DAILY SITREP FOR 19 JUN 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BANDITRY ACTIVITIES, SUCH AS THEFT, HIJACKINGS, ARMED ROBBERIES ETC HAVE DRASTICALLY REDUCED DURING THE LAST 5 DAYS AFTER THE FC MADE A PERSONAL APPEAL TO THE VP AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE TO ASSIST IN CURBING THE RECENT RAMPANT CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES AIMED AGAINST UNAMIR, UN AGENCIES AND NGOS.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF TANZANIA, H.E. MR. JULIUS NYERERE, CONTINUED HIS VISIT TO RWANDA. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, AT A LUNCHEON ATTENDED BY FOREIGN DIPLOMATS ACCREDITED TO RWANDA YESTERDAY, HE STATED THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SHOULD NOT BLAME THE CURRENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FOR EVERY MINOR INCIDENT REPORTED IN THE COUNTRY, BECAUSE THE GOVERNMENT WAS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SITUATION IT HAD INHERITED. HE ALSO VISITED RWANDESE REFUGEES IN TANZANIA YESTERDAY WHO REPORTEDLY TOLD HIM THAT THEY COULD NOT RETURN HOME FOR FEAR OF BEING KILLED, AND BECAUSE THEIR FARMS AND HOMES WERE STILL OCCUPIED BY OTHERS. MR. NYERERE REPORTEDLY STATED THAT SUCH FEARS WERE UNFOUNDED BECAUSE HE HAD SEEN MANY UNOCCUPIED FARMS IN RWANDA AND MILLIONS OF PEOPLE WERE LIVING IN RWANDA WITHOUT FEAR FOR THEIR SECURITY.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE** IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS AUTHORIZED FISHING ON LAKE KIVU, EAST OF ISHARA PENINSULA GR 0142 AND THE KIRAMBO COMMUNE GR 0444 ALONG THE COAST. MILOB ALSO REPORTED THAT A FERRY - MADE UP OF TWO LARGE BOATS - OPERATES REGULARLY BETWEEN KIRAMBO COMMUNE AND ISHARA PENINSULA. THE FERRY HAS BEEN OPERATING SINCE TUESDAY 13 JUN 95.

B. **MILITIA/FRGF.**

(1) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOB REPORTED THAT IN THE BUHORO SECTOR SQ 1346 OF GATARE COMMUNE AT ABOUT 2300 HRS ON 18 JUN 95, A GROUP OF BANDITS MACHETTED A MAN AND ROBBED HIM OF 20,000RWF. THE MAN IS NOW AT THE KIRAMBO HOSPITAL. THE VICTIM COULD IDENTIFY SOME OF THE BANDITS AND THE NAMES GIVEN TO RPA.

(2) IN ANOTHER INCIDENT IN THE SECTOR, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 19 JUN 95 AT ABOUT 1310 HRS, AN UNIDENTIFIED SINGLE ENGINE AIRCRAFT FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROX 3,000 FEET WAS OBSERVED WEST OF KAMEMBE COMMUNE FLYING FROM THE NORTH-WEST IN A SOUTH EASTERLY DIRECTION, TOWARDS WHAT SEEMED TO BE BURUNDI. NO FURTHER DETAILS ARE AVAILABLE.

(2) HE LATER MET WITH MR. RANDOLPH KENT OF UNREO TO DISCUSS FUTURE ROLE AND POTENTIAL OF UNREO IN UNAMIR MANDATE.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) NIBATT EOD TEAM RECOVERED 4 ANTI-PERSONNEL MINES, 132 ROUNDS OF 7.62 AND 244 ROUNDS OF 8.5MM AMMO. ALSO FOUND WERE TWO ROUNDS OF ANTI-AIRCRAFT GUN, RIFLE AND HAND GRENS AT NYAGAHANGA GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL GR 2420.

(3) PTL TO NGARAMA GR 264291 REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE AREA INDICATED THAT 25 LOCALS HAD BEEN IMPRISONED IN THE AREA. TWO OF THEM ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN GENOCIDE.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 130 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SHOTS OF MACHINE GUN WERE HEARD FIRED FROM DIRECTION OF RPA CAMP AT RUHUHA GR 0645. CAUSE OF FIRING NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) BN COMD PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SAKE GR 4454, BARE GR 5450 AND KABILIZI GR 5067 TO ASSESS THE SECURITY SIT IN THE AREA.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 62 LOCALS IN AOR.

D. SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED ONE METRIC TON OF MAIZE FOR WFP FROM KIBUYE TO MABANZA COMMUNE FOR DISTRIBUTION TO LOCALS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTL TO BUHANIKA GR 8761 REPORTED THAT THERE WAS AN OUT-BREAK OF MALARIA DISEASE IN THE AREA. HAC INFORMED.

(3) ASSISTED LWF WITH TWO VEHS TO TRANSPORT BUILDING MATERIALS FROM RUHANGO TO MUGINA.

F. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 237 LOCALS IN AOR.

G. SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 104 RETURNEES CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM BURUNDI.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 244 LOCALS IN AOR.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A SECURITY MEETING WAS HELD AT ETHIOBATT HQ TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SIT IN THE SECTOR. ETHIOBATT BN COMD, REP OF NGOS, UN AGENCIES, MILOB AND RPA LO ATTENDED THE MEETING.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 22 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS IN AOR.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 182 LOCALS IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED ESCORTS TO BROWN AND ROOT WATER TANKER FOR NIGHT SHIFT DUTIES.

(3) CIVIL WORKERS OF BENIRWA DISCOVERED ONE UNEXPLODED BOMB NEAR THE FACTORY PREMISES AT THE GIKONDO AROUND INDBATT HQ. FORCE ENGR COY RECOVERED AND DETONATED THE BOMB.

(4) 97 IDPs WERE EVACUATED BY UNHCR FROM NDERA CAMP TO KANZENZE, RUHENGIERI AND KIBUNGO. A TOTAL OF 120 IDPs NOW AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 61 MEDICAL AND 19 DENTAL PATIENTS IN AOR.

(1) **POLITICAL.** MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT THE FORMER TANZANIAN PRESIDENT JULIUS NYERERE THIS MORNING PAID AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO BUTARE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS AND LEFT FOR KIGALI LATER IN THE DAY.

(A) THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC:

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO.

III. REMERA AND AKABUGA.

IV. KANYARU-HAUTE AND KANYARU-BAS.

(B) GISENYI AND RUSIZI I AND II BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS ON THE ZAIREAN SIDE.

(3) **MILOB GP HQ.** CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) **IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA.**

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THAT DIFFERENT NGOS OPERATING WITHIN THE SECT ARE HELPING THE LOCALS BY PROVIDING THEM WITH DRUGS, VACCINES, FOOD, SEEDLING, CLOTHING ITEMS AND CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS.

(C) PTLs TO NYAGATARE REPORTED THAT THERE ARE ABOUT 800 PEOPLE IN NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP. APPROX 40 RETURNEES COME INTO THE CAMP EVERYDAY. THEY ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO STAY IN THE CAMP FOR A MAXIMUM OF 4 WEEKS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE WHO ARE NOT ABLE TO FIND IMMEDIATE RESETTLEMENT AREAS.

(5) **IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.**

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PTLs TO MEREBA SECTOR GR 0848 REPORTED OF ACUTE SHORTAGE OF WATER IN THE AREA.

(C) PTLs TO NGENDA REPORTED THAT GUN SHOT WAS HEARD AT NGENDA PRISON AT ABOUT 181900 JUN 95. THIS WAS LATER CONFIRMED BY THE GHANBATT PLATOON ON LOCATION. REASON FOR FIRING NOT KNOWN.

(D) PTL TO KANKOBWA REPORTED THAT BETWEEN 300 AND 400 IDPS HAVE BEEN RE-SETTLED IN THE COMMUNE.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PTLs TO NYAKABANDA COMMUNE VISITED GASOVU SQ 6688, KIRWA SQ 6387 AND KAGOGWE SQ 6490 SECTOR AND REPORTED THAT THE SINGLE DISPENSARY IN THE THREE SECTORS LACKED DOCTORS AND MEDICAL EQUIPMENT. THE DISPENSARY HAS NO AMBULANCE AND ENOUGH QUALIFIED PERSONNEL.

(C) PTLs TO RWAMATSAMA SQ 2063 MET WITH RPA SOLDIERS WHO INFORMED MILOBS THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS A BIT TENSE AND THEY WERE EXPECTING AN ATTACK FROM ZAIRE. THEY COULD NOT IDENTIFY THE DIRECTION OF THREAT. LOCALS WERE AFRAID TO TALK TO MILOB FOR FEAR OF REPRISAL FROM RPA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PTLs TO BUTARE REPORTED THAT PAM (NGO) DONATED FOODSTUFF TO INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS' OFFICE IN BUTARE TO BE DISTRIBUTED AMONG THE TEACHERS IN ALL THE 20 HOME COMMUNES WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PTLs TO REMERA GR 130843 OPPOSITE GHANBATT TRANSIT CAMP IN KIGALI WAS DENIED ACCESS TO THE AREA BY RPA AND CIVILIANS IN THE AREA. REASON FOR THIS ACTION NOT KNOWN. RPA LO INFORMED.

(C) PTLs TO GIKOMERO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT UNICEF

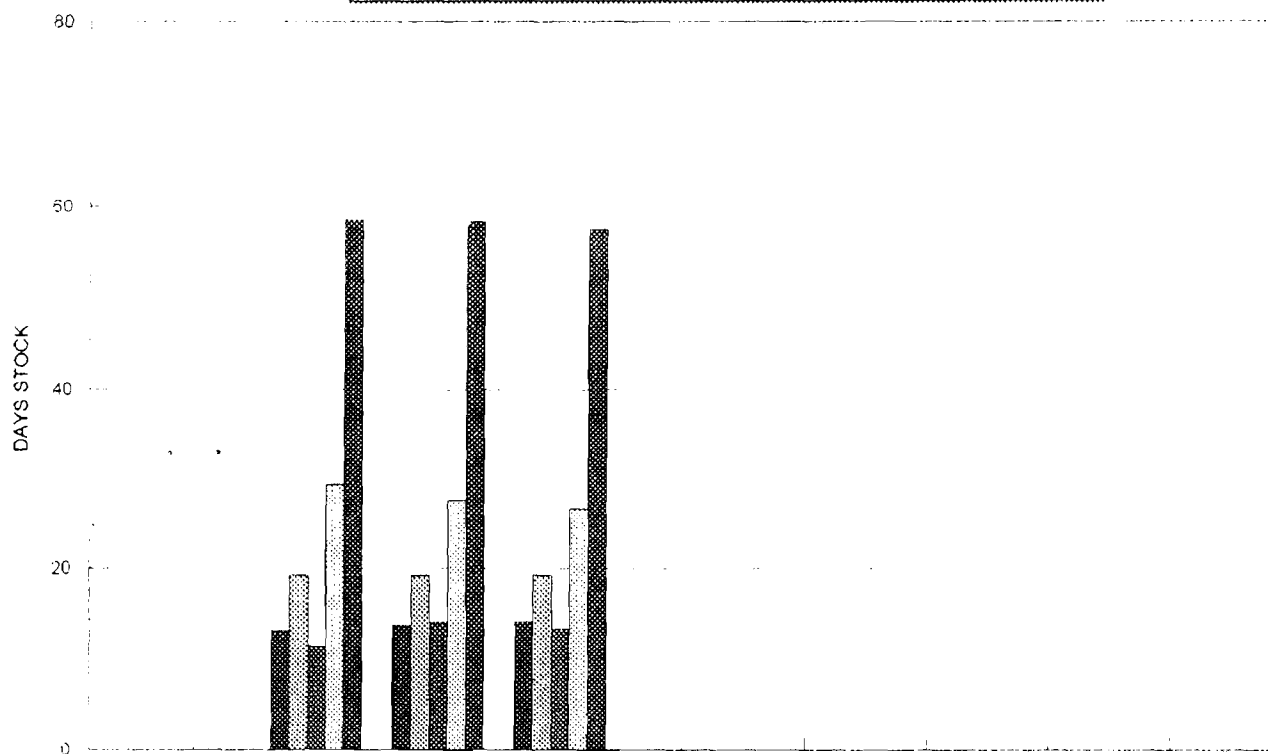

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 12 JUN TO 18 JUN 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE:

A. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT ACCOMPANIED BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE AND THE PRIME MINISTER VISITED CYANGUGU ON 13 JUN 95 WHERE THE PRESIDENT ADDRESSED THE PEOPLE AT KAMEMBE STADIUM. ISSUES ON ECONOMIC AND SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY WERE RAISED. NOTHING REGARDING UNAMIR WAS RAISED EITHER BY THE PRESIDENT OR THE LOCALS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. REGIONAL COOPERATION (ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA)

(1) THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, ENDED HIS FOUR-DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI ON SUNDAY 11 JUNE. IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED ON 9 JUNE, THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF RWANDA, BURUNDI AND ZAIRE AGREED TO SET UP JOINT PATROLS TO CONTROL THEIR COMMON BORDERS AND TO TAKE OTHER MEASURES TO ELIMINATE ARMED GANGS, AS WELL AS TO PREVENT THE PROLIFERATION OF ARMS IN THE REGION. THEY HAVE ESTABLISHED A COMMISSION WHICH IS TO MEET ON A BIMONTHLY BASIS TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF SECURITY ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDERS. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THEY ALSO AGREED THAT THE CEPGL (COMMUNAUTE ECONOMIQUE DES PAYS DES GRANDS LACS) WOULD PROVIDE THE BASIS FOR RESOLVING THE REGION'S REFUGEE PROBLEMS.

(2) A TWO-DAY MEETING OF THE KAGERA BASIN ORGANISATION (KBO) BEGAN ON 12 JUNE. THE OBJECTIVES OF THIS ORGANISATION ARE TO INCREASE MUTUAL COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT AMONG ITS MEMBER STATES: TANZANIA, BURUNDI, UGANDA AND RWANDA.

(3) THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF TANZANIA, H.E. MR. JULIUS NYERERE, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 16 JUNE FOR A 4-DAY VISIT DURING WHICH HE WILL HOLD TALKS WITH SEVERAL HIGH-RANKING RWANDESE OFFICIALS AND ADDRESS THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY.

(4) IN A PRESS CONFERENCE GIVEN IN BURUNDI, MAJOR GENERAL KAGAME REJECTED THE CREATION OF A SEPARATE HUTULAND AND TUTSILAND TO RESOLVE THE ETHNIC PROBLEMS IN RWANDA AND BURUNDI BY EXPLAINING THAT IT WAS NOT EVIDENT TUTSIS FROM BURUNDI WOULD BE ABLE TO COEXIST PEACEFULLY WITH TUTSIS FROM RWANDA, OR THAT HUTUS FROM BOTH COUNTRIES COULD DO THE SAME. HE REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT THE ETHNIC TWA MINORITY WERE OFTEN FORGOTTEN, AND THAT DIVISIONS WERE ALSO POSSIBLE WITHIN THE SAME ETHNIC GROUP, AS HAD OCCURRED UNDER THE FORMER REGIME IN RWANDA. HE ALSO DENIED THE PAST EXISTENCE OF AN ETHNIC PROBLEM IN RWANDA AND CLAIMED THAT BAD POLITICAL IDEOLOGIES HAD BEEN THE ONLY CONTRIBUTING FACTOR TO SUCH TENSIONS.

