INFORMATION NOTE FOR FILE

1. Paragraph 29 of the programme of work of the Committee on the United Nations Fund for Namibia was shown to the President of the Council, H.F. Mr. Paul J.F. Lusaka (Zambia) on 2 February 1982 before the document was submitted for processing.

2. In the form approved by the Fund Committee, the paragraph reads "The Committee, in co-operation with the Office of the Commissioner, will undertake fund raising missions to major donors and potential contributors to the Fund and report on these missions."

3. The President stated that in line with decisions taken by the Council at its 371st meeting, held on 1 February 1982, when it approved the work programmes of the three other standing committees, the word "Committee" should be replaced by the word "Council." Furthermore, the expression "in co-operation with the Office of the Commissioner" should be deleted, as the Council is assisted by a single secretariat.

"The General Assembly,

"18. Expresses its appreciation to the United Nations Development Programme for its contribution to the financing and administration of the Nationhood Programme for Namibia and calls upon it to continue to allocate, at the request of the United Nations Council for Namibia, funds from the indicative planning figure for Namibia for the implementation of the projects within the Nationhood Programme and to increase the indicative planning figure for Namibia;".

ANNEX

Memorandum approved by the United Nations Council for Namibia
at its 359th meeting, on 2 September 1981

1. The United Nations Council for Namibia, in the discharge of its responsibilities as the legal Administering Authority for Namibia and as a major policy-making organ of the United Nations charged with defending the rights and interests of the Territory and its people, submits for urgent consideration by the international community its assessment of the grave situation in Namibia resulting from the continuing illegal occupation of the Territory by South Africa in persistent violation of the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and in blatant defiance of its resolutions and decisions on the question of Namibia.
2. It is now nearly 15 years since the General Assembly adopted resolution 2145 (XXI), by which it terminated South Africa's Mandate over Namibia, declared South Africa's presence there illegal and placed the Territory under the direct responsibility of the United Nations. Namibia thus became a unique responsibility of the United Nations which it has exercised through the Council. Since 1966, the community of nations has had the historic mandate to protect the rights and interests of Namibia and has committed itself fully to the early exercise by the Namibian people of their right to self-determination, freedom and national independence through the withdrawal of South Africa from Namibia, and to preserving the territorial integrity and sovereignty of Namibia.
3. Since the termination of the Mandate, the General Assembly and the Security Council have adopted numerous resolutions demanding that South Africa withdraw from Namibia. In an advisory opinion handed down on 21 June 1971, a/ the International Court of Justice stated that the continued presence of South Africa in Namibia was illegal, that South Africa was under obligation to withdraw from Namibia immediately and that States Members of the United Nations were under obligation to recognize the illegality of South Africa's presence in Namibia and to refrain from any acts and dealings with South Africa with regard to Namibia. Faced with the arrogant defiance of South Africa, the General Assembly and the Security Council called upon States to take specific measures to co-operate in the implementation of United Nations decisions on Namibia and to support and promote the rights of the people of Namibia. Furthermore, the General Assembly recognized the South West Africa People's Organization (SWAPO) as the sole and authentic representative of the Namibian people and supported the legitimacy of their armed struggle under the leadership of SWAPO. The Assembly confirmed and strengthened the mandate of the United Nations Council for Namibia as the legal Administering Authority for the Territory until genuine independence was achieved.

4. Since its creation, the United Nations Council for Namibia has spared no effort to fulfil the mandate entrusted to it by the General Assembly. The Council has endeavoured to mobilize international support in order to press for the withdrawal of the illegal South African administration from Namibia in accordance with United Nations resolutions on Namibia. The Council has taken measures to counter the policies of South Africa against the Namibian people and has denounced and rejected all of South Africa's manoeuvres through which the illegal régime has attempted to perpetuate its occupation of Namibia.

5. The Council has conducted, on a permanent basis, consultations with Governments of Member States in order to ensure the implementation of United Nations resolutions. Furthermore, the Council has represented Namibian interests in international conferences, organizations and bodies so as to ensure that the rights and interests of Namibia are adequately protected. Thus Namibia, as represented by the Council, has been granted full membership in the International Labour Organisation (ILO), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), as well as in the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD).

6. The Council, deeply concerned about the plunder of Namibia's resources by South African and other foreign economic interests, enacted on 27 September 1974 Decree No. 1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia b/ and actively pursued its implementation. In this connexion, the Council has contacted Governments and corporations and has organized hearings and seminars on the protection of the natural resources of Namibia in order to stop foreign investments and operations in Namibia. The Council has declared that those corporations and interests which contravene Decree No. 1 may be held liable for damages by the future Government of an independent Namibia.

7. The Council has formulated, co-ordinated and directed programmes of assistance to the Namibian people. It has also formulated and directed, within the context of mobilizing world public opinion, programmes of dissemination of information on the illegal occupation of Namibia by South Africa.

8. The Security Council, in the meantime, has also kept the question of Namibia under continuous review. Initiatives to resolve the impasse created by South Africa's non-compliance with United Nations resolutions and to establish the necessary conditions to enable the people of Namibia to exercise their right to self-determination and independence have met with defiance by South Africa, which has continued to challenge the United Nations.

9. On 30 January 1976, the Security Council adopted resolution 385 (1976), by which it condemned the continued illegal occupation of Namibia by South Africa and declared that it was imperative that free elections under the supervision and

control of the United Nations be held to enable Namibians to determine their own future. The Security Council demanded that South Africa urgently make a solemn declaration accepting the provisions for the holding of elections in Namibia under United Nations supervision and control, undertaking to comply with the resolutions and decisions of the United Nations and recognizing the territorial integrity and unity of Namibia as a nation.

