

COO AND ENGR OFFR COMPLIMENTED THE NORMAL PATROLS BY CONDUCTING AN INDEPTH PATROL (80 KM NORTH OF KABALE) TO CHECK ON THE SERVICEABILITY OF ROADS AFTER THE HEAVY RAINS AND TEST THE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS. THE ROADS IN GENERAL WERE FOUND TO BE IN BAD BUT MOTORABLE STATE. ON THE COMMUNICATIONS SIDE, THE REPEATER STATION WAS BEING INSTALLED AT THAT TIME SO RESULTS ARE STILL AWAITED.

OUR SCHEDULED PATROLS ARE STILL CONTINUING TO PATROL THE BORDER, THE ATTITUDE OF THE LOCALS ALTHOUGH NOT OUTRIGHT HOSTILE REMAINS INDIFFERENT. INFORMATION IS BEGINNING TO TRICKLE IN BUT NOT AT OUR DESIRED RATE.

A GOOD RAPPORT AND WORKING RELATIONS DO EXIST BETWEEN THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME AND INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE RED CROSS AND UNOMUR ON THE OTHER HAND. THEIR CONVOYS ARE THE REGULAR USERS OF OUR 24/7 CP AT KATUNA.

THE TECHNICIAN HAS PROCEEDED ON LEAVE, REQUEST YOU SEND ANOTHER TECHNICIAN TO SORT OUT THE PROBLEM.



2. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

YESTERDAY 01 DECEMBER 1993 AT ABOUT 1040 HRS ANOTHER AREA EAST PATROL WAS AGAIN DENIED ACCESS (BY THE NRA) TO GET TO THE BORDER POST AT MBALE, GRID 240599. THE REASON GIVEN WAS THAT THE UN SHOULD NOT GO TO MBALE BECAUSE THE RPF WERE PREPARING FOR A WAR WITH THE RGF IN RWANDA. A MISSION HQ PATROL WAS IMMEDIATELY DEPLOYED TO THE AREA, BUT THIS TIME THE PATROLS WERE ALLOWED ACCESS TO MBALE - WHERE THEY OBSERVED VERY FRESH TRACKS CROSSING INTO RWANDA. THE MISSION HQ PATROL LATER APPROACHED THE LOCAL NRA BATTALION SECOND-IN-COMMAND, WHO EXPLAINED THAT ALL THE NRA DETACHMENTS HAD BEEN INSTRUCTED TO ALLOW UN PATROLS FREE MOVEMENT.



2. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

YESTERDAY ON THE 301000C NOV 93 A SECTOR EAST MOBILE PATROL WAS UNNECESSARILY DELAYED, AND RESTRICTED MOVEMENT AT KASHEKE (A MAKE-SHIFT BOOMGATE S.W. OF LUBIRIZI) BY THE NRA. THE NRA INFORMED THE PATROL THAT THE CLEARANCE WAS THE BATTALION COMMANDER'S PREROGATIVE. EVEN AN OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE NRA IN THE AREA WAS AFRAID TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM CHOOSING TO REFER EVERYTHING TO HIS BATTALION COMMANDER. THE BATTALION COMMANDER WHO FOR SOME UNKNOWN REASONS WAS NOT IN THE SCENE, CHOSE TO BE AT A PLACE WHERE HE COULD NOT BE EASILY ACCESSIBLE, THEREFORE, CAUSING FURTHER DELAYS TO THE TEAM. THE ACTION BY THE NRA CAME AS A SURPRISE BECAUSE OUR PATROLS USE THE ROUTE ON A DAILY BASIS. WE HAVE THROUGH THE NORMAL CHANNELS LAUNCHED A FORMAL COMPLAINT ON THE INCIDENT.
