qui vous est adressée par le Rapporteur spécial sur la situation des droits de l'homme au Rwanda:

"Monsieur le Ministre,

J'ai l'honneur de m'adresser à vous en ma qualité de Rapporteur spécial sur la situation des droits de l'homme au Rwanda, conformément à la résolution 1994/-3/1 de la Commission des droits de l'homme.

Depuis ma nomination, je n'ai cessé de suivre avec attention l'évolution de la situation dans votre pays. Comme vous le savez, j'ai déjà effectué une visite au Rwanda, qui m'a permis d'adresser un rapport préliminaire aux Etats membres de la Commission des droits de l'homme. J'ai noté avec soulagement le cessez-le-feu ainsi que la relative accalmie qui règne à l'heure actuelle au Rwanda. Toutefois, la situation extrêmement précaire des réfugiés rwandais dont se font écho les médias nationaux et internationaux, reste des plus inquiétante.

C'est dans ce contexte que je voudrais effectuer une deuxième visite dans votre pays pour établir le contact avec les nouvelles autorités rwandaises et évoquer avec elles les problèmes relatifs aux droits de l'homme soulevés par la situation actuelle. Je serais très intéressé de pouvoir m'entretenir avec vous même, si, bien sûr, votre calendrier le permet, ainsi qu'avec le Président de la République, le Vice-Président et Chef de l'Etat Major, les Ministres de l'Intérieur, de la Justice, de la Réintégration des réfugiés et de l'Information, et d'autres autorités toute fois qu'ils s'occupent des questions relatives aux droits de l'homme au Rwanda. La gravité continue de la situation commande qu'une telle visite soit faite le plus tôt possible. En ce sens, j'ai l'intention de me rendre à Kigali dès le jeudi 28 juillet 1994 en vue de pouvoir rencontrer les personnalités précitées le vendredi 29 juillet 1994.

Ma visite aura comme objet d'examiner avec les autorités compétentes les mesures nécessaires pour assurer le retour des réfugiés, y compris des dispositions relatives à leur déplacement, leur sécurité et toute l'assistance nécessaire à leur survie et à leur installation. Je souhaiterais prendre personnellement contact avec les réfugiés et, à cette fin, me rendre dans leurs camps.



I need to know:

- Have you been able to re-instate a mine cell in your HQ, and if so who should be my point of contact? I badly need to get a better perspective of the situation.
- Can I still get from you a troop of 30 Bangladeshi sappers for mine clearance?
- If I can generate a reasonable RFP, are you able to let a contract from your HQ, or should we try to do the job from New York?

It is Canadian Helicopters' understanding that customs and handling fees associated with the arrival of aircraft to the mission area are to the account of the United Nations.

In fact, up to this point in time, we have not paid for any import fees or customs handling fees on any contract. Normally, the UN is exempt from such fees and the UN, in turn, passes this exemption to the Operator.

Positioning and Depositioning Fees cover the actual cost of mobilizing and demobilizing the helicopters to and from the mission area, but exclude any import, customs, handling fees, since it is very difficult to ascertain what these costs might be, if any.

There is an outstanding invoice from CARGOLUX in Uganda for handling and clearing four helicopters which arrived Entebbe, Uganda (three for UNOMUR and one for UNAMIR). The invoice totals \$17,631.00.

Would you be so kind as to review the situation, since we understood that import, customs and handling would be to the account of the United Nations.

I would appreciate your attention to this matter, with the view that we can resolve the issue to the United Nations and Canadian Helicopters' mutual satisfaction.

UNAMIR II RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

C. Revised Draft UNAMIR Rules of Engagement dated 30 Jun 94 (enclosed)

1. J3 Plans and J5 Legal Staffs met recently to discuss reference A, which had been provided to this Headquarters by PRMNY. Maj Beardsley, a former member of your staff who was also in attendance, supported the plan developed for review and improvement of the document. As a result of that meeting and subsequent staff work reference C has been produced. It is forwarded for your consideration.

2. The majority of the changes made were editorial in nature. Current terminology found in other ROE documents such as that used by UNPROFOR and Canadian forces in Somalia (ie; deadly force, non-deadly force as opposed to armed force and unarmed force), has been incorporated. A new section with specific direction on Search and Detention has also been added. The document has also been broken down into parts and re-arranged into a sequence which should promote readability and easy understanding. Some amendments to the preliminary parts were necessary to bring the document in line with reference B, which consolidated all previous UNSCRs dealing with UNAMIR. Two areas dealing with support to Civilian Police and war crimes were removed as they were considered not necessary to specify, given the current mandate and scenario. A key definition, that of self-defence, has been expanded to include persons and property under the protection of UNAMIR forces. In addition, the definition of Positive Identification has been removed as it was considered unnecessary.