10. In the same resolution, the Security Council further reiterated its demand that South Africa take the necessary steps to effect the withdrawal of its illegal administration maintained in Namibia and to transfer power to the people of Namibia with the assistance of the United Nations. The Security Council demanded that South Africa release all Namibian political prisoners, abolish the application in Namibia of all racially discriminatory and politically repressive laws and practices and accord unconditionally to all Namibians currently in exile for political reasons full facilities for return to their country without risk of arrest, detention, intimidation or imprisonment.

11. Following the adoption of resolution 385 (1976), five Western members of the Security Council, namely Canada, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America undertook to draw up a "proposal for a settlement of the Namibian situation" designed to bring about an internationally acceptable peaceful transition to independence for Namibia. The Western contact group stated that its proposal addressed itself to all the elements of resolution 385 (1976) and provided an effective basis for its implementation.

12. The proposal initiated by the Western contact group and negotiated with SWAPO and South Africa, the two parties to this colonial conflict, as well as with the African front-line States, was finally accepted by SWAPO and South Africa on the clear understanding that the proposal constituted the only internationally acceptable peaceful plan leading to Namibia's independence.

13. After the Security Council took note of the proposal, the Secretary-General undertook to formulate administrative arrangements for its implementation. However, while the international community was engaged in this initiative, South Africa persisted in carrying out armed attacks against Namibian refugee camps and neighbouring African countries and in manoeuvring to establish a puppet administration in Namibia in violation of United Nations resolutions, in particular Security Council resolutions 385 (1976) and 431 (1978) of 27 July 1978.

14. On 29 September 1978, the Security Council adopted resolution 435 (1978), by which it approved the report of the Secretary-General c/ containing his recommendations on administrative arrangements for the holding of elections in Namibia. The Council decided to establish a United Nations Transition Group (UNTAG) to assist the Secretary-General's Special Representative in carrying out his mandate of ensuring early independence in Namibia through free and fair elections under the supervision and control of the United Nations.

15. The Security Council welcomed the readiness of SWAPO to co-operate in the implementation of the Secretary-General's report and called on South Africa to do likewise.

16. Furthermore, in its resolution 439 (1978) of 13 November 1978, the Security Council declared null and void all unilateral measures taken by the illegal administration in relation to the electoral process in contravention of resolutions 385 (1976), 431 (1978) and 435 (1978).

17. Despite the resolutions of the Security Council and despite consultations between the South African Government and the foreign ministers of the five Western Powers in October 1978, South Africa raised objections to the administrative arrangements to implement Security Council resolution 435 (1978). The international community in various forums expressed the hope that the five Western Powers, consistent with their commitment as expressed throughout the consultation process prior to the adoption of resolution 435 (1978), and commensurate with their influence on South Africa, would exert pressure on Pretoria to comply with the relevant Security Council resolutions.

18. The five Western Powers involved in the negotiations continued, however, to maintain diplomatic, economic, consular and other relations with South Africa in which it purported to act on behalf of or concerning Namibia, as well as military or strategic collaboration, all of which had the effect of supporting and encouraging South Africa in its defiance of the United Nations.

19. A protracted period of negotiations followed which was characterized by South Africa's manoeuvres such as the escalation of its military acts of aggression and the holding of unilateral elections, designed to delay and hinder the efforts of the United Nations. Finally, in January 1981, in what was termed pre-implementation talks, chaired by the United Nations, SWAPO and South Africa met at Geneva to discuss with the representatives of the Secretary-General administrative arrangements for the implementation of Security Council resolution 435 (1978). The discussions were also attended, in an observer capacity, by representatives of the front-line States and Nigeria, who throughout the negotiations played a positive role, as well as by representatives of the Western countries composing the contact group, who failed to ensure the co-operation of South Africa in the implementation of the plan they had initiated.

20. SWAPO co-operated fully with the representatives of the Secretary-General and declared its readiness to sign immediately a cease-fire agreement. However, the Geneva pre-implementation meeting failed because of South Africa's opposition to the very concept of an independent Namibia and because of South Africa's intention to promote and install a puppet régime devoted to the perpetuation of its colonial and illegal domination. In this context, South Africa's blatant refusal to implement Security Council resolution 435 (1978) constitutes another instance of its continuing defiance of the will of the international community.

21. South Africa then engaged in another series of acts of aggression against the Namibian people and neighbouring African States. It further increased its military

build-up in the Territory, the forcible and massive displacement of Namibians from their homes for military and political purposes and the use of other agents to carry out its policy. In this regard, grave concern was expressed at the reported attempts by the Government of the United States to destabilize the legitimate Government of Angola by, inter alia, providing assistance to Angolan traitor groups in the service of the Pretoria régime. South Africa also increased its threats and acts of subversion and aggression against neighbouring independent African States, particularly Angola and Zambia, as well as the use of mercenaries to carry out those military attacks.

22. After the blatant refusal of South Africa to implement the United Nations plan, the international community reviewed the question of Namibia in various forums, including the thirty-sixth ordinary session of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) Co-ordinating Committee for the Liberation of Africa (Arusha, 19-23 January 1981); the thirty-sixth ordinary session of the Council of Ministers of OAU (Addis Ababa, 23 February-1 March 1981); the Conference of Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Non-Aligned Countries (New Delhi, 9-13 February 1981); the resumed thirty-fifth session of the General Assembly (New York, 2-6 March 1981); and the Extraordinary Ministerial Meeting of the Co-ordinating Bureau of the Non-Aligned Countries on the Question of Namibia (Algiers, 16-18 April 1981). In all these forums, the international community condemned the Pretoria régime for its persistent refusal to comply with United Nations resolutions on Namibia and for its repeated acts of aggression against the front-line States, in particular against Angola, and called on the Security Council to impose, as a matter of urgency, comprehensive mandatory sanctions against South Africa under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations to ensure Pretoria's immediate compliance with the resolutions and decisions of the United Nations on Namibia.