B. REFUGEE SITUATION (ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA)

(1) THE RWANDESE CABINET ANNOUNCED THAT REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM CAMPS LOCATED IN BURUNDI WOULD VISIT RWANDA TO ASSESS CONDITIONS IN RWANDA FOR THEIR SAFE RETURN HOME.

(2) THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, CHAIRED A MEETING OF THE HEADS OF RWANDESE PREFECTURES TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND THE PROBLEM OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES AND RETURNEES. THE PRIME MINISTER REPORTEDLY STATED THAT THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION WAS GOOD, DESPITE ACTS OF INSECURITY IN CERTAIN AREAS. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER STRESSED THAT ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING CRIMES ON THE BASIS OF STRONG EVIDENCE SHOULD BE ARRESTED. THE PREFECTS, ACCORDING TO THESE REPORTS, RECOMMENDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT TAKE SWIFT ACTION TO APPOINT LOCAL CIVILIAN ADMINISTRATORS AS THE LACK OF LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURES REMAINED A PROBLEM IN THEIR PREFECTURES.

C. INTERNAL POLITICAL SITUATION

(1) THE DIRECTOR OF CABINET OF THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE IN RWANDA, MR. JEAN-DAMASCÈNE NTAKIRUTIMANA, DEFECTED. HE REPORTEDLY ANNOUNCED HIS RESIGNATION FROM KENYA WHERE HE HAD TRAVELLED ON OFFICIAL MISSION. IN HIS STATEMENT, HE REPORTEDLY CRITICISED DIVISIONS WITHIN THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT, AND ACCUSED THE RPF OF HAMPERING HIS WORK AND RPA TROOPS OF TERRORISING THE POPULATION.

(2) THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE ON 14 JUNE STATING THAT HE HAD NOT RECEIVED A FORMAL LETTER OF RESIGNATION FROM HIS FORMER DIRECTOR OF CABINET, AND THAT HE HAD ONLY LEARNED OF HIS DEFECTION THROUGH MEDIA REPORTS. THE PRIME MINISTER ADDED THAT RWANDA'S PROBLEMS COULD ONLY BE RESOLVED THROUGH TRUTH AND POLITICAL REALISM, AND THAT HE REGRETTED THE LACK OF COURAGE AND PATIENCE DEMONSTRATED IN THE DEPARTURE OF SUCH A HIGH-RANKING POLITICAL LEADER.

D. GOVERNMENT/UNAMIR RELATIONS

(1) THE FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT, MET WITH MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, TO DISCUSS UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE. DURING THIS MEETING, THE VICE-PRESIDENT CONFIRMED THAT UNAMIR TROOPS WOULD NO LONGER BE STATIONED IN RWANDA UPON THE EXPIRY OF UNAMIR'S CURRENT MANDATE ON 8 DECEMBER 1995. WITH REGARD TO THE ISSUE OF THE DAILY THEFT OF UNAMIR VEHICLES, THE VICE-PRESIDENT ADDED THAT HE WAS CONCERNED THAT SUCH INCIDENTS MIGHT INCREASE AS UNAMIR TROOPS BEGAN THEIR WITHDRAWAL, AND ACKNOWLEDGED

THAT RPA FORCES MAY BE RESPONSIBLE FOR AS MUCH AS A THIRD OF SUCH THEFTS.

(2) RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A PRESS CONFERENCE, THE VICE-PRESIDENT STATED THAT "IT WOULD NOT HAVE MATTERED FOR US IF UNAMIR HAD LEFT RWANDA COMPLETELY, BECAUSE WE CAN GET ALONG WITHOUT UNAMIR, AND WITH UNAMIR THE PROBLEMS REMAIN ANYWAY." HE REPORTEDLY FURTHER ADDED THAT HIS GOVERNMENT HAD AGREED TO A REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF UNAMIR TROOPS AS A COMPROMISE GESTURE, BECAUSE IT DID NOT WISH TO HAVE PROBLEMS WITH DONOR COUNTRIES BY INSISTING ON UNAMIR'S DEPARTURE.

(3) THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER FOR DEFENCE OFFICIATED AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY HELD ON 15 JUNE FOR 301 GENDARMES WHO RECENTLY COMPLETED AN INTENSIVE 6-MONTH TRAINING PROGRAMME ORGANISED BY UNAMIR. IN HIS ADDRESS ON THE OCCASION WHICH WAS BROADCAST LIVE BY RADIO RWANDA, HE PRAISED UNAMIR TROOPS FOR TRAINING RWANDESE GENDARMES, BUT ADDED THAT THE TOTAL NUMBER OF GENDARMES TRAINED SO FAR WAS NOT SUFFICIENT FOR ENSURING SECURITY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE VICE-PRESIDENT ALSO STATED THAT SOLDIERS ACTING AS POLICEMEN HAD MADE SOME MISTAKES DUE TO LACK OF TRAINING, BUT THAT THE ENTIRE ARMY SHOULD NOT BE FAULTED FOR THE ACTS OF INDISCIPLINE COMMITTED BY SOME OF THESE SOLDIERS. HE URGED SOLDIERS "TO BRING AN END FOREVER TO THESE ACTS, BECAUSE IT IS NOT RIGHT FOR PEOPLE IN CHARGE OF ENSURING SECURITY TO CAUSE INSECURITY THEMSELVES."

#### E. MEETINGS WITH FOREIGN DIGNITARIES

(1) THE FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. DAVID RAWSON, TO DISCUSS THE IMPACT OF UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE ON ITS PEACE-KEEPING CAPABILITIES IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS THE ATTEMPTED AMBUSH OF THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO BURUNDI.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER ALSO HELD TALKS WITH THE INDIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO RWANDA AND UGANDA, H.E. MR. SURRENDER SINGH GILL, TO DISCUSS, INTER ALIA, THE INDIAN CONTINGENT'S PARTICIPATION IN UNAMIR'S MILITARY COMPONENT, AS WELL AS THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE ENTIRE REGION.

(3) THE FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. AUGUST HUMMEL, AND THE DIRECTOR FOR EAST AND CENTRAL AFRICA AT THE GERMAN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS IN BONN, MR. UWE SCHRAM. THEY DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE REGION, AND ALSO EXCHANGED VIEWS ON UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE.

(C) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS INTENSIFIED PATROLS ON KITABI-CYANGUGU ROUTE AS IT IS SUSPECTED TO BE AN INFILTRATION ROUTE FOR THE FRGF FROM ZAIRE.

(D) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA HAVE REDUCED THEIR CHECK POINTS IN THE HOME COMMUNES AND ARE NOW CONCENTRATED AT THE BURUNDI BORDER.

(E) SECTOR 1 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA CHECK POINTS AT RUKOMO AND NYTACYONGA ARE STILL ACTIVE AND CONTINUE TO SEARCH VEHS AND PASSENGER'S PERSONNEL EFFECTS.

(F) MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT ON 12 JUN 95 NIGHT, 11 PEOPLE WHO WERE COMING IN FROM ZAIRE, WERE SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA AT RWARAMBA.

(G) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS PATROLS WERE INFORMED THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE ARRESTING LOCALS AND TAKING BRIBES BEFORE RELEASING THEM.

(H) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA INTENSIFIED ITS SEARCHES OF PEOPLE COMING INTO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE THROUGH RUSIZI-I GR 7624 AS REPORTS HAD BEEN RECEIVED THAT PEOPLE WERE CROSSING THE BORDER WITH GUNS AND GRENS.

(I) IN SECTOR 1, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA BN COMD AT NYAGATARE WARNED THE MILOBS NOT TO GO ON PTL OR TALK TO OFFICIALS WITHIN THE COMMUNE WITHOUT AN RPA REP ACCOMPANYING THEM.

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 11 JUN 95, 7 ARMED BANDITS WHO WERE FORMER INHABITANTS OF KIRANGA AREA GR 8008, CAME IN FROM ZAIRE AND SHOT AND WOUNDED TWO LOCALS SERIOUSLY. B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(A) ON 12 JUN 95, THE FC AND HIS SENIOR STAFF CONTINUED TO DEVELOP THE STRATEGY AND IMPLEMENTATION PLAN TO SCALE DOWN THE MISSION BY OCT 95. 

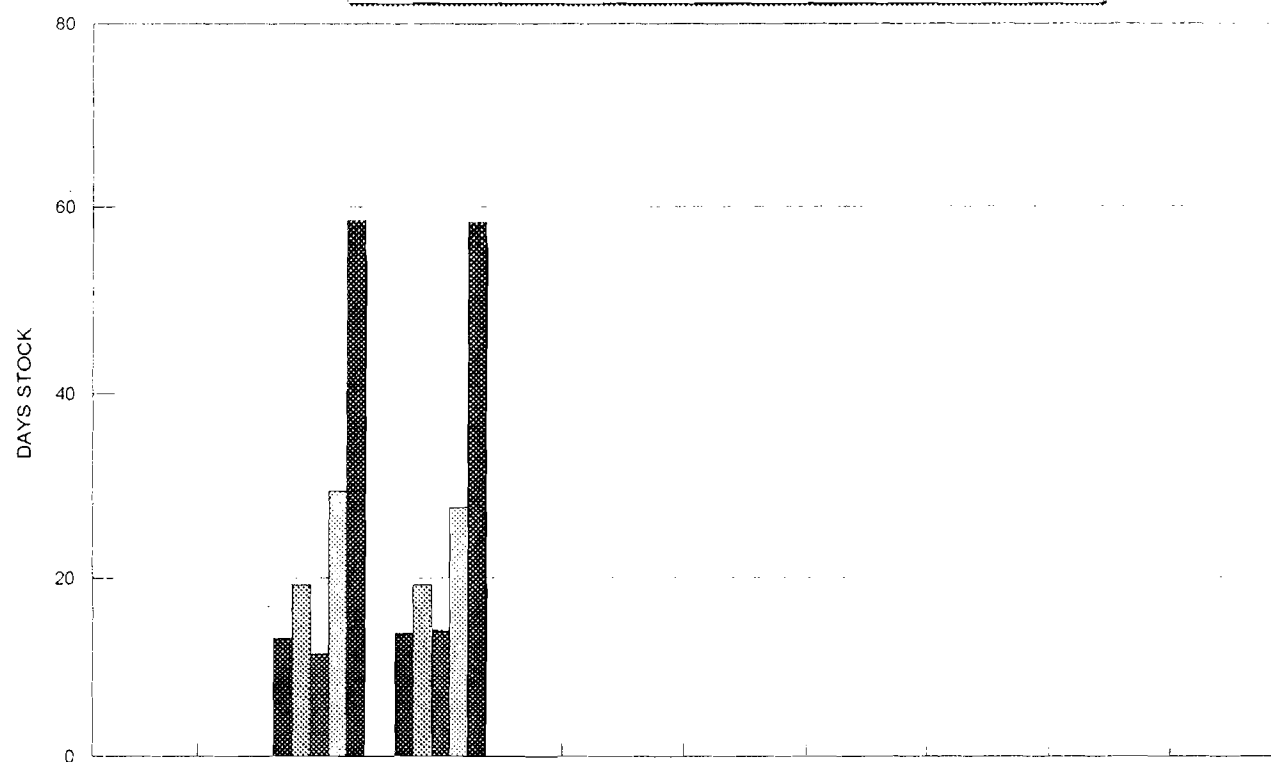

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE. IT IS NOTE WORTHY THAT NO BANDITRY OR HIJACKINGS HAVE OCCURRED AGAINST UNAMIR OVER THE LAST TWO DAYS.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. THE FC, MAJ GEN GUY TOUSIGNANT, MET WITH THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. AUGUST HUMMEL, AND THE DIRECTOR FOR EAST AND CENTRAL AFRICA AT THE GERMAN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS IN BONN, MR. UWE SCHRAM. THEY DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE REGION, AND ALSO EXCHANGED VIEWS ON UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE.

B. THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER FOR DEFENCE, MAJ GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, YESTERDAY OFFICIATED AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY FOR 301 GENDARMES WHO RECENTLY COMPLETED AN INTENSIVE 6-MONTH TRAINING PROGRAMME ORGANISED BY UNAMIR. IN HIS ADDRESS ON THE OCCASION WHICH WAS BROADCAST LIVE BY RADIO RWANDA, HE PRAISED UNAMIR TROOPS FOR TRAINING RWANDESE GENDARMES, BUT ADDED THAT THE TOTAL NUMBER OF GENDARMES TRAINED SO FAR WAS NOT SUFFICIENT FOR ENSURING SECURITY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE VICE PRESIDENT ALSO STATED THAT SOLDIERS ACTING AS POLICEMEN HAD MADE SOME MISTAKES DUE TO LACK OF TRAINING, BUT THAT THE ENTIRE ARMY SHOULD NOT BE FAULTED FOR THE ACTS OF INDISCIPLINE COMMITTED BY SOME OF THESE SOLDIERS. HE URGED SOLDIERS "TO BRING AN END FOREVER TO THESE ACTS, BECAUSE IT IS NOT RIGHT FOR PEOPLE IN CHARGE OF ENSURING SECURITY TO CAUSE INSECURITY THEMSELVES".

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF TANZANIA, H.E MR. JULIUS NYERERE, ARRIVED IN KIGALI TODAY FOR A 4-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT DURING WHICH HE WILL HOLD TALKS WITH SEVERAL HIGH RANKING RWANDESE OFFICIALS AND ADDRESS THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE**

(1) IN SECTOR 5, MILOBS ON HELI PATROL TO RUSHASHI (8309) AND MUSASA (8298) WERE NOT ALLOWED TO CONTACT LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THE LOCAL RPA TROOPS SAID THEY WERE NOT INFORMED OF THE FLIGHT.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS PATROLS WERE INFORMED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ARREST LOCALS AND ASKED FOR TIPS BEFORE THEY COULD BE RELEASED. THIS METHOD OF EXTORTION WAS CONFIRMED BY ONE LOCAL MALE OF KIGESE SECTEUR (9880), WHO WAS ARRESTED ON 21 MAY 95. HE WAS SEVERELY BEATEN AND ASKED TO PAY 2,000 FRW BEFORE HE COULD BE RELEASED. HE IS STILL AT THE COMMUNE HOSPITAL SUFFERING FROM WOUNDS SUSTAINED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ

(1) THE FC AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, MAJ-GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT SPENT THE FIRST PART OF HIS DAY REVIEWING WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF THE PLAN TO REDUCE THE MILITARY STAFF OF UNAMIR HQ FROM ITS CURRENT SIZE TO APPROX 35 PERSONNEL BY THE END OF SEPTEMBER. HE ALSO ASKED THE STAFF TO WATCH FOR WHAT MAY BE AN EMERGING TREND TOWARDS COOPERATION BY BRANCHES OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND ITS VARIOUS STATE OWNED BUSINESSES. HE ALSO HELD WORKING SESSIONS WITH HIS STAFF TO OVERSEE THE UPCOMING VISIT OF THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL, MR. AJELLO. WORK IS PROGRESSING SMOOTHLY AND PREPARATIONS ARE IN HAND.

