DAILY SITREP FOR 29 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO EXHUME BODIES IN KIBEHO UNDER COVER OF DARKNESS AND TRANSPORTING THEM OUT OF KIBEHO. NO UNAMIR PERSONNEL WERE ALLOWED NEAR THE AREA OF THE EXHUMATIONS.

C. IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 PEOPLE WERE KILLED ON 28 APR 95 AT SERIRECHIKA SECTOR. THEY WERE FLEEING TO ZAIRE TO JOIN THEIR FAMILIES AND SOME ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. REPORTS INDICATE THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATHS. THE RPA HAVE A CAMP AT RWARAMBA GR 2063 ALONG THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU WHICH IS NEAR THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE AREA HAS ORDERED THAT NO LOCAL SHOULD GO TO THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE DEAD BODIES HAVE BEEN BURIED. MILOB INFORMED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ACCOMPANIED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. AJELO, AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE AFRICA BUREAU, DPKO, MR. ANNABI, HELD MEETINGS WITH PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE, GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, AND PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, ISSUES RELATED TO UNAMIR'S MANDATE, THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO AND SECURITY.

B. SRSG THEN MET WITH MR. PAUL GROSRIELER, ICRC DIRECTOR, GENEVA, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO, AS WELL AS RELATED HUMAN RIGHTS CONCERNS.

C. ON FRIDAY, THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER FOR DEFENSE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, OFFICIATED AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF A TWO-DAY SEMINAR HELD AT HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI TO DISCUSS WAYS FOR THE NGOS OPERATING IN RWANDA TO ENSURE THE TRANSITION FROM EMERGENCY AID TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AID IN RWANDA. IN HIS SPEECH ON THE OCCASION, GENERAL KAGAME EXPRESSED HIS SATISFACTION OVER THE ASSISTANCE CONTRIBUTED BY HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS IN RWANDA, BUT CRITICISED SOME ORGANISATIONS WHICH DID NOT BRING SUBSTANTIAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA AND WERE IN THE COUNTRY FOR THEIR OWN UNSPECIFIED INTERESTS.

D. THE HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION HAVE PROTESTED AGAINST THE DECISION BY THE EU TO SUSPEND ITS ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA FOLLOWING THE KIBEHO EVENTS. THE HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS ANNOUNCED THAT THE MEMBER STATES OF THE EU SHOULD INSTEAD ASSIST RWANDA IN ITS REHABILITATION EFFORTS AND IN THE REINFORCEMENT OF THE RULE OF LAW IN THE COUNTRY.

E. THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL HAS CONDEMNED THE KILLINGS AT KIBEHO, BUT EXPRESSED ITS SATISFACTION OVER THE DECISION MADE BY THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TO SET UP A COMMISSION OF INQUIRY TO INVESTIGATE THE EVENTS OF KIBEHO.

F. MR. BERNARD KOUCHNER, THE FORMER FRENCH MINISTER OF HEALTH, AND FOUNDER OF MSF, HAS BEEN IN RWANDA SINCE FRIDAY

AND WILL VISIT AN ORPHANAGE ON SATURDAY IN GITARAMA WHICH IS BEING RUN BY ANOTHER ORGANISATION ESTABLISHED BY HIM. IN HIS INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, MR. KOUCHNER REFUSED TO COMMENT ON THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KILLINGS IN KIBEHO AND ON THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED PENDING THE PUBLICATION OF CONCLUSIONS BY AN APPOINTED COMMISSION OF INQUIRY. HE INDICATED, HOWEVER, THAT IT WAS THE DUTY OF EVERYBODY TO CONDEMN WHAT HE CALLED THE HORRIBLE MASSACRE IN KIBEHO.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1, NIBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE INTRODUCED SEARCHES OF UNAMIR VEH INCLUDING PERSONAL EFFECTS AT ROAD BLOCKS. CO NIBATT CAR WAS SEARCHED INCLUDING HIS PERSONAL EFFECTS AT RUKOMO JUNCTION GR 1121.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THE THEFT OF THE WFP VEHICLE AT KIBUYE HAS NOW BEEN CONFIRMED AS AN RPA ACTION. THE NAME OF ONE OF THE SOLDIERS INVOLVED IN THE CRIME HAS BEEN PASSED TO HIS BN COMD FOR THE NECESSARY ACTION. THE RPA BDE LO IN LOCATION EXPLAINED THAT THE VEH HAD BEEN TAKEN TO CARRY A SICK SOLDIER TO KABGAYI MILITARY HOSPITAL. SINCE THE VEH DID NOT RETURN THE RPA ARE NOW SEARCHING FOR BOTH THE VEH AND THE SOLDIER.

(3) MILOB IN SECTOR 3B REPORTED THAT LAST NIGHT THE RESIDENCE OF A SWISS DISASTER RELIEF WORKER WAS ROBBED IN KIBUYE. HE ALLEGES THAT THE PERPETRATORS WERE RPA SOLDIERS.

(4) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO CORDON THE KIBEHO MSF BUILDING BEING OCCUPIED BY IDPs.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 292200B APR 95, ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA AT ISHARA PENINSULA. ONE BOAT WAS CAPTURED BY THE RPA. NO CAS REPORTED.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 291145B APR 95, UNKNOWN NUMBER OF ARMED ELEMENTS WHO CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE IN THE AREA OF GAFUNZO IN A BOAT EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA. 4 OF THE ARMED ELEMENTS WERE KILLED AND 1 AK 47 CONFISCATED BY THE RPA.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) CO NIBATT ATTENDED A PARTY ORGANISED BY THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILIES, MISS ALUZIA FOR FEMALE RETURNEES FROM OUTSIDE RWANDA.

(3) PROVIDED TPT TO CONVEY THE BOURGEMESTRE OF BOUYOGA FROM BYUMBA TO HIS COMMUNE.

(4) AN UNEXPLODED BOMB WAS DISCOVERED BY A PTL AT NYARUBARE, NEAR KAZAZA GR. ALSO DISCOVERED A HAND GRENADE WITHIN BYUMBA CAMP. EOD TEAM TASKED TO TAKE DISPOSAL ACTION ON BOTH UXOs.

(5) UNCONFIRMED REPORT HAD IT THAT 50 RETURNEES FROM KIGALI SENT TO NGARAMA COMMUNE WERE SENT BACK TO KIGALI. NIBATT PL POST AT NGARAMA INVESTIGATING.

(3) HANDING AND TAKING OVER BETWEEN ZAMBATT 1 AND 2 CURRENTLY IN PROGRESS.

(4) 68 IDPs WERE MOVED FROM KIBEHO TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

K. MILOB GP. IN SECTOR 5, IT WAS REPORTED THAT ON 26 APR 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN INFILTRATORS AND THE RPA AT THE AREA OF RWERERE BORDER POST. ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND UNKNOWN NUMBER INJURED. WHILE WITHDRAWING THE INFILTRATORS REPORTEDLY THREW GRENADES INTO THE TENTS OF THE LEOPARD BATTALION, A ZAIRIAN FORCE EMPLOYED BY UNHCR IN THE VICINITY OF THE KIBUMBA CAMP ON RWANDESE SIDE. THE INCIDENT WAS DISCUSSED BY THE RPA AND REPRESENTATIVES OF ZAIRIAN ARMY ON 27 APRIL.

(1) POLITICAL.

(A) IN SECTOR 1, THE PREFECT ORGANIZED A GET TOGETHER OF RETURNEE LADIES AT THE CENTRAL HALL OF THE PREFECTURE. THE FUNCTION WAS PRESIDED OVER BY MS NYUMBA ALUZIA MINISTER FOR DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILIES. REPS FROM MILOBS AND NIBATT ATTENDED. IN HER ADDRESS THE MINISTER TOLD THE GATHERING TO WORK TOWARDS PEACE AND HARMONY AND TO FORM SUCH COMMITTEES IN EACH COMMUNE.

(B) SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS VISITED KIBEHO CAMP WITH THE PRESS.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

III. CYANIKA BORDER POST.

IV. KANYARU-HAUTE AND KANYARU-BAS.

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) ALL BORDERS TO BURUNDI WERE REPORTED TO BE CLOSED TO ALL RWANDAN CITIZENS WISHING TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS WITH NIBATT CONDUCTED A JOINT PATROL TO IDENTIFY MINED AREAS. THE PATROL LOCATED AN UNEXPLODED MORTAR BOMB AT GR 345677.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) AT MUGESERA, ALL IDPS WHO ARRIVED HAVE LEFT FOR THEIR HOMES.

(C) ONE TEAM MONITORED ACTIVITIES IN THE ASPEK AND NYAKIRAMBI TRANSIT CAMPS WHERE IDPS AND OLD CASE LOAD RETURNEES FROM TANZANIA WERE HELD. THE SITUATION IN THE CAMP WAS REPORTED TO BE CALM. AT THE ASPEK CAMP, 19 IDPS LEFT FOR THE RUSUMO COMMUNE.

(D) 2900 IDPS WERE REGISTERED TODAY AT THE NGENDA TRANSIT CAMP AND 250 SUSPECTS WERE DETAINED.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.



(B) MILOB PATROL TO MASANGO AND MURAMA COMMUNE REPORTED THAT 600 AND 3000 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED RESPECTIVELY IN THE TWO COMMUNES.

(C) PRISON AUTHORITIES IN GITARAMA ARE STILL ANXIOUS TO CARRY ON THE PREVIOUS PLAN TO MOVE PRISONERS. THEY NOW CLAIM TO HAVE RECEIVED DIRECTION FROM THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE TO BEGIN THE MOVE AS SOON AS TRANSPORT ARE AVAILABLE.

(D) IN SECTOR 3B, MILOB PATROL TO MABANZA GR 3473 FOUND THE SITUATION TENSE DUE TO THE RECENT ARREST OF A SECONDARY SCHOOL INSPECTOR, AN AGRONOMIST, THE PRESIDENT OF THE FARMERS ASSOCIATION OF RWANDA AND A NURSE WORKING FOR MSF.

(E) MILOB SECTOR HQ HELD A MEETING WITH ALL NGOS TO DISCUSS SECURITY AND TO WORK OUT EMERGENCY MEASURES TO DEAL WITH THEFT AND THREAT.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO

(A) THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR VISITED KIBEHO CAMP. IT WAS REPORTED THAT AT 1245 HRS A TOTAL OF 68 IDPS DECIDED TO LEAVE THE CAMP FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNE. THE IDPS WERE SEEN ON FOOT, GOING IN THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF RWAMIKO GR 4914. TEAMS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA DENIED THEM ACCESS AT THEIR CHECKPOINT NEAR THE CAMP. THEY WERE ALLOWED ACCESS THROUGH THE CHECK POINT ONLY WHEN THE LOCAL RPA CO DETAILED AN RPA CAPT TO ESCORT THEM THROUGH THE CHECKPOINT.

(B) PATROLLED KINYAMAKABA GR 6026 AND KARAMA GR 6327. THE BOURGEMESTRES OF BOTH THE COMMUNES CONFIRMED THAT THEY ARE READY TO RECEIVE IDPS. THEY ALSO MENTIONED THAT THERE WILL BE NO PROBLEMS OF ACCOMMODATION FOR THE IDPS. BOURGEMASTRE AT KARAMA CONFIRMED OFFICIALLY THAT NO RETURNEES HAVE ARRIVED IN HIS COMMUNE.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS MONITORED THE RESETTLEMENT OF IDPS IN THE SECTOR:

I. IN RUNYINYA GR 6012, SITUATION REPORTED CALM. 250 IDPS IN THE COMMUNE PRISON AND 10925 RETURNEES REGISTERED. BOURGMASTER TOLD THE TEAM THAT THE RETURNEES ARE CURRENTLY REHABILITATING THEIR HOMES.

II. AT GISHAMVU GR 6505, SITUATION REPORTED

NORMAL WITH 8,179 RETURNEES REGISTERED AND 120 IN COMMUNE PRISON. THE BOURGMASER INFORMED THE TEAM THAT TRIAL OF ALLEGED PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE WILL START ON 01 MAY 95.

III. 105 IDPS WERE TRANSPORTED FROM BUTARE TO HUYE GR 6714 BY UNHCR.

III. AT NYAKIZU GR 5696, THE SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL WITH 18,691 IDPS REGISTERED ON 29 APR 95 AND 106 HELD PRISONER. 65 SUSPECTS WERE ACQUITTED BY THE BOURGMASER 28 CONVICTED AND 10 PENDING.

IV. AT SHYANDA GR 7718, TEAM WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT SEVERAL ARRESTS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE RPA OUT OF WHICH ONLY 03 IDPS WERE RELEASED.

V. AT MUYANGA GR 9026 THE ASSISTANT BOURGMASER TOLD THE TEAM THAT 349 IDPS HAVE SO FAR BEEN REGISTERED IN THE COMMUNE. SOME OF THE IDPS GO STRAIGHT TO THEIR HOMES WITHOUT REGISTRATION. THERE WERE NO PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE PRISON. FOOD AID REQUIRED IN THE COMMUNE. HAC INFORMED.

VI. AT MUGUSA GR 8425, 1684 IDPS ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE. 100 ARRIVED ON FOOT AND 150 ARE DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE PRISON.

VII. AT RUHASHYA GR 6926, 1347 IDPS WERE REGISTERED TODAY. 53 WERE ARRESTED. THERE ARE 223 PRISONERS HELD AT COMMUNE PRISON. LOCALS ARE REPORTED VERY HOSTILE TOWARDS IDPS ACCUSING THEM OF BEING CRIMINALS. ONE IDPS WAS KILLED BY LOCAL AND NO ARREST HAS BEEN MADE BY THE AUTHORITIES.

VIII. AT MUGUSA (GR 8426) 1500 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED. THE COMMUNE PRISON HAD 170 PRISONERS OUT OF WHICH 30 WERE RETURNEES.

IX. AT MUYAGA COMMUNE (GR 9026) 500 IDPS WERE REGISTERED. 10 IDPS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA. THE TEAM COULD NOT GET INFO ABOUT BORDER CROSSINGS AT KABUMWE SECTOR (GR 9326) ON ILLEGAL BORDER CROSSINGS DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF RPA TROOPS.

X. AT MUGANZA (GR 8407). THE BOURGMASER HAS ASKED UNAMIR TO ASSIST WITH VEHICLE TO TOUR THE SECTOR ON 01 MAY 95. MILOBS ALSO REPORTED WARM RECEPTION OF IDPS TO THE AREA. FOOD, CLOTHING, AGRICULTURAL TOOLS AND SEEDS

WERE REQUESTED. HAC INFORMED.

XI. AT NDORA (GR 8112), 339 IDPS WERE REGISTERED AND COMMUNE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED FOOD AID. HAC INFO.

XII. AT NGOMA (GR 9637), 1146 IDPS WERE REGISTERED. IDPS HAVE REQUESTED ITEMS SUCH AS CLOTHING, FARMING TOOLS, SEEDS AND MEDICINE. HAC INFORMED.

XIII. AT NTYAZO (GR 8631) 2048 IDPS WERE REGISTERED WITH 89 IDPS DETAINED BY RPA INCLUDING 7 WOMEN AND A 13 YEAR OLD BOY.

XIV. AT MUYIRA (GR 8639), 2137 IDPS WERE REGISTERED, WITH 154 ARRESTED BY RPA. 22 OF THOSE DETAINED ARE TO BE EVAC TO KIGALI. URGENT REQUIREMENTS OF IDPS WERE FOOD, WATER, ACCOMMODATION, MEDICINE, TOOLS AND SEEDS. HAC INFORMED.