23. The Security Council considered the question of Namibia from 21 to 30 April 1981 with the unprecedented participation of 19 ministers for foreign affairs from Africa and from the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries. However, despite the will of the international community in favour of imposing sanctions against South Africa in view of the threat that régime poses to international peace and security, the Council failed to act in conformity with its mandate and to impose sanctions because of the veto of its three Western permanent members.

24. In response to a request from Angola, the Security Council met from 28 to 31 August 1981 to consider South Africa's latest act of aggression, but was unable, on account of the veto of the United States, to exercise its responsibilities with respect to the maintenance of international peace and security.

25. By refusing to vote in favour of sanctions, the Western Powers demonstrated their open support for South Africa's policies towards Namibia and gave it political encouragement to continue its illegal occupation of the Territory, to pursue its war against the Namibian people and against African States and to persist, with their co-operation, in the plunder and pillage of Namibia's resources. The attempts to link the question of Namibia with irrelevant questions such as that of co-operation between Angola and certain other countries, which fall under the exclusive competence of the sovereign Government of the People's Republic of Angola, are designed solely to justify the illegal occupation of Namibia by racist South Africa, thus delaying the independence of the Territory.

/...

26. Seriously concerned about the fact that the Security Council had been unable to discharge effectively its responsibilities owing to the opposition of the Western permanent members, the International Conference on Sanctions against South Africa, held in Paris from 20 to 27 May 1981, adopted the Paris Declaration on Sanctions against South Africa (A/36/319-S/14531, annex I) and the Special Declaration on Namibia (A/36/319-S/14531, annex II), by which it called for a programme of sanctions and related measures against South Africa. The United Nations Council for Namibia, in its Panama Declaration and Programme of Action on Namibia adopted on 5 June 1981 (A/36/327-S/14546), reiterated the call of the Council of Ministers of OAU and the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries for the early convening of an emergency special session of the General Assembly to review the question of Namibia and to take measures as appropriate under the Charter of the United Nations.

27. The Council of Ministers of OAU, at its thirty-seventh ordinary session held at Nairobi from 15 to 21 June 1981, rejected the latest sinister schemes by certain members of the Western contact group, in particular the United States, aimed at forcing the international community to abandon Security Council resolution 435 (1978) endorsing the United Nations plan for the independence of Namibia, and depriving the oppressed Namibian people of their hard-won victories in the struggle for national liberation. It also expressed its profound dismay at the demonstrated unwillingness of certain members of the contact group to carry on with the implementation process, which it had itself initiated, and to exert the necessary pressure on the racist Pretoria régime to force it to comply with Security Council resolutions 435 (1978) and 439 (1978). The Council of Ministers denounced the emerging unholy alliance between Pretoria and Washington characterized by baseless hostility against Angola and their collusion to intensify acts of destabilization in that country as well as to misrepresent the nature of the colonial conflict in Namibia as one of global strategic considerations.

28. Subsequently, the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of OAU, at its eighteenth ordinary session, held at Nairobi from 24 to 27 June 1981, reiterated the call for an emergency special session of the General Assembly on the question of Namibia during the first week of September 1981.

29. The General Assembly has declared that South Africa's continuing illegal occupation of Namibia constitutes an act of aggression against the Namibian people as well as against the United Nations, the legal Administering Authority for the Territory until independence. The following acts of South Africa with respect to Namibia have confirmed this assessment:

(a) South Africa has deliberately caused the failure of negotiations towards an internationally acceptable settlement for the peaceful transition of Namibia to independence;

(b) South Africa has continued to pursue a policy of ruthless oppression and brutal repression, constantly increasing the arrests, detention and torture of the Namibian people, particularly of leaders and members of SWAPO;

/...

(c) South Africa has escalated its militarization of the Territory and has increased its acts of aggression against the Namibian people and against African States, particularly Angola, Botswana, Mozambique and Zambia;

(d) South Africa has also intensified attempts aimed at destabilizing African States, particularly Angola;

(e) South Africa has taken measures to undermine the territorial integrity of Namibia by annexing Walvis Bay and claiming sovereignty over the islands off the shore of Namibia in acts that have been rejected and declared illegal, null and void by the General Assembly;

(f) South Africa has persisted in the plunder of Namibia's natural resources in collusion with other foreign economic interests in violation of the resolutions of the Security Council and the General Assembly and of Decree No. 1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia, enacted by the United Nations Council for Namibia on 27 September 1974;

(g) South Africa has continued its manoeuvres aimed at gaining international recognition for illegitimate groups which it has installed in Namibia and which are subservient to Pretoria's interests, in order to maintain its policies of domination and exploitation of the people and resources of Namibia;

(h) South Africa has not only created a situation of total confrontation between itself and the Namibian people, supported by the world community at large represented at the United Nations, but has also committed a manifest breach of international peace and security.

30. In the light of South Africa's persistent defiance of the United Nations and the international community, the Council considers that South Africa has challenged:

(a) The Namibian people, by denying them their inalienable rights to self-determination, freedom and national independence;

(b) The territorial sovereignty and integrity of Namibia, by its obdurate refusal to withdraw from the Territory which it illegally occupies;

(c) SWAPO, the sole and authentic representative of the Namibian people, by pursuing policies of repression, torture and murder of Namibian patriots in an attempt to destroy SWAPO;

(d) The sovereignty, peace and security of the African front-line States, particularly Angola, by constant acts of aggression and attempts at destabilization by South Africa with the participation of international mercenaries, in a vain attempt to undermine the determination of the African people to free their continent from colonialism and racism;

(e) International law, by acts violating the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and its resolutions and decisions;

/...