(2) THE FC HELD A CORDIAL MEETING THIS MORNING WITH THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR HUMMEL, AND THE DIRECTOR FOR CENTRAL AFRICAN AFFAIRS. (SEE THE POLITICAL AFFAIRS SECTION FOR DETAILS). A LATE AFTERNOON VISIT BY A GROUP OF IRISH PARLIAMENTARIANS - MR. PAT GALLAGHER, KENNETH THOMPSON AND MARTIN GROVES - WHO REPRESENT IRISH FOREIGN AID, RECEIVED FROM THE FC HIS VIEWS ON THE CURRENT POLITICAL CLIMATE AND SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY. HE ALSO SHARED WITH THEM HIS PERSPECTIVE ON THE REVISED ROLE FOR UNAMIR IN RWANDA AND THE GREAT LAKES REGION.

(3) DURING THE DAY, THE FC HELD A VARIETY OF MEETINGS ON CURRENT ISSUES. HE DISCUSSED WITH MAJ GEN BARIL, MILAD, THE CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS AS PROPOSED BY UNAMIR FOR CONTINGENT FORCES IN THE NEW MANDATE. IT HAS BEEN APPROVED IN PRINCIPLE AND WOULD BE ACTIONED SHORTLY ONCE MINOR ADJUSTMENTS WERE INCORPORATED.

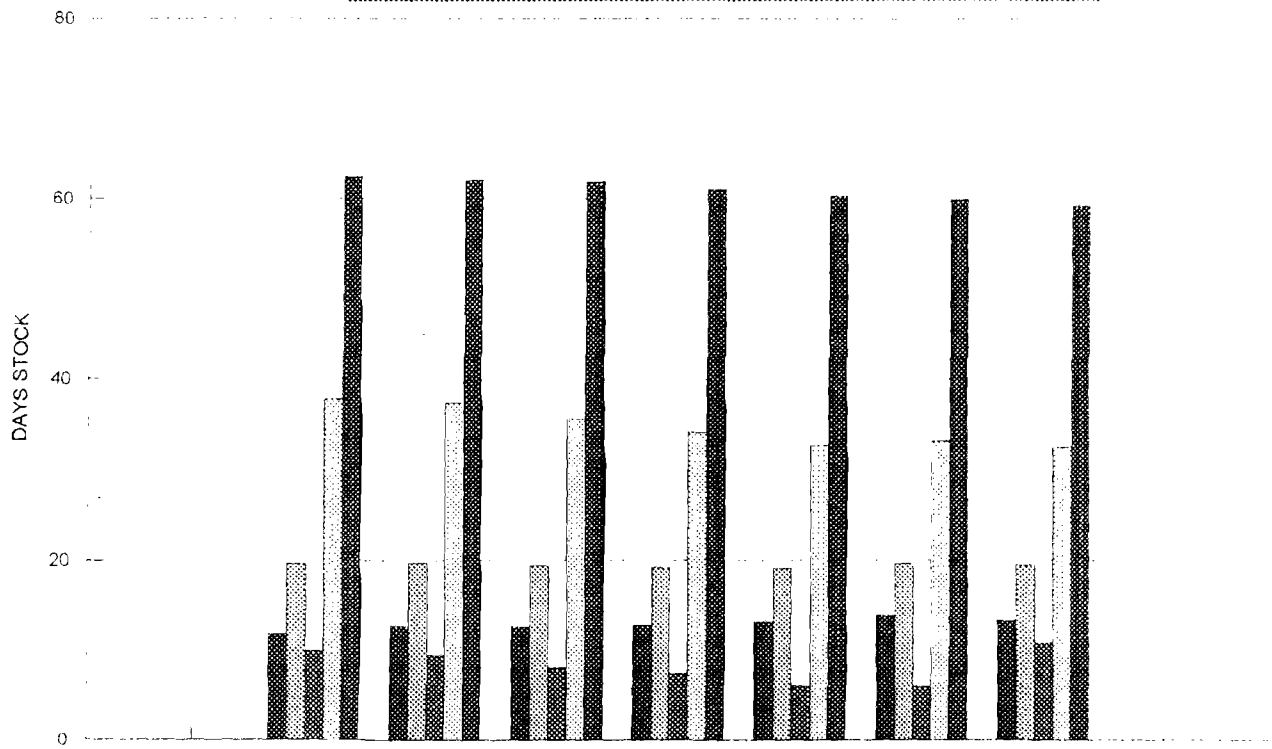





2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FC MET WITH THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E MR DAVID RAWSON, TO DISCUSS THE IMPACT OF UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE ON ITS PEACE-KEEPING CAPABILITIES IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS YESTERDAY'S ATTEMPTED AMBUSH OF THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO BURUNDI. THE FC WAS INFORMED THAT THERE WAS NO APPARENT NEED FOR ANY ACTION ON THE PART OF UNAMIR WITH RESPECT TO THIS INCIDENT.

B. THE FC ALSO HELD TALKS WITH THE INDIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO RWANDA AND UGANDA, H.E. MR SURENDER SINGH GILL, TO DISCUSS, INTER ALIA, THE INDIAN CONTINGENT'S PARTICIPATION IN UNAMIR'S MILITARY COMPONENT, AS WELL AS THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE ENTIRE REGION.

C. THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE YESTERDAY STATING THAT HE HAD NOT RECEIVED A FORMAL LETTER OF RESIGNATION FROM HIS FORMER DIRECTOR OF CABINET, AND THAT HE HAD ONLY LEARNED OF HIS DEFECTION THROUGH MEDIA REPORTS. THE PRIME MINISTER REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT RWANDA'S PROBLEMS COULD ONLY BE RESOLVED THROUGH TRUTH AND POLITICAL REALISM, AND THAT HE REGRETTE THE LACK OF COURAGE AND PATIENCE DEMONSTRATED IN THE DEPARTURE OF SUCH A HIGH-RANKING POLITICAL LEADER.

D. THE ED, ACCOMPANIED BY THE CAO AND ACTING DFC/COS ATTENDED THE GRADUATION CEREMONIES AT THE GENDARMERIE SCHOOL IN RUHENGIRI; VP AND MIN OF DEFENCE WAS ALSO IN ATTENDANCE AS THE REVIEWING OFFICER AND GUEST OF HONOUR. UNAMIR WAS THANKED IN VARIOUS SPEECHES FOR ORGANISING AND PROVIDING RESOURCES TO ENABLE THE TRAINING OF OVER 300 GENDARMES.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT IN RWARAMBA ON THE NIGHT OF 12 JUN AT 2000HRS, ELEVEN PEOPLE WERE SHOT DEAD BY RPA SOLDIERS WHEN THEY WERE COMING FROM ZAIRE. THE VICTIMS WERE SHOT BEFORE THEY LANDED ON THE BEACH.

(1) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 14 JUN 95, UNKNOWN ARMED BANDITS INJURED A CIVILIAN AND ROBBED DIFFERENT HOUSEHOLD MATERIALS AROUND MUYNE.

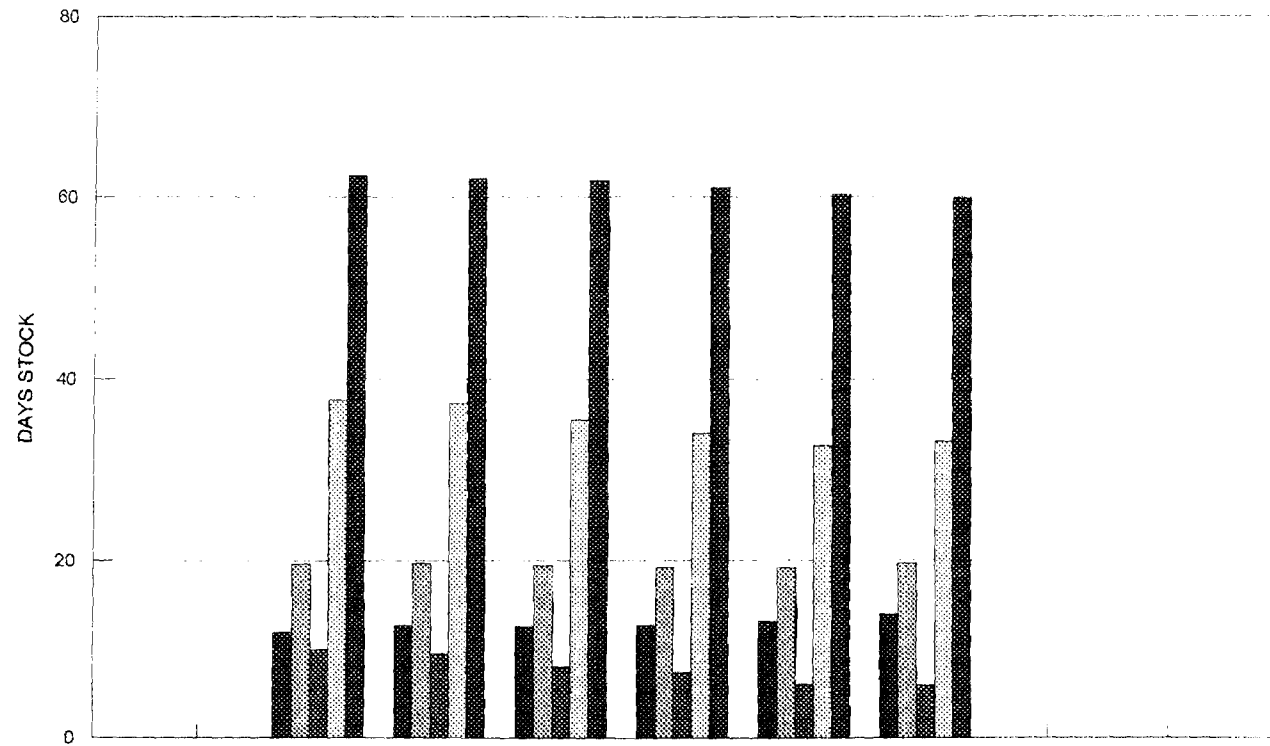

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT, MET TODAY WITH THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, TO DISCUSS UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE. DURING THIS MEETING, THE VICE-PRESIDENT CONFIRMED THAT UNAMIR TROOPS WOULD NO LONGER BE STATIONED IN RWANDA UPON THE EXPIRY OF UNAMIR'S CURRENT MANDATE ON 8 DEC 95. WITH REGARD TO THE ISSUE OF THE DAILY THEFT OF UNAMIR VEHICLES, THE VICE-PRESIDENT ADDED THAT WITH THE CURRENT WITHDRAWAL OF UNAMIR TROOPS HE WAS CONCERNED THAT SUCH INCIDENTS MIGHT INCREASE, AND ACKNOWLEDGED THAT RPA FORCES MAY BE RESPONSIBLE FOR AS MUCH AS A THIRD OF SUCH THEFTS. THE MEETING WAS CONDUCTED IN A VERY WARM AND CORDIAL ATMOSPHERE.

B. ACCORDING TO REPORTS BY RADIO RWANDA AND THE INTERNATIONAL MEDIA, THE DIRECTOR OF CABINET IN THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE IN RWANDA, MR JEAN-DAMASCENE NTAKIRUTIMANA, HAS APPARENTLY DEFECTED. HE REPORTEDLY ANNOUNCED HIS RESIGNATION FROM KENYA WHERE HE HAD TRAVELLED ON OFFICIAL MISSION ABOARD A UNAMIR FLIGHT FOR WHICH HE HAD OBTAINED PRIOR GOVERNMENTAL APPROVAL. IN HIS STATEMENT, HE REPORTEDLY CRITICISED DIVISIONS WITHIN THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT, AND ACCUSED THE RPF OF HAMPERING HIS WORK AND RPA TROOPS OF TERRORISING THE POPULATION BY LEAVING THEIR BARRACKS TO PERFORM ACTS OF INSECURITY.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A PRESS CONFERENCE HELD YESTERDAY, THE VICE-PRESIDENT STATED THAT "IT WOULD NOT HAVE MATTERED FOR US IF UNAMIR HAD LEFT RWANDA COMPLETELY, BECAUSE WE CAN GET ALONG WITHOUT UNAMIR, AND WITH UNAMIR THE PROBLEMS REMAIN ANYWAY". 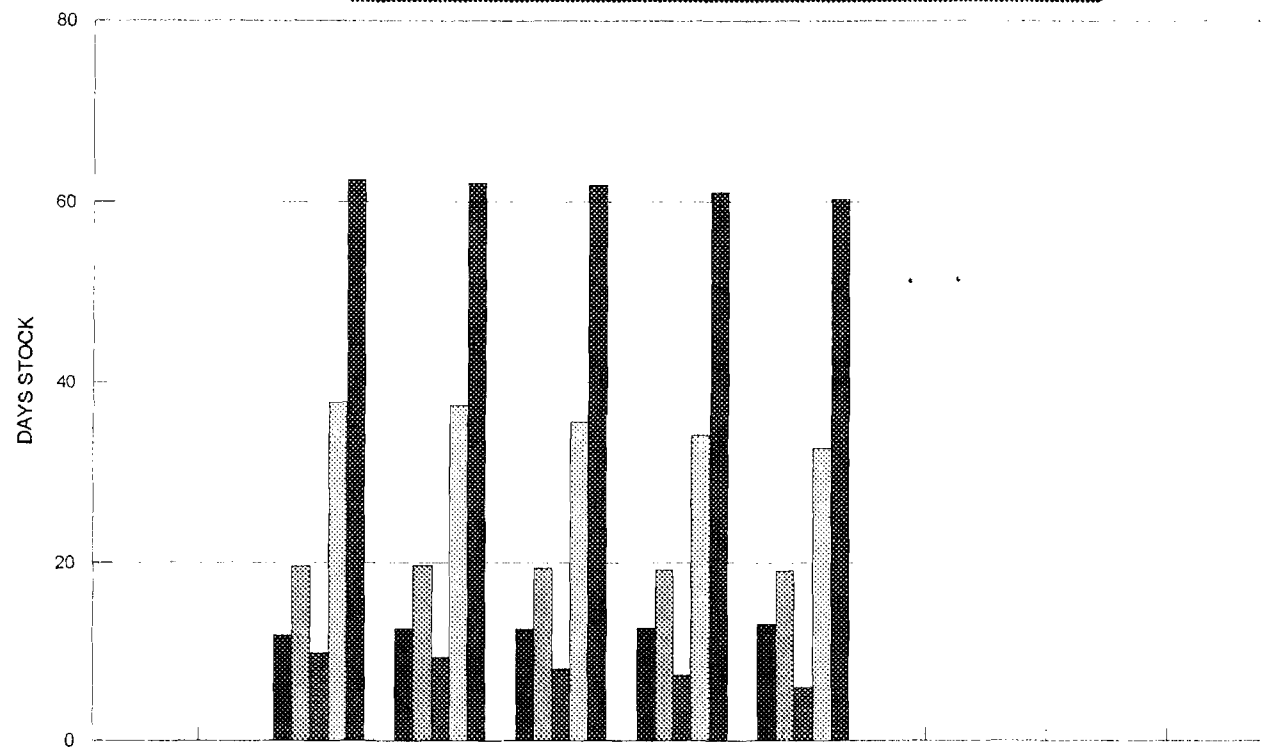