XV. AT GISHAMVU COMMUNE (GR 6505), NYAKIZU (GR 5696) AND RUNYINYA (GR 6012) MILOBS REPORTED A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY IN THE AREA DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS OF RETURNEES BY THE RPA. AT RUNYINYA IT WAS REPORTED THAT BURGOMASTER HAS STARTED TRIALS OF DETAINED IDPS.

THE PATROL ALSO REPORTED THAT UNIFORMED SOLDIERS, PROBABLY FRGF, ROUTINELY ENGAGED THE RPA IN THIS AREA. THE RPA HAS INCREASED ITS PATROLS IN THE AREA.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED KICUKIRO AND RUBONGO COMMUNE. PATROLS ALSO COVERED THE NDERA TRANSIT CAMP, WHERE THE SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL. 24 RETURNEES WERE REPORTED ON 28 APR 95.

L. FORCE ENGR COY.

- (1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.
- (2) DOZER REPORTED BACK AFTER COMPLETING REPAIR OF ROAD KIBUYE-CYANGUGU.
- (3) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE TRUCKS TO TAC HQ BUTARE, FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS.
- (4) CARRIED OUT RECCE FOR REPAIR OF BRIDGE NEAR NYAMATA.
- (5) PROVIDED 3 DUMPERS TO B & R FOR CONVEYANCE OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL.

M. AUSMED.

- (1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.
- (2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 70 OUT-PATIENTS AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK CURRENTLY HOLDING 19 IN-PATIENTS.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL AND TO THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) ONE MINOR TFC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 1050 WAS REPORTED. NO CAS WAS REPORTED.

P. 95 FLSG.

(1) DELIVERED 3,000L OF GASOLINE TO MALICOY.

(2) PROVIDED TPT AND RATION SP DURING ZAMBATT ROTATION.

(3) A WATER BLADDER WAS REPAIRED IN KIBUNGO.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE PATROLLED MASANGO COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT 943 WERE REGISTERED AT THE COMMUNE. IT WAS OBSERVED THAT MANY OF THE IDPs HAD INJURIES AND LACKED FOOD AND MEDICAL CARE. THE COMMUNE AUTHORITIES INFORMED THE TEAM THAT NONE OF THE IDPs WAS UNDER ARREST SINCE INVESTIGATIONS INTO THEIR ACTIVITIES DURING LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE HAD NOT COMMENCED. THE TEAM FURTHER PATROLLED MURAMA COMMUNE AND WAS INFORMED THAT 2,830 IDPs AND 8 LOCALS HAD ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE. SOME OF THE IDPs INTERVIEWED SAID THEY WERE IN DIRE NEED OF FOOD, WATER AND MEDICINE. HAC INFORMED.

C. A PATROL TEAM TO NTONGWE COMMUNE IN SECTOR 3 WAS INFORMED BY OFFICIALS OF CARITAS THAT 805 IDPs HAD SO FAR RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE. MOST OF THE IDPs HAD SO FAR RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

D. IN RUHENGERI PREFECTURE, A JOINT CIVPOL/MILOBS PATROL TO KINIGI COMMUNE ON 28 APR 95 WAS INFORMED BY THE BOURGMESTRE THAT LOCALS IN KABWENDE, BISATE AND NYARUGIRE SECTORS LIVE IN FEAR AS A RESULT OF RUMOURS OF EMINENT ATTACK BY FRGF. THE TEAM FURTHER REPORTED THAT A JOINT CIVPOL, MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND RED CROSS TEAM VISITED TUNBATT ON 28 APR 95 TO INVESTIGATE AN INCIDENT IN WHICH A LOCAL SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE HAD SOUGHT REFUGE WITH TUNBATT. THE LOCAL WAS HANDED OVER TO THE INSPECTOR OF POLICE IN THE AREA WHEN IT WAS CLEAR THAT

A WARRANT HAD BEEN ISSUED FOR HIS ARREST BY THE JUDICIAL OFFICE FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS. HUMAN RIGHTS TO FOLLOW UP.

E. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL CONTINUES.

7. HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE CELL. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY EJECTED FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A.

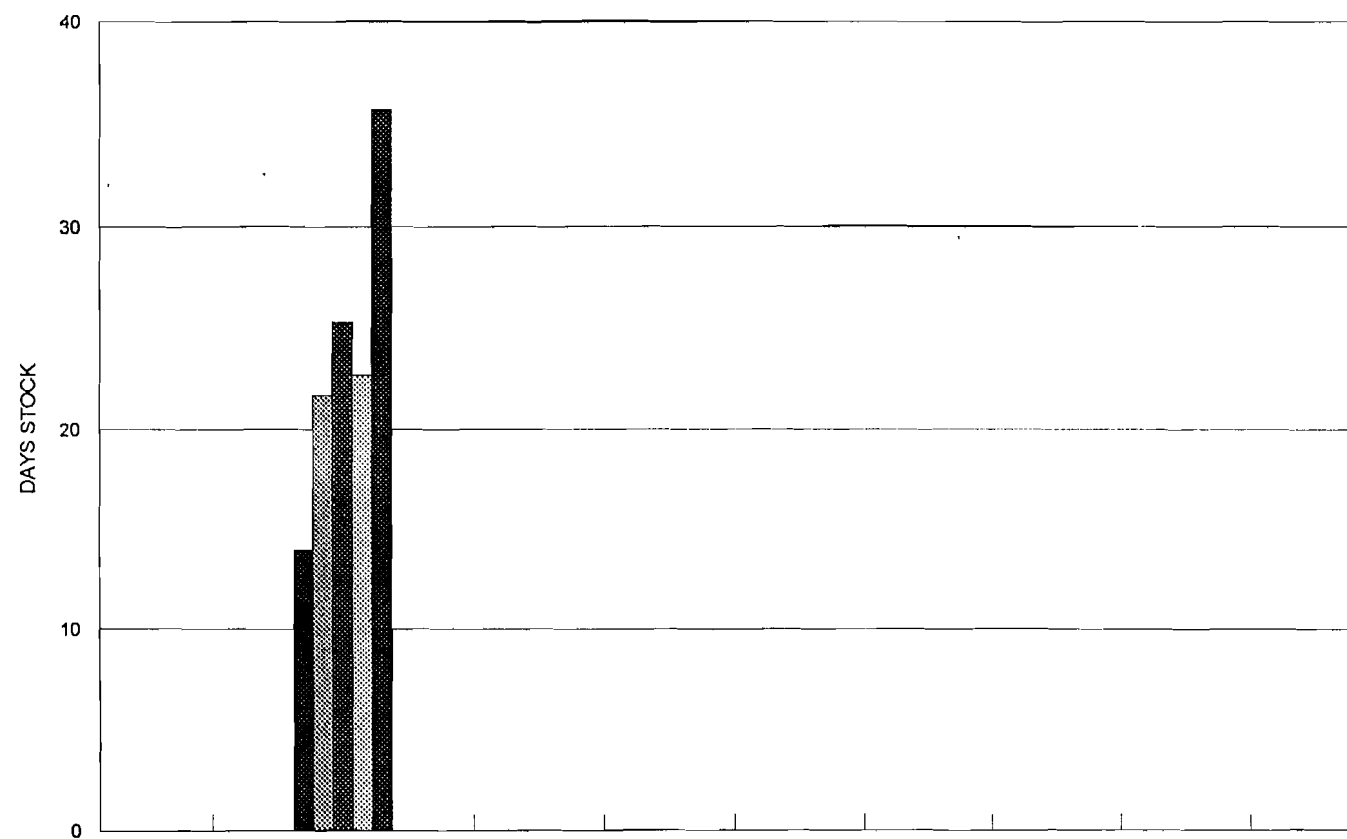

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY AT THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS AT KIBEHO IDP CAMP LAST NIGHT EXHUMED APPROXIMATELY 16 IDP BODIES FROM KIBEHO. THE REPORT FURTHER SAID THE EXERCISE COULD HAVE BEEN GOING ON FOR SOME TIME AND COULD CONTINUE SO THAT ONLY VERY FEW BODIES WOULD BE FOUND AT KIBEHO BY THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.

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2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, AND THE FORCE COMMANDER, GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, GAVE A FULL BRIEFING TO MR. ALDO AJELO, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL. AMBASSADOR KHAN SPENT MOST OF THE DAY IN DISCUSSIONS WITH MR. AJELO, INCLUDING DISCUSSIONS RELATING TO THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO.

B. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA, WHO WAS ACCOMPANIED BY VICE-PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME, PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND OTHER GOVERNMENT MINISTERS, ON THURSDAY WENT TO KIBEHO CAMP WITH THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR RWANDA, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR KHAN AND THE FOREIGN DIPLOMATS ACCREDITED TO KIGALI, TO FIND THE TRUTH ABOUT THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED IN KIBEHO CAMP ON SATURDAY.

(2) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR KHAN, AND THE OTHER FOREIGN DIPLOMATS EYE- WITNESSED THE EXHUMATION OF DEAD BODIES FROM MASS GRAVES AND THE COUNTING OF THOSE BODIES WHOSE TOTAL NUMBER WAS 338. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID THAT THE KILLINGS HAD BEEN A RESULT OF ATTACKS BY MILITIA MEN ON SOLDIERS AND CHALLENGED UNAMIR TROOPS AND ANYBODY ELSE TO SHOW OTHER MASS GRAVES IN KIBEHO. THEY DID NOT FIND ANY. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU STRONGLY CASTIGATED THE ATTITUDE OF MEMBERS OF FOREIGN MEDIA AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS WHO SPREAD EXAGGERATED FIGURES THAT GO UP TO 4 THOUSAND AND 8 THOUSAND.

(3) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU ALSO ANNOUNCED THE SETTING UP OF AN INDEPENDENT COMMISSION COMPOSED OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES, AMONG THEM CANADA, FRANCE, GERMANY, GREAT BRITAIN, THE OAU, THE UNITED STATES AND UNAMIR.

(4) THE COMMISSION IS IN CHARGE OF INVESTIGATING THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED, THE MANNER IN WHICH THEY WERE KILLED, THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE KILLINGS, WHETHER THE GOVERNMENT TROOPS WERE PROVOKED BY THE MILITIA AMONG THE DISPLACED PEOPLE, WHETHER THERE WERE CONSULTATIONS BEFORE THE MAKING OF THE DECISION TO CLOSE THE CAMP AND WHETHER THERE WAS AN ETHNIC BASIS BEHIND THE KILLINGS, ETC.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) RPA STOPPED A NIBATT PATROL TEAM AT RUKOMO JUNCTION GR 1121 AND INSISTED ON SEARCHING THE VEH.

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ISSUE WAS RESOLVED. STILL IN SECTOR 1, MILOBS REPORTED THAT A COMBINED RPA AND GENDARMERIE CHECK POST (GR 1120) STOPPED MILOBS, NIBATT EOD AND FORCE ENGR TEAM AND INSISTED ON CHECKING THEIR VEHICLES AND DOCUMENTS. THE MILOBS INFORMED THEM THAT THE PATROL WAS ON ITS WAY TO RECCE THE ROAD TO MUGAMBAZI AND TO REMOVE SOME MINES. THEY WERE ALLOWED PASSAGE ONLY AFTER THEY HAD SUBMITTED TO A SEARCH. ANOTHER MILOB TEAM WAS STOPPED AND ASKED TO SHOW THEIR PASSPORTS AT THE SAME CHECK POST.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 REPORTED RPA HAD CLOSED ITS TRAINING CAMP AT NYARUBUYE. HOWEVER ABOUT TWO PLATOONS OF TROOPS ARE STILL IN THE CAMP.

(3) MILOBS REPORTED THAT IN SECTOR 4B RPA CONTINUED ARRESTS OF SUSPECTED PERSONS. RPA TROOPS DEPLOYED TO MUSANGE SECTOR (GR 690095) OF HUYE COMMUNE (GR 6711) WERE REPORTED HOSTILE TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND DID NOT ALLOW IDPS WHO HAD HOMES IN THE AREA TO RESETTLE.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE PATROLLED RUNDA COMMUNE ON 26 APR 95 WITH THE PROSECUTOR TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST A SPANISH ROMAN CATHOLIC PRIEST AT

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KABUGA THAT HUTUS IN TABA COMMUNE WERE BEING ADVISED BY THE PRIEST TO FLEE THE AREA SINCE THERE WERE PLANS FOR TUTSIS TO ATTACK THEM. THE PRIEST WHEN CONTACTED BY THE CIVPOL TEAM AND THE PROSECUTOR DENIED THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST HIM AND EXPLAINED THAT COUNSELLOR OF THE SECTOR MADE THE FALSE ALLEGATIONS TO DISCREDIT HIM BECAUSE HE HAD MADE IT DIFFICULT FOR THE COUNSELLOR TO EXTORT MONEY FROM LOCALS HE HAD THREATENED TO IMPLICATE IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE IF THEY DID NOT BRIBE HIM WITH MONEY. THE TEAM THEREAFTER INTERVIEWED 14 LOCALS INCLUDING THE COUNSELLOR'S MOTHER. THEY ALL EXPLAINED THAT THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST THE PRIEST WERE UNFOUNDED.

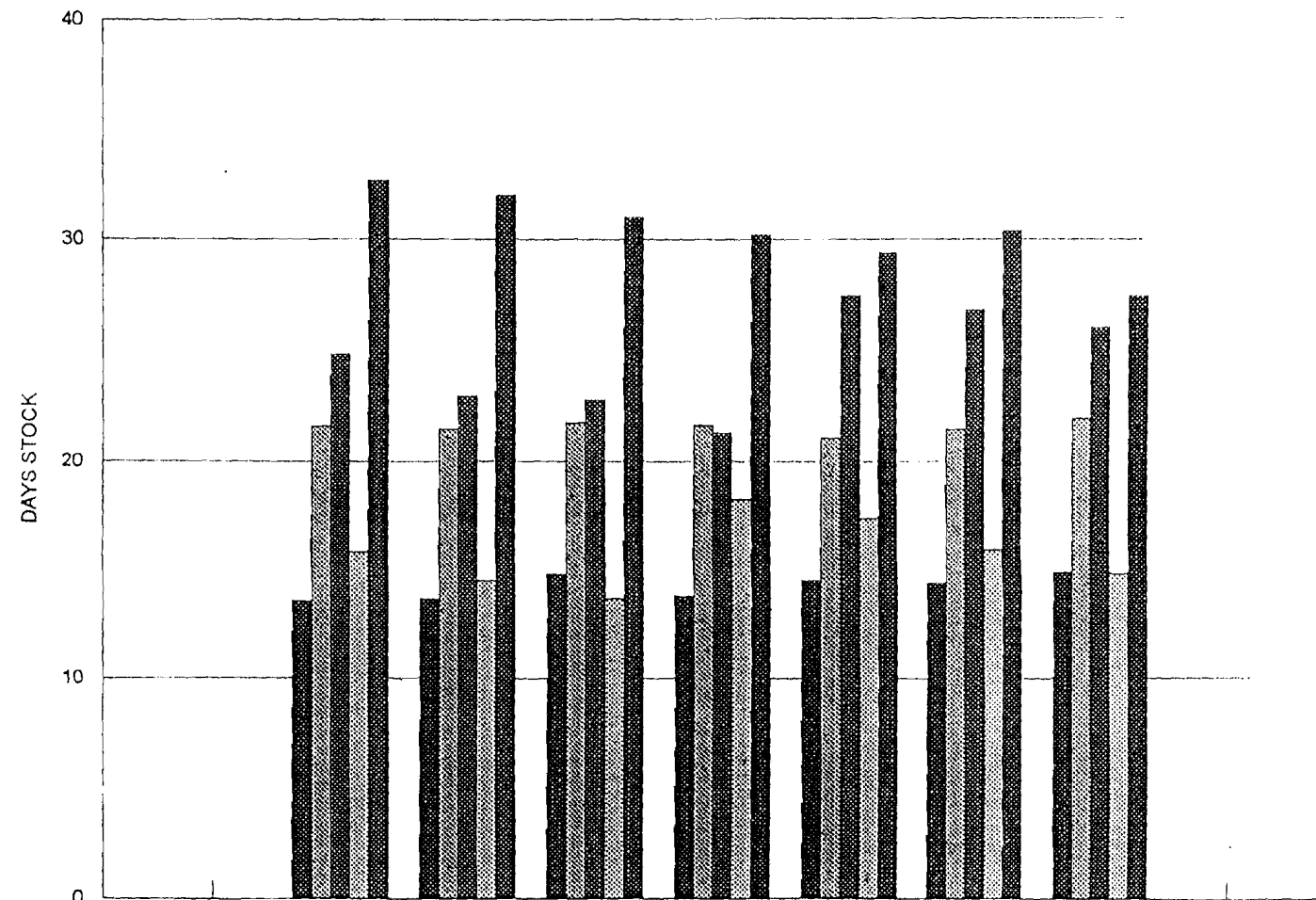

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY AT THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, TRAVELLED TO KIBEHO TODAY, ACCOMPANIED BY MR. ANNABI, DIRECTOR, AFRICAN BUREAU, DPKO, AND BY MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS, AMONG THEM, THE

AMBASSADORS OF BELGIUM, FRANCE AND GERMANY, AS WELL AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNHCR, TO ASSESS THE SITUATION ON THE GROUND. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE GEN KAGAME, PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE CABINET WERE PRESENT, AS WELL. NEARLY ALL MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS WERE IN ATTENDANCE, ALONG WITH UN AGENCY HEADS AND JOURNALISTS.