(f) The international community, by defying its repeated demands and appeals that South Africa put an end to the illegal occupation of Namibia;

(g) The United Nations, by resorting to manoeuvres aimed at usurping and undermining its authority over Namibia.

31. Therefore, the United Nations Council for Namibia, in its capacity as the legal Administering Authority for Namibia, submits that it is the duty of the international community at the eighth emergency special session of the General Assembly to adopt as a matter of urgency effective and comprehensive measures under the Charter so as to ensure the complete isolation of South Africa and to compel it to withdraw from Namibia in accordance with the relevant United Nations resolutions.

The Permanent Mission of Japan presents its compliments to the United Nations Council for Namibia and with regard to Decree No.1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia, has the honour to inform the latter of the following:

The Government of Japan voted in favor of General Assembly resolution 2248 (S-V) of 19 May 1967 which established the United Nations Council for South West Africa, which later became the United Nations Council for Namibia. Further, the Government has made it clear repeatedly that it fully supports the advisory opinion of the International Court of Justice of 21 June 1971 on the question of Namibia.

Japan has consistently upheld the view that the United Nations should assume responsibility for the administration of the Territory of Namibia pending the Territory's attainment of independence. In this connection, the Government of Japan recognizes the political significance of Decree No. 1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia. In May 1975 it took measures to bring the Decree to the attention of the general public by publishing it in an official bulletin of the Ministry of International Trade and Industry and in the Trade and Commerce Report, a publication of the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO).

With regard to a contract for the purchase of Namibian uranium which the Kansai Electric Power Co., Inc., a private enterprise, had concluded with Rossing Uranium prior to the publication of Decree No. 1., the company decided not to import Namibian uranium under the present circumstances. It has postponed receipt of the uranium to be delivered under the terms and conditions of the said contract. In response to a charge made at the hearings on Namibian uranium conducted last year by the United Nations Council for Namibia, an investigation was undertaken which reconfirmed that the contract continues to be suspended.

Japan made this clear in its explanation of vote at the resumed session of the 35th General Assembly on 6 March 1981. This has been reconfirmed by the recent inquiry described in the preceding paragraphs.

* The Government of Japan, fully recognizing the political significance of Decree No.1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia, has taken concrete measures to bring it to the attention of the general public. The positive response to these measures has been demonstrated, for example, by the suspension of the contract for the purchase of Namibian uranium.

national taking part in the management of any enterprise in Namibia, and no Japanese national or enterprise has a mining concession in Namibia.

It is earnestly hoped that the Council for Namibia will acknowledge the cooperation which the Government and people of Japan have been extending through the United Nations for the early realization of Namibian independence, and that the results of their positive efforts will be correctly and widely recognized and duly reflected in the Report of the Council.

COUNCIL FOR NAMIBIA MISSION HOLDS CONSULTATION IN NETHERLANDS

(Received from a United Nations Information Officer accompanying the Mission in the Netherlands.)

At the invitation of the Government of the Netherlands, a Mission of the United Nations Council for Namibia held consultations with government officials on 25 June 1981. The Mission was headed by Shamsah Ahmad (Pakistan) and included the following members: Feodor Starcevic (Yugoslavia), Essam Ramadan (Egypt), Herman Ithete and Axel Johannes (South West Africa People's Organization (SWAPO)).

The Mission was received by C.A. Van Der Klaauw, Minister for Foreign Affairs. The Mission also held consultations with officials of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission reviewed the latest developments on the question of Namibia and expressed their grave concern over the deteriorating situation in Namibia resulting from South Africa's continued illegal occupation of the Territory, its repressive measures against Namibians and its repeated acts of aggression against the neighbouring independent African States. They emphasized the seriousness of the situation arising from South Africa's unwillingness to implement the United Nations Settlement Plan for Namibia. In this regard, the Government of the Netherlands reaffirmed their support for Security Council resolutions on the question of Namibia, particularly, resolutions 385 (1976), 435 (1978) and 439 (1978) which constituted the only universally accepted framework for a negotiated solution to the question of Namibia. The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission reiterated their conviction that those resolutions should be implemented without further delay.

The Mission informed the Government of the Netherlands that in view of the failure of the Security Council to fulfil its obligations under the Charter, the United Nations Council for Namibia had called for the early convening of an emergency special session of the General Assembly to review the question of Namibia and take appropriate measures.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission reiterated their rejection of any attempt to impose an internal settlement in Namibia. In this

connection, the Government of the Netherlands reiterated that it would not recognize any government in Namibia which would not be the result of internationally supervised elections under United Nations supervision and control. The Government of the Netherlands also expressed readiness to continue to use every suitable opportunity to induce South Africa to comply with the United Nations Plan for Namibia.

The Government of the Netherlands expressed its appreciation for the continued readiness of SWAPO to co-operate in the implementation of the United Nations Plan for Namibia. In this regard, the Mission reaffirmed that the parties to the conflict were on the one hand South Africa, which was illegally occupying Namibia and committing aggression against its people, and, on the other hand, the Namibian people under the leadership of the SWAPO, supported by the United Nations, which had direct responsibility for the Territory until genuine independence.