3. In the course of the review concern arose over the potential use of deadly force to prevent theft or looting which was alluded to in the original draft in the CONCEPT section where weapons were authorized to defend "property or installations belonging to or under the protection of the UN", and in the PRINCIPLES section where "firing for effect" was authorized, "where a delay would cause casualties or destruction of property". It is simply not defensible under

Canadian law to justify extending this authorization to include shooting a fleeing thief who poses no clear threat to life in operations wherein the use of deadly force only in self-defence is the guiding principle. Although this type of permission has been seen in recent UN ROE, our opinion is that this latitude needs to be reconsidered in terms of its legal support, and in terms of its operational necessity with respect to achieving the mission. Consequently, para 9b (2) does not repeat the word "theft" from the original ROE. Such an exclusion, while not detracting from the robustness of the ROE, would help to ensure acceptance by other countries with legal systems similar to ours. Should it be necessary to include theft as justification for the use of deadly force, it is possible that Canada would have to caveat its adherence to the ROE in the absence of a compelling operational and legal rationale. You may wish to seek clarification from the UN on this point prior to finalizing this aspect of the ROE.

4. Another area of concern during the review was over the section ACTION DURING FIRING, where it was considered that the requirement to have the use of automatic fire approved by higher authority may place an unnecessary constraint on operations. For example, you may wish to reconsider the implication that automatic fire can not be used as a last resort in self-defence without the authorization of a superior.

5. The actual ROE are from reference A and are considered sufficiently robust to protect UNAMIR forces in the conduct of their mission, and therefore changes are not considered necessary.

PART I

GENERAL

1. The conduct of military operations is controlled and regulated by the provision of international and national law, conventions and precedence. In the case of a United Nations (UN) conducted operation, it is the responsibility of the UN to set the parameters within which UN Forces will operate. Rules of Engagement (ROE) are the means by which the UN can provide to commanders at all levels the political and legal direction and guidance on the use of force by UN personnel. ROE are drafted by the Force Commander, but are approved by the UN and may only be changed with UN authority.

2. These UNAMIR ROE are provided for UN Forces operating under the auspices of the reference which states in paragraph 4 that:

"... the consolidated mandate of UNAMIR includes the following:

- (a) To contribute to the security and protection of displaced persons, refugees and civilians at risk in Rwanda, including through the establishment and maintenance where feasible, of secure humanitarian areas;
- (b) To provide security and support for the distribution of relief supplies and humanitarian relief operations; and
- (c) To act as an intermediary between the parties in an attempt to secure their agreement to a cease-fire; ...".

Paragraph 5 of the Resolution particularly recognizes that:

"UNAMIR may be required to take action in self-defence against persons or groups who threaten protected sites

and populations, United Nations and other humanitarian personnel or the means of delivery and distribution of humanitarian relief."

3. UNAMIR is a peacekeeping force without commitment to either party in the Rwandanese civil war. Under the terms of the Arusha Peace Agreement and the UN Security Council Resolution mandates, UNAMIR has a commitment to all parties to assist them to achieve peace. Impartiality is the key and all UNAMIR's actions must be aimed at ensuring the furtherance of this objective. However, circumstances could arise where the use of force by UNAMIR personnel would be necessary and justified.

PART II**DEFINITIONS**

4. The following key definitions must be clearly understood by all personnel in UNAMIR:

a. **Force**. The use of physical means to impose one's will. Military force is the use of the physical means provided by formed, armed and disciplined bodies of troops under unified command to achieve the same end and generally implies the potential to use significant levels of violence.

b. **Self-Defence**. The use of force to protect:

- (1) oneself and the personnel in one's unit,
- (2) other UNAMIR military or civilian personnel,
- (3) non-UNAMIR humanitarian aid personnel,
- (4) displaced persons, refugees and civilians in sites or among populations under the protection of UNAMIR forces, or
- (5) protected sites or the means of delivery and distribution of humanitarian relief,

against a hostile act or hostile intent, where there is no other choice or time for deliberation.

c. **Hostile Act**. A hostile act is an attack or other use of force against those entities listed in paragraph 4.b. above.