B. AT KIBEHO, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU ANNOUNCED THE CREATION OF AN INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY WHICH WILL INVESTIGATE KIBEHO INCIDENT. AMONG THOSE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE WERE, BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, THE NETHERLANDS AND THE UNITED STATES.

C. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA, TOGETHER WITH THE FOREIGN DIPLOMATS ACCREDITED TO KIGALI, ARE TO GO TO KIBEHO ON THURSDAY TO ASSESS THE SITUATION, FOLLOWING THE INCIDENTS THAT OCCURRED THERE ON SATURDAY.

(2) ON WEDNESDAY, PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, IN THE COMPANY OF PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, GOVERNMENT MINISTERS AND FOREIGN DIPLOMATS BASED IN KIGALI ATTENDED THE REBURIAL CEREMONY FOR THE REMAINS OF VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU LAID A STONE ON THE PLACE WHERE A GENOCIDE MEMORIAL WILL BE BUILT IN KIBUYE.

(3) IN HIS ADDRESS TO THE POPULATION ON THE OCCASION, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU WARNED THE POPULATION AGAINST ETHNIC BIGOTRY THAT HAS BEEN THE SOURCE OF GENOCIDE. ALSO SPEAKING ON THE OCCASION, PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU STRESSED THAT IT WOULD BE A MISTAKE TO BELIEVE THAT ALL HUTUS WERE CRIMINALS, AND THAT THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR GENOCIDE WERE MEMBERS OF MRND, CDR AND "POWER" POLITICAL FACTIONS. IT SHOULD BE UNDERSTOOD THAT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PUNISH CRIMINALS, NOT ETHNIC HUTUS, HE SAID.

(4) THE US ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE, MR. GEORGE MOOSE, ON THURSDAY ENDED HIS VISIT TO RWANDA. SPEAKING AT A PRESS CONFERENCE, HE SAID THAT THE US WOULD CONTINUE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA AND WOULD EXERCISE ITS SUPPORT TO THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RWANDA. MR. MOOSE SAID THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA WAS WILLING TO CLARIFY THE TRUTH REGARDING THE KIBEHO EVENTS. ASKED ABOUT THE DEATH TOLL IN KIBEHO, HE ANSWERED THAT IT WAS WISE TO WAIT FOR THE CONCLUSION OF THE INQUIRY.

(5) THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME ON WEDNESDAY HELD INTERVIEWS WITH CNN, BBC AND RADIO RWANDA IN KIGALI.

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HE TOLD THEM THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE INCIDENTS THAT OCCURRED IN KIBEHO BECAUSE THEY KNEW THAT KIBEHO CAMP HOUSED ARMED CRIMINALS FOR GENOCIDE AND THEY DID NOT DO ANYTHING TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEM. HE ALSO REMINDED THE JOURNALIST THAT UNAMIR WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE PLAN TO CLOSE THE CAMP, EXCEPT FOR THE PARTICULAR TIME THE TROOPS WERE TO BE DEPLOYED.

(6) VICE PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME ATTRIBUTED THE KIBEHO INCIDENTS TO THE ARMED CRIMINALS IN KIBEHO CAMP WHO PROVOKED THE GOVERNMENT TROOPS. HE SAID THAT THE RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE IN SELF DEFENCE. HE INDICATED THAT THREE SOLDIERS WERE KILLED AND NINE OTHERS WOUNDED. THIRTY-SIX GUNS AND MANY HAND GRENS WERE SEIZED. HE ESTIMATED THAT BETWEEN 300 AND 400 PEOPLE INCLUDING INNOCENT ONES, WERE KILLED IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE.

(7) HE POINTED OUT THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY WAS DRAMATISING THE DEATH TOLL IN KIBEHO BECAUSE THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS WORKING IN RWANDA HAD AN INTEREST IN MAINTAINING THE CAMPS IN RWANDA SO THAT THEY COULD REMAIN IN GREAT NUMBERS IN THE COUNTRY. HE ADDED THAT WITH THE CLOSURE OF THE CAMPS, MANY WOULD LOSE THEIR JOBS BECAUSE THEIR PRESENCE WOULD BE DECREASED. ASKED IF THOSE NUMBERS SHOULD NOW LEAVE THE COUNTRY, HE RESPONDED THAT HE THOUGHT THEY WOULD REMAIN IN THE COUNTRY BECAUSE THEY LIKED REMAINING IN THE COUNTRY.

(8) ASKED ABOUT HIS REACTION THE DECISION BY BELGIUM AND HOLLAND TO CEASE THEIR ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA, HE RESPONDED THAT THE DECISION WAS NOT JUSTIFIED BECAUSE THE AID FORMERLY GIVEN BY THOSE COUNTRIES WERE NOT DESTINED TO THE ACCUSED SOLDIERS BUT TO THE NEEDY PEOPLE IN RWANDA. HE UNDERLINED THAT THOSE COUNTRIES MADE THE DECISION AS A RESULT OF A LACK OF INFORMATION, AND THEY ARE INDEED RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KIBEHO INCIDENTS BECAUSE THEY WERE ASSISTING ARMED CRIMINALS IN THE CAMPS.

(9) IN A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED ON 25 APRIL, RWANDESE PARLIAMENT PROTESTED AGAINST THE DRAMATISATION OF THE DEATH TOLL IN KIBEHO BY THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY. THE RWANDESE PARLIAMENT SAID THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY BEARS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE KIBEHO INCIDENTS BECAUSE IT FAILED TO DISARM THE ARMED MILITIA IN THE CAMPS SET UP IN THE FORMER ZONE TURQUOISE, WHICH WAS ESTABLISHED BY FRANCE.

GHANBATT TPS AT GITUKU GR 703637 THAT ON 26 APR 95 HER HUSBAND WAS ARRESTED AT KIBUNGO MARKET BY RPA SOLDIERS FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. MILOB AND HR INFORMED AND INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH BANDITS FROM ZAIRE IN THE AREA OF NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 BY BOATS. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE BACK TO ZAIRE LEAVING THEIR BOATS.

(3) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS EXCHANGED FIRE WITH FRGF SOLDIERS WHO INFILTRATED FROM THE ZAIREAN BORDER AT KABATWA GR 3327 ON 26 APR 95. ONE FRGF SOLDIERS WAS KILLED. THE REST ESCAPED BACK TO ZAIRE.

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE WERE THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION AND AMBASSADORS ACCREDITED TO RWANDA. THE DELEGATION FURTHER TRIED TO CONVINCE THE IDPs TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES BUT IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE IDPs STILL INSIST THAT THEY WILL RATHER DIE IN THE CAMP THAN RETURN TO THEIR COMMUNES.

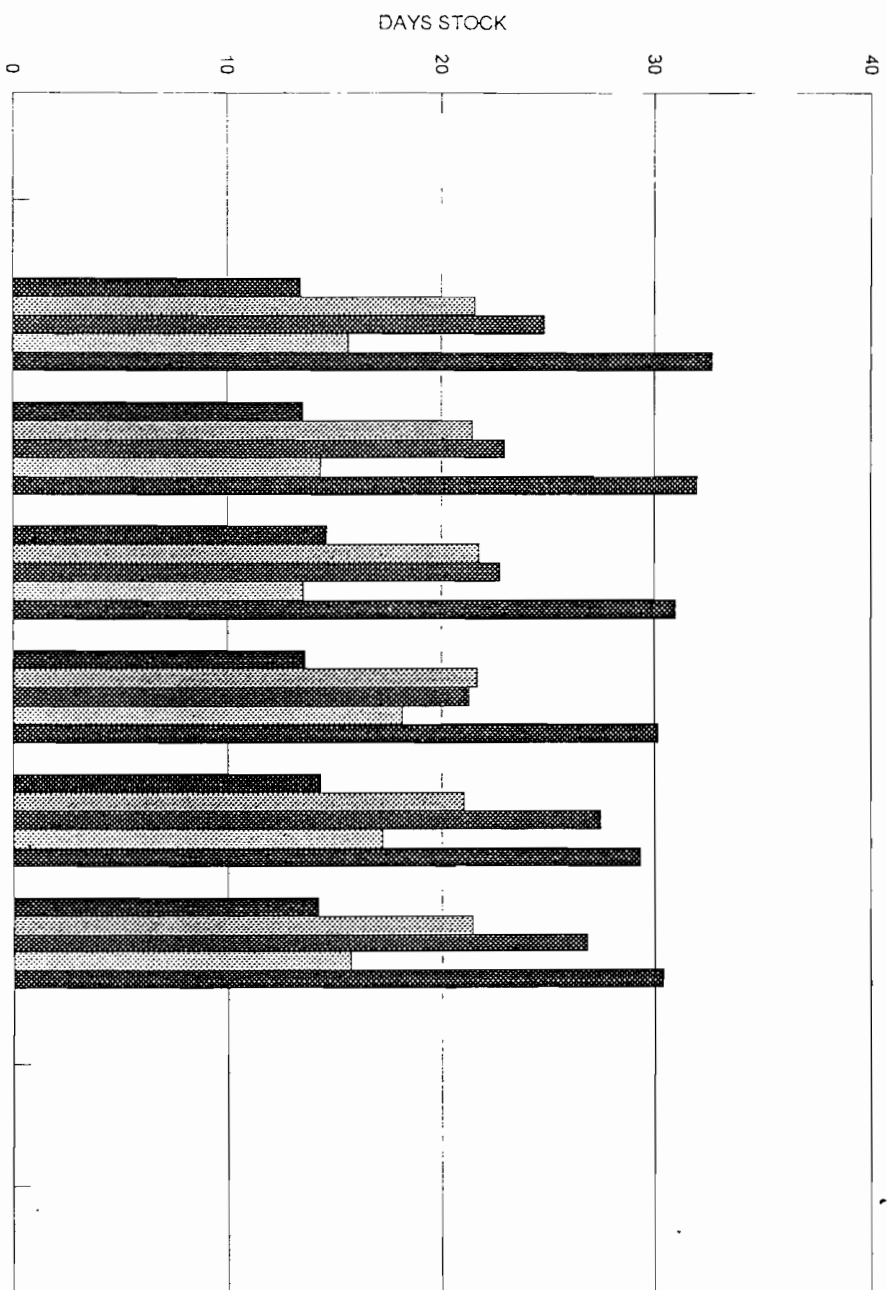

DAILY SITREP FOR 26 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY IN THE IDP CAMPS, THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES.

B. AT KIBEHO NEGOTIATIONS CONTINUED WITH THE IDPs HELD IN THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX ALL DAY. THE IDPs HAD INITIALLY AGREED TO SEND 10 IDPs EACH TO THEIR COMMUNES TO MONITOR THE SY SITUATION. 5 OF THESE WERE EXPECTED TO RETURN TO KIBEHO TO PASS ON THEIR ASSESSMENT OF THE SY SITUATION TO THEIR COLLEAGUES IN THE MSF BUILDING. WHEN THE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TURNED UP TO NEGOTIATE WITH THEM, THE ORIGINAL PLAN WAS ABANDONED AND THE IDPs REMAINED ADAMANT. SO FAR 42 DEAD BODIES WERE TAKEN OUT OF THE BUILDING DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD; MAJORITY HAD BEEN KILLED SOME DAYS PREVIOUSLY.

C. UNHCR AND CIVPOL AT BUTARE REPORTED THAT 28 DEAD BODIES WERE FOUND IN RUSATITA PRISON GR 7431 AND 10 OTHERS TOO WEAK TO STAND ON THEIR OWN WITHOUT ASSISTANCE. THE CAUSE OF DEATH WAS EITHER STARVATION OR SUFFOCATION OR BOTH. CIVPOL INVESTIGATING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, CHAIRED HIS REGULAR HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING DURING WHICH ISSUES INCLUDING KIBEHO, SECURITY AND INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA WERE DISCUSSED.

B. THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER PROVIDED FULL BRIEFING TO MR. ANNABI, DIRECTOR AFRICAN BUREAU OF DPKO. HE THEN GRANTED AUDIENCE TO MR. CARBONARE, THE ARDEC PROJECT ASSOCIATE OF MS. KAGAME.

C. HE CHAIRED A MEETING OF DONORS, HEADS OF AGENCIES AND NGOS TO DISCUSS THE COORDINATED HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO KIBEHO. DURING THE MEETING, AMBASSADOR KHAN ALSO ASKED DONORS TO WAIT FOR ALL THE FACTS BEFORE MAKING DECISIONS RELATED TO ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

E. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE US ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE IN CHARGE OF AFRICAN AFFAIRS, MR. GEORGE MOOSE, WHO ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON MONDAY, HELD TALKS ON TUESDAY WITH PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, VICE-PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME AND PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU. THE TALKS CENTRED ON A VARIETY OF ISSUES, INCLUDING THE CONDITIONS OF DETENTION IN RWANDESE PRISONS, THE PROBLEM OF RWANDESE REFUGEES, THE RELATIONS BETWEEN RWANDA AND ITS NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES, THE MANDATE OF UNAMIR IN RWANDA, SECURITY IN RWANDA AND ON BORDER AREAS, AND THE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION PROCESS.