The Government of the Netherlands reaffirmed its support for the United Nations Council for Namibia as the legal Administering Authority for the Territory in its endeavours to obtain the withdrawal of South Africa's illegal administration from Namibia and for its efforts to mobilize world action in support of the cause of the Namibian people.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission expressed concern at the continued exploitation of Namibia's natural resources by South African and other foreign interests. In this regard, the Government of the Netherlands reaffirmed its recognition of the legal validity in international law of Decree No. 1 for the protection of the natural resources of Namibia and stressed the need for its acceptance by all Member States. The Mission emphasized that foreign economic interests operating in Namibia have contributed to the continuation of South Africa's illegal occupation of Namibia.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission reaffirmed the need to preserve the territorial integrity and national unity of Namibia. In this regard the Government of the Netherlands stressed that Walvis Bay should form part of independent Namibia.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission emphasized that the question of Namibia is one of decolonization and must be solved in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples contained in General Assembly resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960.

The Government of the Netherlands reiterated its commitment to continue to co-operate in providing assistance to the Namibian people through the United Nations Fund for Namibia, the Nationhood Programme and the United Nations Institute for Namibia.

The Government of the Netherlands and the Mission agreed on the need to intensify the dissemination of information on Namibia in order to mobilize greater support for the cause of the Namibian people.

The Mission of the Council expressed appreciation for the consistent position taken by the Government of the Netherlands in support of self-determination, freedom and genuine independence for Namibia and for its continued humanitarian assistance to them.

COUNCIL FOR NAMIBIA SEMINAR HELD 22-24 JUNE AT THE HAGUE
ISSUES STATEMENT ON LEGAL ISSUES CONCERNING NAMIBIA

(Received from a United Nations official attending the seminar at The Hague; delayed in transmission.)

The following statement was issued by the Council for Namibia's seminar on legal issues concerning the question of Namibia, held 22-24 June at The Hague:

1. By resolution 35/227 C, the General Assembly decided that the United Nations Council for Namibia, in the discharge of its responsibilities, should take all appropriate measures to ensure the full application of, and compliance with, the provisions of Decree No. 1 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia and such other measures as may be necessary to assist in the protection of the natural resources of Namibia.
2. In this regard, this resolution requested the Council to conduct hearings in order to obtain relevant information from all available sources to denounce South African schemes of ruthless exploitation of the people and resources of Namibia.
3. By the terms of the same resolution, the General Assembly also decided that the Council should secure the territorial integrity of Namibia as a unitary state, including Walvis Bay and the Penguin Islands.
4. Pursuant to the authority mentioned above, the Council decided to hold a seminar which would discuss in depth the legal aspects of the implementation of Decree No. 1 and the legal arguments strengthening the United Nations position regarding the status of Walvis Bay and the off-shore islands as an integral part of Namibia. The Council also decided that the holding of the seminar would coincide with the commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the Advisory Opinion of the International Court of Justice of 21 June 1971. With a view to further underscoring the historic significance of the Advisory Opinion as a pronouncement by the highest judicial authority of the world about the illegality of South Africa's occupation of Namibia, the Council decided that the seminar should be held at The Hague, the site of the International Court of Justice. Accordingly, the seminar on legal issues

concerning the question of Namibia was held at The Hague from 22 to 24 June 1981. The seminar as envisaged by the Council examined legal questions in order to identify possible initiatives that could be taken by the Council or by the international community to exert further pressure on the illegal South African occupation regime and on the foreign interests that support and contribute to the maintenance of the illegal occupation of Namibia. The seminar also examined various ways and means to ensure the implementation of Decree No. 1 and the preservation of the territorial integrity of Namibia.

5. The seminar meetings were conducted by a delegation of the United Nations Council for Namibia appointed by the President of the Council. The Council delegation, which was constituted into the bureau of the seminar, was composed of the following members: Chairman: Shamshad Ahmad (Pakistan); Vice-Chairman: Feodor Starcevic (Yugoslavia); and Rapporteur: Essam Ramadan (Egypt).

6. The delegation of the Council was accompanied by Herman Ithete, Deputy Secretary for Legal Affairs of the South West Africa People's Organization (SWAPO) and by Elizabeth Landis, representative of the Office of the United Nations Commissioner for Namibia.

7. Some 20 legal experts, lawyers and legal researchers participated in the proceedings of the seminar.

8. The seminar at its opening meeting on 22 June heard statements by the Chairman of the seminar, by Professor Erik Castren and by the Deputy Secretary for Legal Affairs of SWAPO.

9. The seminar expressed its concern over the continued illegal occupation of Namibia by South Africa, its increasing repressive measures against the Namibian people and repeated acts of aggression against neighbouring independent African States.

10. The seminar expressed its conviction of the need for the international community to exert effective pressure on the Pretoria regime to ensure its compliance with United Nations resolutions on Namibia.

11. The seminar emphasized that South Africa's occupation of Namibia was an act of colonial domination in violation of the principles and objectives of the Charter of the United Nations and the decisions and resolutions of the United Nations and that such situation must be resolved in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples contained in General Assembly resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960. The seminar further affirmed its conviction that the persistent and illegal colonial occupation of Namibia, in defiance of the decisions of the United Nations, constitutes a blatant denial to the Namibian people of their inalienable rights to self-determination, freedom and national independence in a united Namibia.

12. The seminar strongly affirmed its complete solidarity with and full support for SWAPO, the sole and authentic representative of the Namibian people whose just struggle enjoys the support and admiration of the international community.

13. The seminar reaffirmed that the failure of all the efforts so far undertaken to implement United Nations resolutions on Namibia bestows upon the international community the moral and political obligations of applying comprehensive sanctions to compel South Africa to comply with the decisions of the United Nations so that the people of Namibia can speedily exercise their inalienable rights to self-determination, freedom and national independence in a united Namibia.