DAILY SITREP FOR 13 JUN 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZUMUNGU OF RWANDA ACCOMPANIED BY VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER FOR DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, AND GOVERNMENT MINISTERS VISITED CYANGUGU WHERE THE PRESIDENT ADDRESSED THE PEOPLE AT KAMEMBE STADIUM. AT THE TIME OF THE MEETING, QUESTIONS ON THE ECONOMIC AND SECURITY SITUATION OF THE COUNTRY WERE RAISED. NOTHING REGARDING UNAMIR WAS RAISED EITHER FROM THE SIDE OF THE PRESIDENT OR THE PEOPLE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ACCORDING TO REPORTS ON RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, YESTERDAY CHAIRED A MEETING OF THE HEADS OF RWANDESE PREFECTURES TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY, THE PROBLEM OF RETURNEES AND RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE PRIME MINISTER REPORTEDLY STATED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS GOOD, DESPITE ACTS OF INSECURITY IN CERTAIN AREAS WHICH, ACCORDING TO THE PREFECTS, INCLUDED MURDER, ROBBERY AND THEFT COMMITTED BY ARMED CIVILIANS AND SOLDIERS, AS WELL AS INFILTRATION OF BANDITS FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER STRESSED THAT ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING CRIMES ON THE BASIS OF STRONG EVIDENCE SHOULD BE ARRESTED. THE PREFECTS, ACCORDING TO THE REPORTS, RECOMMENDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT TAKE SWIFT ACTION TO APPOINT LOCAL CIVILIAN ADMINISTRATORS AS THE LACK OF LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURES REMAINED A PROBLEM IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THE OPENING OF A TWO-DAY MEETING OF THE KAGERA BASIN ORGANISATION (KBO) YESTERDAY. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS ORGANISATION IS TO INCREASE MUTUAL COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT AMONG ITS MEMBER STATES: TANZANIA, BURUNDI, UGANDA AND RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS INTENSIFIED PATROLS ON KITABI - CYANGUGU ROUTE AS IT IS SUSPECTED TO BE AN APPROACH FOR FRGF INFILTRATION FROM ZAIRE.

(2) IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS IN THEIR SECTOR HAVE REDUCED THEIR CHECKPOINTS IN THE HOME COMMUNES AND ARE NOW CONCENTRATED AT THE BURUNDI BORDER

WITH PHYSICAL PRESENCE AT KANYARU-HAUTE/BAS BORDER POSTS.

(3) IN SECTOR 2 MILOB PATROLS WERE DENIED ACCESS BEYOND MUGESERA CHECKPOINT BECAUSE THE BOURGMESTRE WAS NOT THERE TO AUTHORISE IT.

(4) IN SECTOR 3 MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA STOLE UNAMIR VEHICLE NUMBER 1927 BELONGING TO HUMAN RIGHTS FROM A RESIDENCE AT 121230 JUN 95. MALICOY ARMED PATROLS WERE DESPATCHED SAME DAY BUT COULD NOT FIND THE VEHICLE.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C MILOB REPORTED RPA REINFORCEMENTS THROUGHOUT THEIR AOR TODAY PROBABLY DUE TO THE PRESIDENTIAL AND GOVERNMENT MINISTERS VISIT. MACHINE GUN POSITION WAS NOTICED AT PINDURA (1426) AND MANY SOLDIERS WERE DEPLOYED IN THE NYUNGWE FOREST.

B. MILITIA/FRGF.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ

(1) THE FC STARTED THE DAY BY ADDRESSING ALL HIS SENIOR MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF TO PROVIDE THEM WITH HIS VISION OF UNAMIR AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW MANDATE. HE HIGHLIGHTED THE FACT THAT SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 997/95 REMOVES MUCH OF THE NEED FOR INDEPENDENT ACTION BY THE MISSION AND SUBORDINATES US ALL TO A REACTIONARY ROLE IN SUPPORT OF THE RWANDESE PEOPLE AND THEIR GOVERNMENT. HE ALSO DETAILED HOW UNAMIR WOULD REORGANISE ITSELF IN THE COMING MONTHS TO MEET THE LIMITATIONS OF 1,800 FORMED TROOPS BY EARLY OCTOBER. HE ALSO HELD A BRIEF MEETING WITH MR. GEODEON, RWANDA CHIEF OF PROTOCOL, ON A PRIVATE MATTER.

(2) THE AFTERNOON WAS SPENT IN CONSULTATION WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF AND CALL BY DR. LILIAN WONG, THE UK CHARGE D'AFFAIRES, AND A MEMBER OF HER STAFF. THEY DISCUSSED THE IMPACT OF THE REVISED MANDATE ON UNAMIR'S REDUCED CAPABILITIES AS WELL AS THE LATEST SITUATION REGARDING REGIONAL SECURITY.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTL TO MUHURA COMMUNE MET THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO COMPLAINED OF LACK OF OFFICE EQPT, TRANSPORT AND WATER FACILITIES IN THE AREA. HAC INFORMED.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 14 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) AT KAYONZA GR 5789 A FEMALE LURED SIX KIDS INTO A ROOM AND LOCKED THEM UP. SHE THEN BEAT THEM WITH OBJECTS INCLUDING A KNIFE AND A STICK WHICH RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF ONE WHILE FOUR OTHERS WERE LEFT WITH MULTIPLE INJURIES. ONE CHILD MANAGED TO ESCAPE UNHURT. GHANBATT ARRESTED THE ASSAILANT WHO IS BELIEVED TO BE MENTALLY ILL AND HANDED HER OVER TO RPA.

(3) UNHCR REP AND ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED BARE DPs CAMP TO CONFIRM PREPARATION FOR RECEPTION OF DPs FROM BURUNDI.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 25 LOCALS IN AOR.

D. SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTL TO NYAKAHINGA GR 3468 REPORTED THAT LOCALS IN THE AREA LIVE IN FEAR DUE TO INCESSANT ARRESTS BY RPA.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 13 LOCALS IN AOR.

E. SECTOR 3B (MALICOY). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

F. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ICRC HELD A COORDINATING MEETING AT RWAMIKO WITH THE BOURGEMESTER. DISCUSSION CENTRED ON POSSIBLE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO LOCALS.

(2) A BROWN AND ROOT LOCAL WORKER WAS REPORTED MISSING ON 10 JUN 95. EARLIER ON RPA SOLDIERS WERE SAID TO HAVE CONFISCATED ALL HIS PROPERTY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS. MILOB AND HR INFORMED.

(3) PTL TO BUSOGO GR 4828 REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL AUTH ARRESTED ONE LOCAL FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

(4) PROVIDED TWO VEHS TO TRANSPORT MATERIALS FROM RUHENGARI TO OTHER PARTS OF THE SECTOR.

(5) RPA BN COMD AND AN RPA OPS OFFR FROM KIGALI VISITED BN HQ. THE TEAM WANTED TO KNOW WHEN TUNBATT WOULD BE LEAVING THE COUNTRY. NO POSITIVE ANSWER WAS GIVEN. THEY WERE REFERRED TO UNAMIR HQ.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 111 LOCALS IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 134 IDPS WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES. 124 IDPS STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(3) ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOT WATER TANKER FOR NIGHT SHIFT DUTIES.

(4) TWO RPA DENTAL OFFICERS VISITED INDBATT DENTAL CLINIC TO STUDY THE EQUIPMENT HELD IN LOC FOR PROCUREMENT OF SIMILAR EQUIPMENT FROM INDIA.

(5) DEPLOYED RRF IN RESPONSE TO CALL FROM UNHCR WHERE THEY REPORTED THAT THEY HAD HEARD CRIES OF SOME CHILDREN IN A BUILDING 50 METRES FROM UNHCR BUILDING. RRF FOUND THT THERE WAS NOTHING SERIOUS AND THEY REPORTED BACK TO BASE.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 30 UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF IN AOR.

K. MILOB GP.

(1) POLITICAL. SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT SOME RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS FROM THE MINISTRY OF INTERNAL

AFFAIRS TODAY ATTENDED THE HOME VISITING PROGRAMME OF REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI ORGANISED BY UNHCR TO KIGAYI COMMUNE (8498).

(2) BORDERS.

(A) THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC:

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO.

III. REMERA AND AKABUGA.

IV. KANYARU-HAUTE AND KANYARU-BAS.

(B) GISENYI AND RUSIZI I AND II BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS ON THE ZAIREAN SIDE.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NSTR.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) UNICEF DISTRIBUTED 30 TONS OF FLOUR IN GASHORA COMMUNE. LWF DISTRIBUTED FOOD ITEMS TO 7,000 PEOPLE AT RWINKWAVU SECTEUR. UNHCR SUPPLIED WATER TO ISAR KARAMA TRANSIT CAMP (2349). IRC BUILT TWO PLASTIC SHELTERS AT GASHORA TRANSIT CAMP TO ACCOMMODATE OVER 500 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI AND OXFAM PROVIDED FOUR HAND-PUMP EQUIPMENT FOR WATER TO REHABILITATE BROKEN DOWN PUMPS AT RWINKWAVU.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA VISITED THE SECTOR COMMANDER TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF STOLEN VEHICLES. HE PROMISED TO TRANSMIT TO HIS SUPERIORS A SUGGESTED SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM.

(C) A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WENT TO BULINGA COMMUNE (6679). THE BOURGMESTRE MET THE TEAM AND REQUESTED AID IN THE FIELDS OF HEALTH, HOUSING, WATER AND EDUCATION. SOME INMATES OF THE COMMUNE PRISON COMPLAINED TO THE HR MONITORS THAT

THEY HAVE NOT BEEN INTERVIEWED BY THE PROSECUTOR AND THAT THEY WERE ALWAYS BEATEN BY THE SOLDIERS DURING INTERROGATION. HR PROMISED TO TAKE THE MATTER UP.

(D) HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM VISITED GITARAMA PRISON AND REPORTED THAT THERE WERE 6,840 INMATES. TWENTY-TWO WERE HOSPITALIZED AT THE MSF HOSPITAL AT KABGAYI. THE MORTALITY RATE IS HIGH AND STANDS AT APPROXIMATELY 28 PER WEEK. THERE IS A FOOT INFECTION WHICH CAUSED MANY INMATES TO HAVE THEIR LEGS AMPUTATED AND ALSO AN EAR INFECTION WHICH CAUSED MANY INMATES TO LOSE THEIR HEARING. THERE HAS BEEN NO RELEASES OF LATE AND THE AUTHORITIES ARE IGNORING THE PLIGHT OF THE INMATES. THE EXTENSION WORK IN THE PRISON IS AT AN ADVANCED STAGE.

(E) REF YESTERDAY'S SITREP, MILOB INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE 5 PEOPLE REPORTED KILLED IN MAHAMBE SECTEUR (1854) WERE A HUTU RETURNEE FAMILY. THEY WERE KILLED BY TUTSI RETURNEES AND NOT RPA OR CROSS-BORDER RAIDERS AS REPORTED. ALSO THE TEACHER AND HIS SEVEN PUPILS WERE NOT FOUND AT THE GITARAMA PRISON WHEN HUMAN RIGHTS INVESTIGATED. EFFORTS TO LOCATE THEM CONTINUE.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO AKABUGA (4988) AND REMERA (4289) INDICATED THAT LOCALS CLAIMED THAT RPA INTENDS TO ARREST ALL MALES AGED BETWEEN 18 AND 40. SOME MALES ARE REPORTEDLY FLEEING TO BURUNDI AND ZAIRE. OTHERWISE SITUATION WAS REPORTED CALM.

(C) ANOTHER PATROL WENT TO MUSEBEYA (4038) AND MUKO (3742) COMMUNES. THEY WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT THEIR RELATIONS WITH THE RPA HAD IMPROVED.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THERE IS AN INFLUX OF RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI THROUGH KANYARU-BAS BORDER POST REPORTEDLY DUE TO UNSTABLE SITUATION IN THE NGOZI PROVINCE OF BURUNDI.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 85 IDPS WERE STILL AT THE BUTARE WAY STATION AWAITING TRANSPORTATION



TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(D) SECTOR MILOBS CONVEYED USED CLOTHES, BLANKETS, SOAP, COOKING UTENSILS, JERRY CANS, MATTRESSES AND BISCUITS DONATED BY ICRC TO NYAZA AND SAINT ANTOINE ORPHANAGES.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. REPORTED THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED CALM. LOCALS IN NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR ARE GETTING MORE TENSE DUE TO THE BEGINNING OF THE WITHDRAWAL OF NON-ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF NGOS IN THAT AREA.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CARRIED OUT A HELI PATROL TO KIBILIRA (5685) AND A HELI RECCE OF THE GISHWATE FOREST. AT KIBILIRA, THE SECRETARY TO THE BOURGMESTRE INFORMED MILOBS OF TWO ROBBERY/MURDER CASES THAT HAPPENED ON 24 MAY AND 04 JUN 95. SIX PERSONS WERE KILLED IN BOTH CASES. THE SECRETARY COMPLAINED THAT THE AREA DID NOT RECEIVE FOOD AID SINCE MARCH AND THE LOCAL CLINIC LACKED DRUGS AND QUALIFIED PERSONNEL.

(C) THE RECCE OF GISHWATE FOREST INVESTIGATED RUMOUR THAT THERE WAS A SIGNIFICANT MOV OF IDPS INTO THAT AREA. NO NEW SETTLEMENTS OR INDICATION OF SUCH MOVEMENT WAS FOUND.

(D) THE COLLEGE RELOCATION CENTRE IN THE SECTOR WOULD BE EMPTIED COMMENCING 16 JUN 95. THERE ARE OVER 3,000 RETURNEES IN THE CENTER NOW.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TRIED TO GET DETAILS OF THE ON-GOING BANDITRY REPORTED IN KANOMBE COMMUNE BUT COULD NOT OBTAIN ANY CONCRETE EVIDENCE. IT WAS ALLEGED THAT ARMED AND UNARMED ELEMENTS WITH IMITATIONS WEAPONS, HARASS LOCALS AT NIGHT. PATROLS ALSO SHOWED THE AUSTRALIAN MINE-CLEARING TEAM ONE HAND GRENADE AND ONE MORTAR GRENADE AT GR 113826 IN KICUKIRO.

(C) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT UNICEF DONATED A 1,500 LTR WATER BLADDER TO KICUKIRO PRIMARY SCHOOL.