(2) MR. MOOSE SAID THAT HE WAS SENT BY PRESIDENT BILL CLINTON TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT ON THE SUBJECTS OF THE KIBEHO EVENTS AND POLITICAL PROBLEMS IN RWANDA AND IN THE REGION. HE POINTED OUT THAT, IN HIS OPINION, AND IN THE OPINION OF THE US GOVERNMENT, THE KIBEHO EVENTS WERE NOT PRE-PLANNED. HE ALSO UNDERLINED THAT THE US WOULD CONTINUE TO PROVIDE AID TO RWANDA.

(3) A COMMUNIQUE FROM THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER'S

OFFICE SAID THAT RELATIONS BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WERE CURRENTLY TENSE AND THAT TALKS HAD BEEN SCHEDULED BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES TO DISCUSS UNAMIR'S MANDATE.

(4) THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS GHALI, EXPRESSED SHOCK AND CONCERN OVER WHAT HE CALLED THE KIBEHO TRAGEDY. HE SAID THAT HE WAS HORRIFIED BY THE KIBEHO EVENTS AND WOULD SEND AN ENVOY THIS WEEK TO KIGALI WITH A PERSONAL MESSAGE FOR THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

(5) ON TUESDAY, THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, VISITED NGENDA COMMUNE IN KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE, AS WELL AS GIKONGORO PREFECTURE, TO ASSESS THE PREPARATIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF RETURNING DISPLACED PEOPLE. HE SAID THAT A CRIMINAL POLICE INSPECTOR HAD BEEN APPOINTED FOR EACH COMMUNE TO RECEIVE RETURNING DISPLACED PEOPLE WHOSE ROLE WOULD BE TO FOLLOW UP ON THE ARRESTS OF PEOPLE WHO WERE INVOLVED IN GENOCIDE.

(6) THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR HEALTH, COLONEL JOSEPH KAREMERA, ON TUESDAY, DENIED REPORTS CARRIED BY FOREIGN MEDIA WHICH SPOKE OF A CHOLERA EPIDEMIC IN SOUTHERN RWANDA. COLONEL KAREMERA SAID THAT THOSE RUMOURS HAD BEEN SPREAD BY FOREIGN NGOS SUCH AS MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES (MSF) IN ORDER TO PREVENT DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM RETURNING HOME.

(7) PRESIDENT ARAP MOI OF KENYA HAS EXPELLED THE RWANDESE AMBASSADOR TO KENYA, SAYING THAT HE WOULD BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO KENYA WHEN KILLINGS STOPPED IN RWANDA.

(8) THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION, MR. P.C. RWIGEMA, ON TUESDAY, RECEIVED A DELEGATION FROM THE WORLD BANK. THEIR TALKS FOCUSED ON RWANDA'S REQUEST FOR A FINANCIAL LOAN FOR THE TRAINING OF RWANDESE TEACHERS AND FOR REHABILITATION OF RWANDESE SCHOOLS. IN A COMMUNIQUE PUBLISHED ON TUESDAY, MR. (C) SECTOR COMMANDER, MILOBS AND CIVPOL VISITED BUGARAMA SUB-SECTOR AND MET WITH THE RPA REGIONAL COMMANDER AND THE RPA COMMANDER OF BUGARAMA CITY.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS/CIVPOL TEAM INVESTIGATED THE KILLING OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MUTURA COMMUNE. THE DECEASED WAS A HUTU WHO HAD RECENTLY RETURNED TO THIS AREA. HE WAS KILLED BY A GROUP OF UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS WHO BROKE INTO HIS HOUSE AT ABOUT 0100 HRS ON 23 APR 95. RPA REACHED HIS HOUSE 10 MINUTES AFTER THE SHOOTING AND DELIVERED FIRST AID. INTERAHAMWE INVOLVEMENT IS SUSPECTED.

(C) MILOBS ALSO VISITED THE NYUNDO ORPHANAGE AND GISENYI HOSPITAL. THEY FOLLOWED UP REQUESTS FOR FOOD AND DETERGENTS. THEY LIAISED WITH NGOS AND PROVIDED ITEMS TO THE ORPHANAGE.

(D) MILOBS PATROLLED BUTARO GR 8243, CYERU GR 8035 AND NYMUGALI GR 8722. THE BURGEMESTRE AND LOCALS STILL EXPRESS CONCERN ABOUT MINES IN THE AREAS AND ARE APPEALING TO UNAMIR TO CLEAR THEM.

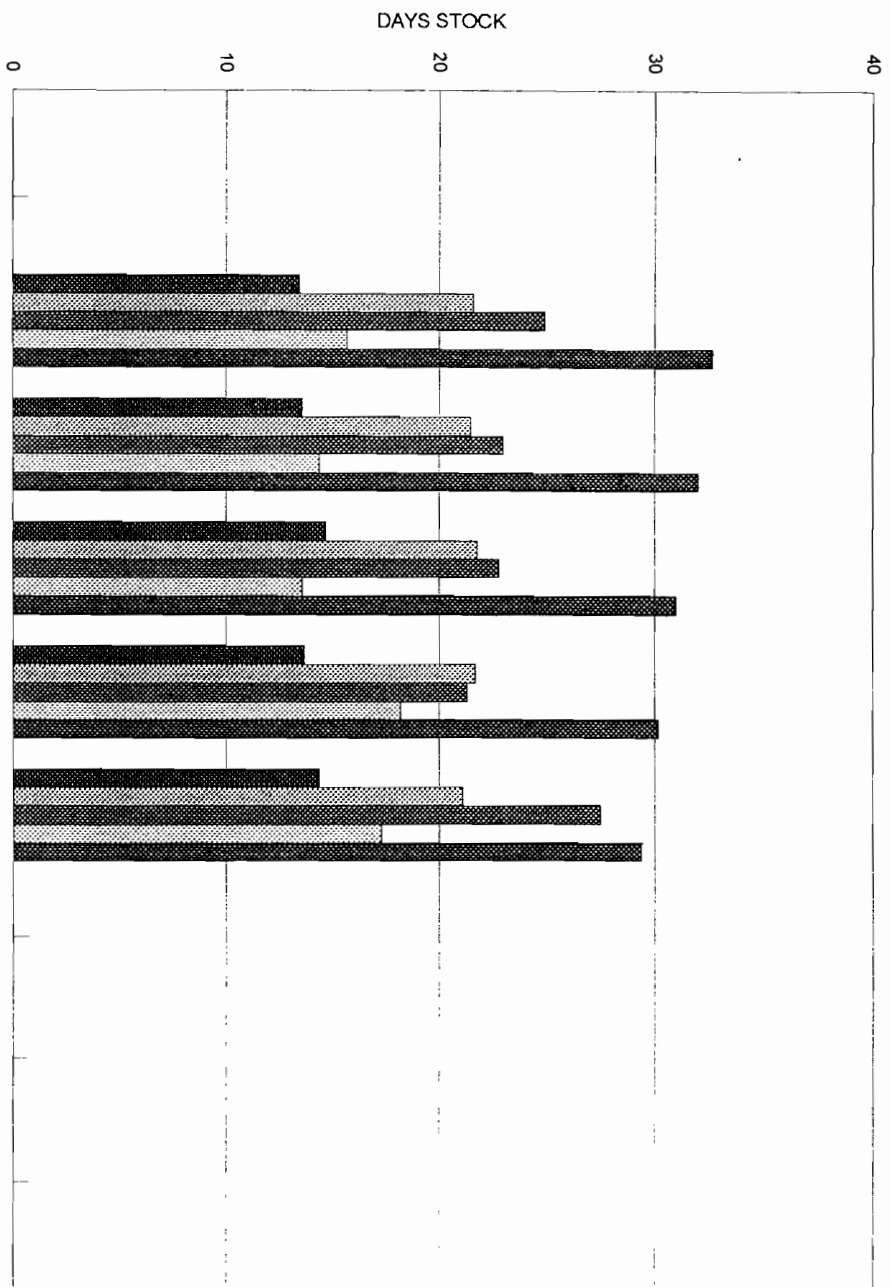

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. AS OF DAWN THIS MORNING, APRIL 23, 1995, UNAMIR ESTIMATED THE NUMBER OF DEAD TO BE 2,000 AND MORE THAN 600 WOUNDED IN KIBEHO CAMP.

B. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, HELD MEETINGS WITH UN AGENCY HEADS AND WITH HIS ADVISORS TO ADDRESS CONCERNS AND PLAN FOLLOW-UP ACTION IN CONNECTION WITH KIBEHO. IN



ADDITION, HE SPOKE TO THE PRIME MINISTER, H.E. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, WHO IS CURRENTLY IN BELGIUM, TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE INCIDENTS IN KIBEHO, AS WELL AS ON THE GOVERNMENT'S RESPONSE. AS OF 2000HRS, NO STATEMENT HAD YET BEEN ISSUED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC NOR BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE.

C. UNAMIR TROOPS HAVE BEEN CONDUCTING TRIAGE IN ORDER TO ASSIST WITH THE MEDICAL SITUATION ON THE GROUND. THE AUSTRALIAN MEDICAL TEAM IS PRESENTLY OPERATING IN THE CAMP AND IS BEING AUGMENTED. THE INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL COMMUNITY IS ATTEMPTING TO RALLY MEDICAL SUPPORT IN THEATRE AND IS MAKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR REINFORCEMENT WITH EXTERNAL MEDICAL RESOURCES.

D. UNAMIR TROOPS ARE PROVIDING SHELTER FOR APPROXIMATELY 250 ORPHANED CHILDREN WHO ARE IN THE SANCTUARY OF THE ZAMBIAN COMPANY LOCATION AT KIBEHO CAMP.

E. UNAMIR VEHICLES ARE BEING MADE AVAILABLE AGAIN TODAY TO PROVIDE TRANSPORT TO THOSE IN NEED IN THE OTHER INTERNALLY DISPLACED CAMPS OF NDAGO, KAMANA AND MUNINI.

F. BOTH UNHCR AND IOM HAVE EXPRESSED CONCERN THAT:

(1) IDPs FROM KIBEHO CAMP ARE BEING FORCED INSIDE THE TRUCKS IN LARGE NUMBERS BY THE RPA (MORE THAN 250 PER VEHICLE, WHICH COULD LEAD TO PANIC AND/OR SUFFOCATION).

(2) ARMED MILITARY ESCORTS ARE ACCOMPANYING RETURNING IDPs INSIDE EVERY TRUCK AND BUS RUN BY IOM.

(3) THERE ARE REPORTS THAT SOME RETURNING IDPS HAVE BEEN STONED OR KILLED BY LOCAL POPULATION, AND MANY HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY AUTHORITIES WITH ANY MONITORING BY NEUTRAL OBSERVERS.

G. RWANDESE PATRIOTIC ARMY SOLDIERS HAVE BURIED A LARGE NUMBER (PERHAPS HALF) OF THE BODIES OF VICTIMS KILLED IN KIBEHO CAMP.

H. SEVERAL HUNDREDS OF DISPLACED PEOPLE REMAIN IN KIBEHO CAMP. THESE INDIVIDUALS WERE REPORTEDLY WARNED BY THE RPA TO LEAVE THE CAMP IMMEDIATELY.

### 3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

#### A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AT MUNINI RPA STOLE 50 COWS FROM LOCALS. DESPITE CLOSE OF NDAGO CAMP, LARGE PRESENCE OF RPA STILL OBSERVED AROUND THE CAMP. THEY ARE REFUSING IDPS MOVING OUT TO CARRY ANY OF THEIR BELONGINGS. THE RPA WERE ALSO REPORTED LOOTING IN THE CAMP.

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(2) SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED TO BE SCREENING IDPS AT THE HUYE STADIUM IN BUTARE. SEVERAL IDPS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND TAKEN TO RPA BARRACKS IN BUTARE FOR INTERROGATION. SEVERAL IDPS HAD THEIR PERSONAL EFFECTS SUCH AS RADIOS AND MATTRESSES CONFISCATED BY RPA TROOPS.

(3) IN SECTOR 2, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS IN NGENDA (GR 0644) FIRED AT 2 IDPS WHO TRIED TO ESCAPE FROM A CONVOY OF IDP TRUCKS ON THEIR WAY TO GASHORA. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED AROUND 1600 HRS CLOSE TO THE GHANBATT POSN IN NGENDA. ANOTHER WOMAN WHO ALSO TRIED TO ESCAPE WAS ARRESTED BY RPA AND DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE HOLDING FACILITY IN NGENDA. THE EXTENT OF INJURY TO THE PERSONS FIRED UPON IS UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(4) IN SECTOR 3A, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 5 FEMALE CLEANERS WORKING IN THE MILOB OFFICE IN KIBUYE FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. SECTOR MILOBS AND HR TEAM INVESTIGATING.

C. MILITIA. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 230230 HRS AROUND NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 10 BANDITS FROM ZAIRE, 4 OF THEM ARMED, AFTER THROWING A GRENADE AND FIRING WARNING SHOTS, ROBBED A 50KG BAG OF COFFEE AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS AND ESCAPED.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) AT NGARAMA NO 2 PL COMD MET WITH THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND COMMUNE LEADER TO DISCUSS PEACEFUL CO-EXISTENCE BETWEEN RPA, UNAMIR AND THE LOCALS.

(3) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 10 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ONE PL OF GHANBATT SOLDIERS LEFT BN HQ KIBUNGO FOR BUTARE TO REINFORCE UNAMIR TROOPS IN SECTOR 4B.

(4) ZAMBATT YESTERDAY HANDED OVER 113 UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN FROM KIBEHO AND NDAGO TO SOLIDARITE AND 07 ZAIRIAN CHILDREN AND 75 ORPHANS FROM NDAGO WERE TAKEN TO BUTARE BY SAVE CHILDREN.

(5) PROVIDED SECURITY DURING THE DISTRIBUTION OF ONE DAY RATION BY ICRC IN KAMANA CAMP.

(6) RURAMBA, BUHORO, MUNINI CAMPS ARE EMPTY. NDAGO IS ALSO CLOSED AND A TOTAL OF 9,000 IDPs WERE OBSERVED LEAVING MUNINI CAMP ON FOOT. AT KAMANA 6 IDPs DIED FROM HUNGER AND 4 OTHERS SHOT DEAD WHEN THEY TRIED TO BREAK THROUGH AN RPA CORDON IN THE CAMP.

(7) THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED KIBEHO DPC. HE TALKED TO THE PRESS.

(8) IN KIBEHO, SEVERAL HUNDRED PEOPLE HAVE REFUSED TO MOVE OUT OF AN NGO COMPLEX IN THE CAMP. THEIR FATE IS NOT YET KNOWN BUT REPORTS RECEIVED INDICATE THAT RPA HAVE AGREED TO ALLOWED THEM TO STAY TILL MORNING OF 24 APR 95. AT WHICH TIME THEY WILL BE EVICTED.

(9) A LOCAL WORKING AS A COMM OFFR WITH UNICEF GIKONGORO REPORTED TO TAC HQ THAT RPA SEIZED FROM HIM AT GUN POINT A 16 CHANNEL MOTOROLA WHEN HE WAS COMING FROM KIBEHO. THEY ALLEGED HE WAS COMMUNICATING WITH FRGF AND THREATENED THAT THEY WILL ARREST HIM SOON.