14. The seminar reaffirmed that Security Council resolution 435 (1978) constitutes the only internationally acceptable framework for a peaceful solution of the Namibian question and must be implemented without any delay, modification, prevarication or change.

15. The seminar reaffirmed the relevant decisions of the General Assembly to the effect that Walvis Bay and the off-shore islands were an integral part of Namibia and that any action by South Africa to separate them from the Territory was illegal, null and void. The seminar declared that on Namibia's accession to independence its territorial integrity including Walvis Bay and the off-shore islands must remain intact.

16. The seminar emphasized the legal validity and the binding character of Decree No. 1 and reaffirmed its support for the Council in its efforts to implement the Decree with a view to preventing the exploitation of the national wealth of Namibia.

Conclusions and Recommendations

1. The seminar considers that since the 1971 Judgment of the International Court of Justice, resolutions and decisions of United Nations bodies have clearly established the obligation of the international community to bring to an end South Africa's illegal occupation of Namibia by all means, including the taking of action against all those engaged in the exploitation of Namibian natural resources, including marine resources, against the wishes and interests of the people of Namibia. The seminar therefore supports the development of comprehensive programmes to enforce these obligations by all means, including pressures on Governments, especially those which have not yet gone all in their power to carry out their obligations, the institution of effective legal actions in appropriate courts, and actions by non-governmental organizations and other concerned groups and individuals aimed at ensuring full compliance at all levels with international law and United Nations resolutions and decisions.

2. The seminar reaffirms the authority of the United Nations Council for Namibia as the legal Administering Authority over Namibia and the legal validity of the actions so far undertaken by the Council as Administering Authority over Namibia.

3. It further reaffirms the obligation of all States to recognize the illegality of South Africa's continued presence in Namibia and the right of the Namibian people under the leadership of SWAPO, to utilize all the means at their disposal to achieve freedom and independence.

4. The seminar considers that Decree No. 1 of 27 September 1974 for the Protection of the Natural Resources of Namibia is a valid legal act of the United Nations and is binding on all States.

5. The seminar considers that the Council might usefully add a penalty clause to the Decree.

6. The seminar also recommends that attention be drawn to the Decree by having it further published in the appropriate legal, financial and other journals together with a statement by the Council that it intends taking legal action against those acting in contravention of the Decree.

7. The seminar recommends that the Council should take appropriate steps to clearly define the territorial limits of Namibia including its territorial sea, exclusive economic zone and continental shelf.

8. The seminar recommends that means be devised to identify goods of Namibian origin using, where appropriate, the device of certificates of origin.

9. The seminar recommends that, given the difficulty of ascertaining the origin of uranium once it has been processed, it should become standard practice for all raw uranium to display a certificate of origin before its enrichment. The seminar further recommends the nuclear processing and enrichment plants be placed under obligation to verify certificates of origin of raw uranium received, prior to further processing under penalty of prosecution.

10. The seminar recommends that Member States be called upon to create additional remedies effective in domestic law, such as mandatory seizure and forfeiture by customs officials of any or all resources originating in Namibia.

11. The seminar considers it urgent that action should be initiated by the Council for Namibia and other appropriate bodies in national courts in furtherance of the objectives of the Decree.

12. The seminar recommends that local lawyers co-operate with the Council in initiating appropriate legal action under the Decree in their domestic courts.

13. The seminar recommends that the local support groups working in co-operation with local lawyers undertake litigation in their respective domestic courts in support or in furtherance of the objectives of the Decree.

14. The seminar recommends that action in domestic courts of the United Nations Member States against persons alleged to have committed gross violations of human rights of inhabitants of Namibia be considered.

15. The seminar strongly reaffirms that Walvis Bay and the off-shore islands constitute an integral part of the Territory of Namibia and condemns South Africa's attempts to disrupt the territorial integrity and national unity of Namibia.

16. The seminar emphasizes the illegality of any attempt to remove the off-shore oil, fish and mineral resources of Namibia before independence is achieved.

1. Two decisions taken by the General Assembly at its 34th session appear to make opportune a review of certain matters which were learned during the preparation of the last annual report of the Council.
2. Firstly, by resolution 34/50 of 23 November 1979, the General Assembly has decided that the Council will not meet when the General Assembly is in session. This implies that the Council should complete consideration of its next annual report before the opening of the General Assembly and that the Drafting Committee should probably complete its work by the end of July.
3. There is also an apparent decision of the General Committee, the status of which is not yet entirely clear, to the effect that subsidiary organs should "submit their reports to the General Assembly at least six weeks before the opening of the session so that they may be available in time in all working languages" (document A/BUR/34/2 of 22 October 1979). If this regulation is indeed in effect, it would imply that the Council should approve its annual report by 15 August and that the Drafting Committee should complete its work probably by 15 July.
4. In the light of these considerations, it may be useful to review what has been learned during the preparation of reports in the past.
5. For some years, criticism has been levelled at the annual report of the Council in the form of observations on its considerable increase in size (from one volume at the 28th session to four volumes at the 34th session) and comments on the quality of its drafting.
6. The comments on the quality of the drafting, while not entirely without foundation, stem largely from a fundamental misconception of the nature of the report of the Council, particularly when it is compared with the

other major report produced by this Department, namely the report of the Committee of 24. An examination of the report of the Committee of 24 to the 34th session of the General Assembly shows that as in previous years at least two-thirds of this report consists of working papers prepared by the Secretariat. These working papers are prepared initially by the substantive officer and are then reviewed successively by a Section Chief, by a Division Chief and from time to time by the Chief of the Secretariat Services Division. This process involving two or three levels of review ensures in most cases that when these papers are submitted to the editors, they have already reached a reasonably high standard of drafting. The last report of the Committee of 24 contains, inter alia, the following Secretariat working papers:

