Further to our joint invitation to the Cairo Conference on Palestine, Reconstructing Gaza, and in light of the interest that the Conference is generating among the participants, we thought it is necessary to apprise you on some important developments in the run-up to the convening of the Conference on 12th of October.

As you are well aware, Palestinians and Israelis resumed their indirect negotiations in Cairo on 23rd of September, with the aim to agree on a permanent ceasefire and on other pending issues relevant to the situation in Gaza. In this round, both sides avidly reaffirmed their commitment to the current truce. They also agreed to reconvene in the second half of October and exchanged their respective proposals for the agenda of the forthcoming negotiation sessions.

Moreover, detailed understandings between Fatah and Hamas have been agreed upon on September 25th which pave the way to enable the Palestinian National Consensus Government to exercise its responsibilities in Gaza, including those pertinent to the crossings with Israel, which in turn would facilitate the introduction of reconstruction material into Gaza.

It is worth noting that in those understandings, the Palestinian parties reiterated their commitment to the stabilization of the ceasefire, called for the international community to convene the Cairo Conference and stressed the essential role of the Palestinian National Consensus Government with regard to the reconstruction as well as the need to cooperate with the concerned UN agencies. Our contacts with the Palestinian Government itself indicate its willingness to assume its role with full determination.

These developments immediately followed the Ad-Hoc Liaison Committee (AHLC) regular meeting on 22nd of September in New York which reviewed the financial status for the Palestinian National Authority and the progress in building state institutions for Palestine. The AHLC welcomed the Cairo Conference and called on donors to provide necessary assistance for the reconstruction of Gaza in addition to keeping sustained levels of budget support to the PA and development assistance to the West Bank.

✓ The AHLC also welcomed the UN-led preparations for a robust and efficient monitoring mechanism in Gaza, and that Israel and the PA now have accepted this mechanism. In the meeting, the Israeli representatives declared that Israel will take determined measures to ease restrictions on movement and access both in the West Bank and Gaza, and will lend its full cooperation to efforts to facilitate rapid recovery and reconstruction in Gaza led by the PA.

✓ The above-mentioned progress will certainly provide a conducive atmosphere for the Cairo Conference. We are confident that you will agree with us on the significance of nurturing that political context and affording the meeting the required synergy to achieve the objectives of the Conference, through our collective efforts and your direct involvement.