(B) DEPLOYED 3 MILOB TEAMS TO SECTOR 4B TO MONITOR THE SITUATION IN THAT SECTOR.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED HEARING SOME SPORADIC GUNFIRE IN THE GITARAMA TOWN DURING THE PERIOD. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS CALM EXCEPT IN THE DPCS AT KIBEHO, NDAGO, MUNINI AND KAMANA WHICH ARE TENSE DUE TO THE FORCED CLOSURE OF THE CAMPS BY RPA TROOPS. THE SITUATION BY CAMPS IS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) KIBEHO. SPORADIC FIRING WAS HEARD EARLY IN THE MORNING AROUND THE CAMP. INITIALLY NGOS WERE REFUSED ENTRY, BUT LATER ALLOWED TO ENTER THE CAMP AFTER NEGOTIATION WITH THE LOCAL RPA COMDS. ABOUT 200 DPS WERE SCREENED AND REGISTERED BY RPA AND EVACUATED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES AND ABOUT 300 IDPs, SOME OF WHOM ARE BELIEVED TO BE ARMED, AND PROBABLY ELEMENTS OF FRGF WERE HELD IN A BUILDING WITHIN THE CAMP AND ARE REFUSING TO LEAVE. MILOBS BELIEVE THAT THE RPA WILL LAUNCH AN OPERATION TO DISLODGE THIS GROUP FROM THE BUILDING, IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT OTHER IDPs WHO ARE SCATTERED ABOUT MAY JOIN THEM DURING THE NIGHT. BOTH THE FC AND PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED THE CAMP AND HAD DISCUSSIONS WITH UNAMIR PERSONNEL DEPLOYED IN THE CAMP. 384 ORPHANS WERE EVACUATED BY THE ICRC. 150 MEN WERE ALSO ROUNDED BY THE RPA ON ALLEGATIONS OF PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY WERE USED FOR CLEARING REFUSE AROUND THE CAMP. AT THE TIME OF SUBMISSION OF THIS REPORT THE CAMPS IS COMPLETELY CLEARED OF IDPs EXCEPT THE SMALL GROUP OCCUPYING THE MSF COMPLEX. THE CASUALTY STATE OF IDPs IS ESTIMATED AT ABOUT 2,000

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DEAD AND 650 WOUNDED. MILOBS STILL STATIONED AT THE CAMP TO MONITOR THE SITUATION.

(2) KAMANA. THERE WAS NEITHER REGISTRATION NOR SCREENING OF IDPS IN THE CAMP DURING THE PERIOD. ICRC DISTRIBUTION ONE DAY RATIONS TO THE IDPS. RPA DUG ABOUT 20 FIRE TRENCHES NEAR THE ZAMBATT POSITION. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE TRENCHES ARE TO PREVENT THE IDPS FROM RUNNING AWAY.

(3) MUNINI. THE MUNINI CAMP WAS REPORTED CLOSED DOWN. 9,000 OF THE ESTIMATED 16,000 IDPS WERE SEEN HEADING OUT OF THE CAMP. THE REMAINDER WERE PRESUMED TO HAVE LEFT THE CAMP PREVIOUSLY. RPA TROOPS PREVENTED THE IDPS FROM TAKING THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS WITH THEM. NO FIRING WAS HEARD FROM THE CAMP.

(4) NDAGO. IDPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE VACATED THE CAMP COMPLETELY. THERE WAS ABOUT A COMPANY STR OF RPA TROOPS IN THE CAMP. 75 ORPHANS LEFT BEHIND WERE EVACUATED BY THE NGO SAVE THE CHILDREN. IDPS WERE PREVENTED FROM CARRYING THEIR PERSONAL POSSESSIONS. RPA TROOPS WERE OBSERVED SEARCHING THE ITEMS LEFT BEHIND BY THE IDPS.

(5) NYAMIGINA. POCKETS OF IDPS NUMBERING ABOUT 900 IN ALL WERE SEEN LEAVING THE CAMP TOWARDS GIKONGORO. THERE WERE NO RPA TROOPS OBSERVED AROUND THE CAMP. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE IDPS WERE LEAVING VOLUNTARILY DUE TO EVENTS IN OTHER CAMPS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS TENSE. IDPS EVACUATED FROM THE KIBEHO CAMP WERE STONED BY THE LOCALS OF THE COMMUNES ON ARRIVAL.

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE ACTIVITIES CONNECTED WITH 5,000 IDPS WHO WERE EVACUATED TO BUTARE FROM KIBEHO. RPA TROOPS SCREENED THE IDPS ON ARRIVAL. THE PROCESS WAS HOWEVER SLOW DUE TO THEIR LARGE NUMBER AND THE POOR RECEPTION GIVEN BY THE LOCALS IN THE BUTARE AREA. SOME OF THE IDPS AT THE HUYE STADIUM WERE IDENTIFIED BY LOCALS TO THE RPA AS PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE AND WERE SUBSEQUENTLY ARRESTED BY RPA. THE EXACT FIGURES OF THOSE ARRESTED IS YET TO BE CONFIRMED.

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SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED UNSTABLE BUT CALM. THERE WAS A SHOOTING INCIDENT AT ISHARA PENINSULA GR 0044 AT 0230 HRS IN THE NIGHT OF 22/23 APR 95. DETAILS BEING OBTAINED.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

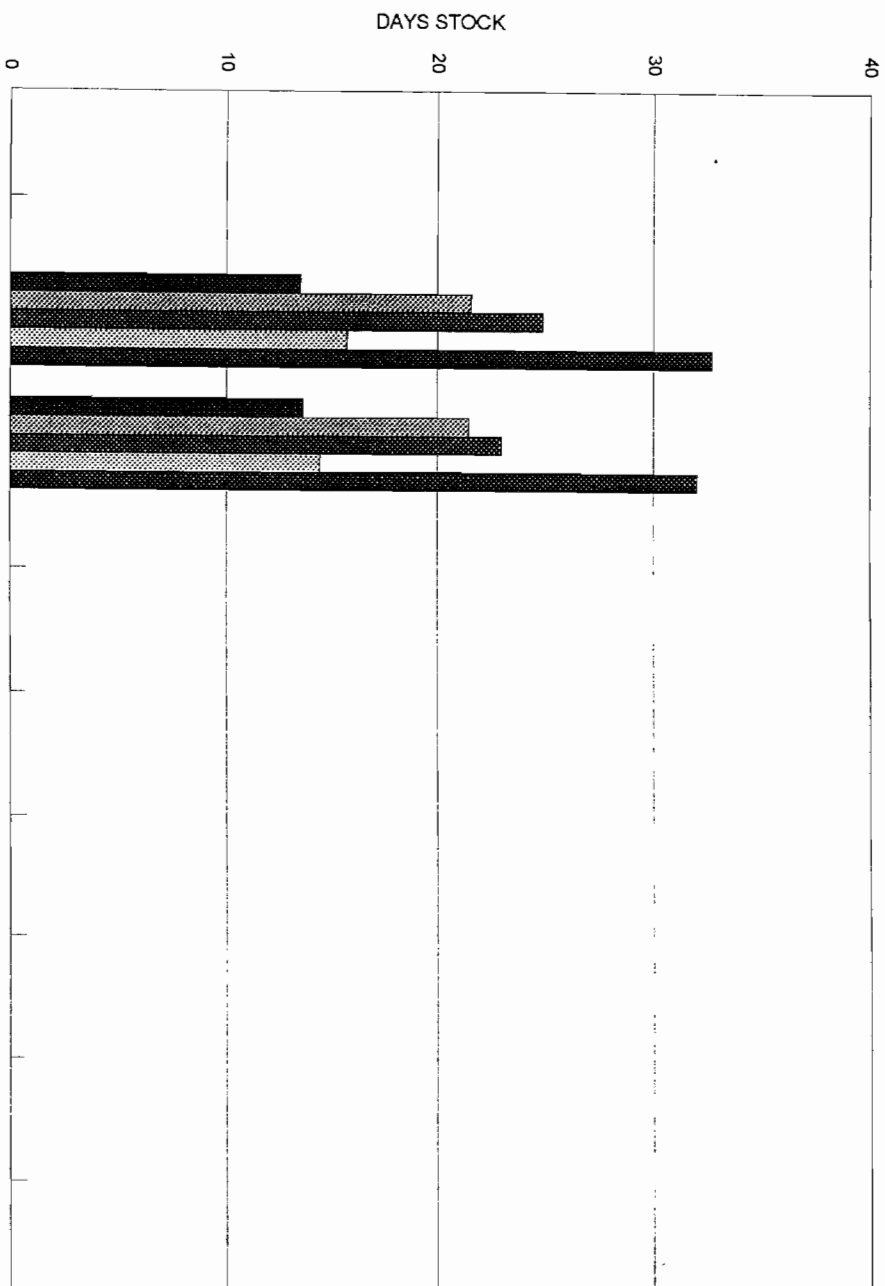



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. AT ABOUT 221200B APR 95 AN ATTEMPT BY SOME IDPs TO BREAK THE RPA CORDON AT KIBEHO CAMP RESULTED IN INDISCRIMINATE SHOOTING BY THE RPA. THE SHOOTING LASTED FOR ABOUT 2 HOURS. NUMBER OF DEATHS NOT CFM, HOWEVER FIGURES VARY FROM 30 TO NEARLY 300. FIGURES OF INJURED IDPs VARY BUT IT IS ALSO IN THE SAME RANGE. DETAILS TO FOLLOW.

## 2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THIS MORNING, AMBASSADOR KHAN, THE SRSG, HELD INTERNAL MEETINGS, INCLUDING A MEETING AT THE INTEGRATED OPERATIONS CENTRE (IOC) AT THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, TO DISCUSS FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS CONCERNING THE SITUATION IN KIBEHO, NDAGO, MUNINI AND KAMANA CAMPS.

B. HE PRESIDED OVER A MEETING ON SECURITY DURING WHICH HE BRIEFED ALL LOCAL AND INTERNATIONAL STAFF ON SECURITY MEASURES AND ALSO ON HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT ON THE SUBJECT OF SECURITY.

C. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RWANDAN ARMY CHIEF OF STAFF TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATED TO THE KIBEHO SITUATION, AND THEN RECEIVED MR. COURBIN, THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR, TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE OVERALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND ON FRANCE'S ROLE IN RWANDA.

D. UPON LEARNING OF THE EVENTS IN KIBEHO, THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD AN EMERGENCY MEETING WITH THE RWANDAN CHIEF OF STAFF COL. SAM KAKA DURING WHICH THEY EXPRESSED THEIR PROFOUND SHOCK AND CONCERN AT THE LOSS OF LIFE AND EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR A NONVIOLENT APPROACH.

E. UNAMIR HAS PLACED ALL ITS MEDICAL FACILITIES ON ALERT AND IS TRANSPORTING THE INJURED BY HELICOPTER TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL UNITS IN BUTARE AND KIGALI. THE AUSTRALIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT GROUP, ALSO PART OF UNAMIR, IS ALSO FULLY MOBILIZED TO ATTEND TO THE INJURED. ELEMENTS OF THE ZAMBIAN BATTALION DEPLOYED IN THE CAMPS HAVE REMAINED IN THEIR POSITIONS AND ARE ASSISTING IN PROVIDING SECURITY, PARTICULARLY TO WOMEN AND CHILDREN WHO HAVE SOUGHT SANCTUARY WITH THEM.

