Confirming our conversation, I wish to inform you that, in the light of the present financial situation of the Congo Fund, the Secretary-General has decided on the following emergency action in regard to recruitment for the WHO programme in the Congo.

Project 40-01 - Advisory Services

Recruitment of the nine vacant posts in this project will be suspended for the time being, except where firm offers have already been made by WHO.

Project 40-02 - Operational Services

Recruitment of the 23 vacant posts will be suspended for the time being except where firm offers have already been made by WHO.

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Where contracts of experts come to an end before the end of 1963, they should only be extended to the end of this year, pending further clarification of financial possibilities for 1964.

The need for this action is greatly regretted, but I am sure you will appreciate the reasons for it. I would emphasize that it is of an emergency character, and we hope it may be possible to reconsider it as soon as the financial prospects are clearer.

Further to Dr Brown's discussions with you yesterday and to my memorandum of 23 July 1963, I am writing to inform you that when commenting on your memorandum of 22 July we overlooked two errors in your tabular summary of submission at the end of that memorandum, namely:

1. The Adviser in Sanitary Engineering indicated under the heading "Advisory" should be suppressed for all three years.
2. The Sanitary Engineers mentioned under the heading "Operational" should be five each for 1963, 1964 and 1965 instead of the four, six and six indicated for these years.

This makes a total of seven Sanitary Engineers. The cumulative totals for the three groups thus become 24 for 1963, 28 for 1964 and 28 for 1965.

I would also take this opportunity to ask you to note for the record that the presentation of the posts funded under the UNTA Expanded Programme is not in accordance with the present situation. We understand, however, that this is intentional and based on the original programme and budget submissions for 1964/5.

The four posts presently funded from TA funds are:

1. CTA 1 - Public Health Adviser
2. CTA 2 - Assistant Chief Adviser
3. CTA 3 - Public Health Adviser
4. CTA 4 - Nurse Training Officer

and operational elements is in fact quite artificial. However, we understand your immediate need for attempting such a distinction.

In connexion with the table at the end of the submission, we would like to suggest that -

1. The expert in hospital administration at present figuring in the operational group, should be placed in the training group. This officer is literally full-time on training, having given, single-handed, the course on hospital administration and delivering 1050 hours of lectures and demonstrations within the last 10 months.
2. We would suggest that the adviser on health education is dropped entirely from the list. Such a post has been established but we have been quite unsuccessful in finding a suitable candidate. French-speaking health educators of the quality required are very rare, so we are prepared to drop this post for the moment.

We believe that the line in the operational group given over to sanitary engineers, should read:

"Sanitary engineers - 1963 (4), 1964 (6), 1965 (6)" instead of four for each year. The reason for this oversight is probably to be found in the decision to finance two of these posts from the TA funds. All six posts have in fact existed for some time.

The position in the text of the appropriate post descriptions should be readjusted in the light of this revised table.

To avoid confusion we are attaching a list of the posts with the suggested revisions incorporated.

With reference to your memo of 25 June addressed to Mr. Ahmed, please note the following points of agreement:

- (a) Travel by commercial aircraft, where ONUC flights are not available, of WHO personnel and missionaries involved in MCH work in the Congo, whom you invite to participate in the Seminar, may be charged to the WHO project No.40-02. The higher rate of travel subsistence allowance to which WHO agents are entitled when travelling on duty away from their duty stations, may also be charged to project No.40-02. No per diem or subsistence allowance is admissible for the missionaries invited by WHO to attend the Seminar.
- (b) We can detach for the period of the Seminar an Administrative Assistant who can act as transport officer, it being understood that no call will be made on ONUC for the provision of additional transport. I have assigned Mr. Sequeira for this temporary post.
- (c) Arrangements have been made to assign Miss Alida DeJager as Administrative Assistant/Documents Officer to head the secretariat for the period of your Conference.

The travel of participants should be authorized on the standard form, with the notation: "In the case that the traveller purchases his own ticket, reimbursement will be made by ONUC in Leopoldville on presentation of a standard travel claim. Where Air-Congo has required payment in non-Congolese currency, reimbursement will be made in convertible foreign currency."

Further to recent conversations between Mr Gilpin, Mr Tooby and Dr Brown, I am writing to inform you that the Ministry of Health, Central Government, is arranging with the assistance of WHO, a conference and a refresher course on Maternal and Child Health to be held in Léopoldville from 8 to 29 July 1963. Various people from several disciplines involved in MCH work in the Congo are being invited to participate. Arrangements are being made for the conference to be held in the Institut d'Enseignement Médical where the participants from the provinces will be accommodated.

It is essential that the interested WHO personnel and certain missionaries should be invited. The provincial ministries are financing the travel of their own personnel; however, no Government funds are available for others to travel.

I would be grateful if funds for travel and per diem of WHO were made available to us as a charge against WHO project number 40-02 (Public Health Operational Services) which covers public health services as well as training. It is estimated that the sum involved approximates 200 000 Congolese francs.

In addition we would also require a transport officer and an administrative assistant for this period. The transport officer would be required to direct the use of the vehicles and drivers loaned us by UNESCO. The administrative assistant would help Miss Hudson, the conference officer, with the preparation of documents and other administrative matters.

Your early approval would be appreciated.

Your 497 most welcome. Assume the German contribution can be used for employment of experts from Germany as well as those from other countries. The Congolese Government need urgently the services of over one hundred experts and technicians for Ministry of Public Works and we have indicated possibility of recruiting these along the same lines as UNESCO teachers. Official Government request in this connection is expected to be received shortly. Could German contribution be used for financing a part of the salaries of these experts? Alternatively the salaries ~~and allowances~~ of Public Works experts already employed under Project 85-01 might be met from German contribution in addition to financing part of the medical and Public Health Programme under project 40-02. In the event money is used for financing any of the existing experts the ~~present~~ present Programme ceiling would remain unchanged. On the other hand if a new project such as engagement of Public Works engineering staff is financed from the funds the programme ceiling would be increased. As to which of the two alternatives is ~~best~~ <sup>ADOPTED</sup> depends upon the prospects of availability of funds from other sources for the financing of the 1963 Programme as <sup>IT STANDS AT</sup> present ~~approved~~. We await your further guidance on above points for preparing detailed plan for utilisation of German contribution.

Guido Brunner of the German Observer Mission has told us informally that while the Bonn Government would like to make a contribution in cash to the Congo Fund in response to the Secretary-General's appeal of 5 December, it is doubtful that appropriations for the purpose will be voted by the German Parliament within the present fiscal year. The German Government has, however, at its disposal 3.5 million marks (About dollars 850,000) which have been specifically allotted by Parliament for the payment of bilateral technical assistance programmes and which the Government would like to use in a manner that might serve to strengthen some of the projects in the Civilian Operations Programme. For example, about 2-thirds of this sum might be used to defray the cost of a few road improvement and maintenance teams and the remaining third to pay the salaries of a number of medical doctors and health inspectors. The road teams would carry out their work in coordination with our activities under project 85-01 and the doctors and health inspectors would form an integral part of project 40-02.