IT WOULD BE INSTALLED TODAY AND FILLED EACH OTHER DAY BY A WATER TANKER FROM TRAFIPRO.

- (1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.
- (2) CONTINUED DOZER WORK FOR IMPROVEMENT OF ROAD IN BUTARE.

O. UN MP COY. THERE WERE TWO ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 600 TOYOTA LAND CRUISER AND UNAMIR 4031 CHEVROLET. ALSO TWO THEFT CASES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD. A CASE OF ATTEMPTED THEFT WAS ALSO REPORTED IN BUTARE. MPs RESPONDED AND THE THIEVES RAN AWAY.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT AT RUNDA PRISON THE NUMBER OF INMATES HAD RISEN TO 135 WITH POOR SANITARY CONDITIONS. HR INFORMED.

C. THE RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS PREPARING GROUNDS FOR THE GRADUATION CEREMONY OF STUDENTS WHO HAD RECENTLY COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING. ALSO PREPARATION OF HANDOUT IN ENGLISH LESSONS IS IN PROGRESS.

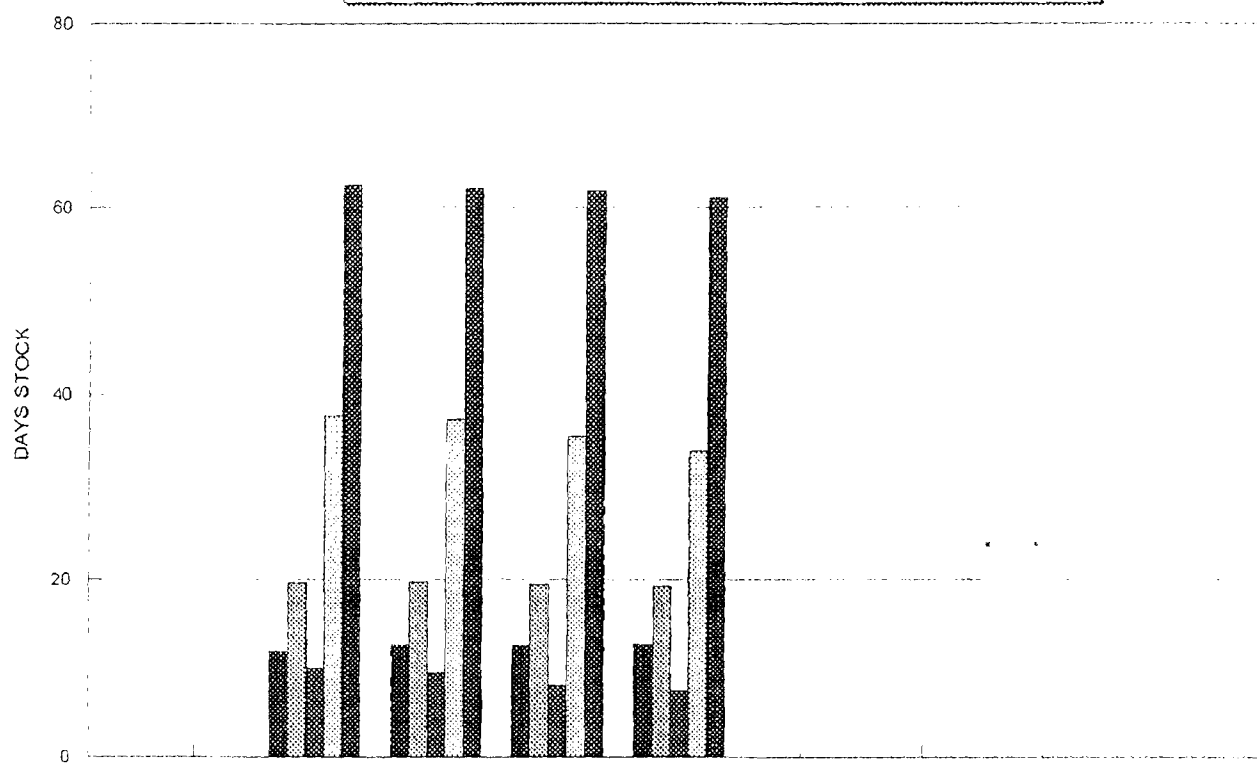

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs:

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 9 JUNE, THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED RESOLUTION 997 (1995) MODIFYING UNAMIR'S MANDATE AND EXTENDING IT UNTIL 8 DECEMBER 1995.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, ENDED HIS TWO-DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI WHERE HE HELD TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS AND VISITED A RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMP. THE PRIME MINISTER STATED IN AN

INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED BETWEEN THE TWO GOVERNMENTS; RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WOULD VISIT THE RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS IN BURUNDI TO URGE THE ESTIMATED 200,000 RWANDESE REFUGEES LOCATED THERE TO RETURN HOME.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA PAID A VISIT TO GISENYI ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER WHERE, IN A PUBLIC SPEECH, HE URGED RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES TO RETURN HOME. IN HIS ADDRESS, HE ALSO CONDEMNED RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMMITTING ACTS OF INSECURITY IN THE COUNTRY.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, BEGAN A VISIT TO BURUNDI ON THURSDAY 8 JUNE. HIS TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS REPORTEDLY CENTRED ON THE ISSUE OF SECURITY ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDER, AND ON BILATERAL RELATIONS AS A WHOLE. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF BURUNDI, RWANDA AND ZAIRE WERE EXPECTED TO MEET TO DISCUSS BORDER SECURITY.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

##### (1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ENGAGED BANDITS WHO CAME FROM ZAIRE AND MANAGED TO ARREST 8 OF THEM WITH ONE BOAT AROUND ISHARA GR 0145 AND NIGOMA GR 9637.

(B) IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED ELEVEN HUTU MEN AT MURAMBA GR 2055 FOR NO KNOWN REASON. THESE MEN ARE HELD AT NGOMA PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(C) SECTOR 4C MILOBS, REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ON THE NIGHT OF 03 JUN 95, HARASSED LOCALS AND FORCED THEM TO CLOSE THEIR SHOPS AND BARS AT 1800HRS INSTEAD OF THE NORMAL TIME OF 2000 HRS. IT IS FURTHER ALLEGED THAT THEY WENT TO SOME HOUSES AND ASKED TO IDENTIFY RESIDENTS BY THEIR TRIBES. THIS HAS CAUSED PANIC AMONG THE INHABITANTS OF BUGARAMA CITY (9002) WHERE IT HAPPENED.

(D) IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ARE ARRESTING LOCALS IN MUHIRA GR 4185. ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 14 MAY 95, A GROUP OF MEN WERE ARRESTED BY RPA IN GOMA GR 2061 AND WERE TAKEN TO KIGALI CLAIMING THAT THEY WERE MEMBERS OF FRGF.

LOCALS IN THE AREA ARE LIVING IN FEAR OF ARRESTS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(E) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT 3 ARMED MEN, TWO IN UNIFORM AND ONE IN PLAIN CLOTHES STOLE ONE UNICEF VEH NO- 090 FROM THEIR HOUSE. TEAM FROM SENBATT AND THE MILITARY POLICE AT LOCATION PTL THE AREA TO LOOK FOR THE VEH. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

(F) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT IN THE EARLY MORNING OF 8 JUN 95, RPA WAS INVOLVED IN A FIRE EXCHANGE WITH ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE AT GR 0545. TWO RPA SOLDIERS WERE INJURED.

(G) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED ONE LOCAL FROM KARAGO GR 4518 ON 6 JUN 95 FOR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE.

(H) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT RPA IS MAINTAINING STRICT SECURITY ALL ALONG THE BUTARE TOWN. THEY HAVE ALSO INCREASED THEIR STRENGTH ALONG THE BORDER WITH BURUNDI AND ZAIRE. CIVPOL ON LOCATION REPORTED THAT TWO ROBBED VEH (UNHCR) WERE SEEN PROVIDING ESCORT TO THE VICE PRESIDENT.

(I) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA WERE STILL SEARCHING ALL UNAMIR VEHS IN TRANSIT UNDER THE PRETEXT THAT IN THE PAST VEHS HAD BEEN USED TO TRANSPORT ARMS AND AMMO FOR FRGF. THEY WERE ALSO USED TO FERRY ESCAPED PRISONERS.

(J) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS WERE SEEN IN A UNICEF TOYOTA PICK-UP WITHOUT REGISTRATION NUMBER AND WITH UNICEF LOGO PROVIDING ESCORTS FOR VIPS ON THEIR WAY TO GIKONGORO.

(K) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS SHOT DEAD A MAN AT ISHARA (0142) AT 102200 B JUN 95 ON ALLEGATIONS THAT HE INTENDED SMUGGLING HIS BROTHER'S WIFE TO IJWI ISLAND.

(2) **FRGF**

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ABOUT 2400HRS 7 JUN 95 UNKNOWN ARMED ELEMENTS WHO WORE FACE MASKS LOOTED 95,000 RWF AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS FROM TWO LOCALS AROUND NYARUSHASHI GR 8522. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE WITH THE STOLEN ITEMS.

(B) SECTOR 4C MILOB REPORTED THAT IN THE NYAKIBINGO GR 0340 A GROUP OF BANDITS CAME IN AND ROBBED 2 HOUSES WITH MONEY FROM OTHERS. THEY MADE

THEIR ESCAPE BY A BOAT ANCHORED AT GR 026425 AND APPEARED TO HAVE REJOINED IJWI ISLAND.

(C) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT AT RUGANO SECTOR GR 1141 A GROUP OF BANDITS CAME WITH LOCALS TO THE HOUSES OF ONE LOCAL. THEY ACCUSED HIS WIFE, A TUTSI, OF BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ARREST OF MOST HUTUS IN GATARE COMMUNE AND MACHETED HER TO DEATH. HER HUSBAND WAS SEVERELY BEATEN AND ALSO MACHETED BUT HE SURVIVED AND EVACUATED TO KIRAMBO HOSPITAL.

(3) MILITIA NTR.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) THE FC CONSULTED WITH HIS SENIOR MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF ON A NUMBER OF CURRENT ISSUES. HE WAS ALSO INTERVIEWED BY MR KEN HERRON OF WORLD-WIDE TELEVISION NEWS FROM NAIROBI. THEIR MEETING CENTRED ON THE UPCOMING RENEWAL OF MANDATE AND WHAT A SMALLER UNAMIR MIGHT BE ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH IN RWANDA. THE GENERAL STATED THAT UNAMIR WILL BE STRUCTURED TO SUPPORT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA IN WHATEVER CAPACITY THEY COULD AGREE TO.

(B) THE FC MET WITH TWO RWANDA GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS FROM THE OFFICES OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT. THEY SOUGHT THE MEETING TO RESOLVE THE GOVERNMENT'S LATEST UNILATERAL ACTION WITH RESPECT TO HELICOPTER FLIGHT AUTHORIZATION. THE FC ADVISED THEM THAT THE SERVICE PROVIDED WAS QUOTE "A FAVOUR" UNQUOTE AND SHOULD BE TREATED APPROPRIATELY. DISMISSING THEM, HE SUGGESTED THEY RESOLVE THEIR POSITION BECAUSE HE WAS CANCELLING ALL SUPPORT UNTIL THE PROBLEM WAS RESOLVED TO HIS SATISFACTION. LATER, THE POLITICAL OFFICER FROM THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE ADVISED THE COS THAT ALL MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON UNAMIR FLIGHTS WOULD BE REMOVED FORTHWITH.

(D) THE FC MET WITH GERMAN AMBASSADOR, HUMMEL AND AMBASSADOR TO THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION, ACHIM KRATZ. THEY DISCUSSED SECURITY PROBLEMS IN RWANDA AND THE EFFECTS OF A REDUCED MANDATE FOR UNAMIR.

(E) IN THE AFTERNOON OF 6 JUN 95, THE FC MET WITH AN AUSTRALIAN DELEGATION FROM THEIR PERMANENT MISSION TO UN HQ NEW YORK. THE FC COMMENDED COL PRICKET FOR THE EXCELLENT SERVICE THE TWO

AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENTS HAVE PROVIDED UNAMIR. LATER, HE MET WITH THE CAO AND HIS EQUIVALENT FROM UN HQ IN NAIROBI. THIS MEETING AND A LATER ONE WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WERE TO DEVELOP STRATEGIES TO SOLVE A NUMBER OF ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEMS RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE AND HOUSING.

(F) THE FC IN HIS ROLE AS ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH THE CAO, HIS CONTRACTS STAFF AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM ECONOMAT TO ESTABLISH AN AMENDMENT TO THE SOMA WHICH WOULD EXTEND TO ALL UNAMIR CONTRACTORS THE SAME PRIVILEGES OF TAX AND DUTY FREE PASSAGE AS THOSE ACCORDED TO ALL UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(G) WITH THE NEW MANDATE RECEIVED ON 11 JUN 95, THE FC SPENT THE DAY WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF DEVELOPING AN IMPLEMENTATION PLAN WHICH WOULD SEE THE FORCE SHRINK FROM ALMOST 6,000 MILITARY TO ONLY 2,330 BY OCTOBER 95.

(J) AS THE ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, HE ALSO MET WITH HIS POLITICAL AND LEGAL STAFF TO EXAMINE SEVERAL AREAS OF CONCERN RELATING TO THE MODALITIES OF NEGOTIATING CHANGES IN THE CURRENT SOMA WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(A) PTL MET THE HEADMASTER OF EGUSE EPSICOPAL SCHOOL WHO CONFIRMED A NUMBER OF TEACHING MATERIALS WERE RECEIVED FROM AIDE ACTION AND SOS (NGOs).

(B) PTL TO BUGARAMA CLINIC REPORTED THAT A GERMAN NGO SPONSORED BY MALTESER SUPPLIED THE CLINIC WITH 9 BEDS, 9 BLANKETS AND 9 MATTRESSES. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT 100 WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE ATTENDED TO FOR VARIOUS DISEASES.

(C) EOD TEAM REPAIRED A DAMAGED CULVERT ON BYUMBA WATER WORKS ROAD.

(D) THE DFC PAID A FAREWELL VISIT.

(E) MED STAFF TREATED 590 LOCALS IN AOR.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(A) PROVIDED 3 VEHS TO WFP DURING THE DISTRIBUTION OF RELIEF ITEMS IN KIBUNGO, KIGALI AND KIGARAMA.

(B) A 9-MAN DELEGATION LED BY A REP FROM THE

OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED RILIMA TO ASSESS THE SY SITUATION IN RILIMA PRISON.

(B) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 46 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(A) THREE SINGLE SHOTS WERE HEARD FIRED IN THE DIRECTION OF KANOMBE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, KIGALI, RUNWAY SIDE AT 2357 HRS ON 03 JUN 95.

(B) DFC VISITED INDBATT 05 JUN 95. HE ADDRESSED ALL RANKS IN A DURBAR AND LATER HAD LUNCH WITH TROOPS.

(C) FIVE SINGLE SHOTS AND FIVE TO SIX ROUNDS FIRED IN ONE BURST WERE HEARD IN THE DIRECTION OF MILOBS GP HQ BETWEEN 080500HRS AND 080145HRS.