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- d. Hostile Intent. Hostile intent is the threat of the imminent use of force against those entities listed in paragraph 4.b. above.
- e. Minimum Force. The minimum degree of authorized force which is necessary, reasonable and lawful in the circumstances.
- f. Collateral Damage. Damage to persons or property adjacent to, but not part of an authorized target.
- g. Non-deadly force. Any physical means of forcing compliance that does not pose a risk of death or serious bodily harm to the individual against whom the force is directed. This is usually through the use of physical force short of the use of firearms or other deadly weapons. Examples include: pushing and lesser forms of striking or hitting, and physically or mechanically restraining persons. Warning shots are non-deadly force, even though they involve the use of firearms.
- h. Deadly Force. This is the ultimate degree of force. Deadly force is that level of force which is intended or is likely to cause death or serious bodily harm regardless of whether death or serious bodily harm actually results.

PART III**INSTRUCTIONS ON THE USE OF FORCE****APPLICABILITY**

5. The ROE stated in this directive apply to all personnel provided by nations participating in UNAMIR under the provisions of UN Security Council Resolution 925 dated 8 June 1994. These ROE are written in the form of either prohibitions or permissions. Issued as prohibitions, they are orders not to take specific actions. Issued as permissions they are guidance to commanders that certain specific actions may be taken if they are judged necessary to achieve the aim of the mission.

COMMANDERS' RESPONSIBILITY

6. Commanders at all levels are required:

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- a. to have this directive translated and disseminated to every subordinate under their command; and
- b. to ensure that every subordinate under their command understands the contents of this document.

AUTHORIZATION LEVELS FOR THE USE OF FORCE

7. The delegation of authority for the use of different types of weapons is as follows:

- a. **Force Commander or His Delegate:**
 - (1) heavy support weapons (ie. rocket launchers, artillery pieces, light mortars, etc.);
 - (2) heavy machine guns or cannons (.50 cal, 20mm, etc.); and
 - (3) medium machine guns (ie. FN MAG, M60, etc.).
- b. **Sector Commanders:**
 - (1) light machine guns; and
 - (2) all personal weapons for automatic fire.
- c. **Battalion Commander Down to NCO Level at the Scene of a Threat.** Personal weapons for single shot fire.

PRINCIPLES FOR USE OF FORCE

8. When an incident occurs that requires the use of force, the following principles will be adhered to:

- a. if possible, negotiation and warnings must be exhausted before any use of force is initiated;
- b. only the minimum non-deadly and deadly force consistent with achieving the immediate aim shall be employed;
- c. except where authorized under paragraph 11, the escalation of force procedures pursuant to paragraph 10 must be exhausted before the use of any deadly force is initiated;
- d. deadly force is justified only under conditions of extreme necessity and as a last resort when all

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lesser means have failed or cannot reasonably be employed;

- e. escalation of the level of violence is to be minimized;
- f. collateral damage is to be minimized;
- g. the use of force in retaliation is prohibited; and
- h. use of force shall be controlled by the on-scene commander and is to cease once the aim has been achieved.

AUTHORITY TO USE FORCE

9. Force may be used as follows:

- a. **Non-Deadly Force.** UNAMIR personnel are authorized to use non-deadly force in the following circumstances:

- (1) in self-defence (as defined in paragraph 4.b.) against unarmed aggression;
- (2) against unarmed attempts at infiltration or envelopment of UNAMIR units, compounds or locales;
- (3) when UNAMIR premises are violated in unarmed attempts to steal UNAMIR property or property under the protection of the UN;
- (4) when unarmed attempts are made to abduct or detain UNAMIR civilian or military personnel; and
- (5) when unarmed attempts are made to prevent UNAMIR personnel from carrying out their responsibilities as ordered by their commanders.

- b. **Deadly Force.** UNAMIR personnel are authorized to use deadly force in the following circumstances:

- (1) in self-defence (as defined in paragraph 4.b.) against persons committing a hostile act or exhibiting hostile intent;

- (2) to protect from damage or destruction, property or installations belonging to or under the protection of UNAMIR:
 - (a) which have been designated by the unit Commanding Officer, in consultation with the Force Commander, as essential to the success of the UNAMIR mission,
 - (b) which justifies protection through the use of deadly force, and
 - (c) where there is no other way to prevent the damage or destruction;
- (3) to overcome forceable attempts to prevent UNAMIR Forces from discharging its duties, when authorized by the Force Commander or his delegate;
- (4) to resist deliberate military or para-military incursions into UNAMIR protected areas;
- (5) to resist armed attempts to disarm, abduct or detain UNAMIR military or civilian personnel;
- (6) to resist armed attempts to compel UNAMIR personnel to withdraw from protected areas they were ordered to occupy by the Force Commander or his delegate; and
- (7) to resist armed attempts to cut off a UNAMIR force.