- Foreign Economic Interests in Southern Rhodesia (9 pages)
- Foreign Economic Interests in Namibia (27 pages)
- Foreign Economic Interests in Bermuda and other territories (20 pages)
- Military Activities in Southern Rhodesia (13 pages)
- Military Activities in Namibia (14 pages)
- Military Activities in Belize and other territories (8 pages)
- General Paper on Southern Rhodesia (40 pages)
- General Paper on Namibia (44 pages)
- General Paper on Western Sahara (12 pages)
- General Paper on East Timor (10 pages)
- Papers on Gibraltar and Brunei (16 pages)
- General Paper on Cocos Island (85 pages)
- General Paper on Bermuda (24 pages)

The report also contains a considerable number of Secretariat working papers on other territories as well as a paper prepared by the Department of Public Information. Furthermore, the report is prepared by a Rapporteur, Mr. Haydar (Syria), who works in close collaboration with the Secretariat.

7. By contrast, in the last two annual reports prepared by the Council, the working papers prepared by the Secretariat were not accepted by the Council, so that the totality of the material was either prepared by the Drafting Committee or, in the case of the annexes, was prepared by the members of various missions who in most cases were not assisted during their missions by Secretariat staff members. Furthermore, suggestions that the Council should appoint a Rapporteur to prepare its annual report have not been accepted and the Council continues to prepare its report by means of a Drafting Committee which is not a rubber stamp body but whose members in fact contribute actively to the drafting process.

The over-all determination of the members of this Drafting Committee is to produce a document which will faithfully reflect the political position of the Council. It will thus be seen that this drafting process is not within the control of the Secretariat and that the output of the Drafting Committee by its nature is fundamentally different from the two-thirds of the report of the Committee of 24 which is prepared by the Secretariat. The material produced by the Drafting Committee cannot be reviewed or redrafted by Secretariat officials and can only be amended by the Council itself.

8. With regard to the dimension of the annual report of the Council, it is true that out of four volumes, two volumes consisted of annexes. Had the process of publishing the documentation of the Council proceeded normally during the course of 1979, it might well have been possible for a high-ranking Secretariat official to have raised with the Drafting Committee the question of limitation of documentation and to have proposed the non-inclusion of the annexes. However, the factual situation facing the Drafting Committee was that by the time it concluded its work, out of 32 annexes only two had already been published as documents in the A/AC.131/L. series (two other annexes were extracted from S/ documents). The Drafting Committee was thus in effect procuring the publication of material which might well have been published during the year with a less wide form of distribution. If this problem could be taken up early in 1980, it might be possible to substantially reduce the dimension of the next annual report.

9. If a Drafting Committee is appointed early in 1980, in February for example, and if this Drafting Committee were to establish a table of contents substantially similar to the contents of the last report a number of other procedures to accelerate production could be considered.

(a) The chapter of the report dealing with the 34th session of the General Assembly for which the raw material is already available, could be prepared forthwith and submitted to the Drafting Committee:

(b) The half of the Organization of African Unity chapter which deals with the work of the OAU Liberation Committee could be submitted shortly to the Drafting Committee;

(c) The annex I to the report dealing with the allocation of resources to the Council for the period 1980-1981 could be prepared forthwith;

(d) The section of the report dealing with the organization of work of the Council could be prepared and submitted to the Drafting Committee as soon as the work programme for 1980 is approved by the Council;

(e) If, as expected, the Fund Committee gives consideration to the timing of the three principal reports of its Rapporteur, namely the Report on the Fund as a whole, the Report on the Nationhood Programme, and the Report on the budget of the Institute, and if the Fund Committee establishes a reporting period such as the calendar year 1979 which would allow these reports to be embarked upon immediately, then this chapter of the annual report could be submitted to the Drafting Committee much earlier than in the past:

(f) If the Fund Committee were also to establish a reporting period for the Report of the Commissioner which would correspond to the calendar year 1979, this would also permit the chapter on the activities of the Commissioner to be embarked upon immediately.

10. If as appears to be almost inevitable the deadline for completion of annual reports is going to be brought forward in such a way that it will fall within the Council's peak period of activity which usually runs from March to July, difficult problems will arise in establishing the period to be reported upon in chapters such as:

- Consultations with Member States,
- Representation of Namibia,
- Action concerning foreign economic interests,
- Action concerning the military situation,
- Consideration of legal matters, and
- Dissemination of information.

If would appear undesirable and probably unpracticable to have a situation in which the Drafting Committee attempts to report upon activities undertaken by the Council while the Drafting Committee is actually preparing its report. It will probably become essential to establish a rather early cut-off date for inclusion of material in the report.

11. With regard to the section of the report dealing with recommendations, a recommendation was placed before the General Committee (document A/BUR/34/2 of 22 October 1979) "that subsidiary organs reporting to the General Assembly should submit draft resolutions in order to facilitate the consideration of the items while eliminating the need for co-sponsorship by individual delegations". If this recommendation is now in effect,

it would appear to mean that the recommendation^s section of the report should be upgraded to the status of a draft resolution and that no further draft resolution would be required unless there were amendments.

12. Consideration should also be given to the administrative side of servicing the Drafting Committee. It would appear undesirable for members of the Secretariat of the Council to take leave during the peak period of work of the Drafting Committee, after the peak period has been defined. Furthermore, it would appear to be of substantial importance to hold discussions with the Chief of the Secretariat Services Division regarding the leave programme of the Editorial Unit and to avoid the situation by which half the staff of the Editorial Unit take leave without being replaced during the production period of the report of the Council. This situation has been occurring for several years.