(D) PROVIDED ESCORTS TO INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL TEAM WHICH VISITED KIBUYE BY HELICOPTER AND A BROWN AND ROOT WATER TANKER FOR NIGHT SHIFT DUTIES.

(E) PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON TO ASSIST IN ADMINISTRATION DUTIES OF THE PRISON.

(F) SOUNDS OF 10 SINGLE SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF MILOBS GP HQ AT 1920HRS ON 10 JUN 95. PATROL DESPATCHED TO THE LOCATION HAD NOTHING UNUSUAL TO REPORT.

(A) POLITICAL.

(I) MILOB FROM SECTOR 3 REPORTED THAT A MEETING WAS HELD AT MUKURA GR 425723 ADDRESSED BY BOURGE- MASTER OF MABANZA COMMUNE ON 03 JUN 95. HE URGED PEOPLE TO WORK TOGETHER AND ESCHEW TRIBALISM.

(II) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT A COMBINED MILOB/HR/ UN POLITICAL OFFR TEAM ATTENDED THE REBURIAL OF THE VICTIMS OF THE

GENOCIDE AT RUBAYA IN THE GASEKE COMMUNE.

(III) SECTOR 4B REPORTED ON 8 JUN 95 THAT THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND DEFENCE MINISTER MAJ GEN PAUL KIGAME PASSED THROUGH BUTARE ON HIS WAY TO BURUNDI BY ROAD.

(IV) THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF RWANDA VISITED GIKONGORO PREFECTURE. HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE PRIME MINISTER AND TEN OTHER MINISTERS. HE SPOKE TO A CROWD FOR NEARLY THREE HOURS ANSWERING QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE. SPEECH CENTRED MOSTLY ON RECONCILIATION AND PRAISE FOR THE EFFORTS AND INITIATIVE OF THE POPULACE.

II. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO GATUNA (0143) AND KAGITUMBA (5184) BORDER POSTS AS WELL AS MUHURA (2908) RUTONGO (0493) AND MUKARANGE (0831) COMMUNES. SITUATION WAS CALM. PATROLS LOCATED SOME EXPLOSIVES/AMMO AT NAGAHANGA SECONDARY SCHOOL (2420). NIBATT EOD TEAM WILL INSPECT TOMORROW.

(III) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF NGOS ARE PROVIDING ASSISTANCE IN THE FORM OF STATIONERY, BUILDING MATERIALS, TECHNIQUES (AGRIC) AND HEALTH SERVICES TO MUHURA, MURAMBI, MUKARANGE AND RUTUNGO COMMUNES IN THEIR SECTOR.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO.

I. GERMAN AGRO ACTION (NGO) DISTRIBUTED COOKING MATERIALS TO FAMILIES AT KUKABOYE SECTURE OF MUGESERA COMMUNE SQ 4764. THEY HAVE COVERED 714 FAMILIES AND INTENDS TO COVER 2,500 FAMILIES IN MUGESERA COMMUNE.

II. PTL TO SAKE SQ 4354 REPORTED THAT THERE IS A BROKEN BRIDGE AT GR 265562 PREVENTING VEHICULAR MOVEMENT BETWEEN SAKE SQ 4354 AND GASHORA GR 2655. FORCE ENGRS INFORMED.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

I. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT A PATROL TO KIGOMA COMMUNE (7649) REVEALED THAT THERE WERE 1,550 WIDOWS AND 1,641 ORPHANS. THIS EXPLAINS THE ACUTE SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND OTHER SUPPLIES IN MOST OF THE COMMUNES IN THE SECTOR. IN SPITE OF NUMEROUS REPORTS, NO CONCRETE STEP HAS BEEN TAKEN BY ANY ORGANISATION TO ASSIST THE PEOPLE.

II. THE BOURGMESTRE OF RUNDA (9882) REQUESTED UNAMIR TO APPROACH THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FOR QUICK ESTABLISHMENT OF THE JUDICIAL TRIBUNAL SO THAT PRISONERS HELD ON MERE SUSPICION OF HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE COULD BE TRIED AND RELEASED IF NOTHING IS FOUND AGAINST THEM. THIS IS TO HELP EASE THE CURRENT CONGESTION IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

III. MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS CONDUCTED A JOINT PTL TO CACHOT COMMUNE AT TAMBWE COMMUNE SQ 7653. TEAM WAS REFUSED ENTRY TO THE COMMUNE. THE REASON WAS THAT THE RPA COMD ON LOC HAS SOME DIFFERENCE WITH THE HUMAN RIGHTS MEMBER.

IV. THE SECTOR COMMANDER, MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS AND REPS OF AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL VISITED MUKINGI (7160) AND RUGOGWE SECTEUR WHERE THEY ATTENDED A PUBLIC MEETING BY THE LOCAL CONSEILLER. MEETING CENTRED ON SECURITY MATTERS.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. THE FC VISITED ZAMBATT HQ AND MILOBS WERE PRESENT. AFTER THE CO ZAMBATT'S BRIEFING, THE SECTOR COMMANDER BRIEFED THE FC ON MILOB ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. PTL WITH FORCE ENGR COY TO SURVEY DAMAGE ROADS AROUND BUTARE IDENTIFIED FIVE ROADS AS PRIORITY FOR REPAIRS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) BUTARE - NGOMA - KIBEHO RD.
- (2) HUYE SUBSIDIARY ROAD.
- (3) CYARWA SUBSIDIARY RD.
- (4) SUBWAY STATION LIBRARY RD.
- (5) ROMAN CATHEDRAL RD.

II. THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED CALM. THERE IS A MARKED INCREASE IN VEHICLE THEFT AND ARMED ROBBERY IN BUTARE TOWNSHIP AND NEARBY AREAS.

(III) RED CROSS IN BUTARE DONATED 200 BLANKETS TO DON BOSCO ORPHANAGE AT NYANZA IN NYABISINDU GR 7138.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.

I. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROL AT NYAMASHEKE SQ 9841, KIRAMBO SQ 0444, MURAZA SQ 0745 AND MATABA SQ 0942. THE SITUATION WAS FOUND RELATIVELY UNSTABLE. ON 02 JUN 95 A LARGE GROUP OF BANDITS MOVED IN THROUGH NYAMASHEKE AND THEN DIVIDING THEM INTO TWO GROUPS, ONE GROUP WENT TOWARDS KIRAMBO SQ 0444 AND OTHER GROUP WENT TOWARDS BUSHENKERI SQ 9832. NO ACT OF BANDITRY WAS REPORTED. THE STRENGTH OF THE GROUP IS UNKNOWN. ON 03 JUN ANOTHER GROUP OF BANDITS CAME IN AND RAN INTO THE AMBUSH BY RPA AT BUSHENKERI. TWO BANDITS WERE KILLED AND TWO AUTOMATIC WEAPONS WERE CAPTURED WITH ONE WOUNDED BANDIT. IN THE MEANTIME, IN MURAZA SQ 0745, AT ABOUT 032300HRS A BIG GROUP OF BANDITS DRESSED IN UNIFORM ROBBED MANY HOUSES. THEY ALSO MACHETTED A MAN TO DEATH AND WOUNDED

HIS 13-YEAR-OLD SON. SEVERAL CATTLE WERE TAKEN TO IJWI IN MANY BOATS. THE LOCAL RPA 2IC AND HIS OFFERS VISITED NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR IN ORDER TO ASSESS THE DEPLOYMENT AND THE STRENGTH OF THEIR TROOPS AS WELL AS THE ABOVE-MENTIONED INCIDENT.

II. MILOB TEAM FROM THE CYANGUGU SUB SECTOR WITNESSED THE HANDOVER OF HEHEALTH EQUIPMENT TO THE LOCALS IN BUSHENGE AND THE PREFECTURE MEDICAL AUTHORITIES.

III. IN THE NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR, FEARS OF INSECURITY IS GRIPPING THE LOCALS AS NEWS OF ETHIOBATT WITHDRAWAL IS KNOWN. MILOBS ASSESS THERE COULD BE ANOTHER MASS EXODUS TO ZAIRE IF WITHDRAWAL IS NOT COORDINATED AND ASSURANCE GIVEN TO THE POPULATION.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. MILOBS WERE INFORMED OF RPA HARASSMENT AND ARREST OF LOCALS IN NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE IN BUCIRA CELLULE. HUMAN RIGHTS REP HAS BEEN INFORMED ACCORDINGLY.

II. MILOBS PATROLS FROM GISENYI TO RWERERE(2822), THE BORDER POST AND MUTURA (5243). AN UNEXPLODED BOMB WAS FOUND AT GR 274231. RPA LO HAS BEEN INFORMED FOR NECESSARY ACTION. THE BOURGMESTRE OF RWERERE ALSO REPORTED A MURDER THAT TOOK PLACE LAST NIGHT. HUMAN RIGHTS HAVE BEEN INFORMED.

III. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE WFP ADMINISTRATOR WAS RAIDED YESTERDAY BY THREE ARMED MEN AT 2000 HRS. THEY LEFT WITH 240,000 FRW BELONGING TO THE ORGANISATION AND 82,000 FRW BELONGING TO THE ADMINISTRATOR. MATTER HAS BEEN REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE.

IV. THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT ATTENDED A RE-BURIAL CEREMONY OF THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE AT NYAUNDO. HR AND UNHCR TEAMS ATTENDED THE CEREMONY.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR AND OBSERVED THE SITUATION IN KIGALI CITY AND SUBURBS WAS REPORTED CALM. THERE IS A GENERAL FEAR OF INSECURITY BY NGO PERSONNEL DURING THE SILENT

HOURS ESPECIALLY IN KIGALI.

II. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT PAM DISTRIBUTED SEEDS AND TOOLS AT KACYIRU SECTEUR OFFICE (093863) TODAY. ABOUT 1,000 LOCALS BENEFITTED. ALSO, KICUKIRO PRIMARY SCHOOL REQUIRES ASSISTANCE FOR WATER FOR DRINKING AND WASHING. THE DIRECTOR ASKED FOR 10 EMPTY BARRELS TO STORE WATER FOR USE BY THE 3,200 PUPILS.

III. MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE AFRAID TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF NEW ID CARD SYSTEM IN RWANDA.

- (C) CONTINUED DOZER WORK AT NSINDA PRISON.
- (D) DFC PAID A FAREWELL VISIT TO THE COY.
- (E) DEPLOYED EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER IN COMMUNICATION COMPOUND.
- (F) DEPLOYED DOZER FOR IMPROVEMENT OF ROAD IN KANOMBE COMMUNE.
- (G) COMMENCED REPAIR OF ROADS IN BUTARE.

(A). INVESTIGATED THEFT OF ONE TOOL BOX AT COMMUNICATION COMPOUND IN KIGALI ON 21 MAY 95. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(B) INVESTIGATED TWO ACCIDENTS WHICH OCCURRED IN KIGALI INVOLVING TWO UNAMIR VEHS. BOTH VEHICLES WERE SLIGHTLY DAMAGED.

(C) THERE WERE THREE CASES OF UNAMIR AND NGO VEH THEFTS WHICH WERE REPORTED IN BUTAE. ALL REPORTED ROBBERIES WERE CARRIED OUT BY LOCALS IN RPA UNIFORMS AND THEY WERE ARMED. THERE WAS ALSO AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY BY SOME LOCALS IN THE RESIDENCE OF MP PERSONNEL IN KIGALI. THIS WAS FOILED.

(D) UNAMIR CASHIER, MR HUDSON MBBUYA, WHOSE MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE WAS FIRST NOTICED AT NOON WHEN HE DID NOT RETURN TO HIS DESK AFTER LUNCH, LATER EMERGED AT ABOUT 2030 HRS VISIBLY SHAKEN, UNKEMPT AND RUFFLED, HE SAID THAT ON HIS WAY TO HIS RESIDENCE AROUND CHEZ LANDO, THREE UNKNOWN MEN, IN CIVIL, WHO PRETENDED TO BE EFFECTING REPAIRS ON A MINI-BUS, ACCOSTED HIM AND ORDERED HIM TO ENTER THE MINI-BUS. HE ALLEGED THAT ONE OF THE ASSAILANTS HIT HIM ON THE HEAD AND PUSHED HIM INSIDE THE BUS AND MADE HIM TO LAY ON THE FLOOR AND THEREAFTER THEY SCREECHED OFF TO AN UNKNOWN DESTINATION. HE FURTHER ALLEGED THAT HE WAS QUESTIONED FOR ABOUT THREE HOURS AND THEN COLLECTED HIS BUNCH OF KEYS, BELIEVED TO BE OFFICE AND SAFE KEYS FROM HIM. THEY WENT AWAY WITH THE KEYS, OSTENSIBLY TO OPEN AND CART AWAY MONIES IN THE SAFE, QUIETLY. THEIR PLAN FAILED. AN HOUR LATER, THEY RETURNED TO HIM WHERE HE WAS BEING HELD CAPTIVE TO TELL HIM THAT HE GAVE THEM THE WRONG KEYS. AFTER SOME MOMENT OF VACILLATION AMONGST HIS CAPTORS, HE SAID THAT THEY DROVE HIM BACK CLOSE TO HIS RESIDENCE AND GRUDGINGLY SET HIM FREE WITH A STRONG WARNING THAT HE SHOULD, FROM NOW ON, ALWAYS ENSURE THAT HE CARRIED ABOUT WITH HIM ENOUGH DOLLARS WHEREVER HE WENT, FAILURE TO DO SO, HE ALLEGED, HE WOULD BE KILLED. THE MATTER IS BEING INVESTIGATED.

(E) RECEIVED A REPORT OF THEFT OF UNAMIR 1004 FOUR RUNNER IN GITARAMA AT GUN POINT BY FIVE ARMED MEN BELIEVED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS ON 081910B JUN 95.

(F) RPA SOLDIERS AT A CHECK POINT IN REMERA,

KIGALI, ORDERED THE SEIZURE OF A TOYOTA LAND CRUISER NO 8026 BELONGING TO BELGIUM RED CROSS. THE SOLDIERS CLAIMED THE VEH WAS PROPERTY OF THEIR SENIOR OFFICER.

THE SECURITY SITUATION IN KIGALI WORSENEED WITH A SPATE OF VEHICLE THEFTS AND ARMED ROBBERIES DIRECTED AGAINST UN AND NGO PERSONNEL. VEHICLE HIJACKING RATE IN KIGALI AND GITARAMA ESPECIALLY HAVE BECOME ALARMINGLY HIGH. THIS ISSUE MUST BE DISCUSSED WITH THE RPA/GOVT ESPECIALLY IN LIGHT OF THE GOVT ACCEPTANCE OF THE SECURITY RESPONSIBILITY TO NGOS AND OTHER INTERNATIONALS IN THE COUNTRY AS PER THE THE NEW MANDATE.