AUTHORITY TO SEARCH AND DETAIN

10. Authority to Stop and Search. UNAMIR personnel are authorized to stop all individuals attempting to enter or who are discovered inside any facilities under UNAMIR protection and to request that the individual submit to a consensual search of himself/herself and his/her vehicle where applicable. Any individual not willing to be searched shall be denied access, escorted from the premises or detained as appropriate. Searches of persons and their property are also authorized for the purposes of self-defence. Such searches may be conducted with the minimal use of non-deadly force if resistance is offered.

11. Authority to Detain. Individuals shall only be detained if they commit a hostile act, display hostile intent or carry out any activity which would require that force be used against them under paragraph 9.

12. Once detained, only minimal non-deadly force is authorized to prevent the escape of a detainee, unless there is a necessity to act in self-defence, in which case minimum force, up to and including deadly force, is authorized. However, if the individuals flee and the threat of their use of force has thus been removed, further force of any kind shall not be employed to apprehend them.

13. Any individual detained shall be turned over to appropriate civilian police authorities as soon as possible.

14. Treatment of Detainees. Any individuals detained are not technically Prisoners of War (PW) under the 1949 Geneva Convention. However, all persons detained will be accorded, as a minimum standard, treatment which would be given to a PW. In almost every case, except where extreme operational exigencies demand, a higher standard will be observed. Since the detention should only be for a minimum period of time, many of the procedures under the Geneva Convention accorded to PWs will be inapplicable.

Note: Detainees shall not be subject to intimidation, deprivation or humiliation. Medical care and the attention of medical personnel will be provided when required. Detainees will be given rations and shelter equivalent to that of UNAMIR personnel.

15. Release of Detainees. In the absence of a hostile act, detainees and associated vehicles may be released as soon as any weapons are confiscated or rendered militarily ineffective. All other detainees will be released as soon as the security situation permits and no later than the end of the evacuation operation. Detained personnel will not be removed from Rwandan territory.

CHALLENGE AND ESCALATION PROCEDURES

16. Except where a response in self-defence is required in accordance with paragraph 11, the following procedures are to be followed:

- a. Verbal or Visual Warning. Warn the aggressor to stop the activity, which in normal circumstances, should follow the following sequence:

- (1) depending on the circumstances, a warning may be given orally, by a sign or by illumination (ie, hand-held red flares, search-lights, etc). The issuance of a warning should also be passed up the chain of command with continuous Situation Reports;
 - (2) repeat the verbal or visual warning as many times as is necessary to ensure understanding or compliance;
- b. Charge Weapons if authorized under State B of ROE No. 2 (paragraph 16 refers);
 - c. Warning Shots. If the threat continues, employ aimed warning shots in a safe direction so that there is no danger of personal injury or collateral damage;
 - d. Non-Deadly Force. If warning shots are ignored, employ minimal non-deadly force;
 - e. Deadly Force. If minimal non-deadly force is either not feasible or fails, on order and under the control of a superior, minimal deadly force, such as single aimed shots, may be used until the threat is removed;
 - f. Escalation of Deadly Force. Escalatory weapons fire with other weapons systems shall only be on the order of the appropriate commander in accordance with paragraph 7.

OPENING FIRE WITHOUT WARNING OR ESCALATION

17. The only circumstance under which it is permissible to open fire without warning or escalation is if an attack by an aggressor comes so unexpectedly that even a moments delay could:

- a. lead to death or serious injury to UNAMIR personnel;
- b. lead to death or serious injury to persons who are under the protection of UNAMIR; and
- c. lead to the immediate damage or destruction of UNAMIR property in the circumstances described in paragraph 9.b.(2).

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PROCEDURES DURING FIRING

18. Any use of firearms as a means of applying deadly force, shall be aimed fire, ie, fired at the centre of the visible mass of the target. Fire must be controlled and will not be indiscriminate. Automatic fire and firing of support weapons will only be used as a last resort and only as authorized under paragraph 7. Fire for effect will only continue as long as it is necessary to achieve the immediate aim. Through fire control orders, the commander on the scene will indicate and control the fire, preferably directed at the leaders or instigators of the threat. Regular situation reports will be forwarded through the chain of command.