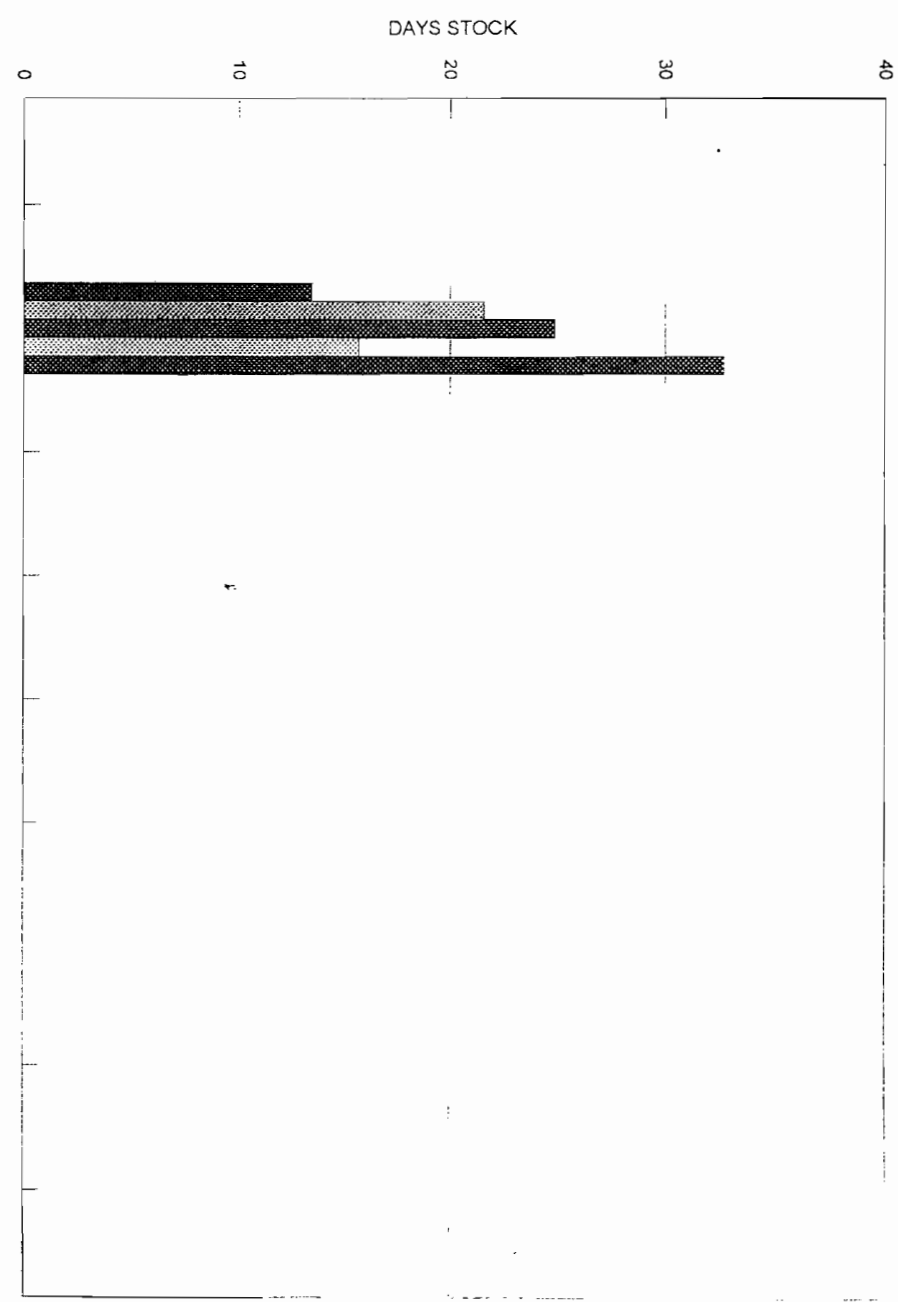

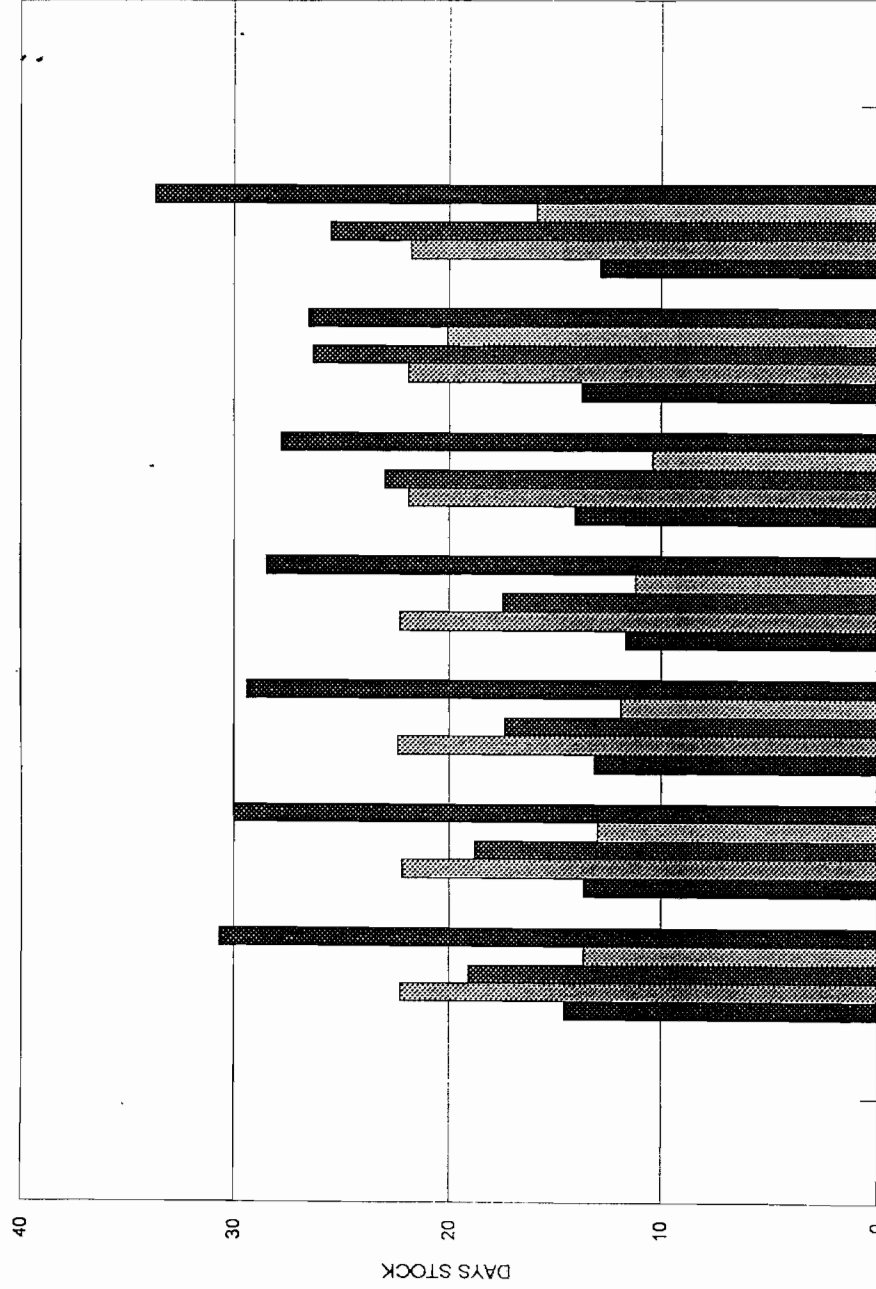

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 3, RPA ELMS CONDUCTED A SEARCH OF RESIDENCES IN KIBUYE INCLUDING THOSE OF NGOS. THE RPA LO SAID THE WPNS' SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED THROUGHOUT KIBUYE TOWN AND NGOS WERE PLACED ON THE LIST BECAUSE THEY RESIDE THERE. THE SOLDIER WHO LED THE SEARCH, MENTIONED THAT THE SEARCH WAS PART OF SECURITY PREPARATIONS FOR AN IMPENDING VISIT BY THE PRESIDENT TO KIBUYE TOWN. THE SOLDIERS WERE NOT PARTICULARLY AGGRESSIVE.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AT 201730B APR 95 AT KIBEHO DPC, RPA OPENED FIRE KILLING THIRTEEN AND INJURING TWENTY-FOUR IDPs. RPA CLAIMED AN IDP ATTEMPTED TO GRAB A RIFLE FROM AN RPA SOLDIER. THE INJURED BEING ATTENDED TO BY ZAMBATT MEDICAL TEAMS. SITUATION REPORTED BACK TO NORMAL.

D. IN SECTOR 4B, DEMONSTRATION WAS HELD AT ABOUT 1000HRS BY THE LOCAL POPULATION IN BUTARE. IT WAS ORGANISED TO SHOW THE DISPLEASURE OF THE PEOPLE TO THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF UNAMIR AND OTHER NGOS OPERATING IN RWANDA. THE CROWD ESTIMATED AT 3,000 STARTED FROM THE GATE OF THE UNIVERSITY AND ARRIVED AT TAC HQ AT ABOUT 1020HRS. THERE WAS NO HOSTILE INCIDENT. THE PREFECT OF BUTARE AND THE BOURGEMESTRE OF NGOMA COMMUNE WERE REPORTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE DEMONSTRATION. SOME OF THE PLACARDS BORE THE FOLLOWING INSCRIPTIONS:

- (1) UNAMIR - INTERHAMWE.
- (2) WE ASK THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY NOT TO BLUFF US ABOUT INSECURITY IN ORDER TO BELITTLE THE GENOCIDE. IN RWANDA, WE ARE FED UP WITH EXTERNAL FORCES.
- (3) NGO = SLAVERY, TREASON, STOP JOKING!
- (4) UNAMIR = UNDESIRE IN RWANDA!
- (5) MILITARY FOREIGN INTERVENTION NEVER SETTLED NATIONAL PROBLEMS.
- (6) BOUTROS LET TRUTH SPEAK! LET US BUILD OUR RWANDA.
- (7) OUR COUNTRY IS NEITHER A SEXUAL EXPERIMENT PLACE NOR CINEMA PLACE WHERE EVERYONE IS PLAYING A ROLE AND DISAPPEARS.

- (8) UNAMIR MISSION HAS TO BE REVIEWED.
- (9) BOUTROS, BRING BACK HOME YOUR UNAMIR, YOUR USELESS UNAMIR.

B. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE AMBASSADORS OF BELGIUM, THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY, FRANCE AND GERMANY AND THE REPRESENTATIVES OF GREAT BRITAIN AND THE NETHERLANDS ON THE SUBJECTS OF SECURITY AND INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE.

C. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU DEPARTED KIGALI WEDNESDAY EVENING FOR A ONE-WEEK VISIT TO SEVERAL SCANDINAVIAN COUNTRIES.

(2) THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, RECEIVED SUCCESSIVELY THE U.S. AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, MR. DAVID RAWSON, A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN HIGH COMMISSION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, MR. KABLAN, AND MR. JOST, THE NEW REPRESENTATIVE OF IOM IN RWANDA.

(3) MR. GASANA TALKED WITH THE US AMBASSADOR ABOUT THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES AND THE RECENT ACTS OF INSECURITY ON THE RWANDAN BORDER WITH ZAIRE. THE RWANDAN MINISTER TOLD HIM THAT RWANDA WAS COMMITTED TO THE NAIROBI AGREEMENT ON REFUGEES, AND THAT RWANDA WOULD PARTICIPATE IN THE DAKAR MEETING THAT WILL GATHER REPRESENTATIVES FROM AFRICAN AND AMERICAN COUNTRIES FROM THE 1ST TO THE 6TH OF MAY, 95.

(4) THE REPRESENTATIVE OF UNHCR TALKED WITH THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER ABOUT THE RESPECT FOR LEGAL PROCEDURES IN THE ARREST OF SUSPECTED CRIMINALS AND THE STATUS OF THE TRIALS OF PEOPLE ACCUSED OF INVOLVEMENT IN GENOCIDE. BOTH AGREED THAT NO DENUNCIATIONS SHOULD BE MADE WITHOUT EVIDENCE.

(5) THE OPERATION TO CLOSE THE CAMPS OF INTERNALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE CONTINUED ON WEDNESDAY WITH ACTIONS TO CLOSE THE CAMPS OF MUNINI AND KAMANA, FOLLOWING THE CLOSURE OF KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS. THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, VISITED THE REGION ON WEDNESDAY TO OVERSEE THE OPERATION. THE OPERATION PROCEEDED SMOOTHLY WITH THE DISPLACED PEOPLE DESTROYING THEIR HUTS AND PROMPTLY LEAVING FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(5) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT TWO PLATOONS OF RPA TROOPS CONTROLLED THE ANTI-UNAMIR DEMONSTRATION AT BUTARE YESTERDAY.

(6) AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 200945B APR 95, A BLUE SEDAN VEHICLE WAS STOPPED BY AN RPA SOLDIER. VEHICLE WAS TRAVELLING NORTHBOUND PAST HQ AUSMED WHEN IT WAS STOPPED. VEH DVR ALIGHTED AND SPOKE WITH RPA SOLDIER IN KINYARWANDAN. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, THE DVR WAS SHOT IN THE LEG AND WAS BLEEDING HEAVILY. HE WAS MOVED BY RPA TO THEIR BARRACKS ON SOUTHSIDE OF RUE DE L'HOSPITAL. THE CAUSE OF THE INCIDENT IS UNCLEAR DUE TO LANGUAGE DIFFICULTY. RPA LO AND UN MP INFORMED. AND INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

THE BURGEMESTRE WHO WAS INTENDED TO PRESENT FAVOURABLE TESTIMONIALS FROM THE PEOPLE WHO HAD BEEN HELPED BY THE PRIESTS FAILED TO DO SO. THE PRIEST BELIEVED THAT THE PROBLEM WAS MOTIVATED BY THE MILITARY AND THAT THEY WOULD SOON BE ARRESTED. FATHER LEONARD ASKED THAT HE BE GIVEN A PAPER OF SOME SORT STATING THAT IN CASE OF ARREST UNAMIR/HUMAN RIGHTS MUST BE CONTACTED. IT WAS THE INTENTION OF SECTOR 3 TO REFUSE ON THE GROUNDS THAT IT WOULD NOT HAVE ANY EFFECT ON THE RPA. THE PRIESTS WILL BE VISITED DAILY AND THE POSSIBILITY OF PROVIDING GUARDS WILL BE DISCUSSED WITH THE PRIESTS. THE INDIVIDUAL WHO HAD BEEN ARRESTED FOR MAKING FALSE ACCUSATION HAS NOW BEEN ELECTED COUNSELLOR IN PLACE OF THE PERSON HE HAD ACCUSED.

(C) COMBINED MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM ATTEMPTED TO INVESTIGATE CASES OF INDIVIDUALS WHO HAD FLED TO GITARAMA HQ FROM TAMBWE GR 7653 AND HAD RETURNED HOME LAST WEEK. THE TEAM FAILED TO INVESTIGATE THE CASES BECAUSE THE NAMES GIVEN BY INDIVIDUALS WERE FALSE AS NOBODY COULD BE FOUND.

(E) KIBUYE MILOB TEAM WENT TO RUGABANO (GR 4266) TO INVESTIGATE A MURDER WHICH OCCURRED ON 25 MARCH 95. THE TEAM REPORTED THAT EARLY IN THE MORNING OF 25 MARCH 95, THE RPA WENT TO THE HOUSE OF A HUTU MALE, AGED 47, WHO PANICKED AND RAN OUT TO THE BUSH. HE WAS WOUNDED BY A GUNSHOT AND CARRIED BACK TO THE HOUSE BY RPA WHERE THEY SLIT HIS THROAT. THERE WERE FOUR WITNESSES, ONE OF THEM WAS READY TO IDENTIFY THE SOLDIER WHO WIELDED THE KNIFE. THE SOUS-PREFECT WHO WAS INFORMED ABOUT THIS CLAIMED THAT THERE WAS NO NEED OF A FORMAL INVESTIGATION SINCE THE MAN WAS A THIEF.

(F) A PATROL FROM KIBUYE TO GITWA GR 2560 OBSERVED THAT THERE WAS VERY LITTLE ACTIVITY IN THE AREAS PATROLLED.

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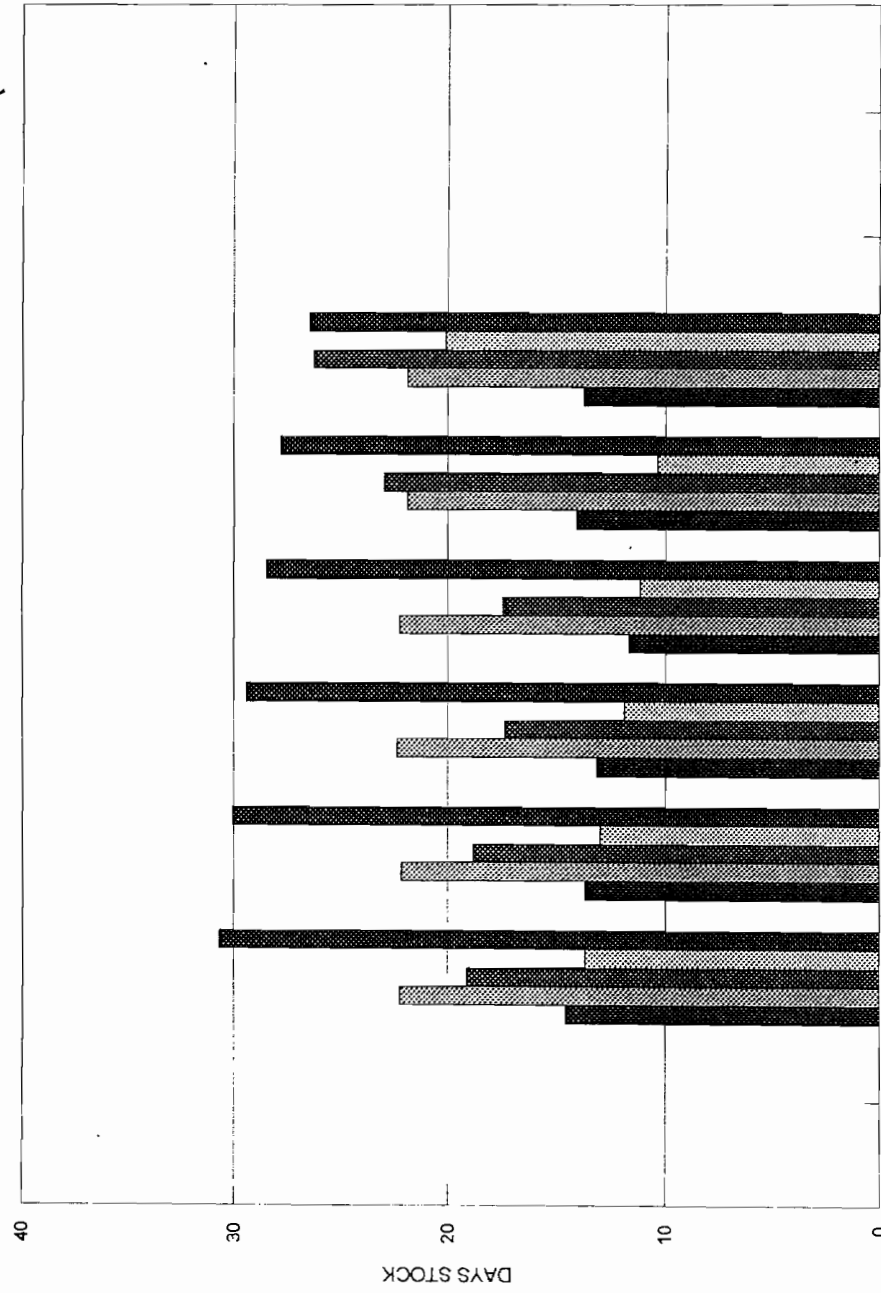

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. DFC AND DCOS OPS VISITED KIBEHO CAMP AND NOTED THAT DESPITE URGENT SITUATION AND APPALING CONDITION OF THE IDPs THAT MANY OF THE AGENCIES AND NGOS HAD NOT YET RESTARTED HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITY. IDPs WERE CROWDED TOGETHER IN UNSANITARY, UNHYGENIC CONDITIONS WITHOUT FOOD AND WATER. UNAMIR WAS SINGULARLY ATTEMPTING TO MOVE IDPs USING TRANSPORT COLLATED FROM ALL UNITS AND USING OWN RESOURCES WITH UNHRFO AND RPA ASSISTANCE TO REGISTER IDPs. 950 IDPs WERE MOVED TO BUTARE COMMUNES AND SOME TO BUTARE TRANSIT CAMP.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, PRESIDED OVER HIS REGULAR HEADS OF UN AGENCIES MEETING DURING WHICH HE DISCUSSED, AMONG OTHERS, SECURITY ISSUES, INCLUDING THE EVENTS IN KIBEHO CAMP. HE HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE DURING WHICH HE ADDRESSED QUESTIONS OF SECURITY AND, ESPECIALLY, THE DEVELOPMENTS IN KIBEHO CAMP. HE CONCLUDED BY MEETING WITH MR. TAKEHITO NAKATA, THE HONOURARY AMBASSADOR FOR THE UNITED NATIONS VOLUNTEERS TO DISCUSS THE UPCOMING ARRIVAL OF UNVS.

B. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ON TUESDAY BEGAN THE OPERATION TO CLOSE THE SEVEN CAMPS IN GIKONGORO WHICH HOUSE 120,000 INTERNALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE. ON TUESDAY, THE GOVERNMENT ARMED FORCES INITIALLY SURROUNDED THE KIBEHO CAMP AND FIRED INTO THE AIR, CAUSING PANIC AND A SUBSEQUENT STAMPEDE OF THE CROWD. SOME CHILDREN WERE CRUSHED TO DEATH IN THE STAMPEDE AND A WOMAN WAS WOUNDED.

(2) THE MILITARY LEADERS HELD A MEETING WITH THE POPULATION, AND THE DISPLACED PEOPLE ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WERE HAPPY WITH THE OPERATION AND WERE EAGER TO RETURN HOME. THE POPULATION WAS INFORMED THAT UNAMIR AND NGOS OPERATING IN GIKONGORO HAD STOPPED DISTRIBUTING FOOD AID IN THE CAMPS.

(3) THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION, MR. JACQUES BIHOZAGARA ANNOUNCED AT A PRESS CONFERENCE IN KIGALI THAT THE OPERATION TO CLOSE THE CAMPS HAD INITIALLY BEEN PLANNED TO BEGIN ON 15 APRIL BUT WAS POSTPONED UNTIL 18 APRIL BECAUSE OF THE MOURNING WEEK IN MEMORY OF THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE.

(4) HE UNDERLINED THAT UNAMIR AND THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS AND NGOS OPERATING IN THE CAMPS HAD BEEN INFORMED AHEAD OF TIME. HE CALLED FOR THE DISPLACED PEOPLE TO RETURN HOME, AND HE GUARANTEED THAT THEIR SECURITY WOULD BE ENSURED AS IT WAS ENSURED FOR THE REST OF THE POPULATION IN THE COUNTRY.

(5) SPEAKING AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE, MR. BIHOZAGARA ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT A DECISION HAD BEEN MADE STIPULATING THAT PEOPLE WISHING TO GET BACK THEIR PROPERTY WOULD BE REQUIRED TO HAVE A PERMIT SIGNED BY FOUR MINISTERS, NAMELY THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE, THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR, THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION, AND THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE. MR. BIHOZAGARA EXPLAINED THAT, UP UNTIL NOW, ONLY THE INTERESTS OF PROPERTY OWNERS HAVE BEEN RESPECTED,

WHILE THE INTERESTS OF HOMELESS GENOCIDE SURVIVORS HAVE BEEN IGNORED BY THE INTERIOR-MINISTRY-CONTROLLED NATIONAL COMMISSION WHICH HAD BEEN, UP UNTIL NOW, IN CHARGE OF RESTORING PROPERTY TO THE RIGHTFUL OWNERS.

(6) THE RWANDESE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, RECEIVED IN HIS OFFICE THE REPRESENTATIVE OF ACCT (AGENCE DE COOPERATION CULTURELLE ET TECHNIQUE), MR. JEAN FRANÇOIS BONNET. MR. GASANA PRAISED THE AGENCY FOR ITS ASSISTANCE IN THE JUSTICE AND EDUCATION SECTORS IN RWANDA.

(2) PROVIDED THREE VEHS IN SUPPORT OF GENDARMERIE TRAINING.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 191 LOCALS IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) RRF WAS DEPLOYED AT 182030 HRS FOR SEARCH OF VEHICLE UNAMIR 47, WHICH HAD BEEN STOLEN FROM MERIDIEN HOTEL. ALSO DESPATCHED RRF TO B & R COMPOUND AT 182045 HRS TO INVESTIGATE AN ARMED ROBBERY COMMITTED BY FOUR ARMED PERSONS.

(4) 105 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM RUHENGARI AND KIBUNGO. 93 WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, RUHENGARI AND KANZENZE.

(5) ABOUT 600 IDPs WERE TRANSPORTED BY INDBATT VEHICLES TO BUTARE AND OTHER HOME COMMUNES FROM KIBEHO IDP CAMP.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 14 UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF IN AOR.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

III. CYANIKA BORDER POST.

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) ALL ZAIRIAN BORDER CROSSINGS STILL CLOSED TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS. THE DFC/CMO HELD A MEETING WITH UN AGENCIES AND NGOS TO URGE THEM TO ASSIST IN THE EVAC OF IDPs BEING EJECTED FROM THE DPCs BEFORE THEY START DYING OF HUNGER DISEASE OR VIOLENCE. UN AGENCIES AND NGOS HAVE HOWEVER DECIDED TO SEEK APPROVAL FROM THEIR VARIOUS HQs BEFORE ASSISTING SINCE FORCED EVACUATION OF IDPS WAS AGAINST THEIR MANDATE. SOME NGOS HOWEVER AGREED TO ASSIST WITH FOOD AID STARTING ON 20 APR 95.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS INVESTIGATING A CASE OF HARASSMENT REPORTED BY A WOMAN AND HER 6 CHILDREN IN GATI (GR 4392). THE FAMILY IS STILL UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION.

(C) MILOB PATROLS TO GIRIMA (GR 5487) REPORTED THAT DURING A FOOTBALL MATCH FOR CHILDREN UNDER 15 YEARS, ONE OF THE SPECTATORS THREW A GRENADE ONTO THE FIELD. NO CAS REPORTED. SIX PERSONS HAVE HOWEVER BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INCIDENT.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) - CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PATROL TO KIBUYE COMMUNE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE INCREASING ANIMOSITY TOWARDS MILOBS BY LOCALS. LOCALS OFTEN APPROACHED PATROLS ASKING WHAT UNAMIR WAS DOING IN RWANDA AND DEMANDING THAT THEY GO HOME.

(C) MILOBS FOLLOWED UP THE RADIO BROADCASTS ON RADIO RWANDA INVOLVING TWO CATHOLIC FATHERS IN THE TABA (GR 8883) AND RUNDA COMMUNES. BOTH MEN BELIEVE THEY ARE NOT IN DANGER. THEY INFORMED MILOBS THAT THE ALLEGATIONS WERE STARTED BY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOW THE SUBJECT OF RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ACTION. THE PRIESTS ALSO MENTIONED THAT THE LOCAL RPA HAVE ENCOURAGED THE NEGATIVE ATTITUDE EXPRESSED ON RADIO RWANDA. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF TABA COMMUNE INFORMED SECTOR 3 HQ DURING THE PERIOD THAT HE HAD DEPOSITED A TESTIMONIAL WITH THE PREFECT SUPPORTING THE PRIESTS AND DEMANDING THAT RADIO RWANDA RETRACT THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST THE PRIESTS.

(D) PATROL TO KAYENZI COMMUNE LEARNED THAT ARBITRARY ARRESTS WERE STILL BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE COMMUNE. THE NAMES OF 4 RECENTLY ARRESTED PERSONS WERE COLLECTED FOR INVESTIGATION BY THE TEAM. THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMUNE OFFICE INFORMED MILOBS THAT THE RPA SELDOM INFORMED THE BOURGEMESTRE OF ARRESTS AND THEREFORE COULD NOT PROVIDE ANY INFO.

(E) PATROLS TO RUTONDE VILLAGE (GR 5880) IN THE KIVUMU COMMUNE WERE INFORMED THAT RPA TROOPS DRESSED IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES WERE HARASSING LOCALS AFTER EVERY VISIT BY UNAMIR PERSONNEL. LOCALS ALLEGED THAT RPA TROOPS APPROACHED LOCALS WHO WERE INTERVIEWED BY MILOBS AND DEMANDED A LIST OF QUESTIONS ASKED. RPA TROOPS OFTEN TRIED TO TELL THE LOCALS THAT UNAMIR WAS NO GOOD FOR RWANDA. IT WAS ALSO ALLEGED THAT PERSONS ARRESTED ON SUSPICION OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE WERE BOUND AND DRAGGED THROUGH THE STREETS IN RECENT TIMES.

(F) PATROL TO KAVUMU SECTEUR (GR 3355) OF GISIVU COMMUNE WAS UNABLE TO GATHER ANY INFORMATION DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF RPA TROOPS WHO FOLLOWED THEM THROUGHOUT THEIR PATROL AND HARASSED THEM THROUGH THEIR INTERPRETER.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS CALM EXCEPT IN THE KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS WHERE THERE WAS REPORTED TO BE TENSION DUE TO THE IMMINENT FORCED

CLOSURE OF THE CAMPS BY RPA TROOPS.

(B) IDPS FROM THE MUNINI CAMP HAVE CONVERGED AT THE ZAMBATT PL POSN FOR ASSISTANCE.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(2) PATROLS TO KIBEHO AND NDAGO IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT ALL UN AGENCIES AND NGOS HAD SHUNNED THE EXERCISE AND THAT ONLY UNAMIR HAD DESPATCHED VEHICLES TO EVAC IDPs. A TOTAL OF 14 UNAMIR TRUCKS TRANSPORTED 825 PERSONS FROM THE CAMP TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN THE BUTARE PREFECTURE. 1 ADDITIONAL PERSON WAS ALSO REPORTED DEAD FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE STAMPEDE DURING THE RPA CORDON AND SEARCH EXERCISE ON 18 APR 95 (TOTAL DEAD THUS TOTALS 11).

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED UNSTABLE. SEVERAL ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED. SOME LOCALS ARE STILL SEEKING PROTECTION WITH MILOBS AT NIGHT IN NYAMASHEKE. THE UVIRA CROSSING POINT REMAINS CLOSED ON THE RWANDESE SIDE.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED THAT BETWEEN 2200-0100 HRS ON THE NIGHT 18/19 APR 95, 19 ARMED BANDITS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM CROSSED THE LAKE IN A LARGE ROWING BOAT AND ROBBED 7 HOUSEHOLDS OF ALL PROPERTY AND LIVESTOCK IN GASAYO (GR 9941). THE BANDITS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE LEFT A LIST OF 7 INDIVIDUALS WHO HAD BEEN TARGETED FOR KILLING ON CHARGES OF BEING TRAITORS. THE MESSAGE ALSO WARNED YOUNG MEN TO MAKE THEMSELVES READY FOR TRAINING AT IJWI. ONE MAN WAS KIDNAPPED AFTER HIS HOUSE WAS ROBBED. THERE WERE NO DEATHS FROM THESE INCIDENTS HOWEVER SEVERAL PERSONS WERE INJURED. LOCALS REPORTED THAT THIS GROUP HAD BEEN THE SAME ONE THAT CARRIED OUT THE ROBBERIES ON 17 APR 95. THEY IDENTIFIED SOME OF THE BANDITS AS FORMER RESIDENTS OF THE AREA.

(D) MILOBS REPORTED HEARING THE FIRE OF AT LEAST ONE HEAVY MACHINE GUN AND SMALL ARMS OFF THE SOUTH-EASTERN COAST OF IJWI ISLAND AROUND 1630 HRS. THE FIRING LASTED APPROXIMATELY 30 MINS. IT WAS NOT AIMED AT THE MAINLAND. MILOBS SURMISE THAT SOME FORM OF TRAINING MAY HAVE BEEN TAKING PLACE ON THE ISLAND.

(E) MILOBS HELD CONFERENCE WITH THE SUB-PREFECT

AND RPA COMD OF BUGUYUMA TO DISCUSS THE INCIDENT OF 14 APR 95. THE SUB-PREFECT AND RPA COMD'S REMARKS INDICATED THEIR SUSPICIONS OF AN ORGANISED ATTEMPT BY THE FRGF AND MILITIA TO HARASS THE RPA AND TO RECRUIT LOCALS FOR TRAINING, WITH THE ULTIMATE AIM OF STAGING A COMEBACK TO RWANDA. THEY SAID THEY EXPECTED MORE OF SIMILAR INCIDENTS IN THE FUTURE.

(F) ABOUT 40 LOCALS FROM NYAMASHEKE WERE REPORTED TO BE CAMPED OUTSIDE THE MILOBS ACCOMMODATION FOR PROTECTION.

(G) MILOBS ATTENDED A MEETING WITH PREFECT OF CYANGUGU AND REPS OF NGOS, HUMAN RIGHTS AND LOCALS AUTHORITIES TO ORGANISE REPATRIATION OF IDPS FROM THE SECTOR.

(H) REPORTS WERE RECEIVED OF AN ATTACK ON THE VIRARA CAMP NEAR BUKAVU WHICH OCCURRED ON 11 APR 95 IN WHICH 3 PERSONS WERE SHOT DEAD AND 47 OTHERS INJURED. ONE VERSION STATED THAT THE INCIDENT FOLLOWED AN ATTACK WITHIN THE CAMP WHICH RESULTED IN A FIGHT BETWEEN REFUGEES AND ZAIREAN CIVILIANS. THE SECOND VERSION INDICATES THAT RPA TROOPS HAD INITIATED THE ATTACK. NEITHER VERSION HAS BEEN CONFIRMED. FURTHER INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(3) MILOBS RECEIVED AND BRIEFED THE AMBASSADOR OF JAPAN ON THE SECURITY SITUATION.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PATROL TO KICUKIRO VISITED THE CENTRE DES JEUNES GATENGA SCHOOL. THERE WERE ONLY 7 OF THE 24 TEACHERS WHO WERE AVAILABLE BEFORE THE WAR. PATROL WAS INFORMED THAT MOST OF THE FORMER TEACHERS WERE EITHER IN PRISON OR OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY. TEACHERS IN THE BUTAMWA COMMUNE HAVE NOT BEEN PAID SINCE DEC 94. THE PTL ALSO REPORTED THAT URGENT FOOD DISTRIBUTION IS REQUIRED AT NYARUBANDE COMMUNE DUE TO A FOOD SHORTAGE IN THE AREA CAUSED BY THE LACK OF RAIN.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 85 OUT-PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 11 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) LEGAL OFFR DEPLOYED WITH INF PROTECTION TO SECTOR 4B TO CONDUCT VISITS WITH UN AND LOCAL OFFICIALS IN CONNECTION WITH THE EVACUATION OF KIBEHO IDPs.