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, ENDED HIS FOUR DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI ON SUNDAY 11 JUNE. IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED ON 9 JUNE, THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF RWANDA, BURUNDI AND ZAIRE AGREED TO SET UP JOINT PATROLS TO CONTROL THEIR COMMON BORDER AND TO TAKE OTHER MEASURES TO ELIMINATE ARMED GANGS, AS WELL AS TO PREVENT THE PROLIFERATION OF ARMS IN THE REGION. THEY HAVE REPORTEDLY SET UP A COMMISSION WHICH IS TO MEET ON A BIMONTHLY BASIS TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF SECURITY ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDERS. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THEY ALSO AGREED THAT THE CEPGL (COMMUNAUTE ECONOMIQUE DES PAYS DES GRANDS LACS) WOULD PROVIDE THE BASIS FOR RESOLVING THE REGION'S REFUGEE PROBLEMS.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT IN A PRESS CONFERENCE GIVEN IN BURUNDI, MAJOR GENERAL KAGAME REJECTED THE CREATION OF A SEPARATE HUTULAND AND TUTSILAND TO RESOLVE THE ETHNIC PROBLEMS IN RWANDA AND BURUNDI BY EXPLAINING THAT IT WAS NOT EVIDENT THAT TUTSIS FROM BURUNDI WOULD BE ABLE TO COEXIST PEACEFULLY WITH TUTSIS FROM RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT THE ETHNIC TWA MINORITY WERE OFTEN FORGOTTEN, AND THAT DIVISIONS WERE ALSO POSSIBLE WITHIN THE SAME ETHNIC GROUP, AS HAD OCCURRED UNDER THE FORMER REGIME IN RWANDA. HE ALSO DENIED BAD POLITICAL IDEOLOGIES HAD BEEN THE ONLY CONTRIBUTING FACTOR TO SUCH TENSIONS.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, AT A CABINET MEETING HELD ON FRIDAY 9 JUNE 95 IN KIGALI, THE RWANDESE CABINET ANNOUNCED THAT REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM CAMPS LOCATED IN BURUNDI WOULD VISIT RWANDA TO ASSES CONDITIONS IN RWANDA FOR THEIR SAFE RETURN HOME.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS AT MUMUNI AREA GR 4799 ARE HOLDING 03 RPA SOLDIERS IN CUSTODY FOR ALLEGEDLY GRABBING HERDS OF CATTLE FROM LOCALS. SUSPECTS WILL BE SENT TO KIGALI ON 13 JUN 95 FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS. RAMPANT THEFT OF CATTLE BY RPA IS ON AN INCREASE IN THE AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUE WITH PATROL AND MANNING OF CHECK POINTS AND PRISON THROUGH OUT THE SECTOR.

(3) IN SECTOR 1, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUES TO CONDUCT VEH AND FOOT PATROLS IN THE AOR BOTH BY DAY AND NIGHT. RPA CHECK POINT AT RUKUMO AND NYACYONGO ARE STILL ACTIVE.

(4) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 11 JUN 95, AT 1630 HRS, RPA SOLDIERS STOLE UNAMIR VEH NO - 1401 ON CHARGE TO MALICOY.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 11 JUN 95 A GROUP OF SEVEN ARMED BANDITS CAME FROM ZAIRE IN THE KIRANGA GR 8008. THE GROUP HAS STOLEN 67000 RFR FROM A LOCAL AND SEVERELY INJURED THE PERS WITH A GUN SHOT. HOWEVER THE PATROL COULD NOT LOCATE THE INJURED MAN. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE SAME GROUP STOLE A COW FROM ANOTHER MAN BEFORE INJURING HIM WITH GUN SHOT. THE INJURED IS ADMITTED AT GIHUNDWE HOSPITAL. THE BANDITS WENT BACK TO ZAIRE AFTER BEING IDENTIFIED BY LOCALS AS FORMER VILLAGERS OF THE KIRANGA AREA. THE NAMES OF THE BANDITS HAVE BEEN FORWARDED TO THE LOCAL RPA TROOPS.

HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 11 JUN 95, 3 ARMED LOCALS SUSPECTED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS HIJACKED A HUMAN RIGHT VEH AT GUN POINT AT RUE-AKAGERA AREA IN KIGALI. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

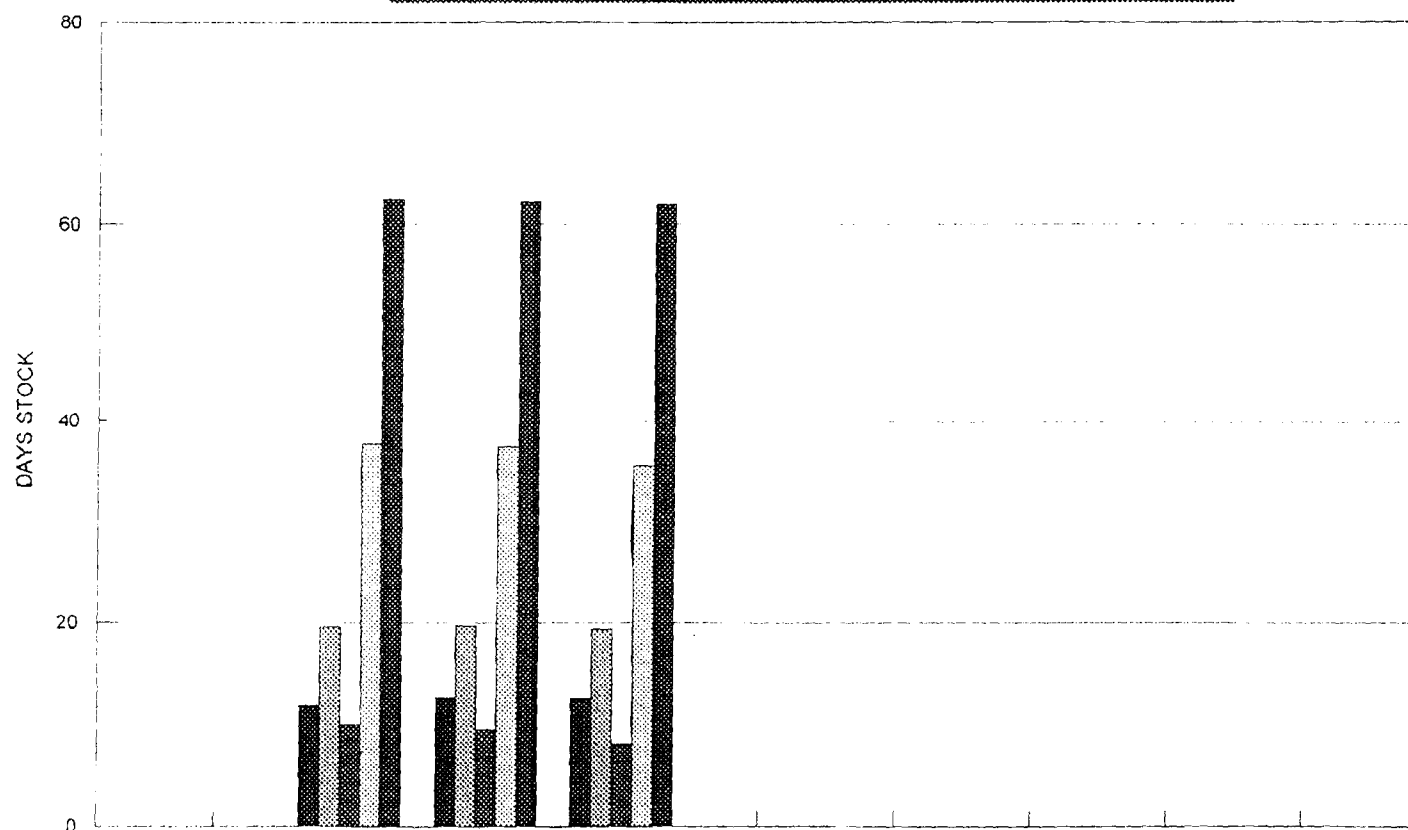

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs:

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 9 JUNE, THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED RESOLUTION 997 (1995) MODIFYING UNAMIR'S MANDATE AND EXTENDING IT UNTIL 8 DECEMBER 1995.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, ENDED HIS TWO-DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI WHERE HE HELD TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS AND VISITED A RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMP. THE PRIME MINISTER STATED IN AN

INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED BETWEEN THE TWO GOVERNMENTS, RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WOULD VISIT THE RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS IN BURUNDI TO URGE THE ESTIMATED 200,000 RWANDESE REFUGEES LOCATED THERE TO RETURN HOME.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA PAID A VISIT TO GISENYI ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER WHERE, IN A PUBLIC SPEECH, HE URGED RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES TO RETURN HOME. IN HIS ADDRESS, HE ALSO CONDEMNED RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMMITTING ACTS OF INSECURITY IN THE COUNTRY.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, BEGAN A VISIT TO BURUNDI ON THURSDAY 8 JUNE. HIS TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS REPORTEDLY CENTRED ON THE ISSUE OF SECURITY ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDER, AND ON BILATERAL RELATIONS AS A WHOLE. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF BURUNDI, RWANDA AND ZAIRE WERE EXPECTED TO MEET TO DISCUSS BORDER SECURITY.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ENGAGED BANDITS WHO CAME FROM ZAIRE AND MANAGED TO ARREST 8 OF THEM WITH ONE BOAT AROUND ISHARA GR 0145 AND NIGOMA GR 9637.

(B) IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED ELEVEN HUTU MEN AT MURAMBA GR 2055 FOR NO KNOWN REASON. THESE MEN ARE HELD AT NGOMA PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(C) SECTOR 4C MILOBS, REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ON THE NIGHT OF 03 JUN 95, HARASSED LOCALS AND FORCED THEM TO CLOSE THEIR SHOPS AND BARS AT 1800HRS INSTEAD OF THE NORMAL TIME OF 2000 HRS. IT IS FURTHER ALLEGED THAT THEY WENT TO SOME HOUSES AND ASKED TO IDENTIFY RESIDENTS BY THEIR TRIBES. THIS HAS CAUSED PANIC AMONG THE INHABITANTS OF BUGARAMA CITY (9002) WHERE IT HAPPENED.

(D) IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ARE ARRESTING LOCALS IN MUHIRA GR 4185. ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 14 MAY 95, A GROUP OF MEN WERE ARRESTED BY RPA IN GOMA GR 2061 AND WERE TAKEN TO KIGALI CLAIMING THAT THEY WERE MEMBERS OF FRGF.

LOCALS IN THE AREA ARE LIVING IN FEAR OF ARRESTS.  
HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(E) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT 3 ARMED MEN, TWO IN UNIFORM AND ONE IN PLAIN CLOTHES STOLE ONE UNICEF VEH NO- 090 FROM THEIR HOUSE. TEAM FROM SENBATT AND THE MILITARY POLICE AT LOCATION PTL THE AREA TO LOOK FOR THE VEH. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

(F) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT IN THE EARLY MORNING OF 8 JUN 95, RPA WAS INVOLVED IN A FIRE EXCHANGE WITH ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE AT GR 0545. TWO RPA SOLDIERS WERE INJURED.

(G) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED ONE LOCAL FROM KARAGO GR 4518 ON 6 JUN 95 FOR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE.

(H) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT RPA IS MAINTAINING STRICT SECURITY ALL ALONG THE BUTARE TOWN. THEY HAVE ALSO INCREASED THEIR STRENGTH ALONG THE BORDER WITH BURUNDI AND ZAIRE. CIVPOL ON LOCATION REPORTED THAT TWO ROBBED VEH (UNHCR) WERE SEEN PROVIDING ESCORT TO THE VICE PRESIDENT.

(I) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA WERE STILL SEARCHING ALL UNAMIR VEHS IN TRANSIT UNDER THE PRETEXT THAT IN THE PAST VEHS HAD BEEN USED TO TRANSPORT ARMS AND AMMO FOR FRGF. THEY WERE ALSO USED TO FERRY ESCAPED PRISONERS.

(J) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS WERE SEEN IN A UNICEF TOYOTA PICK-UP WITHOUT REGISTRATION NUMBER AND WITH UNICEF LOGO PROVIDING ESCORTS FOR VIPS ON THEIR WAY TO GIKONGORO.

(K) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS SHOT DEAD A MAN AT ISHARA (0142) AT 102200 B JUN 95 ON ALLEGATIONS THAT HE INTENDED SMUGGLING HIS BROTHER'S WIFE TO IJWI ISLAND.

(2) **FRGF**

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ABOUT 2400HRS 7 JUN 95 UNKNOWN ARMED ELEMENTS WHO WORE FACE MASKS LOOTED 95,000 RWF AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS FROM TWO LOCALS AROUND NYARUSHASHI GR 8522. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE WITH THE STOLEN ITEMS.

(B) SECTOR 4C MILOB REPORTED THAT IN THE NYAKIBINGO GR 0340 A GROUP OF BANDITS CAME IN AND ROBBED 2 HOUSES WITH MONEY FROM OTHERS. THEY MADE

THEIR ESCAPE BY A BOAT ANCHORED AT GR 026425 AND APPEARED TO HAVE REJOINED IJWI ISLAND.

(C) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT AT RUGANO SECTOR GR 1141 A GROUP OF BANDITS CAME WITH LOCALS TO THE HOUSES OF ONE LOCAL. THEY ACCUSED HIS WIFE , A TUTSI, OF BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ARREST OF MOST HUTUS IN GATARE COMMUNE AND MACHETED HER TO DEATH. HER HUSBAND WAS SEVERELY BEATEN AND ALSO MACHETED BUT HE SURVIVED AND EVACUATED TO KIRAMBO HOSPITAL.

(3) MILITIA NTR.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) THE FC CONSULTED WITH HIS SENIOR MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF ON A NUMBER OF CURRENT ISSUES. HE WAS ALSO INTERVIEWED BY MR KEN HERRON OF WORLD-WIDE TELEVISION NEWS FROM NAIROBI. THEIR MEETING CENTRED ON THE UPCOMING RENEWAL OF MANDATE AND WHAT A SMALLER UNAMIR MIGHT BE ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH IN RWANDA. THE GENERAL STATED THAT UNAMIR WILL BE STRUCTURED TO SUPPORT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA IN WHATEVER CAPACITY THEY COULD AGREE TO.

(B) THE FC MET WITH TWO RWANDA GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS FROM THE OFFICES OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT. THEY SOUGHT THE MEETING TO RESOLVE THE GOVERNMENT'S LATEST UNILATERAL ACTION WITH RESPECT TO HELICOPTER FLIGHT AUTHORIZATION. THE FC ADVISED THEM THAT THE SERVICE PROVIDED WAS QUOTE "A FAVOUR" UNQUOTE AND SHOULD BE TREATED APPROPRIATELY. DISMISSING THEM, HE SUGGESTED THEY RESOLVE THEIR POSITION BECAUSE HE WAS CANCELLING ALL SUPPORT UNTIL THE PROBLEM WAS RESOLVED TO HIS SATISFACTION. LATER, THE POLITICAL OFFICER FROM THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE ADVISED THE COS THAT ALL MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON UNAMIR FLIGHTS WOULD BE REMOVED FORTHWITH.