19. Whenever possible, each escalation in the use of force should be authorized by the chain of command of UNAMIR. A request in clear by radio for authorization to fire can have a calming effect on its own. Permission to use higher level of force must be obtained from the appropriate commander in accordance with paragraph 7. The on-scene commander is responsible for assessing the situation and taking action appropriate to the situation.

PROCEDURES AFTER FIRING

20. After firing, commanders should ensure the following actions are taken.

- a. **Medical**. Any wounded, including those fired upon by UNAMIR personnel will be given first aid, if such an action can be done without further endangering the lives of UNAMIR personnel.
- b. **Recording**. Details of the incident will be recorded, including:
 - (1) date, time and place of firing;
 - (2) unit and personnel involved;
 - (3) the events leading up to the firing;
 - (4) why UNAMIR personnel opened fire;
 - (5) who or what was fired on;
 - (6) the weapons fired; and
 - (7) the apparent results of the firing.

- c. Reporting. The above information and the current situation will be reported through the chain of command to Force HQ ATTN Force Commander and Chief Operations Officer.

PART IVRULES OF ENGAGEMENT

21. Rule No. One: Authority to Carry Arms
- a. State A: No authority; and
 - b. State B: Authority granted to carry weapons.
22. Rule No. Two: Status of Weapons
- a. State A: Weapons will be carried with loaded magazines.
 - b. State B: Weapons will be carried, charged and made safe.
23. Rule No. Three: Response to Hostile Intent or Hostile Act without the Use of Fire
- a. State A: Observe and report but will withdraw in order to preserve own force.
 - b. State B: Stay in place. Make contact and establish liaison with opposing force(s) and/or local authorities concerned.
 - c. State C: Observe and Report. Stay in Place. Warn aggressor of intent to use force and demonstrate resolve by appropriate means without opening fire.
 - d. State D: Observe and Report. Stay in place. Warn aggressor of intent to use force and demonstrate resolve by appropriate means. Demonstrative use of fire is authorized.
24. Rule No. Four: Disarmament of Paramilitary Personnel or Civilians
- a. State A: No authorization granted.

- b. State B: Authorization is granted. In doing so, use minimum force and escalate to include use of deadly force if hostile intent is exhibited or a hostile act is committed. Hand over to appropriate authority at the earliest opportunity.

25. Rule No. Five: Intervention and Warning Shots

- a. State A: Intervention is prohibited.
- b. State B: Intervention with deadly force against positively identified and designated targets only after warning shots have been fired as part of the warning process.

26. Rule No. Six: Control of Weapons Systems

- a. State A: Manning, preparation, movement and firing of weapons in the presence of the forces in conflict is prohibited.
- b. State B: Designated activity in the presence of the forces in conflict is permitted but will be specified by the following notes:
 - (1) Man (type of system);
 - (2) Prepare (type of system);
 - (3) Move (type of system); and
 - (4) Fire (type of system).

27. Normal Rules and States. In the normal, daily situation the following ROE status shall apply:

- a. Rule No. One, State B (Authority granted to carry weapons.);
- b. Rule No. Two, State A (Weapons will be carried, charged and made safe.);
- c. Rule No. Three, State B (Stay in place. Make contact and establish liaison with opposing force(s) and/or local authorities concerned.);

- d. Rule No. Four, State B (Authorization is granted. In doing so, use minimum force and escalate to include use of deadly force if hostile intent is exhibited or a hostile act is committed. Hand over to appropriate authority at the earliest opportunity.);
- e. Rule No. Five, State A (Intervention is prohibited.); and
- f. Rule No. Six, State A (Manning, preparation movement and firing of weapons in the presence of the forces in conflict is prohibited.)

Note: Changes in normal status of the ROE for UNAMIR Forces as a whole, as described in this paragraph, will be ordered by the Force Commander or his delegate. Sector Commanders may order changes in normal status of the ROE for their sectors, if authorized by the Force Commander or his delegate.

PART V**CONCLUSION**

28. The aim of this directive is to provide guidance to commanders and soldiers at all levels in the use of force. However, no definitive directive can be created that can detail every possible course of action for every possible situation. It is critical and mandatory that all members of UNAMIR understand these ROE and apply them to any and all situations that develop requiring the use of force.

29. Amendments to this directive will be issued as required and as approved by the UN.

30. This directive will be classified UN RESTRICTED.