THE NYAMIRAMBO BRIGADE COMMANDER WAS NOT IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE FOR COMMENTS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

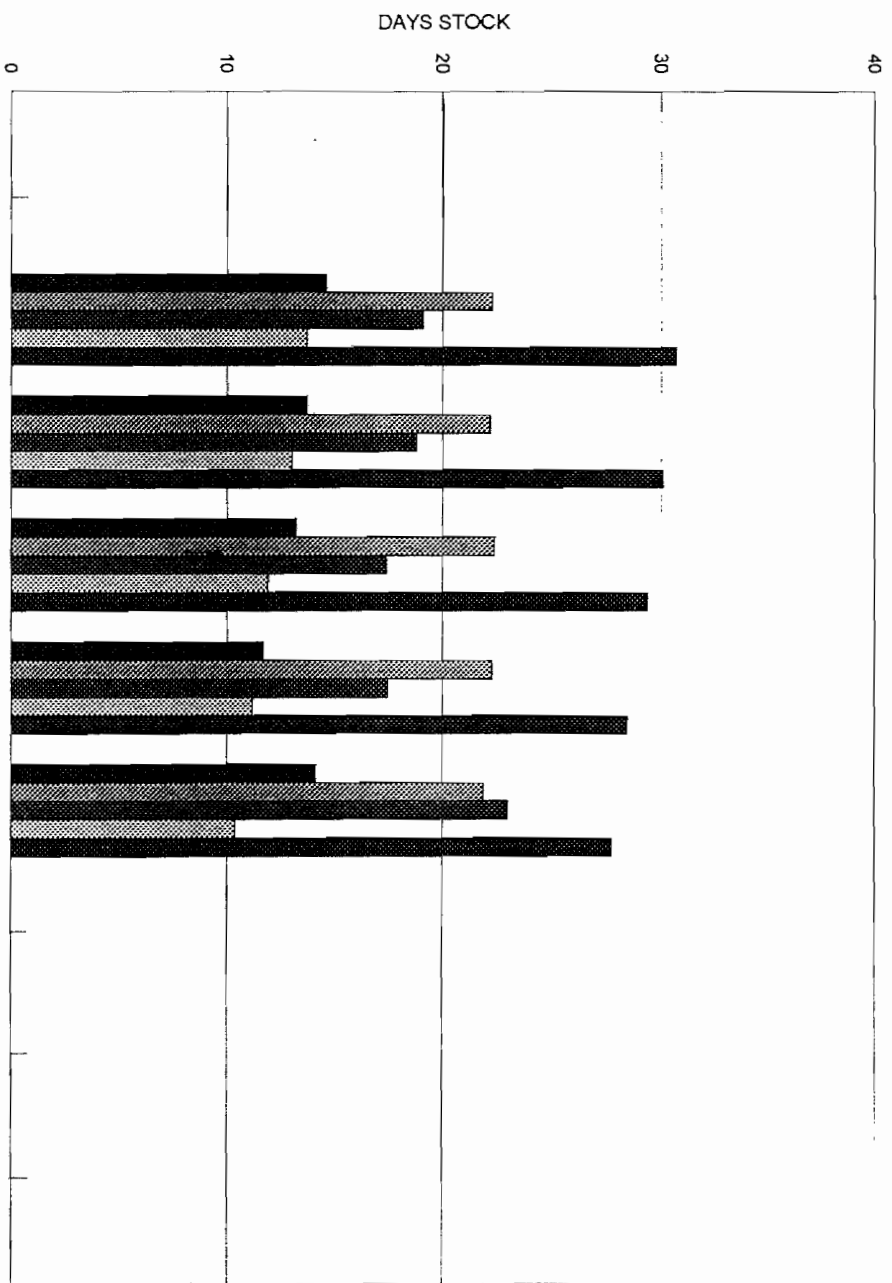

DAILY SITREP FOR 18 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. ZAMBATT IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT AT 0300 HRS RPA SOLDIERS SURROUNDED THE WHOLE OF KIBEHO, NDAGO AND MUNINI DPCs. FIRED SHOTS INTO THE AIR TO GATHER THE IDPs AT SELECTED PLACES. IN AN ATTEMPT TO SEEK PROTECTION WITHIN A ZAMBATT COMPOUND, 11 IDPs DIED DURING THE CRUSH OF THE CROWD OF IDPs. AT MUNINI, RPA HAVE PULLED DOWN IDP STRUCTURES TO FORCE THESE IDPs BACK TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. ZAMBATT TROOPS ALSO OBSERVED THAT SOME OF THE RPA SOLDIERS WERE LOOTING VALUABLE ITEMS FROM THE ABANDONED STRUCTURES. MEANWHILE UNAMIR AND UNHCR/IOM HAVE ARRANGED TRANSPORT TO MOVE IDPs WILLING TO GO BACK HOME.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, MET WITH MS. JEANNE-MARIE COLE OF UNDP TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, PROPOSALS FOR TRUST FUND FINANCING.

B. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH MR. CLARANCE, THE CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS, DURING WHICH THE TWO ADDRESSED THE TOPIC OF PRISONS SECURITY.

C. HE CONCLUDED BY RECEIVING MR. JACQUES COURBIN, THE AMBASSADOR OF FRANCE, TO DISCUSS FRANCE'S PROGRAMME OF ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

D. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT FATHER RAMONI AMENALIS, A SPANISH NATIONAL BASED IN THE MUSENYI ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH, IN TABA COMMUNE, GITARAMA PREFECTURE AND THE COUNCILLOR OF MUSENYI SECTEUR, MR. DANIEL MUNYANDAGUZA, STAND ACCUSED BY LOCAL GENOCIDE SURVIVORS INCLUDING MANY WIDOWS AND ORPHANS OF PROTECTING INTERAHAMWE CRIMINALS ACCUSED OF INVOLVEMENT IN GENOCIDE. FATHER RAMONI, TOGETHER WITH FATHER MANUELI OF GIHARA PARISH WHO ALSO COMES FROM SPAIN, CEASED THEIR ASSISTANCE TO THE LOCAL WIDOWS FOLLOWING THESE ACCUSATIONS. WHEN INTERVIEWED BY RADIO RWANDA, FATHER RAMONI DENIED THE CHARGES AND CLAIMED THAT THOSE PEOPLE WHO ACCUSED HIM INTENDED TO CREATE A FOUL CLIMATE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ON 171600B APR 95 RPA SOLDIERS FROM REMERA ARRESTED THREE LOCAL OF NSHILI COMMUNE. THEY WERE ACCUSED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA ON THE NIGHT OF 15/16 APR 95, CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH AT BUNYOVE CELLULE 3124 TO ARREST INFILTRATORS. DURING THE SEARCH, A SUSPECTED INTERAHAMWE THREW A GRENADE KILLING ONE RPA SOLDIER AND WOUNDING ANOTHER SERIOUSLY. HE WAS LATER SHOT DEAD WHEN HE TRIED TO ESCAPE. THE OWNER OF THE HOUSE IN WHICH THE SUSPECT WAS HIDING WAS ALSO KILLED.

(3) SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THE EXISTENCE OF AN RPA COMMANDO TRAINING CAMP AT THE FORMER GENDARMERIE TRAINING CENTRE WEST OF KABGUYI. RPA TROOPS FOLLOWED A MILOB PATROL TO RWAMATAMU COMMUNE 1557 AND BROUGHT CONVERSATION BETWEEN PATROL AND CHEF DE SECTEUR TO A SUDDEN STOP. OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS, THE RPA HAVE EFFECTIVELY INTIMIDATED LOCALS THIS WAY AND MADE MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS IMPOSSIBLE.

(4) THE FC HELD MEETINGS AND MONITORED SITUATION IN KIBEHO CAMP IN SECTOR 4A WHICH RESULTED FROM AN RPA CORDON OPERATION WHICH IN TURN CAUSED THOUSANDS OF REFUGEES TO ABANDON THEIR HUTS AND CONGREGATE AT THE CENTRE OF THE CAMP.

(5) THE DFC ACCOMPANIED BY THE RPA CHIEF OF STAFF VISITED KIBEHO CAMP TO ASSESS THE SITUATION IN THE CAMP.

(5) A MEETING WAS HELD AT TAC HQ, BUTARE TO DISCUSS OP RETOUR ISSUES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RPA CURRENT OPERATION IN KIBEHO. UN AGENCIES (UNREO, UNHCR, IOC AND IOM), REP OF RWANDAN MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, NGOS, UNAMIR STAFF AND MILOBS ATTENDED THE MEETING.

ACCUSED OF BEING HUTU EXTREMISTS. THE LOCALS ARE CURRENTLY UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION AT KIYANJA. MILOBS AND HR INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) AT ABOUT 180605B APR 95, A 26-YR-OLD LOCAL FEMALE REPORTED THE ARREST OF HER HUSBAND (HUTU) AND TWO OTHERS ON 16 APR 95 AT MULINDI GR 7667. ACCORDING TO THE LADY THE ARRESTS WERE EFFECTED BY THE GENDARMERIE AND GITUKU COUNCILLOR. SHE FURTHER ALLEGED THAT SHE MOVED FROM GITUKU GR 703637 WITH HER HUSBAND TO MULINDI BECAUSE OF ASSAULTS AND ARRESTS OF HUTUS BY THE LOCAL SY COMMITTEE. THE LADY'S HUSBAND WAS LATER RELEASED ON 18 APR 95 FOR LACK OF EVIDENCE BUT THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE OTHER TWO MEN IS NOT KNOWN. MILOBS AND HR INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

MILOBS AND HR INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(B) MILOBS SENT PATROLS TO TABA COMMUNE TO INVESTIGATE A RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCEMENT THAT A LOCAL PRIEST HAD BEEN AIDING PERPETRATORS OF GENOCIDE, PROTESTING THE ARREST OF HUTUS, CARRYING HUTU SUSPECTS TO UNAMIR FOR PROTECTION AND STOPPING FOOD DISTRIBUTION. MILOBS SPOKE TO BOURGMESTRE AND HE EXPLAINED THAT THE PRIEST IN QUESTION WAS LARGELY BEHIND ALL HUMANITARIAN AID IN THE COMMUNE. HE HAD PERSONALLY DONATED LARGE SUMS OF MONEY TO WIDOWS AND ORPHANS, ARRANGED FOR THE PROVISION OF ROOFING MATERIALS FOR THOSE WHO RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE RECENTLY. HE ASSISTED WITH FOOD, BLANKETS AND SPORTS EQUIPMENT OVER THE PAST FOUR MONTHS. MILOBS LATER VISITED BUGOBA SECTOR WHERE LOCALS CONFIRMED THIS. PATROLS WERE INFORMED AT MUSENYI SECTOR THAT THE PERSON MAKING THE ACCUSATIONS HAD BEEN IMPRISONED FOR TWO DAYS BY THE BOURGMESTRE RECENTLY FOR FALSEHOOD AGAINST THE COUNCILLOR OF HIS SECTOR.

(C) MILOBS ACCOMPANIED HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO GITARAMA PRISON WHERE THEY WERE INFORMED THAT MORE THAN 25 INMATES WERE INJURED BY BRICKS THROWN INTO THE COURTYARD ON THE NIGHTS OF 13, 14 AND 15 APR 95. MILOBS WILL DISCUSS THIS WITH RPA LO SINCE RPA TROOPS ARE THE ONLY PERSONS AUTHORISED TO GET CLOSER TO THE WALLS. PRISON CONDITIONS WERE REPORTED WORSE THAN BEFORE AND THERE HAD BEEN 30 DEATHS BETWEEN 13 AND 18 APR 95.

(D) IN KIBUYE, MILOBS PATROLLED BUTEMBO SECTOR 1254. ~~THEY WERE INFORMED THAT RPA CLEARED MUSHUNGWE ISLAND 0853 OF PEOPLE TWO WEEKS AGO.~~ ABOUT 50 FAMILIES WERE REPORTEDLY FORCED TO LEAVE

FOR THE MAINLAND. ALSO ABOUT 216 RETURNEES WERE SEEN SLEEPING IN THE COMMUNE CENTRE INSTEAD OF THEIR HOMES DUE TO FEAR OF THE RPA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR AND REPORTED THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR CALM EXCEPT IN THE DPCs WHERE RPA OPS CAUSED SOME PANIC AMONG IDPs.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO NYAMIGINA 4523 AND RWAMIKO 4914 INVESTIGATED AN INCIDENT WHICH TOOK PLACE ON THE NIGHT OF 16/17 APR 95. A MAN WAS KILLED AND HIS WIFE WOUNDED WHEN THE COUPLE TRIED TO STOP UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS FROM ROBBING THEM. ZAMBATT WAS INFORMED AND 10 LOCALS WERE ARRESTED FOR QUESTIONING. FIVE HAVE BEEN RELEASED AND FIVE OTHERS SENT TO GIKONGORO FOR FURTHER QUESTIONING.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR AND MONITORED RPA CORDON AROUND KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THAT SOME LOCALS ARE STILL SEEKING UNAMIR PROTECTION WITH MILOBS AT NIGHT IN NYAMASHEKE. THE UVIRA CROSSING POINT REMAINED CLOSED ON THE RWANDESE SIDE PROBABLY DUE TO THE NYABISHUNGU INCIDENT.

(C) MILOBS ALONG WITH HUMAN RIGHTS INVESTIGATED THE BUGARAMA INCIDENT REPORTED ON 14 APR 95. THE GENDARMERIE, RPA, BOURGMESTRE AND ONE OF THE INTERHAMWE ARRESTED WERE INTERVIEWED. DETAILS ARE THAT THE GENDARMERIE WAS INFORMED AT APPROX 1100 HRS OF SOME SUSPICIOUS PERSONS IN A HOUSE. RPA AND GENDARMERIE WENT TO THE LOCATION AND ORDERED THE PEOPLE TO COME OUT. ACCORDING TO THE CAPTURED INTERHAMWE, THEY STARTED FIRING FROM INSIDE THE HOUSE KILLING ONE GENDARME AND INJURING ANOTHER. RPA/GENDARMES ALSO RETURNED FIRE KILLING 3 OF THE INFILTRATORS AND INJURING 2 OTHERS. FOUR OF THEM ESCAPED TO THE NEARBY FOREST. THERE WERE IN ALL 9 PERSONS IN THE HOUSE; 4 RWANDESE, 3 ZAIRIANS AND 2 BURUNDIANS. RPA RETRIEVED 2 AUTOMATIC RIFLES, AMMO, 6 GRENADES, 1 MACHETE AND SOME UNIFORMS FROM THE HOUSE. THIS INCIDENT MAY HAVE LED TO THE MASSACRE OF THE 16 LOCALS AT NYABISHUNGU.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO NYARUGENGE AND KANOMBE COMMUNES TRIED TO TALK TO PEOPLE ON THE STREETS SO AS TO OBTAIN INFORMATION ON PUBLIC OPINION. PATROLS REPORTED THAT THE PEOPLE WERE MORE FRIENDLY THAN BEFORE BUT WERE STILL CAREFUL NOT TO GO FAR AS RPA HAS PLANTED INFORMANTS IN MARKETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES. THE PATROLS ASSISTED IN TRANSPORTING OF A SICK CHILD TO THE RPA HOSPITAL. THE PTL WAS STOPPED AT AN RPA ROAD BLOCK AND THE CHILD TAKEN OVER BY RPA.