13. It might also be helpful to prepare for the Council a document which would synthesize the various decisions on the control and limitation of documentation. If such a document were to be discussed in the Council, it could perhaps be introduced by an official concerned substantively with documentation questions.

Dear Colleague,

During the past two weeks, the following working papers prepared by the Secretariat have been sent to you:

(a) "Economic Conditions in Namibia" (Conference Room Paper No. 146)

(b) "Military Situation in Namibia" (Conference Room Paper No. 147)

(c) "Social Conditions in Namibia as affected by Legislation" (Conference Room Paper No. 148)

(d) "Political Conditions in and relating to Namibia" (Conference Room Paper No. 164).

As you know, the terms of reference of Standing Committee II include the consideration of the economic, military, social and legal aspects of the situation in Namibia. In this connexion, the papers prepared by the Secretariat provide the basic information required by the Committee in order for it to consider the situation in Namibia.

At the present time, the Drafting Committee of the Council is preparing the Draft Report of the Council to the Thirty-fourth session of the General Assembly. Standing Committee II is expected to contribute to the report the material for the chapters dealing with foreign economic interests in Namibia, the military situation in Namibia and legal matters concerning Namibia.

Standing Committee II is also expected to submit recommendations dealing with the situation in Namibia for consideration by the Council which in turn will submit its recommendations to the General Assembly.

As Acting Chairman of Standing Committee II, I should like to propose that Standing Committee II hold a formal debate, in which all members would be expected to speak, during the week of 10 September 1979, to review all aspects of the situation in Namibia and to prepare recommendations for submission to the Council. These recommendations could take any of the following forms:

- (a) recommendations to be included in the annual report of the United Nations Council for Namibia to the General Assembly;
- (b) a draft resolution to be adopted by the Council;
- (c) paragraphs to be included in a General Assembly resolution;
- (d) a draft declaration or draft consensus to be adopted by the Council or by the General Assembly.

I am convinced that the active participation of your delegation in the debate of Standing Committee II will be of great value to the work of the Committee.

Studies required by Standing Committee II

In addition to the studies of the political, economic, military and social situation in Namibia, the following studies are also required in connexion with the work of Standing Committee II. This memorandum has been prepared in consultation with Standing Committee II.

(a) Weekly news summary

At its 44th meeting on 29 March 1979, Standing Committee II requested the preparation by the Secretariat of a weekly news summary. This matter should now receive attention.

(b) List of States

The opinion of the Legal Counsel on the question of placing Namibia, represented by the United Nations Council for Namibia, on the list of States of the Secretary-General, requested by the Council at its 268th meeting on 21 December 1977 is now urgently required.

(c) Question of multilateral treaties

Some time ago, a compendium of multilateral treaties in which South Africa purported to sign on behalf of Namibia was prepared by a consultant for the Council.

A brief review should now be made of this compendium in order (i) to establish the list of countries to which the President of the Council should address letters requesting abrogation of any paragraphs by which South Africa purports to represent Namibia, and (ii) to prepare a draft letter.

(d) Illegality of activities of foreign companies in Namibia

Standing Committee II has been mandated (a) to send out a series of letters to Governments of States in which are based state-owned or private corporations which are operating in Namibia in contravention of United Nations decisions, and (b) to send out a second series of letters addressed directly to the Chairman of the boards of directors

of privately-owned corporations operating in Namibia.

The study would, firstly, study the legislative basis which establishes the illegal character of the activities of the foreign corporations in Namibia, i.e.:

- (i) Resolutions of the General Assembly on the question of Namibia;
- (ii) Resolutions of the General Assembly on Foreign Economic Interests;
- (iii) Resolutions of the Security Council;
- (iv) Decisions of the International Court of Justice;
- (v) Decree No. 1 of the United Nations Council for Namibia.

The study would distinguish, if necessary, between varying degrees of illegality which may attach to various activities; would establish the dates on which various activities became illegal; and would indicate which activities possess the greatest degree of illegality.

Secondly, the study would prepare an updated list of corporations operating in, possessing investments in or contemplating investing in Namibia, showing parent and subsidiary corporations. The study would also provide a draft letter to be sent (a) to Governments and (b) to privately-owned corporations.

- (e) Questions arising as a result of the full membership of Namibia, represented by the United Nations Council for Namibia, in the specialized agencies, FAO, ILO and UNESCO.

Under this heading, four categories of questions need to be studied:

- (i) Position to be taken by the Council when the agencies request specific data, frequently of a statistical nature, pertaining to the situation in Namibia;
- (ii) Position to be taken when agencies seek views of the Council on amendments to their Constitutions;
- (iii) Question of whether, on behalf of Namibia, the Council should sign certain conventions sponsored by the agencies;
- (iv) Position to be taken by the Council when the vote of Namibia is requested by other States in connexion with elections to be held for offices and bodies in the agencies.

Attached is correspondence in the above four categories. Assistance in preparing replied is requested. This is expected to be an on-going process rather than a one-time study.

- (f) Question of reparations

General Assembly resolution 33/182A of 21 December 1978, in its paragraph 8,

"Declares that South Africa is liable to pay reparations to Namibia for the damage caused by its illegal occupation of Namibia and its acts of aggression against the Namibian people since the termination of its mandate over Namibia in accordance with General Assembly resolution 2145 (XXI)."

A study should be prepared showing the legal basis for the payment of such reparations, giving relevant historical precedents.