(D) THE FC MET WITH GERMAN AMBASSADOR, HUMMEL AND AMBASSADOR TO THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION, ACHIM KRATZ. THEY DISCUSSED SECURITY PROBLEMS IN RWANDA AND THE EFFECTS OF A REDUCED MANDATE FOR UNAMIR.

(E) IN THE AFTERNOON OF 6 JUN 95, THE FC MET WITH AN AUSTRALIAN DELEGATION FROM THEIR PERMANENT MISSION TO UN HQ NEW YORK. THE FC COMMENDED COL PRICKET FOR THE EXCELLENT SERVICE THE TWO

AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENTS HAVE PROVIDED UNAMIR. LATER, HE MET WITH THE CAO AND HIS EQUIVALENT FROM UN HQ IN NAIROBI. THIS MEETING AND A LATER ONE WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WERE TO DEVELOP STRATEGIES TO SOLVE A NUMBER OF ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEMS RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE AND HOUSING.

(F) THE FC IN HIS ROLE AS ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH THE CAO, HIS CONTRACTS STAFF AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM ECONOMAT TO ESTABLISH AN AMENDMENT TO THE SOMA WHICH WOULD EXTEND TO ALL UNAMIR CONTRACTORS THE SAME PRIVILEGES OF TAX AND DUTY FREE PASSAGE AS THOSE ACCORDED TO ALL UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(G) WITH THE NEW MANDATE RECEIVED ON 11 JUN 95, THE FC SPENT THE DAY WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF DEVELOPING AN IMPLEMENTATION PLAN WHICH WOULD SEE THE FORCE SHRINK FROM ALMOST 6,000 MILITARY TO ONLY 2,330 BY OCTOBER 95.

(J) AS THE ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, HE ALSO MET WITH HIS POLITICAL AND LEGAL STAFF TO EXAMINE SEVERAL AREAS OF CONCERN RELATING TO THE MODALITIES OF NEGOTIATING CHANGES IN THE CURRENT SOMA WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(A) PTLs MET THE HEADMASTER OF EGUSE EPSICOPAL SCHOOL WHO CONFIRMED A NUMBER OF TEACHING MATERIALS WERE RECEIVED FROM AIDE ACTION AND SOS (NGOs).

(B) PTL TO BUGARAMA CLINIC REPORTED THAT A GERMAN NGO SPONSORED BY MALTESER SUPPLIED THE CLINIC WITH 9 BEDS, 9 BLANKETS AND 9 MATTRESSES. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT 100 WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE ATTENDED TO FOR VARIOUS DISEASES.

(C) EOD TEAM REPAIRED A DAMAGED CULVERT ON BYUMBA WATER WORKS ROAD.

(D) THE DFC PAID A FAREWELL VISIT.

(E) MED STAFF TREATED 590 LOCALS IN AOR.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(A) PROVIDED 3 VEHS TO WFP DURING THE DISTRIBUTION OF RELIEF ITEMS IN KIBUNGO, KIGALI AND KIGARAMA.

(B) A 9-MAN DELEGATION LED BY A REP FROM THE

OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED RILIMA TO ASSESS THE SY SITUATION IN RILIMA PRISON.

(C) THIRD BATCH OF CADRE ON M113 APC ENDED.

(D) ASSISTED UNHCR PERS TO DELIVER WATER TO DPS FROM BURUNDI AT BARE GR 5449.

(E) MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 63 LOCALS IN AOR.

(4) SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY).

(A) PROVIDED VEHS TO TRANSPORT 50 ORPHANS FROM NGOMA GR 2159 TO ATTEND CELEBRATIONS IN KIBUYE IN COMMEMORATION OF AFRICA'S DAYS OF THE CHILDREN.

(B) THE DFC VISITED LOC TO BID FAREWELL TO THE TROOPS.

(C) MED STAFF TREATED 16 LOCALS IN AOR.

(D) PTL TO JARAMA GR 1353 REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE ARRESTED 10 LOCALS IN THE AREA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(5) SECTOR 3B (MALICOY).

(A) PROVIDED ONE VEH TO LWF TO TRANSPORT BUILDING MATERIALS FROM RUHANGO GR 7653 TO MUGINA GR 9267.

(B) PTL TO KARAMBA GR 8757 OBSERVED THE AREA DESERTED BY LOCALS, VERY FEW LOCALS WERE SEEN IN THE SECTOR.

(II) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT A COMBINED MILOB/HR/ UN POLITICAL OFFR TEAM ATTENDED THE REBURIAL OF THE VICTIMS OF THE

GENOCIDE AT RUBAYA IN THE GASEKE COMMUNE.

(III) SECTOR 4B REPORTED ON 8 JUN 95 THAT THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND DEFENCE MINISTER MAJ GEN PAUL KIGAME PASSED THROUGH BUTARE ON HIS WAY TO BURUNDI BY ROAD.

(IV) THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF RWANDA VISITED GIKONGORO PREFECTURE. HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE PRIME MINISTER AND TEN OTHER MINISTERS. II. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO GATUNA (0143) AND KAGITUMBA (5184) BORDER POSTS AS WELL AS MUHURA (2908) RUTONGO (0493) AND MUKARANGE (0831) COMMUNES. SITUATION WAS CALM. PATROLS LOCATED SOME EXPLOSIVES/AMMO AT NAGAHANGA SECONDARY SCHOOL (2420). NIBATT EOD TEAM WILL INSPECT TOMORROW.

(III) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF NGOS ARE PROVIDING ASSISTANCE IN THE FORM OF STATIONERY, BUILDING MATERIALS, TECHNIQUES (AGRIC) AND HEALTH SERVICES TO MUHURA, MURAMBI, MUKARANGE AND RUTUNGO COMMUNES IN THEIR SECTOR.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO.

I. GERMAN AGRO ACTION (NGO) DISTRIBUTED COOKING MATERIALS TO FAMILIES AT KUKABOYE SECTURE OF MUGESERA COMMUNE SQ 4764. THEY HAVE COVERED 714 FAMILIES AND INTENDS TO COVER 2,500 FAMILIES IN MUGESERA COMMUNE.

II. PTL TO SAKA SQ 4354 REPORTED THAT THERE IS A BROKEN BRIDGE AT GR 265562 PREVENTING VEHICULAR MOVEMENT BETWEEN SAKA SQ 4354 AND GASHORA GR 2655. FORCE ENGRS INFORMED.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

I. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT A PATROL TO KIGOMA COMMUNE (7649) REVEALED THAT THERE WERE 1,550 WIDOWS AND 1,641 ORPHANS. THIS EXPLAINS THE ACUTE SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND OTHER SUPPLIES IN MOST OF THE COMMUNES IN THE SECTOR. IN SPITE OF NUMEROUS REPORTS, NO CONCRETE STEP HAS BEEN TAKEN BY ANY ORGANISATION TO ASSIST THE PEOPLE.

II. THE BOURGMESTRE OF RUNDA (9882) REQUESTED UNAMIR TO APPROACH THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FOR QUICK ESTABLISHMENT OF THE JUDICIAL TRIBUNAL SO THAT PRISONERS HELD ON MERE SUSPICION OF HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE COULD BE TRIED AND RELEASED IF NOTHING IS FOUND AGAINST THEM. THIS IS TO HELP EASE THE CURRENT CONGESTION IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

III. MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS CONDUCTED A JOINT PTL TO CACHOT COMMUNE AT TAMBWE COMMUNE SQ 7653. TEAM WAS REFUSED ENTRY TO THE COMMUNE. THE REASON WAS THAT THE RPA COMD ON LOC HAS SOME DIFFERENCE WITH THE HUMAN RIGHTS MEMBER.

IV. THE SECTOR COMMANDER, MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS AND REPS OF AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL VISITED MUKINGI (7160) AND RUGOGWE SECTEUR WHERE THEY ATTENDED A PUBLIC MEETING BY THE LOCAL CONSEILLER. MEETING CENTRED ON SECURITY MATTERS.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. THE FC VISITED ZAMBATT HQ AND MILOBS WERE PRESENT. AFTER THE CO ZAMBATT'S BRIEFING, THE SECTOR COMMANDER BRIEFED THE FC ON MILOB ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. PTL WITH FORCE ENGR COY TO SURVEY DAMAGE ROADS AROUND BUTARE IDENTIFIED FIVE ROADS AS PRIORITY FOR REPAIRS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) BUTARE - NGOMA - KIBEHO RD.
- (2) HUYE SUBSIDIARY ROAD.
- (3) CYARWA SUBSIDIARY RD.
- (4) SUBWAY STATION LIBRARY RD.
- (5) ROMAN CATHEDRAL RD.

II. THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED CALM. THERE IS A MARKED INCREASE IN VEHICLE THEFT AND ARMED ROBBERY IN BUTARE TOWNSHIP AND NEARBY AREAS.

(III) RED CROSS IN BUTARE DONATED 200 BLANKETS TO DON BOSCO ORPHANAGE AT NYANZA IN NYABISINDU GR 7138.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.

I. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROL AT NYAMASHEKE SQ 9841, KIRAMBO SQ 0444, MURAZA SQ 0745 AND MATABA SQ 0942. THE SITUATION WAS FOUND RELATIVELY UNSTABLE. ON 02 JUN 95 A LARGE GROUP OF BANDITS MOVED IN THROUGH NYAMASHEKE AND THEN DIVIDING THEM INTO TWO GROUPS, ONE GROUP WENT TOWARDS KIRAMBO SQ 0444 AND OTHER GROUP WENT TOWARDS BUSHENKERI SQ 9832. NO ACT OF BANDITRY WAS REPORTED. THE STRENGTH OF THE GROUP IS UNKNOWN. ON 03 JUN ANOTHER GROUP OF BANDITS CAME IN AND RAN INTO THE AMBUSH BY RPA AT BUSHENKERI. TWO BANDITS WERE KILLED AND TWO AUTOMATIC WEAPONS WERE CAPTURED WITH ONE WOUNDED BANDIT. IN THE MEANTIME, IN MURAZA SQ 0745, AT ABOUT 032300HRS A BIG GROUP OF BANDITS DRESSED IN UNIFORM ROBBED MANY HOUSES. THEY ALSO MACHETTED A MAN TO DEATH AND WOUNDED

HIS 13-YEAR-OLD SON. SEVERAL CATTLE WERE TAKEN TO IJWI IN MANY BOATS. THE LOCAL RPA 2IC AND HIS OFFERS VISITED NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR IN ORDER TO ASSESS THE DEPLOYMENT AND THE STRENGTH OF THEIR TROOPS AS WELL AS THE ABOVE-MENTIONED INCIDENT.

II. MILOB TEAM FROM THE CYANGUGU SUB SECTOR WITNESSED THE HANDOVER OF HEHEALTH EQUIPMENT TO THE LOCALS IN BUSHENGE AND THE PREFECTURE MEDICAL AUTHORITIES.

III. IN THE NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR, FEARS OF INSECURITY IS GRIPPING THE LOCALS AS NEWS OF ETHIOBATT WITHDRAWAL IS KNOWN. MILOBS ASSESS THERE COULD BE ANOTHER MASS EXODUS TO ZAIRE IF WITHDRAWAL IS NOT COORDINATED AND ASSURANCE GIVEN TO THE POPULATION.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. MILOBS WERE INFORMED OF RPA HARASSMENT AND ARREST OF LOCALS IN NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE IN BUCIRA CELLULE. HUMAN RIGHTS REP HAS BEEN INFORMED ACCORDINGLY.

II. MILOBS PATROLS FROM GISENYI TO RWERERE(2822), THE BORDER POST AND MUTURA (5243). AN UNEXPLODED BOMB WAS FOUND AT GR 274231. RPA LO HAS BEEN INFORMED FOR NECESSARY ACTION. THE BOURGMESTRE OF RWERERE ALSO REPORTED A MURDER THAT TOOK PLACE LAST NIGHT. HUMAN RIGHTS HAVE BEEN INFORMED.

III. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE WFP ADMINISTRATOR WAS RAIDED YESTERDAY BY THREE ARMED MEN AT 2000 HRS. THEY LEFT WITH 240,000 FRW BELONGING TO THE ORGANISATION AND 82,000 FRW BELONGING TO THE ADMINISTRATOR. MATTER HAS BEEN REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE.

IV. THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT ATTENDED A RE-BURIAL CEREMONY OF THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE AT NYAUNDO. HR AND UNHCR TEAMS ATTENDED THE CEREMONY.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR AND OBSERVED THE SITUATION IN KIGALI CITY AND SUBURBS WAS REPORTED CALM. THERE IS A GENERAL FEAR OF INSECURITY BY NGO PERSONNEL DURING THE SILENT

HOURS ESPECIALLY IN KIGALI.

II. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT PAM DISTRIBUTED SEEDS AND TOOLS AT KACYIRU SECTEUR OFFICE (093863) TODAY. ABOUT 1,000 LOCALS BENEFITTED. ALSO, KICUKIRO PRIMARY SCHOOL REQUIRES ASSISTANCE FOR WATER FOR DRINKING AND WASHING. THE DIRECTOR ASKED FOR 10 EMPTY BARRELS TO STORE WATER FOR USE BY THE 3,200 PUPILS.

III. MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE AFRAID TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF NEW ID CARD SYSTEM IN RWANDA.

(B) INVESTIGATED TWO ACCIDENTS WHICH OCCURRED IN KIGALI INVOLVING TWO UNAMIR VEHS. BOTH VEHICLES WERE SLIGHTLY DAMAGED.

(C) THERE WERE THREE CASES OF UNAMIR AND NGO VEH THEFTS WHICH WERE REPORTED IN BUTAE. ALL REPORTED ROBBERIES WERE CARRIED OUT BY LOCALS IN RPA UNIFORMS AND THEY WERE ARMED. THERE WAS ALSO AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY BY SOME LOCALS IN THE RESIDENCE OF MP PERSONNEL IN KIGALI. THIS WAS FOILED.

THEY WENT AWAY WITH THE KEYS, OSTENSIBLY TO OPEN AND CART AWAY MONIES IN THE SAFE, QUIETLY. THEIR PLAN FAILED. AN HOUR LATER, THEY RETURNED TO HIM WHERE HE WAS BEING HELD CAPTIVE TO TELL HIM THAT HE GAVE THEM THE WRONG KEYS. 9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 05 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION. ALTHOUGH THE SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL, THERE WAS A MARKED INCREASE IN THE BANDITRY ACTIVITIES. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN KIGALI WORSENEED WITH A SPATE OF VEHICLE THEFTS AND ARMED ROBBERIES DIRECTED AGAINST UN AND NGO PERSONNEL. VEHICLE HIJACKING RATE IN KIGALI AND GITARAMA ESPECIALLY HAVE BECOME ALARMINGLY HIGH. THIS ISSUE MUST BE DISCUSSED WITH THE RPA/GOVT ESPECIALLY IN LIGHT OF THE GOVT ACCEPTANCE OF THE SECURITY RESPONSIBILITY TO NGOS AND OTHER INTERNATIONALS IN THE COUNTRY AS PER THE THE NEW MANDATE.
